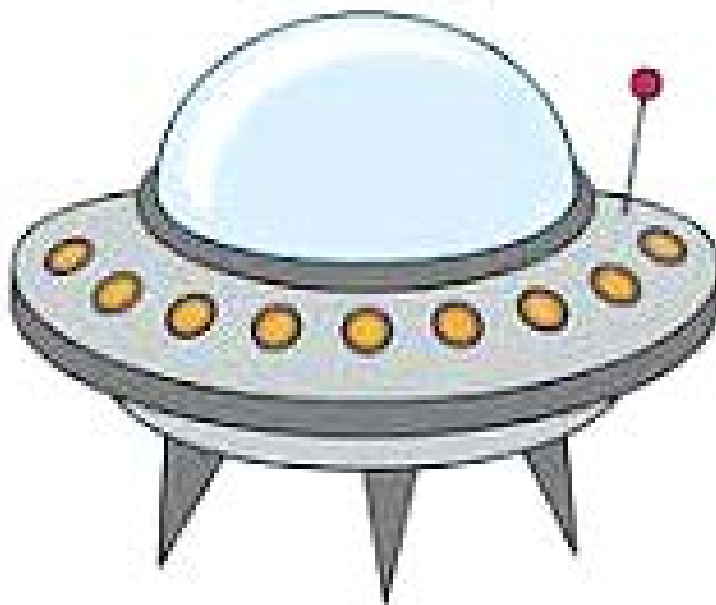



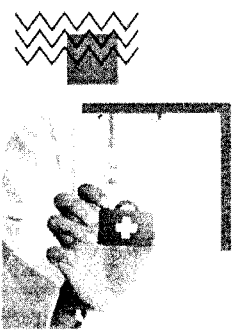
Bar complaints. No, I'm not talking about that mixed drink you order and, it comes out distasteful and has to be sent back. Rather, our State Bar Association says that it's a situation involving attorney "misconduct". A written expression of dissatisfaction with services rendered to a client; or, a 3rd party observation of unethical conduct. And, the litmus test to determine "misconduct" is found in the Century Code and the ND Rules of Professional Conduct, i.e., to commit a criminal act, be dishonest or fraudulent, deceive a court, knowingly assisting a judicial officer to violate judicial canons, improperly affect a government official, steal client funds or, engage in conduct that is prejudicial to the administration of justice. Simply being an advocate for a client, or hurting an opponent's feelings, is not a violation of these rules and, shouldn't be. Why? Well, again, in a high school civics class, one learns that our American system of justice (civil or criminal) is "adversarial."

The Oxford Dictionary defines the process as "involving or characterized by conflict or opposition, opposed, or hostile." Each side in the trial or legal hearing is responsible for finding and presenting their own evidence to convince the fact finder. Not the modern mantra of "thou shalt be nice" or equitable. Lawyers "argue" for a living and, arguing inevitably causes conflict and feelings to be hurt. And, the odds of an amateur arguer defeating a professional is self-obvious. The pro usually wins. Which is why the phrase "sue me" is a lot less glib after you actually get sued. And, that is what I am starting to notice now-a-days where litigants choose to act as their own lawyer, or hire one they disagree with, and, then want to point fingers and cry foul after they lose.

This week, in a case resolved years ago, a losing party made a complaint that I (along with the judge and the other attorney) should all be disciplined because I was good at what I do and, the losing party HAD to hire an "incompetent" lawyer who did not "honor their legal oath." Other than these conclusory allegations and, frankly, gibberish about the case, the argument was that I "interrogated" the losing side too well, was competent in pleadings; and, therefore, I was intimidating and coercive. Bad, bad lawyer! Suffice it to say that is NOT misconduct and, despite the losing side's feelings and pockets being hurt, not grounds for discipline. I continue to hope that we return to the days of excellence and competence, losing graciously and, feelings being our own responsibility and not everyone else's (or a basis for liability). In the meantime, I'm going to frame this thing and hang it on the wall. I'm odd that way, you know, being accused of competence and all. Have a great week!

