



Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time we dealt with the flaw in Naomi's thinking that God's hand had gone out against her. We saw that God is always FOR the true believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, even when He has to bring corrective discipline into his or her life. But there is another flaw in Naomi's thinking. We have previously looked at Ruth 1:5, in which Naomi urged Ruth to remain in Moab as her sister-in-law Orpah decided to do. "And she said, 'Look, your sister-in-law has gone back to her people and to her gods; return after your sister-in-law."


Naomi's seeking to talk her daughters-in-law into staying in their own country might appear to be a "tough love" approach. It looks as if she was willing to do the hard thing by trying to send them away so that they could become wives and mothers among their own people. But Naomi seems to have been thinking only in terms of the physical and material well-being of her daughters-in-law and not giving serious consideration to their spiritual condition. Though she had a good relationship with them, there does not seem to be a deep concern for their souls.

How could Naomi have advised her daughters to go back to their gods? Surely, if we are thinking Biblically, we would see that this was not in the best interests of her daughters-in-law. Let's assume that Orpah went on to meet a man and have a happy marriage and a lot of children and that she lived a comfortable life. Is that the most important thing? However it turned out for Orpah in Moab, she missed the one thing of lasting value: a relationship with the living and true God. Pleasant outward circumstances are

no substitute for the saving of a person's soul and being restored to a right relationship with God. Orpah may have avoided the ostracism of being a Moabite in Israel, but she also forfeited the opportunity of having the greatest treasure.

Believers in Christ, are we content to be nice to people and even to help them with their needs but fail to speak to them about how they can know God? Like Naomi, do we have little concern for the souls of others? Let us be careful not to think that being nice or helpful to people is as important as caring for their souls. Let us remember that we are all spiritual Moabites. None of us are born as part of the people of God. In order to become a member of God's family and be part of His people we need what the Bible refers to as the new birth. We need for God to show us that we are NOT right with Him and that we are helpless to do anything to establish a right relationship with Him and that only through Jesus can we establish such a relationship. And we need to ask God to give us great concern for unbelievers and boldness to tell them about the Savior.

Jesus' invitation in Matthew 11 was the opposite of Naomi's. He does not invite people to stay in their old lives with their false gods. He says, "Come unto Me." For there is no other way back to God but through Jesus. You must acknowledge Him as the only Savior of sinners and rely only upon His saving work on the cross to provide pardon for your sin and to restore you to God. If you have not done so, please end the estrangement between yourself and your Creator. Go to Him through Jesus Christ, relying only upon the merit of His saving work. As we read in John 1:12, "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name?





2023 Cloud Seeding Operations Summary

BISMARCK, N.D. - As of September 9, cloud seeding has concluded for the District I operations area of the 2023 North Dakota Cloud Modifica-

tion Project (NDCMP). For the season, there were 93.05 flight hours flown in the district, which included Bowman and part of Slope counties. Of those hours, 25.37 were flown for dual seeding purposes, 55.62 for hail suppression, 5.00 for reconnaissance, and 7.06 for aircraft re-

Overall, 2023 District I flight hours were below the ten-year average of 115.14 hours. There were 26 operational days out of a possible 100 project days (including an eight-day extension) when hail suppression, rain enhancement, and/or reconnaissance flights were flown in the district. Dual purpose seeding flights were flown on 8 of the operational days, hail suppression on 14 days, and reconnaissance operations on 7 days.

Planning meetings for the 2024 NDCMP will be held in January. Seeding operations are currently scheduled to resume June 1.





The next day, he didn't go to school and neither did a lot of other kids. For a month, basketball practice was a hit and miss subject. The game with Hazelton was called off due to the flu and right after that, so was the one in Bismarck. The clinics were packed with wheezing, runnv-nosed kids being comforted by coughing feverish parents. Dan'l had his tonsils taken out. They hadn't seen each other for weeks and they were too hoarse to talk on the phone. James wondered what those 1200 people who rode with Custer did when they were overtaken by sickness. The ones who were not yet sick would have to bury the ones who died. They wouldn't know who or where the sickness came from. That would be the time to have your own tent out on the horseshoe where no one could bring their sickness to you.

