Mitigation Plan Draft Available for Review

The draft of the Adams
County, North Dakota, Multi-Ju-
risdictional Multi-Hazard Mitiga-
tion Plan is now available for re-
view on the Adams County and
City of Hettinger websites. A
printed copy is also available at
the Adams County Courthouse
in the emergency manager's of-
fice.

On Wednesday, Septem-
ber 18, 2024, Hettinger Coun-
ty Emergency Management
will host a day-long Draft Plan
Open House from 8 a.m. to 5
p.m., MST, in the lower-level
conference room at the Hetting-
er County Courthouse in Mott,
North Dakota. Come at your
convenience and hard copies
of the plan will be available for
review. A digital presentation will
be held at 10 a.m. and 3 p.m. for
those wishing to see a tutorial of
the plan's structure. The Open
House is open to the public.

On Thursday, Septem-
ber 19, 2024, Adams County
Emergency Management
will host a day-long Draft Plan
Open House from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.,
MST, in the community room at
the Adams County Courthouse
in Hettinger. Hardcopies of the
plan will be available for review
and a digital presentation of the
plan will be held at 10 a.m. and
3 p.m. You are invited to attend

at your convenience to review
plan sections most relevant to
your stakeholder position. The
Open House is open to the pub-
lic.

A public hearing to accept
comments on the draft plan will
be held from 6:30 to 7:00 p.m.,
MST on Thursday, Septem-
ber 26, 2024, at the Hettinger
Research and Extension Cen-
ter in Hettinger, North Dakota.
The public hearing will review
the draft plan, results from the
mitigation survey, and public
comments received. The public
hearing will officially close at
7:00 p.m. and will be followed
by a short Steering Committee
meeting immediately thereafter.
The Steering Committee will
review public comments re-
ceived and participation by lo-
cal jurisdictions and approve
the draft plan to be submitted
to the N.D. Dept. of Emergency
Services (NDDSES) and the Fed-
eral Emergency Management
Agency (FEMA) for approval.
Once the plan receives approv-
al pending-adoption, each in-
corporated jurisdiction included
in the plan must pass an adop-
tion resolution before an official
approval letter from FEMA is
issued.

Adams County Weed Cutting and Hay Removal Policy

Therefore, all weeds and grass along Township roads, designated by each Township (Organized and Unorganized) and the Village of North Lemmon, shall be mowed no later than October 1st of each year.

The prescribed height of the stubble to be left shall not exceed six inches. The minimum width of the cut shall be nine feet. A windrow may not be left on the roadway or shoulder of the roadway.

Maps provided by the Townships or the County for Unorganized Townships designating the roads to be mowed will be on file on the County Website for the landowner or operators review.

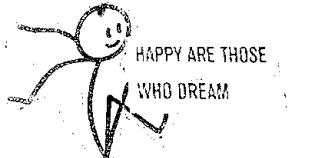

2024 District 1 Cloud Seeding Operations Summary
BISMARCK, N.D. - As of September 1, cloud seeding has concluded for the District 1 operations area of the 2024 North Dakota Cloud Modification Project (NDCMP). For the season, there were 72.32 flight hours flown in the district, which included Bowman and part of Slope counties. Of those hours, 35.85 were flown for dual seeding purposes (rain enhancement and hail suppression), 1.54 for hail suppression, 9.12 for rain enhancement, 16.65 for reconnaissance, and 9.16 for aircraft repositioning.
Overall, 2024 District 1 flight hours were below the five year average of 97.74 hours. There were 22 operational days out of a possible 92 project days when hail suppression, rain enhancement, and/or reconnaissance flights were flown in the district. Dual purpose seeding flights were flown on 10 of the operational days, hail suppression on 1 day, rain enhancement on 3 days, and reconnaissance operations on 14 days.
Planning meetings for the 2025 NDCMP will be held in January. Seeding operations are currently scheduled to resume June 1.

