Three Blind Mice, see how they run, they all ran after the Farmers Wife, who cut off their tails with a carving knife, have you ever seen such a sight in your life as Three Blind Mice.

Music playing, sheets of paper with above story on paper. Class sat down and Professor said, "today we learn a new song, tomorrow we discuss."

Three Blind Mice - - class sang over and over. Professor Joe said "Now turn over sheet of paper and sing" - - students did. Many remem-

One group - - "Just a dumb story - we hear them all the time." Second group - - "Why were they blind, what happened to them?" Third group - "We couldn't figure out how blind mice could chase after the farmers wife - - could they smell - - we laughed at that answer but then we agreed maybe they were pretending they couldn't see - kinda like us - - sometimes we pretend so we don't have to do something or we pretend cuz we don't really know or we pretend so people feel sorry for us"

Next question - - "She cut off their tails with a carving knife?" Again much laughter as they each tossed out funny answers - - then one by one each group gave their answers - - Group one - "Poor mice, bet it hurt - ran back into their hole and cried poor me." Group two - "We'll never chase her again" and Group three - - "Sure glad we have a doctor in our nest and he's in the clinic today and the three mice were taken care of" - -.

Professor Joe's comment - - "As you see - - we are all different, each answer is right, each answer comes from your heart, depending on how you are that day or what you really think. Now take this story to your community - - and ask yourself are we blind to all the gifts we have - the special people, special businesses. Can I make a difference by my thinking - question for you - your thoughts - -. Class dismissed."





Last weekend I had three tasks in mind I wanted to accomplish. One, get rid of all the dead plants, tomatoes, peppers, and flowers, and put away all the flowerpots for the season. Two, rake up all the pinecones on the ground. Three, put away all the decorations around the yard in preparation for the white stuff that is to come. As I write this article, I am two-thirds of the way done. The decorations might have to wait until this weekend

As I was looking at all the pinecones on the ground after the winds of last week, I thought this would be the last time I would have to rake them up this fall. I then looked up to the top of the pine trees and realized I was wrong. In my mind there should not have been a pinecone left on the trees, but lo and behold the tops are still full of pinecones. I guess I might be doing some more raking.

As I began raking up the pinecones, as I have done on a number of occasions this year, I thought how different and yet how same the process is. I first raked up pinecones in the spring of the year, and then in the summer of the year, and now I am raking them again in the fall of the year. The only season I hope not to be raking pinecones is this winter, but if we do not get snow, I just might be raking them again.

So, you might be thinking, where is he going with this? The answer is Ecclesiastes 3:1, "For everything there is a season, and a time for ev-

As much as we look forward to all four seasons of the year, sometimes the seasons do not follow the normal pattern that we want them to. As much as we want them to be constant, sometimes that is not the case, and the seasons are what they are.

So, with the verse from Ecclesiastes still in my mind I thought about what is one constant that is a part of our lives. It definitely is not the seasons of the year as I have mentioned, so is there one constant in our lives? Yes, there is, and we know this again through the words of scripture.

We read in Hebrews 13:8, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever."

Jesus the Christ is the one constant in our lives. We live each day of our lives in the presence of Jesus. When we have a good day, Jesus is with us. When we have a bad day, Jesus is with us. When we have a normal day, an average day, a blah kind of day, Jesus is with us. We are never alone-and that is good news to hear. In all the days, in all the seasons of the year Jesus is with us because, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever." Reflections on the Words of Life

By Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We come today to the second decision which King Darlus made after the Lord delivered Daniel from the mouths of the lions. Last week we saw that he removed Daniel from the lions' den. Now we read in Daniel 6:24, "And the king gave the command, and they brought those men who had accused Daniel, and they cast them into the den of lions--them, their children, and their wives; and the lions overpowered them, and broke all their bones in pieces before they ever came to the bottom of the den." The scene described here was a most gruesome one. The gods of Daniel's accusers were powerless to help them. Their horrifying death illustrates what is stated in Psalm 7:14-16: "Behold, the wicked brings forth iniquity; yes, he conceives trouble and brings forth falsehood. He made a pit and dug it out, and has fallen into the ditch which he made. His trouble shall return upon his own head, and his violent dealing shall come down on his own crown." The same principle is stated in Proverbs 5:22: "His own iniquities entrap the wicked man, and he is caught in the cords of his sin." We read a similar statement in the New Testament: "Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap" (Galatians 6:7).

Next time, Lord willing, we shall consider the third and final decision of Darius. But I'd like to elaborate a bit on the principle noted above—namely, that the plots of the wicked will eventual-

lv entrap them. God is absolutely holy, and He cannot violate that holiness by overlooking sin. Sometimes His punishment for sin at least partially occurs in this life, but sometimes it seems that the wicked go through life happily and carefree. Men have struggled with this seeming injustice for centuries. In Psalm 37 we read, "Do not fret because of evildoers, nor be envious of the workers of iniquity.... Do not fret because of him who prospers in his way, because of the man who brings wicked schemes to pass" (verses 1a and 7b). The same Psalm explains why the righteous should not fret when evil seems to prevail: "For evildoers shall be cut off For the arms of the wicked shall be broken But the wicked shall perish; and the enamies of the Lord, like the spleridor of the meadows, shall vanish. Into smoke they shall vanish away" (verses 9a, 17a, 20). You see, though God might not bring obvious judgment to the wicked in this life, those who persist in their sinful courses without repentance will certainly be sent to eternal punishment at the final judgment.

Friends, we who are believers in Christ should of all people on this earth be the most thankful because God has extended grace to us. God's Word is clear that every one of us deserves His judgment in hell. Romans 3 tells us, "There is none righteous, no not one For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God" (verses 10b, 23). But the good news is that Jesus Christ has taken the punishment for the sins of all His people, the punishment that we deserve. So we do not have to fear being condemned to spend eternity in hell at the final judgment. This does not mean that believers are necessarily free from the consequences of sin in this life. For example, the person who has indulged in drunkenness might experience great suffering from cirrhosis of the liver. But if that person has repented and placed his or her trust in the Lord Jesus Christ for salvation, he can look forward to spending eternity in heaven with Jesus. For, "There is therefore now no condemnation to those who are in Christ Jesus" (Romans 8:1). All sin must be paid for---either by the sinner or by Jesus.




"It was a long journey to

It's basketball season for grandson Kohen. His team is doing great and they are fun to watch. I hope they continue to play together through high school. They have the potential of a powerhouse team.



All is good. Fall is here and I'm happy.



is, they still need to hear those words every once in a while. It's often what keeps us going in our lives and what helps us to get through the troubled times that we all go through.