CHAPTER THIRTEEN

It was spring vacation and school had been all but closed for two weeks. James had a pile of books about the Indian Wars. As he got better, he spent most of his time reading. He had been up at his grandfather's place all morning. Now he sat next to the heater in the shop and thought over what he and his grandfather had talked about: boot

"This ain't no joke, son," the old man had said, "The military isn't looking for the educated, the rich, the upper crust. They just wanted men. Men who could be molded to do the iob. Men whose loss would be overlooked, 'for the greater good'. Listen to me, James. The enemy has to have somebody to shoot at and the nobility isn't about to let their sons die. They'll take you and strip you of everything that makes you... you. Their whole purpose is to make you obey them even when it's wrong. They'll take your personality, your sense of right and wrong. When they get through destroying your self-esteem, then they'll rebuild you into what they want. You'll be like those robots you read about in the funnies. 'Your every wish is my command.' And every man they remake will be the same. You're there to please your overseer. A lot of this is based on the 'take from' and 'reward' system. If you do what they tell you to do, you will be rewarded. You'll get a pat on the back. If you fail to obey, you will be punished: a cell with nothing but a bedbug infested mattress. You'll learn to say 'yes Sir' to men who aren't half the man you are. You'll never hear about it, but some will die from abuse right in your unit. Some

will even commit suicide. You'll 'get fit' first. That

means you'll be up before dawn, in your uniform or maybe not, without a shower or breakfast and you'll run ten miles. You'll be fed K-rations or some such garbage. You'll drink water, if you can find some. If the sun goes down, you may stay right where you are until the sun comes up. Then you'll run back to the barracks on an empty stomach. Only those chosen to become commissioned officers will be given the time to get dressed and eat before you go out. If you have to take a crap, you'll end up doing it in your pants if you have any on. No one lags or gets out of line without some re-enforcement from the Non-comms and I ain't talking about a bottle of Coke. If you survive, you'll take

a grueling course in firearms. You'll be in class 12 hours a day...or a night. You'll fall asleep on your feet and be awakened by a baton on your head. You'll learn how to build and take explosives apart even if you get your head blown off. Then you'll do ten miles with a pack and rifle. This training is not for those who have been in ROTC or any militia group. It's for grunts. That's what you'll be called: grunts, like a hog. You are expendable. These Noncoms feel it's a major victory when they turn you all into a UNIT. You look alike, you smell alike, you eat and drink the same thing, you wear the same clothes until they're so smelly even skunks will avoid you. You'll come in exhausted and filthy, and the toilets and showers will be locked. You will fall on a cot with one blanket and imagine you will sleep and recover

before the next ordeal. But two hours later, the lights will come on, bugles will blow, the Noncoms will come down between the bunks with batons banging on the bottoms of your feet. You will stand out in the night with little or nothing on, in the rain, the snow, whatever. You will sweat, freeze, and shiver. When they let you go back in the barracks, you might sleep another three or four hours and it will happen all over again. The next morning, they will take you to a manmade swamp. You'll be loaded with equipment and ammo and of course, the rifle. You will have to slog, crawl, swim, dogpaddle or drown. Then you'll go back to camp, maybe get to eat and clean up, maybe not, but you'll be cursed, belittled, humiliated and brow beaten before you go to a class on how to build an explosive or how to take an explosive apart. You'll be timed. You'll be expected to do it in that time and if you don't, you'll go to the bottom of the class and start over again. Ten miles."

