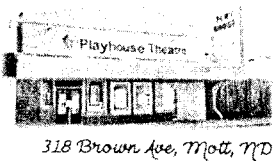

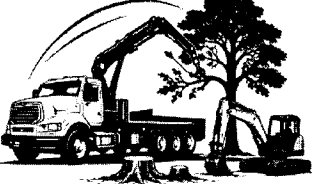

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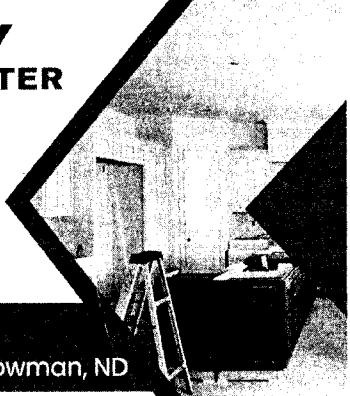

2026 District 1 Cloud Seeding Operations Summary

BISMARCK, N.D. – As of September 1, cloud seeding has concluded for the District 1 operations area of the 2026 North Dakota Cloud Modification Project (NDCMP). For the season, there were 119.04 flight hours flown in the district, which included Bowman and part of Slope counties. Of those hours, 54.88 were flown for dual seeding purposes (rain enhancement and hail suppression), 32.54 for hail suppression, 5.09 for rain enhancement, 7.48 for reconnaissance, and 19.05 for aircraft repositioning.

Overall, 2026 District 1 flight hours were above the five-year average of 91.52 hours. There were 29 operational days out of a possible 92 project days when hail suppression, rain enhancement, and/or reconnaissance flights were flown in the district. Dual purpose seeding flights were flown on 14 of the operational days, hail suppression on 10 days, rain enhancement on 3 days, and reconnaissance operations on 8 days.

A planning meeting for the 2027 NDCMP will be held in January or February. Seeding operations are currently scheduled to resume next June 1.

CLASSES OF PROPERTY TAX

Several property owners blame the county commissioners, city commissioners and school boards for increasing the true and full value of their property. The fact is that none of the above groups set the true and full value of property. They can increase or decrease the mill levy; however, the last legislative session (2025) put a 3% cap on an increase in dollars on the political subdivisions. There are four classes of property tax in North Dakota Agricultural Land, Centrally Assessed Property, Commercially Assessed Property and Residentially Assessed Property.

Agricultural Land Property makes up 20% of all property that property taxes are collected on North Dakota. The true and full value on Ag Land is determined by the production formula and it includes agricultural purpose, farm rentals, soil capability, costs to operate, average annual gross return, capitalization rate and productivity which are analyzed and calculated by the NDSU Ag Economics Department. The information is forwarded to the State Tax Commissioner who certifies to the county directors of tax equalization the estimated average true and full value of agricultural farm and grazing land in each county. Keep in mind the market value of land is not involved in determining the true and full value for Ag Land.

Centrally Assessed Property makes up 8% of all property taxes collected in North Dakota. Properties that are centrally assessed are railroads, investor owned public utilities and airlines and the true and full value is determined by the

State Board of Equalization.

The State Board of Equalization meets the second Tuesday in July to receive testimony on the value of the centrally assessed property and makes the assessment. The State Tax Commissioner certifies the assessments to the counties.

Commercially Assessed Property makes up 30% of all property taxes collected in North Dakota. The true and full value of commercial property is determined by the Local Property Tax Assessor. The local property Tax assessor uses information from sales ratio to work for uniform assessment in market values and other matters that effect the actual value to establish true and full value.

Residential Assessed Property makes up 42% of all property taxes collected in North Dakota. The true and full value of residential property is determined by the Local Property Tax Assessor. The Local Property Tax Assessor uses information from sales ratios to work for uniform assessment in market values and other matters that effect the actual value of establish true and full value.

It is true that the true and full value of property is used to measure wealth to help determine the amount of property tax paid by a property owner to provide for local services. The County Commission, City Commission, School Board and other taxing entities set the number of mills that are levied each year. The legislature has set limits on the number of mills that can be levied. In the current biennium of tax years 2026 and 2027 the legislature has instituted a 3% cap on the dollar amount a political subdivision can increase their budget.

