When one is doing a good job and there is still unreasonable treatment God is watching. And He says that accepting ill treatment patiently is commendable.

Expressions

Reflections on the Words of Life by Pastor Paul Ferrie.

Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We continue in the section of 1 Peter 2, where Peter is giving instructions on how the Christian should live in close relationships. Last time we saw in verse 18 that servants are commanded to submit to their masters, even those who might be unkind and harsh. Bringing this concept over to the present time in our society, we applied this to employee/employer relationships. Peter reinforces this by stating a principle in verses 19 and 20 which applies not only

to the work place, but to all of life: "For this is commendable, if because of conscience toward God one endures grief, suffering wrongfully. For what credit is it if, when you are beaten for your faults, you take it patiently? But when you do good and suffer, if you take it patiently, this is commendable before God."

Let us first note here there is a type of suffering which is deserved. A person who speeds should not be surprised to get a ticket. Goofing off and doing a sloppy job at work will likely get a person fired. These examples come under the category of what Peter calls in our passage being "beaten for your faults."

But on the other hand, there feel is coming to you. No one,

God. The key words here in our passage are that the believer suffers "because of conscience toward God." Better translation of what the Greek says is "because he is conscious of God."

This is a very important principle. What Peter is saying is that the believer should not get all bent out of shape because of unfair treatment. This is quite the opposite of our modern society in which we are constantly hearing the cry for "my rights." The attitude of the average American today is simply this: "If you wrong me in any way, I will get you back." And because all human beings are self-centered by nature, that kind of attitude seems so justifiable. No one is going to fault you if you seek revenge or try to get even when you don't get what you

Friends, we all know that this life can be very unfair. In-

justice is rampant in the world, and we can pretty much take for granted that all of us will at some time encounter it. What a blessing it is that the believer in the Lord Jesus Christ can, because of conscience toward God, accept unfair treatment without being devastated. For the believer in Christ, the promise of Romans 8:28 is especially applicable here, and something that he or she should lean on: "And we know that all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called according to His purpose." The Christian should

not give in to bitterness or depression, thinking that he or she is a helpless victim, but should trust that God is working even the unpleasant circumstances for good. Note, however, that the promise of all things working together for good is ONLY for those who are believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, who are trusting in Him alone to make them right with God. And if you are not a believer, please realize that your condition is desperate. and nothing is working together for your ultimate good. But by turning to Christ and trusting in Him, you can change all that.




