Iryna Zarutska and Charlie Kirk! On August 22, 2025, on the Lynx Blue Line train in Charlotte, North Carolina: and. September 10, 2025, at the Utah Valley University quad in Orem, Utah; I watched as my childhood officially gave up its slow, lingering death. A beautiful, tiny, 22-yearold Ukranian refugee and, an intelligent 31-year-old, father of two both died in the most grotesque ways possible and, no one seemed to really blink an eye. Is this what our culture has become? We have become so used to these scenes of madness and chaos simply because the killing of innocents, particufirearms, has become common place? Words are now violence justifying deadly retaliation, mental illness is just an alternative lifestyle and, we have to accept this as the new norm?

In 1986, I graduated from law school and took my first real job in St. Joseph, Missouri, as an assistant prosecutor, in the city where that state's mental hospital was located. The new buzz phrase "least restrictive environment" was now touted as the way to handle those who suffered from a mental disease/defect and presented an imminent threat of danger to themselves or others. No longer would they be contained, for safety, behind gates and walls but, rather, free

to roam our public streets and take their "medication" to control their behavior. And, I remember my Chief Assistant's question then, "But, what if they don't take their medication? What happens then?" And, as we have since found out, they wander the streets and present a potential threat to everyone with whom they have contact. It's lunacy!

We get into law enforcement because we couldn't stand to watch the smaller kids get picked on. And, honestly, over the last 40 years, I have personally witnessed the gambit of cruelty from the wolves to the sheep. And, as sad as seeing little girl Iryna die scared, alone, in a new country and with no one to comfort her as she departed this life, as the other uninvolved clueless passengers on that train sat glued to their iPhones, was far worse! Again, is that what our culture has become? I guess I just want to say, whatever happened to the phrase "do unto others as you would have them do unto you?" And, refresh everyone's memory that until the new millennium, our criminal justice system was supposed to enforce accountability, deter other criminals, promote public safety, seek restitution, rehabilitate the offender, and insure public confidence. What happened?

#### Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

In light of the recent tragedies that have rocked our nation, we are deviating from our regular study today to consider where we should turn when things around us look dark. We can be thankful that there is hope, and it is found in God's Word. The book of Psalms is a wonderful place to turn for help and comfort. The Psalms cover the gamut of human emotions, from deepest depression to ecstatic praise. There are many Psalms that are helpful for those who are in the midst of painful circumstances, and I'd like for us to look at a few verses from Psalms 42 and 43. These two Psalms are closely related; they are both laments, and they share the same conclusion. The cause for lament seems to be that the psalmist was in a place of exile, under the rule of his nation's enemies, and he had no access to the temple worship in Israel which he had previously enjoyed. Of course none of us are in that condition, but the beauty of God's Word is that its principles can be applied to us in whatever kind of suffering we might be facing. For the sake of space, I will not print the entire Psalms here, but I urge you to read them on your own. Instead, I want to point out some of the verses which express the psalmist's anguish:

Psalm 42:2-3: "My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and appear before God? My tears have been my food day and night, while they continually say to me, 'Where is your God?" Psalm 42:6-7: "O my God, my soul is cast down within me; therefore I will remember You from the land of the Jordan, and from the heights of Hermon, from the Hill Mizar. Deep calls unto deep at the noise of Your waterfalls; all Your waves and billows have gone over me." Psalm 42:9-10: "I will say to God my Rock, 'Why have You forgotten me? Why do I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?' As with a breaking of my bones, my enemies reproach me, while they say to me all day long, 'Where is your God?'" Psalm

43:1-2: "Vindicate me, U Goa, and plead my cause against an ungodly nation; oh, deliver me from the deceitful and unjust man! For You are the God of my strength; why do You cast me off? Why do I go mourning because of the oppression of the enemy?"

