

# Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been considering the decisions which King Darius made after God delivered Daniel from the den of lions. First, he released Daniel from the lions' den. Second, he had Daniel's accusers and their families thrown to the lions, and they were gruesomely slaughtered.

This brings us to the third and final decision of Darius, which is quite remarkable. Daniel 6:25-27: "Then King Darius wrote: To all peoples, nations, and languages that dwell in all the earth: Peace be multiplied to you. I make a decree that in every dominion of my kingdom men must tremble and fear before the God of Daniel. For He is the living God, and steadfast forever; His kingdom is the one which shall not be destroyed, and His dominion shall endure to the end. He delivers and rescues, and He works signs and wonders in heaven and on earth, who has delivered Daniel from the power of the lions."

Darius here expresses some amazing realizations about God. He now sees Him as the living God, in contrast to the lifeless idols of the nations. Sadly, he does not seem to have realized that God is also the life-giving God, who gives spiritual life to those who repent and turn to Him by faith in Christ, who at that time was the Messiah to come. He proclaims that God's Kingdom is indestructible and enduring, unlike any other kingdom on earth. And he understands that Daniel's God is a very powerful and personal God. He cares for His people and delivers them with signs and wonders.

Yet for all of this, it appears that Darius was unconverted. He refers to God not as his God. but rather as the God of Daniel. This is a striking example of the blindness of the natural man. A person can realize God's existence and even His sovereignty and power. But not until the heart is changed can one truly see the Kingdom of God. In John 3:1-8 we read, "There was a man of the Pharisees named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews. This man came to Jesus by night and said to Him, 'Rabbi, we know that You are a teacher come from God; for no one can do these signs that You do unless God is with him.' Jesus answered and said to him. 'Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born again, he cannot see the kingdom of God.' Nicodemus said to Him. 'How can a man be born when he is old? Can he enter a second time into his mother's womb and be born?' Jesus answered, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit. Do not marvel that I said to you, "You must be born again." The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So is everyone who is born of the Spirit."

King Darius could see some amazing truths about God, and Nicodemus was a devout religious leader in Israel, but such things do not cause a person to be born again into God's Kingdom. The new birth is a miracle which only God can perform. Friends, has this new birth happened to you? Someone may ask, "How can I know whether it has?" If you have come to see yourself as a sinner needing a Savior and are trusting in the work of Christ alone to save you, then you have been born again. If, however, you cannot say this about yourself, you can ask God to show you the truth about your condition and to grant you the gift of faith in the only Savior. God will not turn away anyone who comes to Him sincerely seeking His grace in this way.









In the movie "Hook" Robin Williams plays a father who is a career-driven, work-oriented, and self-centered father who often said to his son, "My word is my bond" and then he would break his "word" to his son. Toward the end of the movie, though, he realizes what is truly important in his life and that is his relationship with his two children and his wife. The movie is a good one to watch as a family.

Today we may not say "My word is my bond," but we do make promises throughout our lives. I believe we first say or

hear the words when we are young. How many times as a child did we say, "I promise," and generally follow it up with "I will never do it again"? We said the words when we were young, and we have heard the words spoken by our children, grandchildren, and others we have known in life.

As we grew older, though, the words "I promise" took on a fuller and deeper meaning. As teenagers when we said "I promise" it began to mean more, because if a promise was not kept there was generally unforeseen consequences to not keeping the promise. Hurt feelings, friendships ended, lost trust to name a few. And then, as we mature into adulthood, we do not so much say the words "1 promise," but we express them in other ways. We sign contracts, loan papers, affidavits, legal documents that are binding and specific. The

old days of a handshake to seal an agreement are long gone, at least for the most part.

The words "I promise" though, still do hold an importance in our lives, especially when they are spoken in marriage as a promise to live out the vows that have been spoken. They hold importance in our lives in the promises we make to God when our child is baptized and becomes a member of God's family on earth. The words "I promise" speak to the relationship we have with God and with family, friends, coworkers, business partners and others in our life. The words "I promise" are important for who we are as followers of Christ.

As much as "I promise" is important for us to say, God said the same words to all the world centuries ago. In Jeremiah 31:31-34 God says, "The days are surely coming, says the LORD, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt-a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the LORD. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the LORD: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, 'Know the LORD', for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the LORD; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more."

We do not hear or see the words "I promise" in this passage of scripture but they are the central message. God made a covenant, a promise to the nation of Israel that God fulfilled in sending the Messiah.


#### An Unusual Halloween Story by Geno






sponsored, and mentored dozens of Chaplains who served in multiple branches of the military and communities of service. He retired from this ministerial role in 2010.