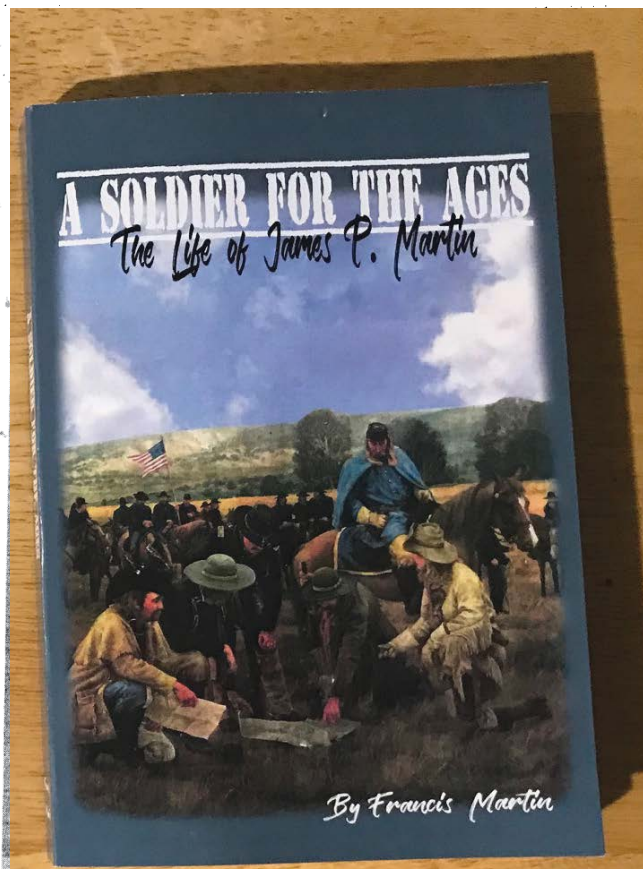

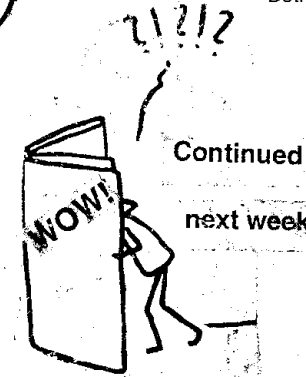

What are you Doing Here

This week we are looking at 1 Kings 19:1-18 and Elijah the Prophet. We are going to be looking at his work for God and how it effects his life and the rest of his life. Elijah's ministry took place right around when Ahab was King and this man was a very very evil man and compounded his evil by marrying Jezebel daughter of Ethbaal, King of the Sidonians. He was King of a people no Jew was to marry into their culture. We start out in 1 Kings 17:1 when Elijah says no more rain till, he says so.

Then Chapter 17:2-7 God has Elijah to go into hiding and that He would command the Ravens to feed him and he was to drink from the Brook Cherith. After this in 1 Kings 18:1 God tells Elijah to present himself to Ahab and He would allow it to rain. Remember a big box of crayons with all the colors? Some were even colors I didn't know existed! Did you have a favorite color? Maybe your favorite color has changed over the years or maybe it has stayed the same. The favorites are easily recognizable. This box of crayons is one that contains crayons that are almost brand-new and others that are so short and stubby that they can barely still function as a crayon. They are all shapes and sizes and it becomes clear which are the favorites!

Are people that way? Who are your favorites? Do you choose them based on the way they dress or the way they look? Do you choose them based on their habits, their language, or their skills? Maybe you choose favorites because they think and

look and act like you. James 2:1 states: "My brothers and sisters, do you, with your acts of favoritism, really believe in our glorious Lord Jesus Christ?" as if to say, "because it doesn't look like it!" James calls partiality/favoritism a sin. James 2:9 "But if you show partiality, you commit sin and are convicted by the law as transgressors."

Instead, Jesus reminds us to love ALL our neighbors. (Lev. 19:18, Matt. 19:19, Matt 22:39, Mark 12:31, James 2:8, etc.) Then, Jesus takes it one step further. In addition to "love your neighbor as yourself," Jesus says, "Love one another as I have loved you." (John 13:34-35) Not only are we to love others as we love ourselves (which can be great or not so good at times), we are commanded by Jesus to love others as God has loved us!

No matter the shape or size or color or ability or religion or lack of religion or any other differences of our neighbors, we are commanded to love all people following the example of Jesus. We can choose our favorite colors, and we might even have our favorite people, but showing no favoritism means we treat all people equally. When people are treated unfairly, James tells us it doesn't look like we even believe in Jesus. (James 2:1)

It doesn't feel great when others are treated better, and I don't feel that great when others are treated worse than I am treated. However much we struggle as humans, the good news is that God shows no partiality!

Acts 10:34: "In truth I perceive that God shows no partiality."