The final verses of Psalm 42 and 43 are identical and show that the psalmist had found a way to gain comfort in his suffering: "Why are you cast down, O my soul? And why are you disquieted within me? Hope in God; for I shall yet praise Him, the help of my countenance and my God" (Psalm 42:11, Psalm 43:5). The psalmist despairs, but his despair leads him to look to God and hope in Him. Friends, all other sources of hope are fleeting and will fail. Political solutions cannot change a person's heart, and what we are needing in our country is for God to work in many hearts, replacing hatred with love. Believers, when we are tempted to despair, we must look to God, setting our minds on Him. It is a blessing to be able to pour out our griefs and sorrows to the Lord as the psalmist did. In the midst of turmoil, we must remember that we have not been abandoned. Believers are not to respond to the wicked by using the same methods as their enemies, but they are to commit their way to God and cry out to Him. They are to love their enemies. There is no better recourse than prayer and God's Word. As the psalmist found, we too shall yet praise Him. Even if circumstances in this life do not improve, we can look forward to praising Him forever in heaven. For believers, the best is yet to

For those who have not yet placed their trust in the Lord Jesus Christ, I pray that the trials facing our nation will drive you to Him. He is our only way of access to God, as He Himself clearly said: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6). Through faith in Him, you can become a child of God and have the joy of being able to cast all your cares upon Him. You will be able to claim the words of another Psalm: "My help comes from the LORD. who made heaven and earth' Psalm 121:2.

## Author Makes Stop In North Dakota

SNOWFLAKE, AZ—Author Paula F (Pfeiffer) Winskye, a North Dakota native, will hold a book signing at the Pioneer Trails Regional Museum in Bowman, Thursday, September 25th from 3:00 to 6:00 PM.

Winskye spent most of her life in North Dakota before moving to Arizona in 2017. She taught in Bowman and Rhame in the early 1980s.

The author's 28th novel, Scrawled in Blood, the fourth in her Randy McKay mystery series, was published this spring.

Murder at Shackleton, the third book in her Lunar Enforcement sci-fi mysteries, is also scheduled for release in 2025.

Winskye is best known for her popular Tony Wagner mysteries. The first novel in the series, The Reverend Finds His Calling, reached number six on Amazon for serial killer mysteries. The 14th volume, The Reverend Escapes, will be published in 2026. ILVER DOLLAR

Weed cutting notice to all landowners or Operators that weeds must be cut

Notice is hereby given to all landowners or operators to cut all weeds and grasses adjoining their lands along those roads defined as roadways by the Township supervisors and the Hettinger County Board of Commissioners including weeds and grasses growing within the public right-of-way bordering such highways and their lands. Such cutting shall be completed by October 1, 2025. Cutting with a swather is not adequate, maximum stubble height of 4 inches and a minimum of 13 feet must be cut using a mower. If the weeds and grasses are not cut along county roads or is not cut adequately to prevent snow buildup, the county will mow the weeds and grasses and charge the adjacent landowner at a rate of \$150.00 per one/half mile. The county will begin cutting ditches on October 1, 2025. If the landowner fails to cut the weeds and grasses along township roads adjoining their lands, the township Board of Supervisors may cause such weeds and grasses to be cut and the actual cost shall be charged against the land of the landowner and shall become part of the taxes levied against the land in the ensuing year. Also if hay bales remain in the ditches of county roads after October 15, 2024,the county will remove the hay bales and the landowner may redeem them by paying the cost of removal. If not redeemed by November the hay will be sold to pay the cost of removal.

The Township Board of Supervisors do not need to advertise for weed cutting in their Township.



The distinct symbol of Christianity is the cross. Albeit, there are many different Christian symbols used over the millennia, the cross is the one sign of Jesus Christ giving his life for all. For Jesus, the cross was the place of sacrifice, the reality of giving up his life into the hands of his Father, being moved with profound love for his creatures. This begs a question: what does the cross then mean for you and me? Is the cross simply a symbol that Jesus has died for our sins or is the cross a reality that I can live today, right now?

Over the last four years as a priest, I am sure people have heard me define the place of our cross enough that they are used to it in my pews. I like to define the cross in our life, the sufferings in our hearts, as "the place I want to control, but I can't." "The place I want to change, but I can't" or "the thing I would like to get rid of, but I can't" are the specific realities that cause a person to suffer. This may be a person in your family, the loss of a loved one, etc. There are an infinite number of possibilities.

cross is important, but then the reality of the cross needs to be lived. As Jesus offered himself on the cross to the Father, we as Christians need to offer our crosses to the Father through Jesus right now. We are not talking about mental gymnastics or a formula to be followed, but a relationship to be lived.

