

Family Fun 3D Archery Shoot

The Hettinger County Extension office will be hosting their annual Family Fun 3D Archery Shoot on Sept. 17 and 18 at the outdoor shooting range which is located 2 miles west of Mott, ND. There will be 3 age divisions for this shoot. 8 to 12 vears in the Jr. Division, 13 to 18 vears old in in the Sr. Division and there will also be an adult division for anyone over 18.

Youth do not have to be in 4-H to participate. Participants will be able to shoot any barebow without sights or freestyle with sights. Maximum draw weight is 60 pounds. The range will have 40 3D targets set up and participants will be able to shoot one arrow at each target.

Adults are encouraged to accompany youth who are shooting. Price for this event will be \$10 per youth and \$15 per adult.

Reflections on the Words of Life By Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace

Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been considering Daniel's dilemma and how he, by God's enabling grace, did not capitulate to the law forbidding prayer to anyone except the king. Knowing that he would violate this law, Daniel's enemies hurried to inform King Darius: "And they went before the king, and spoke concerning the king's decree: 'Have you not signed a decree that every man who petitions any god or man within thirty days, except you, O king, shall be cast into the den of lions?' The king answered and said, 'The thing is true, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, which does not alter.' So they answered and said before the king, 'That Daniel, who is one of the captives from Judah, does not show due regard for you, O king, or for the decree that you have signed, but makes his petition three times a day.' And the king, when he heard these words, was greatly displeased with himself, and set his heart on Daniel to deliver him; and he labored till the going down of the sun to deliver him" (Daniel 6:12-14).

Here we see the painful lesson which King Darius learned. These wicked men approached him with great pretense, asking if he had signed the law which they very well knew he had signed, then sprang on him the news that Daniel had prayed to his God. Darius now realized that he had been duped and had caused a good man to be trapped by a bad law.

Friends, there is nothing new under the sun. When Christians stand in the way of the advance of evil, such conditions will arise as those created by these wicked schemers. Even now laws in our own country are more and more targeting those who would

of the den, and the king sealed it with his own signet ring and with the signets of his lords, that the purpose concerning Daniel might not be changed."

The folly of Darius is a clear illustration of pride coming before a fall. This time one man's pride led to another man's fall. A proud person does not see the problems he is creating. Try as he might, Darius was unable to reverse the law he had signed. How much better it is to humble ourselves BEFORE we act. It is easier to NOT DO than to UNDO something.

There is an uncanny resemblance to Daniel's being sealed in the lions' den and another event which would occur centuries later when another innocent Man would be the victim of a great conspiracy and put to death. Matthew 27:66 savs of Israel's religious leaders: "So they went and made the tomb

secure, sealing the stone and setting the guard." Thank God that both times, the actions of wicked men were in vain. Dear people, no one can thwart God No one can overthrow His Kingdom. The ultimate victory is sealed by that One who came forth from the grave and defeated Satan's kingdom. Even if things look very dark, as they did for Daniel and for Jesus, God will have the last word. Daniel's night in the lion's den and Jesus' three days in the tomb only resulted in bringing greater glory to God.

Friends, are you a member of God's victorious Kingdom? The only way in is by relying on what Christ accomplished on the cross as payment for sinand on nothing else-to make you right with God. Please be sure about this eternally important issue.

Our narrative continues in verses 15-17: "Then these men approached the king, and said to the king, 'Know, O king, that it is the law of the Medes and Persians that no decree or statute which the king establishes may be changed.' So the king gave the command, and they brought Daniel and cast him into the den of lions. But the king spoke, saying to Daniel, 'Your God, whom you serve continually. He will deliver you.' And then Paul went on, encouraging them in this spiritual practice in order that they might reap the fruits of transformation and renewal as they draw closer to God and arow in understanding of God's will.

That's a crop worth tending. May you reap an abundance of blessings as you continue to pursue spiritual practices that deepen your relationship with God.

The last of the sisters

Sister Agnes to retire from hospital

GARRISON – Sixty years ago, Sr. Agnes Reinert began her nursing career as a student nurse at Garrison Memorial Hospital. In two weeks, she will be ending it in the same place she started.

Later this month, Sr. Agnes will retire from the hospital to return to her religious community in Bismarck. In her own words, Sr. Agnes has come "full circle," she said with a laugh as she sat in the conference room at CHI St. Alexius Health Garrison on Sept. 7.

