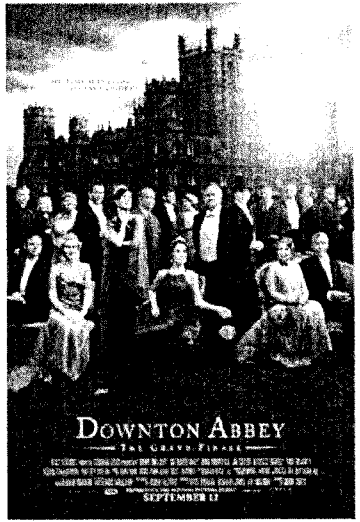

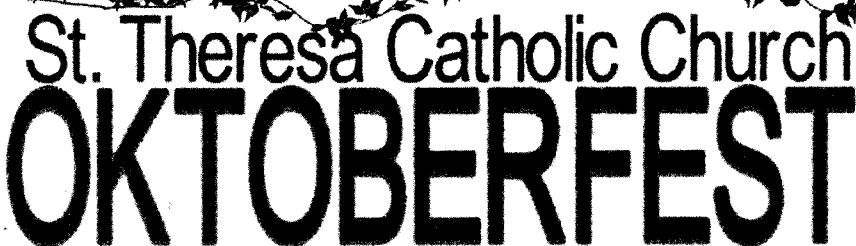

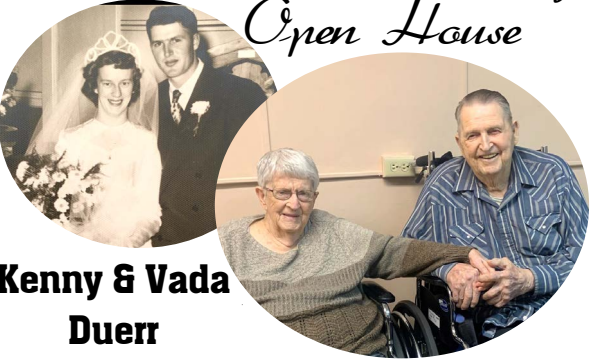

Reflections on the Words of Life

After a brief detour, we return today to our study of 1 Peter 2:16: "As free, yet not using liberty as a cloak for vice, but as bondservants of God." We

previously considered some aspects of Christian liberty, such as freedom from the power of sin, from the guilt of sin, and from slavery to sin. Today we focus on another area of Christian liberty: the freedom to know and serve God. Many have misunderstood and abused this element by thinking that Christian liberty meant that believers

could do whatever they wanted. But notice how careful Peter is to put our liberty in the right context. After telling us that we are to live as free, he immediately adds, "yet not using liberty as a cloak for vice, but as bondservants of God."

One of the best illustrations I have heard of this point is the story of the goldfish that daily looked through its glass bowl, thinking, "If only I could get out and walk around like all those people." One day the fish leaped from the bowl and soon died. Contrary to the false thinking of some, freedom to do whatever one wants is not a blessing. When a fish leaves the water, it dies. And when believers forget that the place of true joy is in knowing and following the Lord Jesus Christ, they will soon find out that excursions into sin actually destroy happiness.

Today we are seeing what happens to a world where people do whatever they want to do. We see what happens to families when spouses are unfaithful. We see the pain of divorce and the heartache of the children. We see what happens when people abuse their bodies with sex and drugs and alcohol and endless entertainment. Instead of bringing the happiness that they thought would result, such things only leave them empty and miserable and often sickly.

But the believer who understands the truth of our verse is truly blessed. He or she is one who knows the living God and is His beloved child. The believer can pursue the truth of God and grow in an intimate relationship with Him. And such a one finds that true joy is a byproduct of knowing and living for the Lord.

Peter says that believers are to exercise their Christian liberty "as bondservants of God." God is to be our ultimate authority, and we are to delight to call Him our Master. Oh yes, believers live in this world and must submit to government and carefully fulfill their responsibilities in the family and in the work place. But all of these relationships are subservient to their relationship to Christ. Peter warns here not to use freedom "as a cloak for vice." Another translation says "as a cover-up for evil." Having forgiveness through Christ is never to be used as an excuse to sin. In fact, if a person can use Christian liberty as an excuse to sin, it is likely that this person has not been truly born again. For when a person is saved by the blood of Christ, the Holy Spirit works in his or her heart a desire to put away sin and live in a way that is pleasing to the Lord.

There is another aspect of Christian liberty that, Lord willing, I'd like to deal with next time. But I close by reminding us that every person who has not placed his or her trust in the Lord Jesus Christ alone is still under slavery to sin. If you have not come to Christ for salvation, I urge you to do so right away. We have had striking examples in our nation recently of how uncertain this life is and how we never know when our time on earth will end. Please do not delay to attend to this most crucial of all matters. Where you will spend eternity depends on it.

His helper told us they try to get him to get dressed and not to smoke so much but he didn't listen.

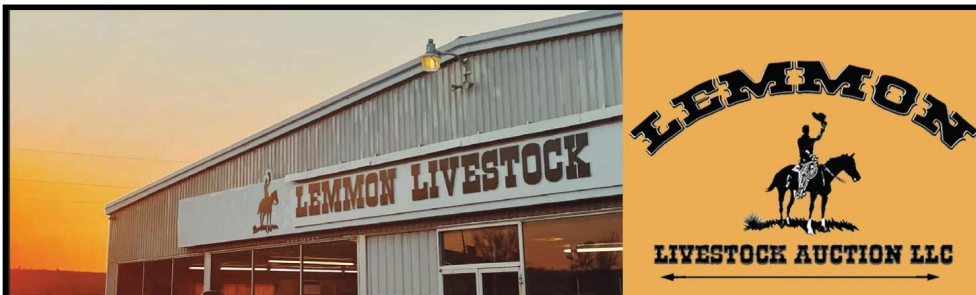

Don't You Want a 40% North Dakota State Tax Credit? Plus Possible Federal Tax Credits?