When we acknowledge and tell Jesus the crosses in our lives, we will receive his goodness, love, and mercy right now. We see this happen on almost every page of the Gospels. People come to Jesus seeking healing from illness, disease, sin, demonic possession and death. As the people come to Jesus and tell him about their cross, we see Jesus give them his healing, tender, merciful, love. The people are able to receive it and are changed through the suffering of their cross. In the parable of the rich young man, he is unable to tell and relate to Jesus his love for his many possessions, and is then unable to receive the love Jesus wants to



### "Since 1989, The Enchanted Highway"

"Since 1989, The Enchanted Highway" between Gladstone and Regent, including Lefor, North Dakota, was envisioned and gradually built stepby-step by its founding visionary artist and metal sculptor, Gary Greff. However, it must be acknowledged that during the past 36 years, an almost infinite number of people have voluntarily given their financial contributions, equipment lending, offering labor time and tool-handling skills... land easements, tax dollars, grants, free metals, and overall general support toward the development of 'The Enchanted Highway' in North Dakota, for which the 'God-spirited artist', Gary Greff, is very sincerely grateful.

Do some artists experience criticism from others? I quickly say "Yes" based on my observations. However, I think that a 'TRUE Heart-Centered Artist' develops the ability to handle criticism because they know deep down that it is an essential component of their artistic-creative journey. The notion that a "true artist" always "dots their I's and crosses their T's" is, in my opinion, a misconception. While certain artists may find it necessary to maintain meticulous attention to detail and order in their 'Everyday World', this is not a must for all artists. From painstaking realism to informal and emotionally charged figurative art, the creative process is varied and, in the end, certainly incorporates a large range of attention to detail.

For instance, when the visionary artist and metal sculptor Gary Greff completed his V-formation "Geese in Flight" sculpture in August 2001, it soon established itself in the Guinness World Records as the 'World's Largest Scrap Metal Sculpture' in 2002. Call it 'Paying Attention to Detail', or not, but how does an enterprising person think of 'ITs Long-Range Planning' any other way when 'It Took' five (5) transported cranes from both Dickinson and Minot, North Dakota, to the Gladstone, North Dakota, erection site (which runs parallel to I-94 on the north side) in order to hoist and assemble the sculpture into position? Before transporting the large sections by semi-truck, the site preparation involved drilling holes for support beams. The "Geese in Flight" sculpture has more than five (5) miles of weld in it. Scrap metal pieces made from oil well tanks and oil well pipes were used in the "Geese in Flight" sculpture. The scrap oil well tanks and pipes had to be literally flattened by a tractor to prepare them for use. The "Geese in Flight" sculpture symbolizes 'Canadian Geese Flying', and took more than half a decade to finish. It weighs 157,659 pounds, or about 79 tons, and stands 110 feet tall and spans 154 feet across 'America's Sky and Great Plains Prairie'.

'The Enchanted Highway' is a 32-mile, two-lane, improved blacktop/centerlined road that runs south from Gladstone, North Dakota, through Lefor, North Dakota, to Regent, North Dakota. Along its picturesque historical route, there are several metal sculptures created by visionary artist and metal sculptor Gary Greff.

......These sculptures include:

"Geese in Flight" (completed 2001)...

"Deer Crossing" (completed 2002)... A sculpture depicting deer leaping in mid-air.

"Grasshoppers in the Field" (completed 1999)... A monumental grasshopper surrounded by wheat stalks that represent a past plague that affected North Dakota's crops.

"Fisherman's Dream" (completed 2006)... A complex sculpture with metal fish leaping as a large dragonfly hovers nearby.

"Pheasants on the Prairie" (completed 1996)... A family of pheasants, including a rooster, hen, and chicks.

Theodore Roosevelt Rides Again" (completed 1993)... Features a large figure of Theodore Roosevelt on a bucking horse.

World's Largest, "Tin Family" (completed 1991)... The first sculpture on the highway depicts a father, mother, and son.