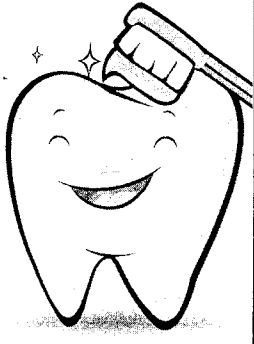
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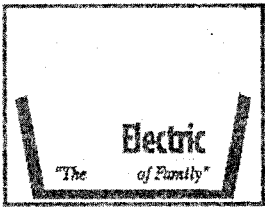

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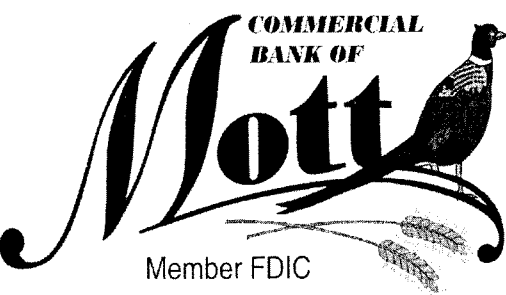

Richard Foster said, "The great moral question of our time is how to move from greed to generosity." The Bible uses other words for greed like avarice and covetousness. No matter the word, greed is the need for instant gratification, often at the expense of future goals. We all have a need for greed - we seem to be born to it - it's all the personal desires and hidden wants that live in the best of us!

Here's a list that may show what I mean - it's called the Toddler's Rules Of Ownership:

1. If I want it, it's mine...
2. If it's in my hands, it's mine...
3. If I can take it from you, it's mine...
4. If I had it a little while ago, it's mine...
5. If it's mine, it must never look like yours...
6. If I'm doing or building something, all the pieces are mine...

8. If I think it's mine, it's mine...
9. If you put something down, it's mine...
10. If it's broken, it's yours...

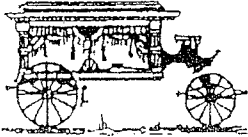
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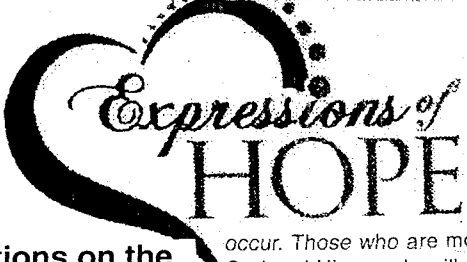
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Expressions of HOPE

Reflections on the Words of Life
by Pastor Paul Ferrie,
Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

An issue with which the church has continually struggled is trying to interpret the meaning of the Biblical expression "the last days." And it is good and right for God's people to be searching the Scriptures to see what is said about this important subject. In the passage where we have arrived today, I Peter 4:7, Peter addresses this subject: "But the end of all things is at hand; therefore be serious and watchful in your prayers."

It is important to pay attention to connective words in the Bible. Even the very simple ones will help us to better grasp the meaning of the passage. In this case, verse 7 begins with the word "but." This tells us that there is a contrast between what Peter is about to say and what was previously said. Peter has been speaking of those who were ridiculing and persecuting believers and warning of the final judgment which all men are going to face. This tells us something about the meaning of "But the end of all things is at hand." The word "but" indicates that a stark contrast will

occur. Those who are mocking God and His people will not go on doing so endlessly. The New Testament teaches that the return of Christ will mark the end of time and the end of creation as we know them. Then all people will stand before the Lord Jesus Christ, who determines where each one spends eternity. Peter is telling us that this end of all things "is at hand," or more literally, "has come near."

Our verse is saying that the end times had already come near when Peter wrote this letter. It's not unusual to hear comments like, "Things are getting really bad. We must be living in the last days." But from a Biblical perspective, man has been living in the last days ever since Jesus came to this earth! Peter himself said in Acts 2:17-18, "And it shall come to pass in the last days," says God, "that I will pour out of My Spirit on all flesh; Your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, Your young men shall see visions, Your old men shall dream dreams. And on My menservants and on My maidservants I will pour out My Spirit in those days; and they shall prophesy." Here Peter is explaining to the Jews that an Old Testament prophecy of the last days made by the prophet Joel in Joel 2:28-29 was being fulfilled before their eyes on the Day of Pentecost. Furthermore, we read in Hebrews 1:1-2, "God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds."