June 5th, 1944, just before you were born, I was among the 127,000 men who landed on a beach that got to be called 'Omaha'. We were ordered off the landing vessel with packs and rifles. The water was about four feet deep, and the Germans were expecting us. They were firing machine guns at us while we struggled through the waves. Those first off, were the first dead. I hadn't even left the boat when I got a bullet in my thigh. There were whole brigades of boats unloading troops, grunts, all along the shore. I laid there and watched my blood go down in the water

where thousands of men floated to shore. All dead.

See James, I didn't get called up until the war was nearly over. I was an only son. and no country wants to stop the family line or worse, kill the father of several children and the government end up having to pay to rear them. They want men who have no one to support and nothing to lose. Somebody has to grow crops and beef to feed massive armies. If this craziness in the far east gets hot. they will not take Shorty. He is the eldest son, and he is a farmer. But you are another story."

He had walked home thinking about all that his grandfather had told him. The thing that he remembered most was that those men who had officer's training were the ones who didn't have to go to boot camp. That was it then. He would find out how he could go to West Point. Colorado Springs was closer but that was for the Air Force. His hero, Custer, was a man on the ground.

That evening, James drove into Dickinson and read all he could find on ROTC and how it would benefit him. He wouldn't get drafted. He could specialize in what he wanted to do as a trainee. His dad always told him that being a mechanic was an honorable profession.

Well, he wasn't out of school yet. Who would know, right here in North Dakota, what a man had to do to get in West Point? A senator? The Selective Service Office? And where was that? Well, he'd have to do some more research

Leipzig, ND celebrating 125 years

The name Leipzig dates back to early 1015 in Germany. The Slavic word means "a settlement by the lime trees," In 1813, the Emperor of Austria wanted to establish German colonies in Bessarabia. Fifteen families came by trains to the colony of Leipzig, settling there in 1843.

In the latter 1800's many colonists saw better opportunities in America. The Leipzigers from Leipzig, Bessarabia came to America & started a settlement named Leipzig, in Grant County, in 1896.

The one problem for the settlers was that they were too far from the railroads. So in 1910, when the Northern Pacific Railroad was constructed 11 miles southwest of Leipzig, the German-Russians moved down to the railroad & established there the settlement that was to

become New Leipzig. Aug. 22, 1897, a meeting was held to organize the early church. On Nov. 16, 1898, the German Congregational Ebenezer Church was granted a certificate of Corporate Existance. A wooden church was built in 1898 for \$600. The parsonage was built in 1912 for \$600.00 and the barn for \$124.00. A new church was built and dedicated in Oct. 1925. This new church was a 30 x 48 brick structure with a 64 foot steeple, completely wired for a total cost of \$9,200.00. The parsonage was later moved to New Leipzig and the barn no longer exists.

Pioneer Trails Regional Museum Names T-Rex

Welcome Rhamond to Pioneer Trails Regional Museum. Rhamond joins Gundy in the Paleontology Exhibits in Bowman,

In the fall of 1992, Dean A. Pearson discovered a single bone sticking out of a steep hillside near Rhame, ND. A short time later it was officially identified as a Tyrannosaurus rex. By the end of the dig season in 1992, eleven bones had been removed from the site with plans to return the following summer. In 1993, PTRM excavated 218 bones, including ribs, vertebrae, pelvis elements, and other associated elements.

The PTRM specimen is considered the 14th T-rex specimen to be found in the world, just behind "Sue the T-rex," which was found near Faith, SD in 1990 by the Black Hills Institute. While Sue is considered the most com-PTRM specimen is not as com-

Thirty years have passed since the excavation and the museum is working on preparing the fossils for display. Darrah Steffen, Paleontology Curator for Pioneer Trails Regional Museum, estimates that the specimen is around 50% complete.

The specimen is made up of the main torso of the dinosaur. Unfortunately, the specimen is missing its head. Steffen states, "Our T-rex is headless. This may be due to the fact that there is evidence the body is scavenged. So, the extremities were likely carried off to be eaten."