BOWMAN COUNTY BURN BAN RESOLUTION

October 15, 2024

WHEREAS, the Bowman County Board of Commissioners recognized that abnormally dry or drought conditions combined with high winds have seen increased fire responses within Bowman County; and

WHEREAS, the impact of fires threatens the health, well-being and safety of citizens in Bowman County; and

WHEREAS, the cost of response and the inordinate equipment wear may be far in excess of available county resources; and

WHEREAS, the Daily Fire Danger Index does not realistically reflect the propensity for wildland fires; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Bowman County Board of Commissioners declares a total burn ban on open burning in Bowman County, (regardless of fire danger categories assigned per the North Dakota Fire Danger Rating Map) effective immediately until further notice. Responsible use of enclosed gas grills may be used at a safe distance from combustible materials. This ban will be reviewed periodically as conditions improve.

THE PENALTY FOR VIOLATION OF THIS BURN BAN IS A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR (NDCC 37-17.0-10.1: MAXIMUM SENTENCE OF 30 DAYS IN JAIL AND \$1500 FINE AND RESTITUTION OF FIRE SUPPRESSION COSTS MAY BE SOUGHT FROM THE COURT).

What is banned?

* Garbage burning, campfires, burning of farm or cropland, unnecessary off-road motorized travel, ignition of fireworks and smoking in undesignated areas.

* No travel is to be allowed off of surfaced roadways normally used for vehicle traffic except as necessary for normal farmer/rancher or industry operations. Industrial operating crews and farmer/rancher operations shall have fire extinguishers and normal fire-fighting equipment at hand, and industrial personnel shall remain at the job site one-half hour after daily operations are completed.

