

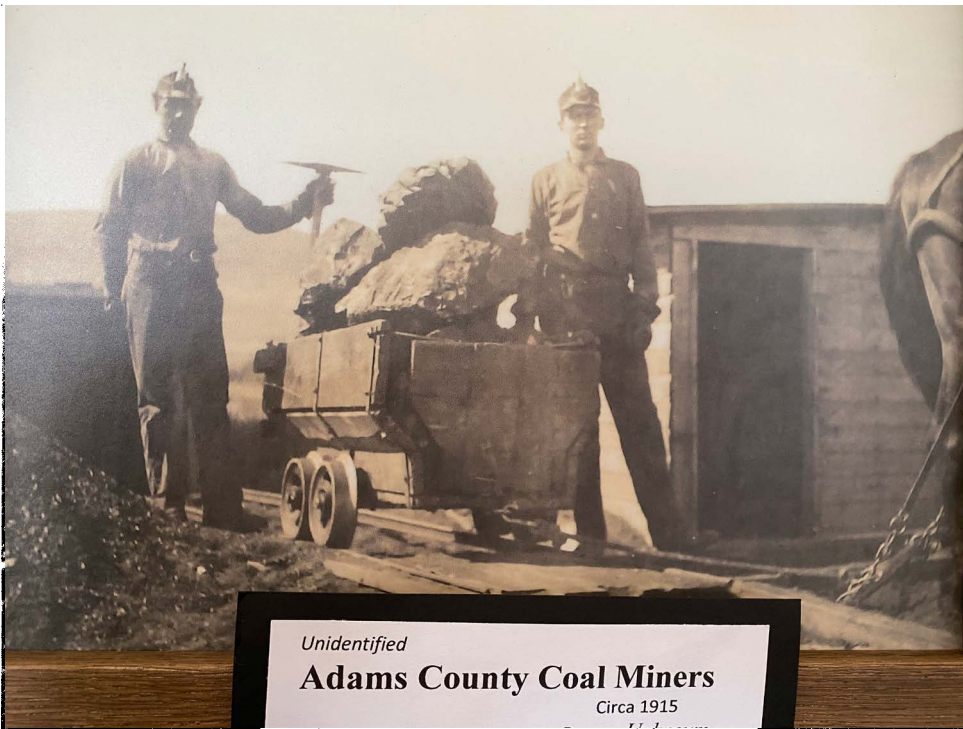

ing freight cars, a coal chute, a round house, an office, a boarding house and kitchen, a rooming house, a bathhouse, an ice house, a garage and a stable. The SD Mining Commission also allowed for six or so private dwellings for miners and their families when it was the South Dakota State Mine.

Fascinating, right? Learn even more at the Dakota Buttes Historical Society/Museum's special program, Labor Day, Monday, September 4, beginning at 12:30 pm MDT. The first speaker will be Hettinger's own, Michael Howe, Environmental Engineer, North Dakota Public Service Commission, Bismarck, ND. Duane Wamre, retired land surveyor at Kadmas, Lee & Jackson, Dickinson, formerly of Haynes, ND, is the second featured speaker, followed by Isabel Deavey Howe's real-life, personal remembrances of growing up at a coal mine. Following the program, a light lunch will be available in building 2.

Shortly after, the tour bus will load by the west, main museum door for drive-by tours of two mines and a stop and light supper at the third. Loren Luc-kow, DBHS/M treasurer, serves as tour guide. People can drive their own vehicles after the bus, if they wish.

All in all, it's a memorable way to spend Labor Day, learning about the labor of these thousands of people who lived at, worked for, or ran some of the highly successful coal mines in and around Adams County, ND.

DBHS/M presents "Mines Galore!"

"The more we study about the coal mines in and around Adams County, the less we know," one committee member said recently. "So much is yet to be discovered."

For example, did you know . . . South Dakota paid \$17,000 for 200 acres of farm land north of Haynes, ND, so that it would have a coal source close to a transportation source, in this case, the Milwaukee Railroad line at Haynes, ND. Run as an underground mine beginning in the 1920s, it was known as the *South Dakota State Mine in North Dakota*. After Jack Fitzgerald bought it in 1936, it was known as the Clermont Mine. Many still call it the "Haynes Mine."