She first came to Garrison to work at the Garrison hospital "for the clinical experience" in the summers of 1962 and 1963. Sr. Agnes was a student at the University of Mary, where she graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Nursing in 1964.

While she went on to pursue her career after graduating, Sr. Agnes would find herself returning to Garrison.

For several years, Sr. Agnes worked as a nurse at St. Alexius Hospital in Bismarck. As a nurse, she rotated to every department.

"I think my biggest challenge as a nurse was when I was asked to be replacement acting director in the intensive care unit," she said.

The director at the time went on honeymoon. "I just presumed she was coming back; she didn't," she said. "I just did it, whatever needed to be done."

For 10 years, from 2002 to 2012, Sr. Agnes also served as a law enforcement chaplain with the Bismarck Police Department.

"That was a good experience," she said.

Sr. Agnes did ride alongs with assigned officers and assisted with different tasks, such as death calls, "if they allowed it," she explained. "There were one or two occasions when they said 'stay in the car."

In addition to this, Sr. Agnes was also a teacher, training students in pastoral education, as well as the LPN program at the University of Mary.

She also had stints working at the Jamestown State Hospital and the hospital in Carrington.

Nurse, teacher, Sister Sr. Agnes' exposure to religion started early.

She grew up on a farm between Richardton and Mott in southwestern North Dakota. - Sr. Lidwina was a Sister of Notre Dame in Mankato, Minnesota. As children, Sr. Agnes and her siblings would visit her in Schefield, a small town between Dickinson and New England.

The feeling of wanting to become a Sister herself "was kind of with me, but not that strong," Sr. Agnes said.

During her freshman year, her home economics teacher asked her students "to put down your first, second and third choices of career you were interested in."

Her two older sisters were training to be nurses at St. Alexius and their mother had been a nurse, so Sr. Agnes wrote down nursing.

"Then I thought 'ahh, maybe I could be a teacher' so I put down teacher," she said.

Then, before she knew it, she wrote down 'Sister.'

"Where that came from at that time, it wasn't as conscious, but I put it down. I thought 'you know, maybe."

After graduating from high school, she followed the first path: nursing. She was halfway through her diploma program when her nursing instructor, Sister Leola – one of the Benedictine Sisters who taught in the program – approached her.

"Miss Reinert, it just seems like you've been preoccupied lately," Sr. Leola said to her. "Is there something you want to tell me about?"

There wasn't, Sr. Agnes told her.

However, she continued, someone put a Novena booklet in her mailbox. Then, she told Sr. Leola about how she was thinking about "seeing what it's like" in the convent.

"When are you going to do that?", Sr. Leola asked.

"I thought after nursing training," Sr. Agnes responded. Sr. Leola was quiet for a

moment. "So you think it's okay if God is calling you to have him wait

until you're ready?" Sr. Agnes paused. She

never thought of it that way. It was Dec. 6, St. Nicholas

Day, which was Sr. Agnes' father's Name Day. She called her parents and after wishing her father a happy name day, Sr. Agnes told her mother her intentions.

The next day, Sr. Agnes' parents drove up to Bismarck. They had lunch with Sr. Agnes and then took her to the priory. Two days after telling Sr. Leola her intentions of the convent, Sr. Agnes was received at the priory.

big part of my chaplain work." Since arriving back to

Garrison, Sr. Agnes has worked part time and is on call. "I think that presence, that

support is really important for families when they are in a critical situation, not knowing what's going to happen," she said, adding that she tries to be with them to help "keep things hopeful."

When she isn't working, Sr. Agnes said she loves to garden, help clean up the yard at the hospital and also visit around town. She also likes to fish on Lake Sakakawea.

"It's been a thrill to get out on the lake and even catch fish," she said with a laugh.

However, the day after Labor Day, Sr. Agnes tendered her two week notice.

She admitted that age played a factor in her decision. "At my age, I need to leave before I'm going to need help

myself." "A few little health things," such as macular degeneration in one eye, also helped push Sr.

Agnes in her decision to retire. She has lived alone in the convent, located above the clinic, for about eight years.

