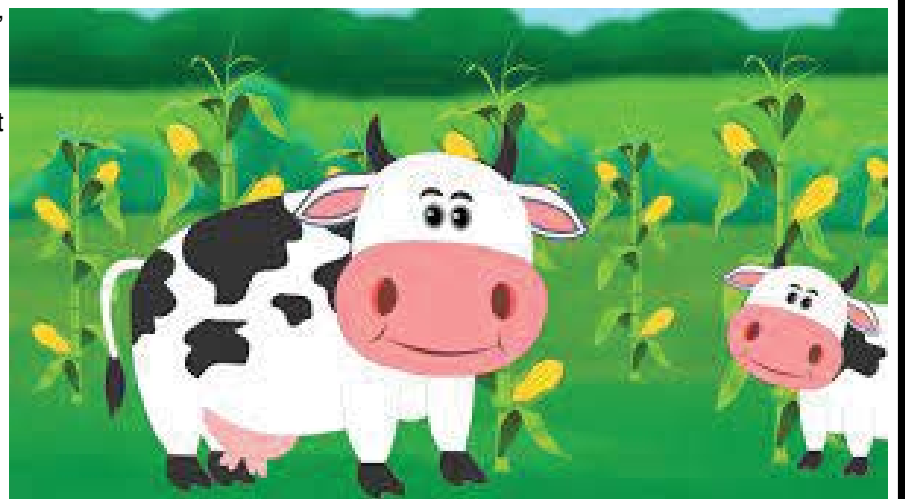

## ~ NOTICE ~

### Weed cutting notice to all landowners or Operators that weeds must be cut

Notice is hereby given to all landowners or operators to cut all weeds and grasses adjoining their lands along those roads defined as roadways by the Township supervisors and the Hettinger County Board of Commissioners including weeds and grasses growing within the public right-of-way bordering such highways and their lands. **Such cutting shall be completed by October 1, 2022.** Cutting with a swather is not adequate, maximum stubble height of 4 inches and a minimum of 13 feet must be cut using a mower. If the weeds and grasses are not cut along county roads or is not cut adequately to prevent snow buildup, the county will mow the weeds and grasses and charge the adjacent landowner at a rate of \$150.00 per one-half mile. **The county will begin cutting ditches on October 1, 2022.** If the landowner fails to cut the weeds and grasses along township roads adjoining their lands, the township Board of Supervisors may cause such weeds and grasses to be cut and the actual cost shall be charged against the land of the landowner and shall become part of the taxes levied against the land in the ensuing year. **Also if hay bales remain in the ditches of county roads after October 15, 2021 the county will remove the hay bales and the landowner may redeem them by paying the cost of removal.** If not redeemed by November the hay will be sold to pay the cost of removal.

The Township Board of Supervisors do not need to advertise for weed cutting in their Township.



## Adams County Emergency Management to Host Community Event to Discuss Hazard Mitigation

Adams County Emergency Manager Frank Fettig invites the public to attend a Community Coffee to discuss hazards and threats, and to share ideas for mitigating their impacts. The event is set for 1 p.m. to 2 p.m. MT, Wednesday, Oct. 19, at the Hettinger Research Extension Center in Hettinger, North Dakota. Coffee and refreshments will be served.

"We welcome input from the public regarding which hazards and threats they think have the greatest potential to impact the residents of Adams County," Fettig said. "Insights shared by our residents will help guide development of both the Adams County and the State multi-hazard mitigation plans."

Mitigation plans serve as a roadmap to increasing communities' resilience to disasters. Based on the risk assessment, planning teams develop strategies to mitigate the impacts of hazards and threats and to build disaster-resilient communities.

The Adams County Multi-Hazard Mitigation Plan (MHMP), which received federal approval in 2019, ensures the county's eligibility for federal hazard mitigation funding under FEMA's Hazard Mitigation Grant Program. This program assists states, territories, federally-recognized tribes and local communities by:

- Significantly reducing or permanently eliminating future risk to lives and property from natural hazards.

- Providing funds to implement projects in accordance with priorities identified in state, tribal or local hazard mitigation plans.

- Enabling mitigation measures to be implemented during the recovery following a major disaster declaration.

