



Reflections on the Words of Life

By Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We resume today where we left off last time, with King Darius asking Daniel a question: "And when he came to the den. he cried out with a lamenting voice to Daniel. The king spoke, saying to Daniel, 'Daniel, servant of the living God, has your God, whom you serve continually, been able to deliver you from the lions?" Daniel 6:20.

Daniel's answer begins in a most remarkable way in verse 21. He starts with an expression of respect: "Then Daniel said to the king, 'O king, live forever!"" Daniel has been unjustly thrown into the lions' den because of the sinful pride of Darius, who foolishly played right into the wicked scheme of his advisors. Yet he displays no bitterness. On the contrary, the first words out of his mouth express his concern not for his own life, but for the king's life. What an example of the attitude commanded by the Savior in Matthew 5:44: "Love your enemies, bless those who curse you, do good to those who hate you, and pray for those who spitefully use you and persecute you."

brilled Daniel to be able to say the words recorded for us in verse 22: "My God sent His angel and shut the lions' mouths, so that they have not hurt me, because I was found innocent before Him; and also, O king, I have done no wrong before you." Again, we see here what is most important to Daniel: that God is his God. That night in the den. God had sent an angel to prevent any of the lions from doing Daniel harm. That this was an unmistakable and mighty miracle will be seen unquestionably as the chapter unfolds.

Furthermore, we see that Daniel explains to the king his innocence before God and also that he had done nothing against the king. Surprisingly he had not tried to bring these matters up before. But he realized that Darius had his hands tied by the foolish law he had made. And Daniel had such great faith and confidence in God that he did not feel it necessary to try to defend himself.

Next time, Lord willing, we shall consider the decisions that Darius made as a result of this miracle. But I close with asking a question: Friends, is the only true and living God YOUR God? I fear that there are many people who are deceived about this most important matter. It is

a common misconception that there are many roads to God. But the Bible makes it clear that God can be approached in only one way, and that is through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. A verse we often quote is John 14:6: "Jesus said to him, I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me." The apostle John states later in 1 John 5:10-13, "The one who believes in the Son of God has the testimony in himself: the one who does not believe God has made Him a liar, because he has not believed in the testimony that



You Worried

St. Charles - Bowman

I am writing this article on the Catholic feast day of St. Francis of Assisi, I always marvel at the providence of God because the Mass reading for today, along with the saint provide a great opportunity for reflection. The reading for today is Galatians 1:13-24, it is St. Paul

sion from being a persecutor of Christians to a great apostle of Christ. The Gospel today is from Luke 10:38-42, Mary and Martha hosting Jesus with Martha complaining about Mary not working. All three of these set us up for a great reflection.

As I said, I marvel at the providence of God to put this together on the same day. Jesus responds to Martha's complaining saying: "Martha, Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things. 

BCDC Releases Four New Workforce Programs

On September 22, Bowman County Development Corporation hosted over 25 people for a Workforce Open Forum that was open to any businesses or employee that wished to attend. My Wild Animal Adventure...

Let's go to the Black Hills for a few days and look for animals. Steve, Penny, Ida (the dog), and I headed out for an adventure.

HAWK! I won the first animal call-out. It's very good to be the FIRST one to call out an animal. The game is on!! We reviewed the rules - no tame animals - no cows, horses, cats, or dogs, unless they are out of their natural environment. We are out for Wild Stuff!

Our first travel adventure happened just turning south from the Reva Store. It is a very straight highway. We can see miles ahead. An old jeep came

at us bearing a large wooden sign on its front bumper -COWS ON ROAD. Even without the sign, as far as the eye could see there were cows! A very long line of Black Angus wandered the highway plus ditches on both sides. They were moving north slowly, being herded along by several cowgirls on horseback. We commented that women were finally taking over the ranching business. Good for them! Bringing up the rear was a fellow on an ATV. We sat watching the cattle drive for over 1/2 hour until they had all passed. The highway was again open to traffic. Let's go!

ANTELOPE ON LEFT! AN-TELOPE ON RIGHT! These animal calls were frequent for

the next hour. After a snack and fuel break, we were finally in the Black Hills, one of my favorite places. After a beautiful and colorful drive through Spearfish Canyon, we headed for Custer State Park. From now on, our eyes would be searching for Bison, more often called buffalo. And see them, we did! Hundreds! They wandered the ditches, took over the roads (who would argue with a buffalo?) and enjoyed grazing their way through mountain mead-

FYI - this was the 57th annual Buffalo Roundup in Custer State Park. It occurs each year on the last Friday of September. For 2-3 weeks prior, they nudge the animals closer to a huge

grassy basin where there are corrals ready to check the animals for health problems, vaccinate them, and possibly relocate many around the country. The park can sustain a herd of between 1000 and 1400, and so must cull some out every year. This is the second time I have been privileged to view the beginning this outstanding event.