Deuteronomy 10:17: "For the Lord your God is the God of gods and Lord of lords, the great, mighty, and awe-inspiring God, showing no partiality and taking no bribe"

Ephesians 6:9: "There is no favoritism with him"

Romans 2:11: "For there is no partiality with God"

Therefore, YOU ALL are God's favorite!!

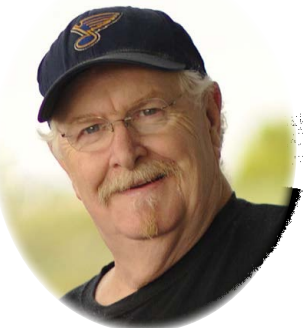

Ian Keith Traquair, known as Keith to his family and friends (or just "Mr. T" to his beloved students), passed away peacefully due to complications from Alzheimer's on August 5th, 2024. He left this world with his children by his side and his favorite music bringing him comfort. He



was 73.



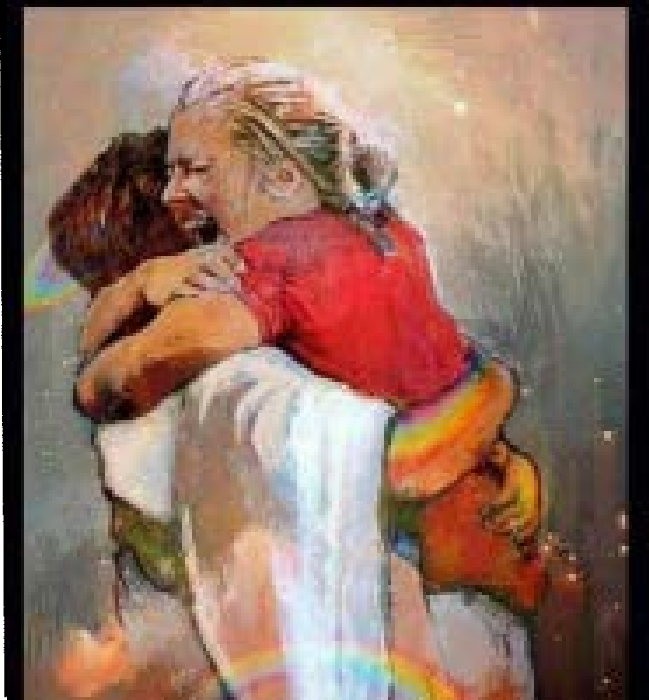

Reflections on the Words of Life

We have been looking in 1 Peter chapter 1 at the necessity and purposes of suffering in the life of the believer. We have seen that suffering is one of the main ways that the Lord purifies the faith of His people and brings glory to Himself. For as He sustains His people in their trials and as He makes them more Christlike by them, glory is brought to His name. We concluded our study of verse 7 last week. The verse ends with the words "Jesus Christ." This leads into the opening words of verse 8: "whom having not seen you love." The "whom" obviously refers back to Jesus Christ, and it is that word "whom" that I would like for us to consider. When Peter says "whom" here, he obviously means to the Lord Jesus Christ as He is presented in the Bible. And this is no minor point. There are many religions and even non-religious groups that have some sort of admiration for Jesus Christ. Yet the Jesus Christ they admire is not the Jesus Christ of the Bible. Christ is taught in some religions to be a created being—a great one, but nevertheless only a creature. In some religions He is presented as a great proph-

et. Many consider Jesus to be one of the greatest, perhaps the greatest of all ethical teachers. But what does Peter mean by this word "whom"?

The Jesus Christ that Peter is referring to here is the One whom the apostle John describes in the opening verses of his gospel: "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made" (John 1:1-3). Jesus Christ is no less than God! He is the Creator of all things and the One to whom all human beings are accountable. It is actually denying the Lord Jesus to speak of Him as a great prophet or ethical teacher or example, if one means that He is ONLY these things.