Scripture teaches that the last days are made up of the period between the first and second comings of Christ to this earth. So technically, they have been going on for over 2000 years. Remember that God's timing is not our timing. When the disciples asked Jesus about the timing of His return, He replied, "But of that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but My Father only" (Matthew 24:36). And just prior to His ascension back into heaven, the disciples asked Jesus again. His answer: "It is not for you to know times or seasons which the Father has put in His own authority" (Acts 1:7).

Next time, Lord willing, we shall see the important application that comes from our being in the last days. But friends, let us think about this: Just as we don't know when the last day of history will be, neither do we know when OUR last day on this earth will be. So it is of utmost importance to be ready. And the only way to be ready is to be trusting in the Lord Jesus Christ alone to make you right with God. I pray you have done so.

Our attitude toward things is likely to be more important than the things themselves.

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Thoughts for the Week

The latest story making headlines all over is the mistrial of a woman who suffocated her children presumably suffering from post partum depression. I am not sure how to equate that with the number of women who are unhappy with that decision that felt that she should be found not guilty by reason of insanity and the fact that the only person dissenting on the jury was a male. While I know that post partum depression is a real and debilitating situation and that she was on a great number of medications supposedly to control this, it still remains that she took the life of her children. She was a trained nurse and knew of the dangers of that condition.

One of the greatest loves in this world is the love of a mother for her child. These children spent 9 months inside her, were brought into this world in love and were cared for her for 5 years for the eldest, 3 years for the middle child and 8 months for her youngest. She was not characterised as an uncaring mother, she had a husband that was with her to raise those children, yet she succumbed to extreme depression. She confessed to her husband that she was having dark thoughts about harming her children, but she maintained that she had no active plan to harm them. Yet she arranged to have her husband gone from the house the day of the event, strangled her children in the basement of their house then tried to commit suicide by cutting her wrists and jumping from a 2nd story window.

My question in this is why

was she not taken seriously when she said she had plans to kill her children? Why did her husband, along with her mother and her sister not take these children into their care and remove them from the household or at least provide that someone remain with her at all times? Instead, she deliberately removed all impediments from the house and in whatever state she was in mentally, devised a plan and inacted that plan to end her children's lives. Do I feel sorry for her situation – yes. Do I condone what she did – absolutely not. I may be in a minority, but in today's day and age with the ability to get mental health care, I just don't see an excuse for her. I also feel that her family let her down in her hour of need. They were aware of what she was going through, they saw her struggle and her attempts with various medications to heal herself, yet she was still left alone. If her children were not there and she did not have the full time responsibility for them, maybe she would have been able to overcome the depression or at least she would have only been responsible for herself and not 3 innocent children who's lives were cut short. Perhaps she should have had different doctors and possibly should have been in a medical facility where they could have monitored her situation closer, and that also may have saved the children from their untimely end. We shall never know as the deed is done and the lives are gone.

We have come a long way in the treatment of mental illness, from the primitive lobotomies and electrical shock therapy and locking them away with handlers disciplining them with ice water baths and padded

rooms, but we cannot help everyone yet. Mental illness is a real thing and even if people are prescribed medication, they do not always take it as it can dull their feelings, making them lethargic and unresponsive.

sive. Many feel that without the meds they are brighter, more alert and see things more clearly, yet they cannot often live normal lives and can be a danger to themselves and others. However if they do get proper treatment, their lives can be as close to normal as possible. We certainly do not have all the answers and all the proper treatments, but we get closer all the time. However for those that are harmed by the mentally ill, that is not much of an answer. Certainly not for the children that are the innocent bystanders, and they are the real victims here. If there would have been someone that made a different decision in this situation, maybe they didn't have to lose their lives, and there would be less suffering all around. God Bless you all.

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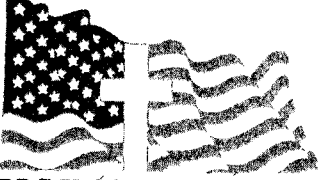