Its main coal vein was 300 ft wide x 14 ft thick, cut at diagonals across the land. Two "drifts" or entries were within ¾ of a mile or so, allowing side room extensions to follow the coal veins. Horses pulled coal cars to the entrance where a cable lifted the cars to the tippie. As the tippie dropped, the coal chunks passed over screens into rail cars which then moved south to the main rail line. Coal from this mine was considered superior quality lignite, marketed in four types, premium jump, mine run, steam coal and stoker coal taken out by 40 workers or so in the cold months; fewer workers in the summer.

During its years of operation, it produced about 500,000 tons of lignite. The mine had a power house, a tippie for load-

WRHS Foundation Funds Recliners, Bariatric Bed and Hi-Lo Beds for WRHS/WHLC

The West River Health Services Foundation Board of Directors met for their quarterly meeting on Monday, August 28th at the WRHS Board Room and approved the following \$12,210 in purchases from their former Partners In Health Club Fund (now called the Grateful Givers Club Fund):

- 4 Recliners for Hospital Floor -- \$6,400 (\$1,600 each)
- 5 Recliners for Western Horizons Living Centers -- \$3,450 (\$690 each)
- 1 Bariatric Bed for Western Horizons Living Centers -- \$2,000
- Part of one high-low bed at Western Horizons Living Centers -- \$360

In addition, the WRHS Foundation Board of Directors also agreed to fund four, high-low beds for Western Horizons Living Centers at \$1,400 each or \$5,600 total, from the Foundation's remaining "One Room At a Time Together" fund (\$5,240).

Cloud Seeding Operations Summary for August 21-27

BISMARCK, N.D. – There were only isolated thunderstorms in southwestern North Dakota last week. High temperatures varied from the 60s at the beginning of last week, warming up into the 90s for mid to late week, and cooling down into the 70s for the weekend.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, one cloud seeding flight for hail suppression was flown last week. Rain enhancement operations were suspended last week due to the ongoing harvest.

Southwestern North Dakota should see favorable weather conditions for harvest this week. Warm high temperatures in the mid to upper 80s are expected for Monday through Wednesday. By mid-week an upper-level low-pressure system is forecast to move through Montana and provide a cool down and slight chance for precipitation. Next weekend, an upper-level ridge warms temperatures back up and should provide dry conditions for harvest.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at <http://www.dwr.nd.gov/arb>. District 1 has elected to extend cloud seeding operations through September 8 due to a late harvest.

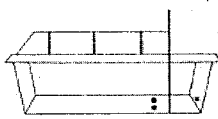

Longtime friends, mother-daughter team complete epic Yellowstone River journey

MONTANA — On August 18, four women, who call themselves the MT River Oars, completed a 570-mile float on the Yellowstone River after years of planning.

"We do think we are the first woman team to do this, and camp along the way and not just go in a hotel every night," said one of the oars, Shari Smith-Holley.

Smith-Holley has been friends with Celesta Hallam-Barwick for years. They first met over 20 years ago at work when, after only knowing each other for three days, Hallam-Barwick invited Smith-Holley on a river float. They have been friends ever since.

So, when Hallam-Barwick first came up with the Yellowstone River float idea, Smith-Holley couldn't pass on the fun adventure.

"I originally wanted to float all the way to Louisiana until I ran the numbers and realized I was not taking a year off of work. So, then I just decided to do the whole Yellowstone and invited my daughter (Michaela), and then Shari invited herself, and then Michaela's friend Virginia invited herself and then it just grew from there," Hal-

lam-Barwick said.

Both Smith-Holley and Michaela Horn live in South Dakota. Shari Smith, is owner of RBar and Red Barn Bakery in Lemmon, SD. Horn's friend Virginia lives in Alaska. Hallam-Barwick is the only one currently living in Montana, so once the plan was set and everyone made their way to Livingston, they set sail.

"We started in Gardiner, Montana," Horn said.

After their launch in Gardiner on July 24, the women spent nearly one month floating and camping along the river.