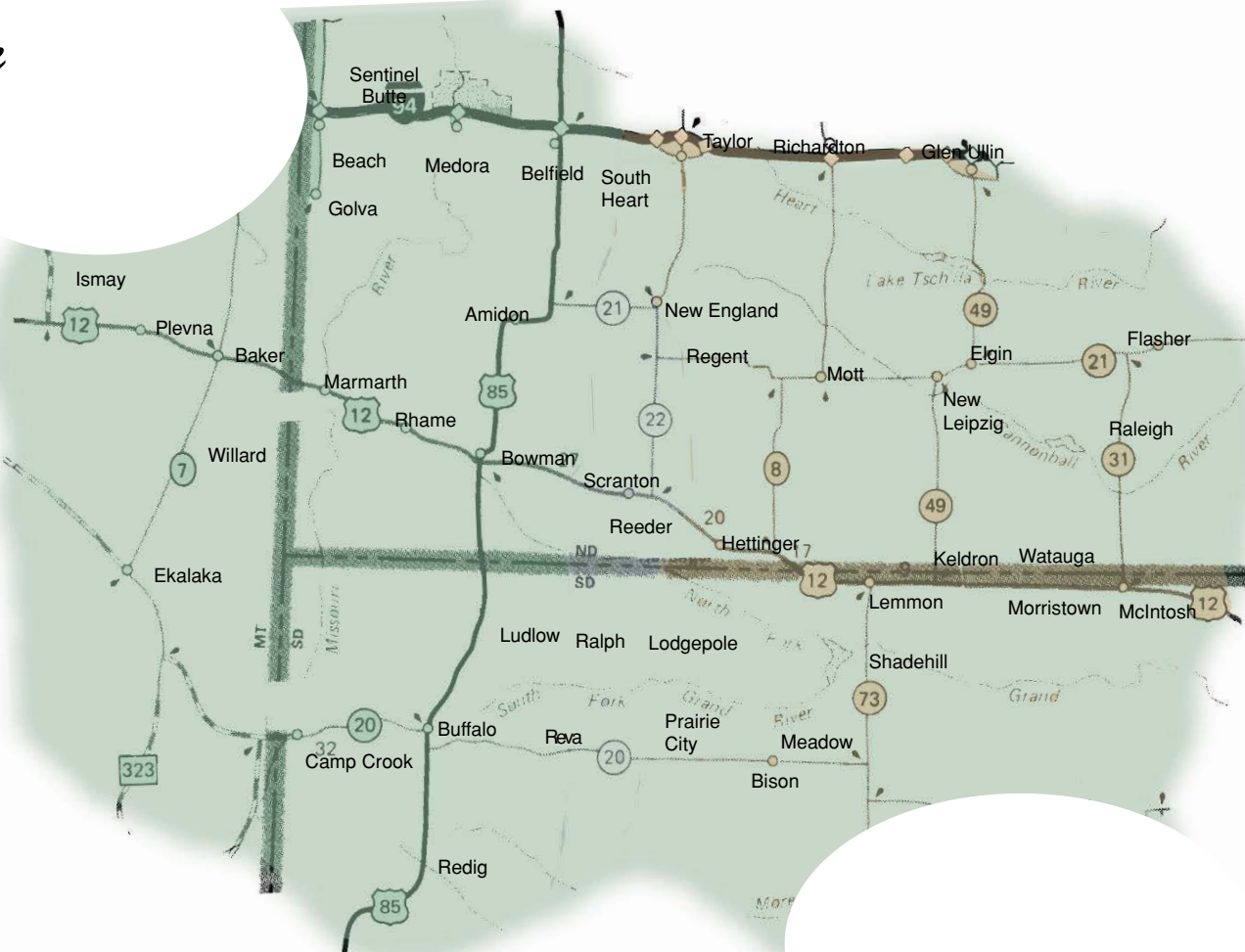

What is a Church

Pastor Julian Burgess

Western Plains Baptist Church

My goodness what a ques-
tion, what is a Church? You
would be surprised to hear all
the answers you would get
from the many different types of
people that go to Church. I think
the real question here is What is
Gods view of what is a Church
and just what is Church sup-
posed to look like. What we will
be looking at here this week is
what the Bible says about what
is Church.

First let's look at Matthew
16:15-18 He said to them, who
do you say that I am? Simon Pe-
ter answered and said, You are
the Christ, the Son of the living
God. Jesus answered and said
to him, Blessed are you Simon
Bar-Jona, for flesh and blood
has not revealed this to you, but
My Father who is in Heaven.
And I also say to you that you
are Peter, and on this rock, I will
build my Church, and the gates
of hell will not prevail against it.

Peter is one of my favorite
people in the Bible. He was real
and Peter was a handful for Je-
sus to handle. Peters pride and
arrogance he was always get-
ting in trouble with Jesus. But,
God knew Peters heart. That is
the very reason He called him,
He knew his heart and that
when it was time, Peter would
take a stand for Him. That is the
way Jesus does us all, we may
be a work in progress, but Jesus
knows when the time is right for
us we take a stand for Him and
we become His through Salva-
tion and become His servant.
God had a plan for Peter, that
God would build His Church on
the Faith of Peter, not the man,
but the Faith of the man. Acts
2:32-33 This Jesus God has
raised up, of which we are wit-
nesses. Therefore, being ex-
alted to the right hand of God,
and having received from the
Father the promise of the Holy
Spirit, He poured out this which
you now see and hear.

Acts 2:36-39 Therefore, let
all the house of Israel know as-
suredly that God has made this
Jesus, whom you have cruci-
fied, both Lord and Christ. Now
when they heard this they were
cut to the heart, and said to Pe-
ter and the rest of the Apostles,
Men and Brethren, what shall
we do? Then Peter said to them,
Repent, and let everyone of you
be baptized in the name of Je-
sus Christ for the remission of
sins; and you shall receive the
gift of the Holy Spirit.

Acts 2:40-41 And with many
other words he testified and ex-
horted them, saying, Be saved
from this perverse generation.
Then those who gladly received
his word were baptized; and
that day about 3000 souls were
added to them. And here the
Church is born. A Godly Church
is built only on the Cross of our
Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

Just as Peter lead that Church in the Book of Acts on his Faith that is how our Churches should be built today, allowing Jesus to lead our Churches in the way that He would have us to go.

We now look at Ephesians 1:20-21 which He worked in Christ when He raised Him from the dead and seated Him at His right hand in the Heavenly places, far above all princinality and power and might and dominion, and every name that is named, not only in this age but also in that which is to come. And He put all things under His feet, and gave Him to be head over all things to the Church, which is His body, the fullness of Him who fills all in all.

In 1 Corinthians 12:12 it says for as the body is one and has many members, but all the members of that one body, being many, are one body, so also is Christ. The Church is one body in Christ, but being one body has many Members. Colossians 1:18 says and He is the head of the body, the Church, who is the beginning, the first-born from the dead, and in all things, He may have the preeminence. Folks I can go on with many more scripture verses from the Bible. We look now to Jesus as the Cornerstone of the Spiritual Temple, the Church; and the most important stone in the structure. The cornerstone is laid first and determines the placement of all other stones. Here we see Jesus as the stumbling stone because He was so much different than the Jews expected, and they rejected Him. This kinda sums it up for a lot of people that refuse to accept Jesus as who He is. 1 Corinthisans 1:23 says that Christ crucified is a stumbling block to the Jews and foolishness to the Gentile.