"I'm quite an independent person, but it's time to go to my other community – my home community," she said, speaking about the Annunciation Monastery, located south of Bismarck on the University of Mary grounds. Here, she explained, Sr. Agnes will "get reintegrated and reinvested in my religious community."

As a Benedictine Sister, "we don't retire as such," she said. That devotion will always be there; it will just be exercised in different ways, such as assisting other Sisters in daily tasks or helping around the convent.

"I just have a yin to go traveling to see more of the country," Sr. Agnes added.

Outside of traveling to Germany for her sister's wedding or for religious conferences, such as a fiveweek conference in Rome, Sr. Agnes has never been outside of the country, nor has she seen much of this country, at least from a recreational point of view. Last of the sisters

Sr. Agnes is the last Benedictine Sister to work at the hospital. After she leaves, there won't be another.

"We have no one else to come in and follow, either as a nurse or chaplain or any other position," she said.

When Sr. Agnes first started at the Garrison hospital, 50 years ago, there were a number of Benedictine Sisters in the X-ray department, Sister Mary Hyacinth in charge of anesthesia and Sister Lucilda in charge of the dietary department.

In addition to the shift in the Benectine Sisters' overall presence at the hospital, Sr. Agnes said that "most everything has changed" since she first started at the hospital 60 years ago. Before, there would be "a very active hospital and staff and things happening. Now, things have all changed."

She noted that the recent downsize in staff – the number of employees who left the hospital because of the COVID-19 vaccination mandate – was "a disaster for many many small hospitals and larger hospitals, too."

Despite the geographic distance, with Sr. Agnes in Bismarck, she said that she will "continue to worry about the hospital situation."

"We've struggled so long and hard to get staff -- and staff that will stay. In my resignation notice, I did put down my thoughts and prayers are going to continue for the hospital will be sustained in future times."

Returning visits to Garrison are definitely in Sr. Agnes' future.

"I hope to come back once in a while," she said, adding with a laugh: "Maybe at fishing time, here or there." James C. Falcon

The local parish parochial school at St. Placidus "six miles off of (Highway) 8" was where Sr. Agnes and her sisters were educated by the Holy Cross Sisters. However, a visit from school board members raised the ire of their mother; they had informed her that her daughters were attending school outside of the school district.

"We were supposed to go to the public schools," she said.

Their mother relented and the following year, Sr. Agnes and her sisters attended public school; Sr. Agnes was in the third grade and continued through eighth grade until she attended high school in Mott.

Her mother, Catherine, had also received education by the Holy Cross Sisters in Wisconsin, but due to overcrowding in the schools, she returned to North Dakota.

In addition, Catherine's older sister – Sr. Agnes' aunt

Sr. Agnes admits that she wanted to "try it for two weeks and it'll be out of my system." The desire to be a Benedictine Sister was there, but it was "hidden in me."

"I tell people I think I'm still trying it," Sr. Agnes said with a laugh. She then added: "It's been a very enriching spiritual journey."

And the journey isn't over yet. Her move to the monastery will be the next chapter.

It's time to go to my other community.

Her most recent chapter – "this time" at the Garrison hospital – started nine years ago in July 2013 in pastoral care.

"As a chaplain, I'm available to all people, regardless of denomination," she explained. "I am called when there is a critical situation, like in the emergency room; or a death to be with family for support. That's been a ranks.

"We were at least eight, if not 10," she said. "We had a fairly nice sized community here."

Those sisters were older she said and many took the path that Sr. Agnes will soon take: retiring to the monastery.

When the hospital opened 70 years ago this past February, the hospital was staffed mainly by the Benedictine Sisters of the Annunciation Monastery (then known as the Convent of the Annunciation) in Bismarck. According to a story which ran in the McLean County Independent on Feb. 7, 1952, those among the staff included: Sister Andriette as administrator, Sister Angele in charge of nursing services, Sister Eleanor in charge of the NW 1/4 Of Section 21-134-92 (160 Acres Excellent Cropland)



In every language there are idioms (from the word 'idiot.') synonyms and homonyms. Synonyms are words having the same meaning such as 'organized' and 'arranged'. A homonym is a word that sounds the same as another word and may even be spelled the same way but means something different such as tear (from your eye) and tear (a rip in your shirt) Whereas an idiom is a form of expression in your particular language. The one speaking an idiom knows what he is talking about but to the one hearing, it does not make sense.