The state mitigation plan achieved Enhanced Mitigation status in February 2018. As an enhanced state, North Dakota is now eligible to receive increased funding under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program of 20 percent, which is an increase from 15 percent.

Adams County Weed Cutting and Hay Removal Policy

Therefore, all weeds and grass along Township roads, designated by each Township (Organized and Unorganized) and the Village of North Lemmon, shall be mowed no later than October 1st of each year.

The prescribed height of the stubble to be left shall not exceed six inches. The minimum width of the cut shall be nine feet. A windrow may not be left on the roadway or shoulder of the roadway.

Maps provided by Townships or the County for Unorganized Townships designating the roads to be mowed will be on file on the County Website for the landowner or operators review.

The Adams County Road Department will mow County roads by October 15th each year.

All hay bales on County road-right-of-ways shall be removed by October 1st of each year. Failure to comply will result in Adams County assuming ownership and removal of the bales by Adams County or its designee.

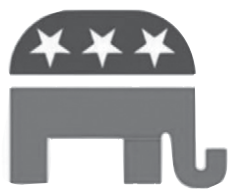

## Reflections on the Words of Life

We ended last time with Daniel safely spending a night in the lions' den and King Darius miserably spending a night in agony and guilt. I am reminded of the account of John Hus, a Roman Catholic priest from Bohemia, who lived from the late fourteenth to the early fifteenth century. Hus adopted the teaching of John Wycliffe that Scripture alone was to be the rule of faith and practice for the believer. He was defrocked because he refused to recant his conviction and was sentenced to death by burning at the stake. The account is given that on the night before his martyrdom, John Hus slept soundly. In fact, someone had to wake him on the morning of his execution. He died singing to the Lord amidst the flames. I suspect that Daniel slept well in the lion's den while King Darius frantically waited for dawn.

We read in Daniel 6:19: "Then the king arose very early in the morning and went in haste to the den of lions." What

an ironic picture this portrays. We see here how much better it is to be a believer, trusting in God in a den of lions than to be a world ruler without God and consumed with anxiety and guilt.

The narrative continues in verse 20: "And when he came to the den, he cried out with a lamenting voice to Daniel. The king spoke, saying to Daniel, 'Daniel, servant of the living God, has your God, whom you serve continually, been able to deliver you from the lions?' Little did Darius realize how well he was describing this man who had devoted himself to God since his childhood in Jerusalem some 70 years earlier. We have considered how Daniel was taken from his family and homeland as a teenager and put through a vigorous program of heathen indoctrination. He did not capitulate when tempted to eat the king's diet. He did not shirk from honestly interpreting the fearful dreams of Nebuchadnezzar and later the handwriting on the wall for Belshazzar. Neither did he stop praying to God before his open window, though that was the very reason for which he was now in the lions' den.

It is extremely difficult to serve God faithfully in high places. There are many who serve God well in an obscure life that is relatively free from strong pressures and temptations, but who fall apart when they achieve a little notoriety or power or prosperity. But not Daniel. He had been grounded in the Scriptures and was so steeped in truth and prayer that it was now almost instinctive for him to think biblically and act bravely in both little matters and big matters. He is accurately described by King Darius as one who served God CONTINUALLY.

Friends, as we have mentioned before, Daniel's faithfulness was not something that he drummed up from within himself. It was God who sustained Daniel and filled him with courage to keep on the right path even at the risk of his life. It was God who enabled Daniel to persevere, as He later enabled John Hus to persevere.

A Little Birdie Told Me: "All Roads Do Not Lead to Ekalaka Montana."

Saturday, September 17th started out with a bit of rain, a perfect day for a road trip to Ekalaka, MT. The only road leading to Ekalaka is Highway 7 south of Baker MT.

My Husband, Dave and I headed west to Baker, MT and then 35 miles south of Baker on Highway 7. Not sure what to expect and seriously I wasn't expecting much, but I was pleasantly surprised! Willard, MT is an unincorporated community in Fallon County the post office closed on September 9, 1995; it still has it's own zip code, 59354.