"We ended at the confluence there where the Yellowstone meets the Missouri," Smith-Holley said.

It was a journey that created lifelong memories for the women, filled with many good days.

"I think it was really healing to be in nature for that long, and we had such a good girl empowerment vibe on our boat," Horn said.

There were also some hardships they had to overcome. On the day Horn described as "the best worst day," she remembers everyone overcoming a difficult journey of emptying their raft to go around a dam in the river.

"We had to lift our boat over the embankment. It was not fun while we were doing it, but looking back, everyone was level-headed. We all had a common goal and worked so well together," Horn said.

Smith-Holley had just turned 50 years old before the trip and had been dealing with health problems. She said that she feared she wouldn't be able to make it through the entire journey. In the end, she was proud of herself for doing it all.

"I learned that I'm not broken and that I can still keep going. So, that was a huge exciting

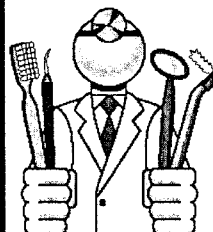
thing for me. Just more empowering that life's not over at 50 yet," she said.

The group already has plans for more river adventures, too.

"We'd like to hit every river in Montana now," Smith-Holley said.

"Well there's a lot of them, but we're going to try," Hallam-Barwick added.

Expressions of HOPE

Faith that Works

Labor Day weekend holiday is coming soon. We live in a community that rightfully can be thankful for promoting a good strong work ethic and excellent sense of community. I would like us to ponder how we view the relationship between faith and our works or actions (as well as our speech). Scripture teaches that we are saved by grace through faith alone and not by our deeds (Romans 1:17 and 3:28) and yet Paul will say in Ephesians 2:8-10 that we are saved through faith and grace alone but have also been created to do good works. This leads us to the passage that I would like to highlight James 2:13-26. James in this passage starts out by asking us two questions: What good is faith without works? Can that kind of faith save? He goes on to teach us that faith in God whether it is the true Triune God of Scripture or a "god" of our own making or imagination is not enough. We can know something is true, but not act on it or implement it in our lives in such a way that it is a faith that is truly working in our lives to make us more like Jesus. A faith in God without growing in works is ultimately a useless faith.

A saving faith in Jesus is demonstrated in our lives through His followers growing in doing the works of Jesus. James will say that faith is dead and useless if not accompanied by deeds and actions. It is not that we can save ourselves through these actions, but that our growing in doing the works of Jesus show that Jesus is at work in our lives transforming us. I, nor anyone else, can judge if you are in right relationship with God, however, we need to be willing to look in mirror of God's Word and examine if we have a certain type of intellectual assent that knows things, but has no interest in submitting to the transformative grace that Jesus wants to bring into our lives. Jesus wants to change us and sometimes we resist. Jesus has prepared good works for us to do now, not just a reservation in heaven. Let us examine our lives to see how we can be transformed by Jesus to do good works now and be in right relationship with Him for eternity as well.