Folks a Godly Church en- courages you to read your Bible. A Godly Church encour- ages you to Pray and to study your Bible. A Godly Church preaches the Bible only, not worldly. Paul wrote to Timothy in 2 Timothy 4:2 Preach the Word. When you preach God's Word, you are preaching Truth. The Bible, God inspired, God wrote, infallible. Inerrant and Perfect Word of God. The very best way to know if you are hearing a Godly message from the Bible, Read the Bible yourself. Study the Bible yourself. Pray as you study. Pray as you read. God will give you insight as you read and study and will allow you to hide little nuggets in your mind and heart to reflect on later. Je- sus is a relationship. Bible read- ing and study and Prayer is how we build on our relationship with Jesus daily.

Reflections on the Words of Life

Having considered last week the believer's joy in knowing that his or her soul is forever saved, we now turn our attention to a very fascinating passage, 1 Peter 1:10-11: "Of this salvation the prophets have inquired and searched carefully, who prophesied of the grace that would come to you, searching what, or what manner of time, the Spirit of Christ who was in them was indicating when He testified beforehand the sufferings of Christ and the glories that would follow." These verses tell us that the Old Testament prophets testified beforehand the sufferings and glories of Christ. In other words, they were teaching about a future salvation, the very salvation that we as believers now enjoy. But what is so intriguing about what Peter says here, is not only that the writings of the Old Testament prophets contain information about the future and the coming of Christ and what He would do, but they also tell us something about the very process of inspiration that these prophets underwent. Note that although these Old Testament prophets wrote about Christ, even they themselves did not fully understand their own writings. The reason for this is that it was God the Holy Spirit who was behind the whole process. In fact, Peter states this very thing. He says in verse 11 that it was the "Spirit of Christ" who was testifying of the things concerning the coming Christ. The Holy Spirit is the ultimate Author of Scripture. Is it any wonder, then, that we find Peter telling us later in 2 Peter 1:20-21, "Knowing this first, that no prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation, for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit"? When Peter says here that no prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation, he includes the fact that not even the writers of Scripture were qualified to fully interpret their own writings.

God, you see, was doing something far bigger than any man could comprehend. The Bible is a divine book. Oh yes, weak and sinful men were used to write its contents, but God the Holy Spirit was so working through the process that what we have is not only without error, but is filled with dimensions and prophecies and teachings which no human being could have ever come up with on his own. In other words, the Bible is REVELATION. It is something which God, through the process of inspiration, reveals to us.

Lord willing, we shall go on with our passage next time. But let us take a few minutes to think about what a wonderful gift we have in God's Word. It tells us things we could never otherwise know. It tells us about God's creation of the universe, about man's fall into sin, about God's plan to rescue fallen man by sending His Son to pay the penalty for the sins of all who would trust in Him. It tells us that we can receive forgiveness and eternal life by trusting in Christ's payment alone to make us right with God. It is full of wisdom, guidance, promises, encouragement, and hope. There is no other book that compares to the Bible. We read this description of the wisdom found in God's Word in Proverbs 3:15: "She is more precious than rubies, and all the things you may desire cannot compare with her." Friends, if you have a Bible, you have a treasure that many people in many countries would give just about anything to own. Oh, let us not neglect this most valuable of all books. Let us make the reading of God's Word a vital part of our daily routine.



Thoughts on Living with Cancer (#1)

Continued from last week



How many times will God let me free-fall, and how far, before he swoops beneath me and bears me up, away from harm, to the heights, to greater faith and trust, and one day to that glory that does not end? Near the end of Morning Prayer, we prayed this, on the memorial of St John the Baptist's martyrdom: "Precious in your sight, O Lord, is the death of your faithful ones."