#### Visiting Noah's Ark by Sharon Larson

Ever found yourself wondering how large a boat would have to be in order to carry two of every land animal that existed a few thousand years ago? A group of adults went on a Diamond tour sponsored by Badlands Ministries on Oct 8-16 to the Ark Encounter and the Creation Museum.

Ark Encounter is a Christian young Earth creationist theme park that opened in Williamstown, KY is 2016. The centerpiece of the park is a large representation of Noah's Ark, based on the Genesis flood narrative contained in the Bible. It is 510 feet long, 85 feet wide and 51 feet high. Noah's Ark is the largest timber-framed structure in the world, built from standing timber, in part by skilled Amish craftsman. Step inside to explore 3 decks of world-class exhibits about events that led up to, during and after the Great Flood as recorded in the Book of Genesis. At the Ararat Ridge Zoo you can meet animals from around the world and discover how they are a part of the Noah's Ark story.

The tour also took us to the Creation Museum in Petersburg, KY. This is a 75,00 Square foot building which has a special effects theater, a planetarium, botanical gardens and insect collection. The museum depicts humans and dinosaurs coexisting which reflects young-Earth creationist beliefs. There are 140+ state of the art exhibits on creation science, including a dinosaur exhibit.







#### **A Little Birdie** Told Me

A Little Birdie Told Me: "North Dakota Nice is Alive and Well in the Lefor Community!" LeRoy Reiner knows this first hand: LeRoy now 84 years old grew up in the Lefor area. He quit high school after his junior year and joined the Navy. He moved to California and started a machine shop business in Santa Clara. Trimac Mfg. provides: "Seamer and related high precision tooling to the Canning and Can Making Industry, both domestically and internationally." LeRoy also owned and operated a commercial salmon & albacore 45' fishing vessel, The BlueFin.

LeRoy continues to live in California and has a small home in Lefor, ND where he spends a few months each summer/fall. The account of the events from a recent fire at his home in Lefor is in his own words.

I will be forever grateful to the Gladstone and Regent Volunteer Fire Departments for the quick response to the 911 call for a backyard shed fire at about 9:15 on Oct. 10. Jared Kaufman and wife Tanner and 1 year old son Cooper, live across the street. They had a window open and smelled smoke, looked out the patio door and saw fire in my backyard. Jared came, banged on my house, his Wife Tanner immediately called 911; the fire was already very large. No chance for fire extinguishers or garden hose. Jared used the garden hose initially on grass fire going towards the house. Levi Hollinger a friend showed up, Jared gave the garden hose to Levi so he could make personal calls for help to Gladstone and Regent Volunteer Firemen that he knew. Levi Hollinger was able to keep the grass fire from migrating towards the house.

Local people including Jared & Levi know many volunteers firemen personally, what a great connection.



and calls by Jared two fast speed trucks showed up. They were able to control the fire and more important keep my house from catching fire. Shortly there after the large fire trucks showed up, 18 units total: Including a large water truck. 45 Volunteer Firemen were in Lefor at my house and surrounding area to prevent houses and outbuildings from possibly catching fire. Everyone stayed until at least 11:30 pm to make sure there were no dangerous "Hot Spots."

I cannot express my deep appreciation to the Regent and Gladstone Volunteer Firemen, showing up to fight a huge potentially very dangerous accidental fire.

Tina McDevitt lives on the next block south of my house, she carried a whole case of bottled water, very heavy to the Firemen, "45 total!" In case anyone needed water to drink: Very Courageous!" I want her to be recognized for her action, she is a petite woman to carry a case of water that far. Tina is an asset to the Lefor community always doing silently different things for different people.

Also I want to thank Lennv and Delinda Kaufman and their friends who stopped by to support me, during this very traumatic experience. Dennis & Cindy Schneider and their son Jake brought their farm water truck to assist with the fire. Honorable Mention goes to Brad Greff with Farmers Union Insurance for handling all the claims.

In regards to the burn barrel, the fire was completely out in the barrel for at least 4 hours. Something had to have landed on the shed and kept hot for 3 plus hours. I checked the barrel at 6:10 pm after picking apples for 3 plus hours. The small amount of cardboard boxes had long been burned, only ashes left. I checked the barrel before going into the house, pushed ashes with a tree stick and added an M&M candy box lying on the grass. I placed the stick and candy box in the





barrel, two days after the fire I checked the barrel, to my surprise the candy box was brown on the bottom but not burned, neither the stick or the candy box were burned.