When people say they believe in Jesus, it is important to know whom they mean. Is it the Jesus of the Bible? Do they believe that He is God? Because as soon as you say that Jesus is God, then you are obligated to worship Him. Some of the early Christians died for this very reason. The Roman Empire at the time of Christ and in the years following, proclaimed the deity of the emperor. The believers, though very good citizens, could not go along with this. They denied the deity of the emperor because they know that there is only one God, who exists in three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. And we who are true believers in Jesus Christ today must not be satisfied to see Jesus' name on a list of the great religious leaders in history. Our desire is to encourage others to join us in bowing before the Jesus, who is the eternal God, the only Lord and Savior. Jesus is God the Son, who left glory in order to become a man. He lived in perfect obedience to all that God's law required. He healed the sick, raised the dead, opened deaf ears, and gave sight to the blind. He taught the truth of God with all the authority of the One who Himself is God. But He became man in order that He might be the Savior of the world. For in His death on the cross He paid the price for the sins of His people. He was the atoning sacrifice on their behalf, and He purchased them that they might be God's people forever. Friends, please be sure that you know and believe the truth about Jesus. Please be sure you are trusting in Him alone to make you right with God. May we all bow the knee to King Jesus, God the Son.

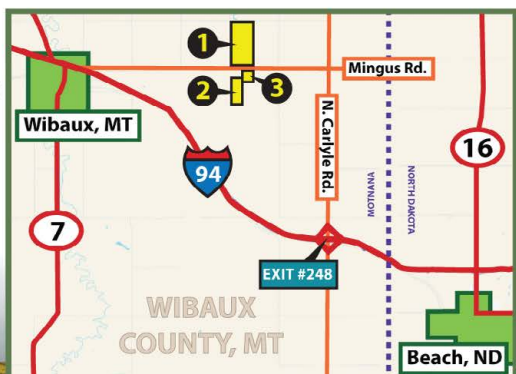

Thoughts for the Week

In a recent event in our local school, there was a lockdown that resulted in a local student being removed from the school for issuing statements of violence to teachers and other students. It is unfortunate that this type of behavior has happened in a small school in our rural community and it resulted in expulsion of the student. My question is why is there a student in a high school anywhere so traumatized that their answer to their life is to threaten to try to take another persons life and think it is acceptable behavior to brag about it.

I realize that it is impossible to return to life in the 1950's, 1960's or 1970's when the worst thing that could happen to you in school was either to get depant-seed, get a wedgie or get locked in a locker. Or if you were a girl, to have someone walk into the locker room when you were changing, or to walk out of the bathroom dragging toilet paper, or the ultimate to have your 'vis-itor' when you went to school with a white skirt and no backup supplies. I know you can't die from embarrassment, but it sure felt like that back then.

I probably shouldn't be so surprised when every day, there

are news reports in our state of knifings, shootings, assaults and whatever every time you look at a news source. People seem to feel that they can act out their feelings however they feel like it, without regard to consequences, and I wonder where this all comes from. Is it possible with the onset of all the violent games online and X-Box and even on the phones, that children are so used to seeing this that they fail to recognize reality from fantasy? If you play a game of first person shooter type, do you realize that it is just a game when you are young or is it similar to the situation when children are upset and distraught and think that suicide is not final? I wonder what goes through their minds about death since it is well known one of the reactions not to realize the final-ity of it at a young age due to the thought processes that are still forming.

Fortunately, someone did take this person seriously and told the right people so that the student was removed from the school. If they said this as a joke, perhaps the expulsion of the child will make clear to them that this was unacceptable behaviour and they need to re-consider their outlook on life. If it was not a joke, then it is possible that they can get some counsel-ing to figure out why they feel

violence is an answer to any-thing, as we are not normally aggressive when growing up. Yes, we all get mad, but most of us know what is the difference between correct responses and incorrect ones. It is always pos-sible that this person came from a situation where this was not normal behaviour, but perhaps they were pushed one too many times so they need a reset. We will probably never know, but being a Christian, I would hope

that they can be redeemed and understand why what they said was not the proper response.

So what can we do about this in our lives to help stop this behaviour. Perhaps we need to look closer at what games our children are playing and see if they understand the difference between gaming and life. Per-haps we need to see what their response is when they get mad when they are still small enough to change an aggressive atti-tude. Perhaps there just needs to be more attention paid as a family or even showing children the love that we feel for them. We can't change everyone, although that would be a won-derful thing, but we can change those that surround us by ex-ample and even by affectionate behaviour. A hug among family should be a recurring event and not just saved for a special oc-casion. My Mother loved to hug us frequently, which made me a hugger which I have passed on to everyone that I can. It's hard to be mad at someone that hugs you, so I wish you all a hug to-day. God Bless you All.