At Vespers this evening, the New Testament piece which we prayed as part of our psalmody was from 1st Corinthians 13, a scripture passage familiar to most of us from weddings. Love is patient, Love is kind, and so on. On this particular day, (we pray this piece every third Thursday at Vespers), the antiphon crafted many years ago by our liturgy monks snagged my attention: *"There is no limit to love's forbearance, to its trust, its hope, its power to endure."* No limit. Love will forbear anything. Love will trust through anything. Love will hope through anything. Love will endure through anything. No limit. Is this the standard to which we will be held, the crucible which will purify us unto true sanctity? No limit to what I will forbear, endure, persevering in trust and

hope? If such is the case, if such is the standard to which I will be held, I conclude that *I need greater love.* No doubt about it. **TEACHER, TEACH THYSELF**

August 31, Saturday, in the wee hours. I was talking to Jesus again about how much suffering I might need to endure near my end, with cancer. Again, I pleaded out my weakness and fear before Jesus. *"Don't let me suffer long. If it gets really tough, please come take me the rest of the way home. Take me home. I have no heart for the 'long and valiant battle' of some cancer patients. I fear I will wear down, lose my joy, even become angry at God for allowing this long grind of suffering. Might I come to hate the God who permits such drawn-out suffering? I'm so afraid, Jesus, that I will fail in the end."*

Hours passed, and some bit of wisdom dawned. Didn't I get a kind of instructive insight not so long ago? August 18, the day before traveling toward Rochester's Mayo Clinic, in the wee hours: *"The Creator will not break the creature whom he made and loves."* I need to apply this to my perseverance down the home stretch, and my concerns of falling apart spiritually over that possible long final grind with cancer. The creator will not break the creature whom he made and loves. I must believe that our insight applies not only to **God's positive will** (what God intentionally and personally sends our way) but also to **God's permissive will** (what God allows to befall us, which can include so much of the chaos set loose in the world due to human sin through ages and generations).

I do not imagine that God chose cancer for me, or me for cancer. Thus, *I think of my coming down with cancer to be in God's permissive will.* So, too, the suffering which may befall me late in cancer, nearing my cancer death, would come not from God's positive will, as if sent upon me, but from God's permissive will. As such, I consider it is within God's power to mitigate suffering so as not to break the creature whom

he made and loves. I kind of need to believe this. **God will mitigate my suffering late in cancer, or God will strengthen me not to fail of spirit at my end.** God will bear me up as on eagle's wings. I need not fear "how bad it might get." **God will sustain me in grace, even (please, God) in profound gratitude and joy for my salvation in Jesus, to my dying breath.**

Make Me Your Own (#5)

MAKE ME YOUR OWN

August 29th, turning in for the night, I prayed as I so often do, *Jesus, thank you for saving me, for coming back for me, for bringing me "home" to the Father's house.* I prayed in tongues for a spell, quietly into my blankets gathered to my face, and then this came to me: *"Take me and break me and make me your own."* I have not used that line in a considerable while. But I wrote it. Or God wrote it in me, many years ago. It is Eucharist language, sacrifice language. A perfect post-Communion prayer. Do with me as you will, for your Kingdom's sake. I have prayed that line countless times over some decades. *Take me and break me and make me your own.*

I could have been "broken" in any manner at all: The now-and-again breaks we encounter via accident or passing illness. The loss of a friendship. The death of a loved one. Being seized with zeal to serve the poor; to advocate against human trafficking; to feed the hungry children of the world. **There are many ways our hearts can be rent, opened in compassion or in pain.** All of us are thus "broken" many times, in ways large or small, in the course of our lives. Certainly, I have been. It did not need to be a diagnosis of terminal, incurable cancer. Yet here I am. And in my prayers, for many years, I have invited being "broken open," being broken for Jesus, for the sake of his Kingdom. Countless times I have prayed, *"Take me and break me and make me your own."* And tonight, in my bed, this line came to my lips again, almost unre-

membered and quite unbidden.