For two nights we stayed in a lovely log cabin, feasted on buffalo burgers by day and marshmallows at night, roasted over an open fire, while exploring the beautiful Black Hills. The planet of Jupiter also sparkled above the forest for us on the super-clear nights.

Wild turkeys! Deer! Elk! Prairie Dogs! Coyote! And to top

it off we drove through Ghost Canvon Road. It was - Boo-tiful!!







David C. Jensen was born to Eldon and Mary Jean (Steinheuser) Jensen on January 5, 1975, in Rapid City, SD. He spent his early years keeping up with his brothers, Derek and Greg, and sister Kari along with all the neighborhood friends in Lemmon, SD.

Dave attended Lemmon Public Schools and was proud to be on the undefeated Lemmon Cowboy Football team in 1993. He also qualified for the SD State High School Track Finals in four events his senior year. Many summer days were spent at the Jensen Cabin on Shadehill Lake. The "Jensen Water-Ski Training" taught many friends and family the art of enjoying being on top of the

Dave met the love of his life, Amber Christine Beld, in his teens and they began dating during high school. Their first official date was her invitation to the Bison prom. In the fall of 1993, Dave enlisted in the U.S. Army. He reported for basic training at Fort Benning, GA in August of 1994. He was named the Honor Graduate of his class in November and graduated from Jump School before leaving Ft. Benning. He was transferred to the 75th Ranger Regiment, Fort Lewis, WA. While with the Ranger Regiment he received advanced training around the world.

Dave and Amber were married in Washington on June 17, 1995. Their children, Jaleigh and Colten Day born on December 1, 1995, and April 8, 1999, while the family was stationed at Ft. Lewis.

in 2000, Dave graduated from West Virginia Assessment and Selection Operator Training Course and was assigned to

B Squadron at Ft. Bragg, NC, where he served with distinction with the U.S. Special Operations Command. The family relocated to Fayetteville, NC, and then soon after to Whispering Pines, NC in 2001, where they lived the rest of their lives. They loved their neighbors, crossing the street to go down to Thagards lake, and their big backyard full of pine trees. Recently, they purchased an Airstream camper and enjoyed camping and traveling together, mostly up to Jordan Lake, NC, to jet ski on weekends in the summer.

Shortly after the 2001 terrorist attack on 9/11, Dave and Amber heard the following scripture in their church in Southern Pines, NC, Isaiah 6:8-9 "Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I, send me!". They knew the Lord was speaking to them both and, in a few short weeks, he left for the War.

Dave felt a huge calling to defend America, the country he loved so much. In October of 2001, he participated in the first military operation in Afghanistan. He was aboard the USS Kitty Hawk between deployments behind enemy lines. He completed several combat deployments while supporting Operation Enduring Freedom (Afghanistan) and Operation Iraqi Freedom while on active duty and as a civilian advisor.

After he was honorably discharged from the Army in 2004, Dave continued to consult with the U.S. Military joining the Wexford Group, Inc. serving with the U.S. Army Asymmetric Warfare Group. David later worked in Operations for the Joint Special Operations Command at Ft. Bragg. He excelled in everything he did while serving in the military and as an ad-

In 2012, David was deployed to Afghanistan as an operational adviser for the Warfare Group alongside the 82nd Airborne Division. On September 10, 2012, David and Company C were set to fly out of Bagram Airfield with Afghan National Security Forces to conduct a partnered air assault operation in Parwan Province. During preflight, their Chinook helicopter was struck by an enemy rocket which set the fuel tanks on fire. Despite the high risk of danger and personal harm, David immediately began evacuating the wounded from the wreckage, saving the lives of four fellow soldiers. For his actions that night he was awarded the Medal for Valor, the highest civilian award given by the Department of Defense. He was recognized for his bravery in an awards ceremony at the Pentagon's Hall of Heroes on April 14, 2014.

Dave passed away at his home in Whispering Pines, NC on Tuesday, September 6, 2022. He is survived by his children, Jaleigh Bliss Jensen (partner Alex) of Sandy, UT, and Colten David Jensen (girlfriend Dina) of Raleigh, NC; his parents, Eldon and Mary Jean Jensen of Lemmon, SD; brothers, Derek and Mitz Jensen of Marion, IA (Mackenzie, Whitney, and Jacob), and Greg and Tonya Jensen of Hettinger, ND (Ella, Laela, and Jaeda); sister, Kari Jensen and Kyle Thomas of Woodbury, MN (Olivia and Zachary) many cousins, aunts and uncles and extended family and friends. Also, his motherin-law, Beth Hulm of Bison, SD; brothers-in-law, Jason (Wendi) Beld, Ryan (Raven) Beld, Jared Beld, and Kirk Hulm; and sisterin-faw Kendra (Pete) Theobald.



He immediately bought it from her for \$10 and designed his Gold Seal emblem after it. Later he sealed a lifelong friendship by giving her a "look-alike pin"... but re-created in gold and diamonds.'

Time to hit the dusty trail and head home with more memories of Medora and the Badlands.