As we continued south strange but incredible rock formations began to appear: Medicine Rocks State Park is just north of Ekalaka. Medicine Rocks are a series of sandstone pillars similar to Hoodoos. They are some 60 - 80 feet high with eerie undulations, hole and tunnels winding their way through the formations: Containing Native American rock art, Medicine Rocks are considered a sacred holy place by the Plains Indians.

Next stop Ekalaka and lunch at the Wagon Wheel Café: Owned by Air Force retirees, Dennis & Trish Bishop. The Bishops took over the café in 2013 and now provide catering services. The Wagon Wheel Café wanted to give Moms a break during branding season and now cater up to 12 brandings each spring, they also cater weddings and the Annual Dino Shindig, which has served up to 500 hungry dinosaur enthusiasts.

Just a short distance from the Wagon Wheel Café is the "IJKALAKA" Grocery store was celebrating one year in their brand new building. The spelling is correct, owner Toni Kratzer wanted to pay tribute to Ijkalaka (Eagle Man) Russel, Wife of David Harrison Russel some of the first settlers to the area: She was an Ogallala Sioux Indian and the Niece of Chief Red Cloud. The Russels were inducted into the Montana Cowboy Hall of Fame in 2008.

Following lunch our trip around town revealed an authentic Mexican Restaurant -

TSO Cantina. The Cantina is located in an old rock building giving it an even more authentic feeling. Rumor has it the Mexican food is the reason Ekalaka is able to keep doctors at the new Dahl Memorial Healthcare facility. Ekalaka also has a new K-12 school, the first class graduated in 1919. Ekalaka is the County Seat for Carter County and has a beautifully maintained Courthouse and grounds.

Final stop the Carter County Museum! Carter County Museum was established in 1936 by amateur archaeologist and paleontologists as the first county museum in Montana and the first dinosaur museum in the state. The CCM is one of 14 museums on the Montana Dinosaur Trail, a passport-style tour of Montana's dinosaur bearing museums.

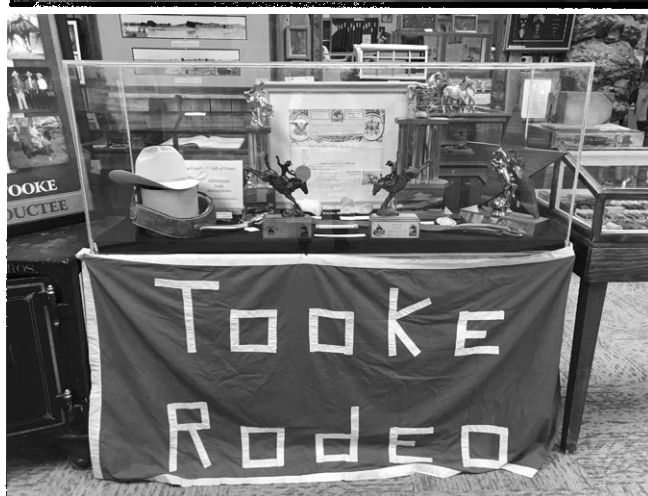
The Annual Dino Shindig now in its 10th year draws dinosaur hunters and enthusiasts from all over the world. The Dino Shindig is held in June of every year with the record setting attendance in 2019 of 900. Noted scientists from around the world share their expertise over the two-day event.

Exhibits in the museum cover a 90 million year history of the area up to the homesteading of the west: The museum boasts over 6000 visitors a year. The exhibit featuring the Tooke Bucking Horses is a must see for rodeo fans. The Tooke Bucking Horses are well known around the rodeo circuit, Ekalaka is home to the original bucking horse line. The Tooke ranch at Ekalaka is responsible for up 90% of today's top bucking horse stock.

Dr. Nathan Carroll a paleontologist and his finance Sabre Moore, Ph.D. Candidate are on hand for tours and to answer questions. Sabre a native of Wyoming and graduate of Montana State University - Bozeman in 2013 (Go Cats) is a knowledgeable guide.

Cook over low heat for 30 minutes, stirring frequently.

If I have a fresh pepper I saute it with the onion and celery also garlic if you like. I use fresh tomatoes if I have them just boil to remove skins then dice. I also season my hamburger with salt and pepper while I'm browning it. ENJOY! Serves 6