Of course you do! For a \$5,000 or more gift (lump sum or aggregate in one year) to one of our three West River Health Services Foundation's qualified Endowment Funds, you may receive a 40% tax credit from the state of North Dakota. Individually, you can give up to a maximum of \$25,000 (which would provide you with a \$10,000 tax credit); if filing jointly, the maximum gift is \$50,000 (providing you and yours a \$20,000 tax credit). The ND State Legislature passed this legislation in 2011. And who knows how long this tax credit incentive will be here?

This past month, a long-time supporting family of the WRHS Foundation gave a \$10,000 gift to our Healthcare Heroes Endowment Fund. They will receive a 40% North Dakota tax credit -- or \$4,000 back. In addition, if they itemize their federal taxes, they could receive another 30% (or \$3,000, depending on their federal tax bracket). We looked at all of the alternatives, with the aid of a

local financial planner, and decided this was the best tool for them to use. Therefore, for their \$10,000 gift to help improve local healthcare, they could receive up to \$7,000 in tax credits! So in retrospect, their \$10,000 gift really only cost them \$3,000! In fact, for this awesome 40% ND state tax credit, you do not need to itemize. Any unused credit can be carried forward for up to three years. There are also potential 40% ND state tax credits for IRA distributions, and planned or deferred gifts such as trusts, annuities and life insurance policies.

Businesses can also participate in this amazing tax credit program. C corporations, S corporations, estates, limited liability companies, trusts and financial institutions that pay state income tax may receive a 40% credit, up to a maximum credit of \$10,000 to a qualified ND endowment fund. This means they could potentially give \$25,000 to receive their maximum \$10,000 tax credit.

Over the last eleven years, the WRHS Foundation has accumulated over \$1.24 million in its three Endowment Funds, mainly through gifts of \$5,000-

\$25,000 from local area believers. The principal has been conservatively invested, leaving the interest for the WRHS Foundation to spend on needed equipment and facilities. We would like to see these Endowment Funds surpass \$2 million before 2030. Then we would have considerable interest to spend wisely each year.

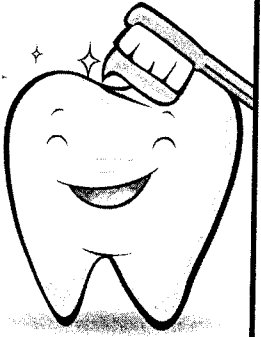

Executive Summary

The start of this school year has been excellent. Our school administration, teachers, para-educators, cafeteria staff, and custodians have been hard at work providing excellent instruction in a clean, safe environment. Our cafeteria staff has provided several new home made dishes to the menu & salad bar and are receiving praise from the student body for these updates. Our athletic teams are competing at a high level, specifically the girls volleyball program has shown great strides and is currently ranked in the top 10 of class B by Max Preps. The JR high team is undefeated and having another impressive season. We are proud that our girls golf team was relaunched this school year with 5 young ladies from grades 6-8 performing at a high level in middle school and junior varsity tournaments. Elementary girls basketball has been equally impressive. It is great to see our volleyball and basketball programs developing the type of continuity that should provide several years of high student participation and excellent results. Policy & Governance

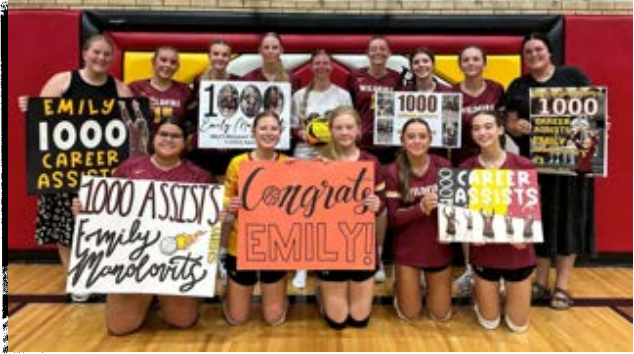

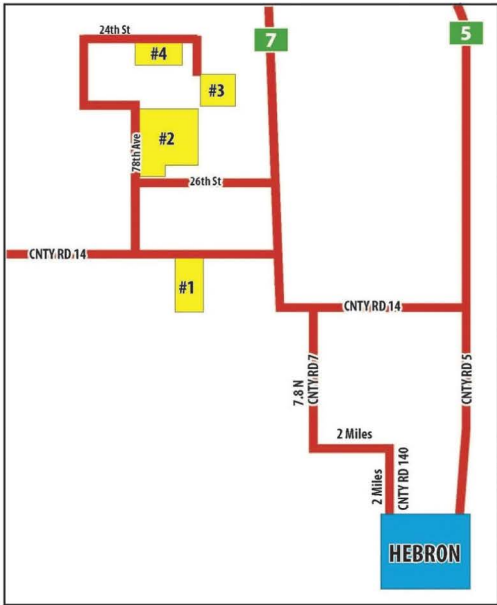