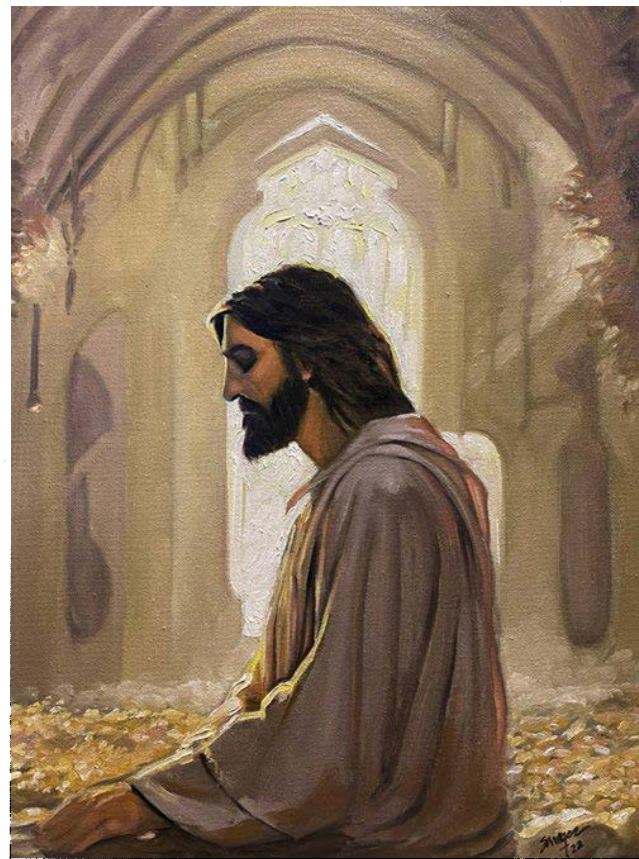
HAVE YOU EVER SEEN THE RAIN

John Fogerty was young, twenty-six (though already an army veteran), had his whole life ahead of him, and had the tiger by the tail. Credence Clearwater Revival was enjoying great popularity, and then, then it started to come apart in the rehearsal studio. Internal tensions were tearing the young talented musicians apart. Fogerty turned this wrenching experience into poetry, poetry of lament, in a song titled *Have You Ever Seen the Rain* (1971): [1] *Someone told me long ago, There's a calm before the storm. I know, it's been comin' for some time. When it's over, so they say, it'll rain a sunny day, I know, shinin' down like water. [R] I wanna know, have you ever seen the rain, I wanna know, have you ever seen the rain, comin' down on a sunny day. [2] Yesterday, and days before, sun is cold and rain is hard. I know, been that way for all my time. 'Til forever, on it goes, through the circle, fast and slow. I know, it can't stop. I wonder: [R] I wanna know, have you ever seen the rain? I wanna know, have you ever seen the rain, comin' down on a sunny day.*

Fogerty's question stands unanswered in the lyrics. I suppose most folks, who have seen a bit of living, have seen the rainy day beset their world with darkness; have seen a storm interrupt their sunny day. The "I wanna know; I wanna know..." may express the singer's question not to his listeners but to life: Why? Why this train wreck of young talented friends over their very successful, albeit short-lived mutual endeavor. **Why, God? Why?**

PACKING A LOT IN

Why am I up at all hours, praying, writing, reflecting? I am packing a lot in. There is a lot to get through, it seems to me. When I come to my last bedridden days, I want to be ready to depart this life, and so I am up at any hour, praying, reflecting, writing. *I want to have done, said, prayed, shared and goodbyed well, when my time comes.* And I seem so far from ready. It's really hard to say goodbye to life in a few short



months, or even in a few short years, if that's what I am granted. For sure, I am still praying for my health restored, still taking my medicine, still exploring additional treatment efforts. I hope for more time, a lot more time. But I am not counting on it. I understand the odds are not looking good in my case. Goodbyes are hard, and *I don't know how long I've got ... to say goodbye.*

There may be a **good bit of shock response (think PTSD) in my urgent efforts:** Hypervigilance, sleeplessness, resolve to not be blindsided again like that last time, that "advanced/metastasized" shocker of diagnosis on June 5th, that "six-to-eighteen-months" sledgehammer blow from the specialist at Mayo Clinic on August 22nd. [Look for more on this insight in part 6, titled *Sleeping with One Eye Open.*] For now, I think it healthy to reckon I may have some PTSD going on, with the sleeplessness and flurry of activity (hypervigilance).

LORD HELP ME, JESUS

I love the work of our folk poets, who can take the stuff of their lives and give us great music, poetry in song. James Taylor wrote *Fire and Rain* as he struggled to accept the loss of a dear friend, Suzanne, to suicide; as he battled his drug demons in rehab. In the second of three verses, he asks heavenly aid: *Won't you look down upon me, Jesus? You've got to help me make a stand. You've just got to see me through another day. Bake uncovered 45 to 55 minutes, turning once and brushing with sauce after 30 minutes, until juice of chicken is no longer pink when centers of thickest pieces are cut. Serve chicken with sauce. 20 appetizers.