&&! "Sir Albert" (is nearing completion)... The [NEWEST] created metal sculpture-the 41-foot-tall knight, 'Sir Albert'is clad in shining armor; he towers over the grounds and majestically guards the 'Enchanted Castle Hotel Complex' in Regent, North Dakota, fending off a fierce fire-breathing dragon. This huge and competitively competent green dragon is 100 feet long from its snout to tail and stands 42 feet tall. Its chain-link fence covering represents its robust, tough scales that will perhaps ward off sword attacks from "Sir Albert".

To create metal sculptures for 'The Enchanted Highway', artist Gary Greff had to master within himself a complex blend of technical, artistic, and engineering skill-abilities. Gary's 'Enchanted Highway Dream' has presented, to put it mildly, considerable challenges through the years.

...Like mastering artistic and design skills, allowing his imagination and idea generation to grow. The capacity to envision and create an engaging work of three-dimensional art involved Gary Greff's understanding of structural parts, layout, scrap metal materials to be used, and the project's overall appearance in a mindful sense, as well as regulating his personal flair for design. Gary told me that every metal sculpture idea starts initially with him physically drawing a small-scale, block-by-block cut, dimensionally detailed, handdrawn papered plan on the gym floor of the 'Enchanted Castle Hotel Complex' in Regent, North Dakota.

To join the metal components and guarantee the sculpture's structural integrity, Gary has accumulated the knowledge necessary to select the ideal scrap metal for the design and to weld it to produce the required effect. Gary is skilled in several welding methods, such

> Gas Metal Arc Welding, or MIG, which uses a continuously fed wire electrode and a shielding gas that protects the weld from atmospheric contamination. It is a quick and flexible welding technique that melts and binds metal components together using an electric arc. It works well for bigger tasks.

> Gas Tungsten Arc Weld-

ing, or TIG, provides more control and accuracy for complex joints and fine details, particularly when working with thinner metals. It produces a high-quality, precise weld.

> Arc/Stick Welding is a versatile welding technique that is applied to a wide range of metal types in a variety of settings. It is a strong and still broadly used choice for welding.

Gary, 'The Sculptor,' cuts and form-shapes the scrap metal into the desired shapes; this often involves heating, hammering, and bending the metal. Then comes the finishing process, which refines the sculpture's appearance. Techniques include grinding, sanding, and polishing to make smooth surfaces, as well as applying paint to add color and to protect the metal design against nature's weather elements.

Creating large metal sculptures requires an understanding of how to build an internal framework and join components so they are structurally sound and stable. As large sculpture pieces are developed, Gary is constantly faced with solving problems related to balance, weight distribution, and the sculpture's assembly. Gary's ability to operate large, specialized machinery, including welding equipment, lifting apparatuses, and power tools, has become invaluable. Gary has had to build upon his understanding of how to transport and securely install his outdoor metal sculpture pieces to provide proper footings and anchoring systems to withstand North Dakota's variable winds and ever-changing seasonal weather conditions.

The qualities, characteristics, and personality traits that make up the visionary artist and metal sculptor Gary Greff's nature were developed at birth, in his childhood, or learned through experiences over time. Each of his traits openly describes who Gary is and therefore influences his behavior, his interactions with others, and his approach to tasks and challeng-

Today, 2025, Gary Greff continues to maintain existing sculptures and works on building new ones for 'The Enchanted Highway', and his sincere intention is still to help revive his hometown of Regent, North Dakota, where he opened The 'Enchanted Castle Hotel Complex'

In 2023, 'The Enchanted Highway Foundation' (its board president is Rich Wardner, a former North Dakota State Senator) was formed to secure the long-term existence of artist Gary Greff's metal sculptures along The Enchanted Highway and in downtown Regent, North Dakota. The foundation can provide a reliable source for sought-after funding, professional stewardship, tourist relations, and help promote 'Area, State, National, and International' support that is necessary to protect The Enchanted Highway's metal sculptures from environmental damage and

'The Enchanted Highway Foundation' aims to be dedicated to providing a stable financial structure and to make persistent, determined, and significant efforts to progress, advance, and carry forward goals and priorities into the years ahead. Financial security is critical for proactive, longterm preservation of the metal sculptures along 'The Enchanted Highway'.