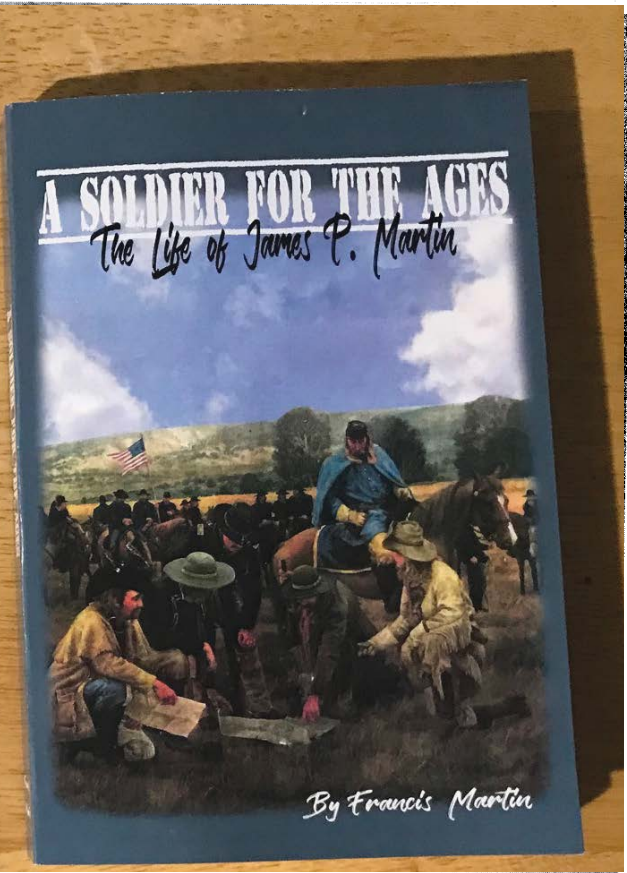

Mott Clinic Update

The City of Mott has been awarded a \$1.2 million grant to remodel the 100 wing (north wing) of the facility into a clinic. West River Health Services has signed an agreement whereby they will rent the remodeled north wing and move the existing Mott Clinic to our location. This relocation is anticipated to happen in the spring of 2024.

Over the years I have found some people need to be loved from afar. I believe that God

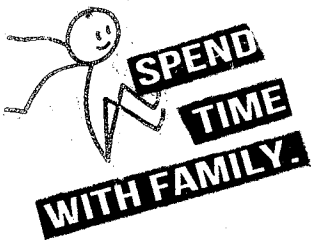
wants us to love one another, but, He does not demand that we be best friends.

Life is good today.

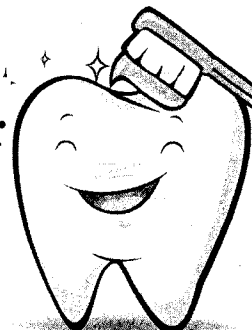

Psm. 111:9 The Apostle Paul admonished us not to have the 'fear of men.' Why? Because they tend to make up the rules as they go irregardless of the laws of God. The great Jurist and writer of English law, Blackstone said, "All law comes

from the original law set out in the Scriptures."

The council in civil council in Roman law is vague since the word civilian comes from the word civil. The law had to be approved by 'civilians.' Yet one of the laws in Rome was about taxation. It was called a head tax. If you didn't pay it, you got your head cut off. They were being civilized. Right? If you didn't or wouldn't (or couldn't) pay the head tax, you wouldn't be allowed to breath. This probably didn't apply to those with diplomatic immunity. I mean, you wouldn't want to behead the goose that laid the golden egg.

The reason this amuses me is because Roman law was called a democracy: people rule.

Yet we also get the word 'demon' from the word 'democracy'. I John 5:19. 'The whole world is lying in the power of the wicked one.' A Tribunal was a seat where the judge sat and eventually, he became called a Tribunal. It took on a negative aspect because it favored the wealthy, the important, those from families with titles. The prefix, tri, from Latin, Greek and French means 'three'. Most tribunals were of three men. When there was a vote, it could not be a tie unless one of them was a halfwit.

Reflections on the Words of Life

In our previous study, we saw that Naomi sought to persuade her Moabite daughters-in-law, Orpah and Ruth, not to return with her to Bethlehem. But we are told in Ruth 1:10, "And they said to her, 'Surely we will return with you to your people.'" This is a rather amazing response, as it seems that the women are more attached to Naomi than to their own people. But that leads Naomi to a second attempt to dissuade her daughters. We read in verses 11 through the first half of verse 13, "Turn back, my daughters; why will you go with me? Are there still sons in my womb, that they may be your husbands? Turn back, my daughters, go—for I am too old to have a husband. If I should say I have hope, if I should have a husband tonight and should also bear sons, would you wait for them till they were grown? Would you restrain yourselves from having husbands?" Basically, Naomi is telling her daughters-in-law that she can no longer bear children; and even if she did by some miracle, Orpah and Ruth would not want to wait that long and marry someone half their age when they could find a husband and start a family now. But Naomi saves her strongest argument for last. She says at the end of verse 13, "No, my daughters; for it grieves me very much for your sakes that the hand of the LORD has gone out against me!" The worst thing of all about Naomi's situation is that she perceives God as her enemy. Her point to her daughters is simply this: Why would you want to stay close to someone whom God is punishing?

