Reflections on the Words of Life

After spending several weeks on 1 Peter 2:16 dealing with various aspects of Christian liberty, we move today to verse 17: "Honor all people. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the king." This section of Peter's epistle is a practical one dealing with how believers are to live in this world and maintain a good testimony for the Lord Jesus Christ. It should be the desire of every Christian to live in a way that attracts others to Him.

In our verse, Peter explains the believer's responsibility to other people. He divides people into four categories and gives particular instruction about relating to each group in a way that pleases God.

Peter's first category is very

general: the believer's relationship to ALL other people. And the specific duty which is required is to HONOR them. Honor has the idea of respect. Christianity does not encourage sinful human pride, yet that does not mean that the Christian cannot give credit where credit is due. One way we can honor others is by recognizing and appreciating their achievements. Of course, the believer's approach to this will be different from the world's way of giving honor. The world does not recognize that all talents and abilities are gifts from God. But when believers honor other people, we should realize and confess that God has blessed them in their accomplishments.

But we must go deeper than this. For not all people have achievements that are worthy of honor. In fact, many people are absolutely wicked. How can we honor them? How can we honor ALL people? The answer lies in the fact that all people are made in God's image and have dignity and immeasurable value for that reason. Of course we do not honor wickedness or pretend to admire one who wastes the talents that God has given him or her. But what we can honor about any person is that he or she is made in the image of God and has the potential to know Him. A human being is one of the most magnificent of all God's creatures. If we truly understood this, it would help us to view people around us in a different light. British pastor Charles Spurgeon was walking down the road with a friend, and they observed a man staggering in drunkenness. Spurgeon's friend commented on the sadness of the scene. Spurgeon replied by saying, "But for the grace of God, there go I." In other words, Spurgeon did not look at the condition of the drunken man as an opportunity to pat himself on the back with pride that he was better. Rather, Spurgeon used the occasion to remember how blessed he had been by God.

been gracious to him, he might be the one who was staggering down the street. Remembering that all people are made in God's image will also give us the desire to see them restored to their full potential by trusting in Jesus Christ and having their lives transformed by Him.

It is the Christian view of mankind which gives real dignity to man. Evolution treats man as an accident. That people hate and abuse and kill others is the natural result of evolutionary thinking. If people are here only by accident, then they have no ultimate value. But Biblical Christianity sees potential in every person to know and glorify

God so loved this fallen world of humanity that He gave His only begotten Son to take on the very nature of man and die to pay the penalty of sin for all who would place their trust in Him. The Lord Jesus is even now seated at the right hand of the Father as a man! And so, brothers and sisters in the Lord, let us seek to honor all men by doing all we can to bring people to Christ through the gospel.







The Sickness And The Cure

The last time we talked. I said, "Where there is free will, there can be peace!" In Philippians 4.6, Paul says, "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplications with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." Faith deals with prayer, and true prayer is void of worry. Peace and worry cannot walk hand in hand - worry causes us to doubt God's plans! When we let worry capture our thoughts, in effect we're saying, "God, I'm not sure You can handle this,

- you will only find peace in a daily walk with Jesus. In John 14.27, Jesus said, "Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." You cannot have peace from God until you have peace with God; real peace is found only in the person of Jesus! Horatio Spafford lost his

son to pneumonia [scarlet fever?], and in the same year he lost his business during the great Chicago fire of 1871. In 1873, his wife Anna, with their 4 daughters, sailed on a ship to England. Within sight of land, another ship collided with them, and 226 passengers died that day, including the 4 girls. Anna was saved, and later wired a message to Horatio saying, 'Saved, alone, what shall I do?" He booked passage on the next available ship, and when they were over the place where his daughters had drowned, he wrote the words to this hymn,

deth my way, when sorrows like sea billows roll; whatever my lot, Thou hast taught me to say, it is well, it is well with my soul!"

Unbelief is the core, root sin in our lives, but the way forward is complete faith in Jesus, our Peace. The 7 Deadly Sins show us where those enticements are in our lives, how they draw us away from God, and how they are based in unbelief. If these 7 are the sickness, the cure is God's perfect will for us!





Thoughts for the Week

As we enter another week of the 'government shutdown' does anybody else feel like it's a tennis match and our heads keep bouncing back and forth with every newscast? And what does it mean when they say that they are shutdown in the first place.

A government shutdown occurs when Congress fails to pass or the president refuses to sign a spending bill to fund the federal government's operations. This results in a funding gap that can cause several government functions to be temporarily disrupted. Government shutdowns are often resolved by Congress passing continuing resolutions, which provide short-term funding while negotiations for a long-term solution continue. Every shutdown since 1990 has been ended with a continuing resolution.

During a government shutdown, Members of Congress, the President, and some federal employees whose positions are funded through sources other than annual appropriations continue to be paid. Most federal employees, including military personnel and essential wokers have their pay delayed, but are guaranteed back pay once the shutdown ends. Federal contractors, however are not guar-

anteed back pay. The salaries of the President and members of the House and Senate are funded through permanent appropriations and are protected by the U.S. Constitution so they continue to receive paychecks.

During a government shutdown, Social Security and Medicare benefits continue, but some services may be slowed or suspended. As mandatory programs, they are funded by existing laws and do not require annual congressional appropriations to operate.

So basically, what it means is that all essential services continue, but anything that is not considered essential or not provided for by separate appropriations is on hold until the government shutdown is over. Maybe if the Senators and Representatives had their paychecks suspended until they sit down and hash this all out, we would be better off and it probably would end a lot sooner. It appears to me that some people are holding the government hostage to get their demands and since the initial resolution that was supposed to 'kick the can down the road' for an extention of the current plan had no changes to it, I wonder who it is that is causing this problem for the rest of us?

The sad part of this is that we are the government, we the people, yet we have little say in what the government does. We