Over the month of August, Pioneer Trails Regional Museum held a contest to name this exciting specimen. They had four options that poked fun at its headless status, gave homage to where it was found or the rock it was found in, or honored the man who discovered it.

Steffen said, "We had 130 people vote to name our T-rex. We noticed that our local votes mostly fell in the category of honoring the place it was found or the man who found it. And in the end, "Rhamond" beat out "Ichabod" by a handful of votes."

Rhamond Ray-mond - is spelled like Rhame, ND as a nod to the town the T-rex was found near Steffen said, "We are very pleased with the results and happy that Rhamond has a name.'

Mott Clinic Update

The City of Mott has been awarded a \$1.2 million grant to remodel the 100 wing (north wing) of the facility into a clinic. West River Health Services has signed an agreement whereby they will rent the remodeled north wing and move the existing Mott Clinic to our location. This relocation is anticipated to happen in the spring of 2024.





This week for my article I want to share a passage written by St. Bernard. I find this passage very enlightening and straight forward pointing us towards the decision of faith. Enjoy!

"We read in the gospel that when the Lord was teaching his disciples and urged them to share in his passion by the mystery of eating his body, some said: This is a hard saying, and from that time they no longer followed him. When he asked the disciples whether they also wished to go away, they replied: Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life.

I assure you, my brothers, that even to this day it is clear to some that the words which Jesus speaks are spirit and life, and for this reason they follow him. To others these words seem hard, and so they look elsewhere for some pathetic consolation. Yet wisdom cries out in the streets, in the broad and spacious way that leads to death, to call back those who take this path.

Finally, he says: For forty years I have been close to this generation, and I said: They have always been faint-hearted. You also read in another psalm: God has spoken once. Once, indeed, because for ever. His is a single, uninterrupted utterance, because it is continuous and unending.

He calls upon sinners to return to their true spirit and rebukes them when their hearts have gone astray for it is in the true heart that he dwells and there he speaks, fulfilling what he taught through the prophet: Speak to the heart of Jerusalem.

You see, my brothers, how the prophet admonishes us for our advantage: If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts. You can read almost the same words in the gospel and in the prophet. For in the gospel the Lord says: My sheep hear my voice. And in the psalm blessed David says: You are his people (meaning, of course, the Lord's) and the sheep of his pasture. If today you hear his voice, harden not your hearts.

Hear also from the prophet Habakkuk. Far from hiding the Lord's reprimands, he dwells on them with attentive and anxious care. He says: I will stand upon my watch-tower and take up my post on the ramparts, keeping watch to see what he will say to me and what answer I will make to those who try to confute me. I beg you, my brothers, stand upon our watch-tower, for now is the time for battle. Let all our dealings be in the heart, where Christ dwells, in right judgment and wise counsel, but in such a way as to place no confidence in those dealings, nor rely upon

our fragile defenses."

Brothers and sisters, we are given a great ability to choose whether we follow God or not. When we choose to follow Him, it does come with "hard" teachings, but the reward is "spirit and life" and joy in the Lord. Scripture points us to this reality in many places. Let's ask God this week for the strength to continue choosing Him even in times of hardship. God Bless.







8 c. shredded cabbage

2 c. grated carrots

1 green pepper (cut into strips)

1/2 c. chopped onion

1/2 c. cold water

1 envelope unflavored gelatin

2/3 c. sugar

2/3 c. vinegar

2/3 c. Mazola oil 2 tsp. celery seed

1 1/2 tsp. pepper

1 1/2 tsp. salt

Mix shredded cabbage, carrots, onion and pepper. Sprinkle with 1/2 cup water. Chill. Soften gelatin in 1/4 cup cold water, mix sugar, vinegar, celery seed, salt in saucepan. Bring to boil. Stir in softened gelatin. Cool until slightly thickened, beat well. Gradually beat in Mazola oil. Drain the vegetables and pour dressing over the vegetables. Mix lightly until vegetables are coated. Store in refrigerator. This keeps for several days. Stir before using.