Naomi is a bitter woman. She views the death of her husband and sons and the barrenness of her daughters-in-law as

God's hand against her. There is one thing in all of this that Naomi is right about. She is in her situation because of the sovereignty of God. God is in control of all things, and nothing can happen without His permission. This fact is clearly taught throughout the entire Bible. One example from the New Testament: Ephesians 1:11 says that God "works all things according to the counsel of His will."

So Naomi is correct in attributing what has happened in her life to God's sovereign control, but there is a major flaw in her thinking that God is against her. Lord willing, we shall see more about that in a future study. But I'd like to conclude by addressing what Naomi should have done instead of resorting to bitterness. She should have turned to God in repentance and asked His forgiveness for leaving Israel and moving to a pagan land. Yes, it was her husband Elimelech who instigated this move, and it is possible that Naomi went unwillingly. However, Elimelech and her sons had been dead for many years, and she had continued to live in Moab. Naomi could have avoided much distress had she turned to God and sought His forgiveness, guidance, and deliverance. And friends, the same is true today. God is gracious and ready to forgive those who turn to Him, seeking mercy through the perfect payment which Christ has accomplished for sin. One who has never sought to be made right with God can come to Him in repentance, asking for salvation on the basis of Christ's work on the cross. One who has been a believer for many years can come to Him over and over again, for we still sin and need cleansing. 1 John 1:9 states, "If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." What a wonderful and gracious provision God has made. May we take advantage of it continually.

Thoughts for the week

I saw a meme on social media today that went like this: Masculinity isn't toxic. It's men who aren't masculine that are toxic. Weak, little men use and abuse women instead of protecting and loving them. Our society is suffering from a shortage of real masculinity and it brings great harm to our women and children. Society spent a lot of years telling men that they needed to be in touch with their 'feminine' side. They were told to share their feelings and that whatever they felt was something to share with everybody and they forgot that men and women are two different types of people.

For many years, it was assumed that women were the weaker of the two sexes. At least men thought that and women were told that by the men. Women were to be protected and sheltered and prevented from doing anything that would cause them harm, yet they were expected to raise children, keep a house, and make sure that when their husband hit the door at night, that he was pampered and cared for the same way that his mother took care of him. This may have worked for the high society types of the old days, but there was never a time when a woman raising a family, when she had to do all the work actually was weak. She just had to appear that way when someone was looking.

A real man was the one that once he took a wife and started a family, he was supposed to work all the hours of the day to bring home the bacon and provide for his family. There was not a time when he should show hurt or feelings as that made

him less than a man. Even when his wife or a child passed away, which happened quite frequently due to poor health standards and expensive medication, he was expected to pull himself up by his bootstraps and get on with it. Lose a wife? Find another or if he was fortunate to have an older daughter, she was expected to take over the duties of taking care of the household and the younger children in the family. Older boys were seldom left to attend school after the 8th grade, as it would then be time to get a job and bring home wages or stay home and help with farm chores. Older girls hardly ever made it even that far as they were often needed at home or hired out to take care of households of people who had the money to employ them. With the advent of child labor laws and more attention paid to education for children, this gradually changed and children were allowed to actually attend school for more years, and even allowed to move on to higher education in some cases.


What has happened, is that men and women have been told over and over that they are equal, and they should be, but what does equal really mean? Does that mean that we have to all like the same thing and react the same way to every situation? Obviously not, as we are all different people. It should be more that we respect each other's opinions, regardless of what they are, and agree to disagree when they don't see things the same way. It should never have been any different, but as in all things, when public opinion is involved, there are many that are swayed to one way or the other. We all have things that we are strong in and weak in. No one is perfect with everything, but

3 Tbsp. lard
1 Tbsp. prepared onion sou
1 tsp. salt

Cut meat in servable pieces. Place a small piece of onion on each portion of meat. Roll meat like a jelly roll and fasten with toothpick. Roll in seasoned flour and brown in lard or drippings. Add 1/s cup of water, bake in oven at 325° for 1 1/2 hours. Then spread 1 tablespoon onion soup and 1/2 cup sour cream over pieces. Cover and bake 1/2 hour longer.
