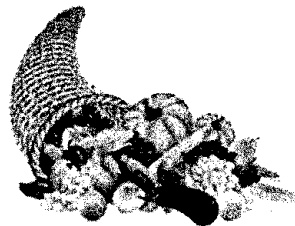

Adams County Weed Cutting and Hay Removal Policy

Therefore, all weeds and grass along Township roads, designated by each Township
(Organized and Unorganized) and the Village of North Lemmon, shall be mowed no
later than October 1st of each year.

The prescribed height of the stubble to be left shall not exceed six inches. The mini-
mum width of the cut shall be nine feet. A windrow may not be left on the roadway or
shoulder of the roadway.

Maps provided by Townships or the County for Unorganized Townships designating
the roads to be mowed will be on file on the County Website for the landowner or
operators review.

The Adams County Road Department will mow County roads by October 15th each
year.

All hay bales on County road-right-of-ways shall be removed by October 1st of each
year. Failure to comply will result in Adams County assuming ownership and removal
of the bales by Adams County or its designee.

Reflections on the Words of Life

Last time we left Daniel as the victim of a cruel plot. Through the unscrupulous dealings of the other leaders in the Persian Empire, he was cast into a den of man-eating lions. And what was the horrible crime he had committed? He was given such a punishment for praying to the living and true God. He refused to break off his customary practice of addressing prayer to God. Oh, that we had more people committing that crime today!

How did Daniel's punishment affect King Darius? We read in Daniel 6:19, "Now the king went to his palace and spent the night fasting; and no musicians were brought before him. Also his sleep went from him." Darius was in great turmoil of soul for having allowed himself to succumb to the flattery and scheming of his other governors and satraps, but even more because of what his foolishness had meant for Daniel, whom he cared for very much. That night, as Daniel was in the lions' den, Darius had no desire for the usual pleasures of life which belonged to the king of a world empire. He did not feel like eating or calling for musicians to entertain him. Even worse, his mind was so plagued by thoughts of Daniel and his stupidity which was the cause of it all, that he could not sleep.

Oh, let us see here a very glaring example of what happens to the one who indulges in the pleasures of sin for a season. In a moment of great pride in which he was swept

off his feet by the flattery of his advisors, Darius, as far as he knew, had lost the best man in the kingdom. And now his conscience so bothered him that sleep became impossible. Dear people, never forget that sin always has its consequences, whether those consequences be felt now or later. The best way to get a good night's sleep is to go to bed with a clear conscience. The Scriptures do not tell us whether Daniel had a good night's sleep that night, but I would suspect that he did.

Friends, a guilty conscience is a very heavy burden. The good news is that anyone who is plagued with a guilty conscience need not stay that way. God has provided a means of forgiveness and cleansing. The person who has never placed his or her trust in Christ alone and His perfect payment for sin on the cross can come to God with a burdened heart. Realizing one's sinfulness is a good thing because it leads a person to see the need for a Savior. If that describes you, you can tell God that you are relying only on what Christ did on the cross to pay for your sins, and you will receive forgiveness and cleansing. For those who are already believers in Christ—we too can have a disquieted conscience. As long as we live in the flesh, we will have a sinful nature and will repeatedly need cleansing. We read in 1 John 1:8-9, "If we say that we have no sin, we deceive ourselves, and the truth is not in us. If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness." Until we reach heaven, we will have need to confess our sins to our Heavenly Father so that our consciences can be cleansed from dead works to serve the living God (Hebrews 9:14). How thankful we can be for a faithful and ever-present Savior who is the Author and Finisher of our faith (Hebrews 12:2).

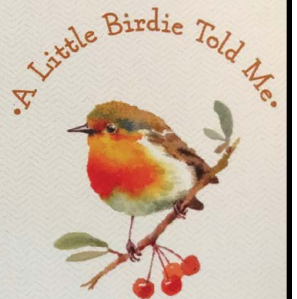

Weed cutting notice to all landowners or Operators that weeds must be cut

Notice is hereby given to all landowners or operators to cut all weeds and grasses adjoining their lands along those roads defined as roadways by the Township supervisors and the Hettinger County Board of Commissioners including weeds and grasses growing within the public right-of-way bordering such highways and their lands. **Such cutting shall be completed by October 1, 2022.** Cutting with a swather is not adequate, maximum stubble height of 4 inches and a minimum of 13 feet must be cut using a mower. If the weeds and grasses are not cut along county roads or is not cut adequately to prevent snow buildup, the county will mow the weeds and grasses and charge the adjacent landowner at a rate of \$150.00 per one-half mile. **The county will begin cutting ditches on October 1, 2022.** If the landowner fails to cut the weeds and grasses along township roads adjoining their lands, the township Board of Supervisors may cause such weeds and grasses to be cut and the actual cost shall be charged against the land of the landowner and shall become part of the taxes levied against the land in the ensuing year. **Also if hay bales remain in the ditches of county roads after October 15, 2021 the county will remove the hay bales and the landowner may redeem them by paying the cost of removal. If not redeemed by November the hay will be sold to pay the cost of removal.**

The Township Board of Supervisors do not need to advertise for weed cutting in their Township.

A Little Birdie Told Me

A Little Birdie Told Me: “A Trip to The Golden Valley County Museum in Beach, North Dakota is a Day Well Spent.” The Golden Valley Museum is open Tuesday – Friday from 9:00- 1:00, Memorial Day – Labor Day. I made my way west on I-94 on a Monday and Judy Ridenhower was happy to open for me and give me the grand tour. The museum features over 2000 exhibits to include a restored 1909 Little Beaver School.

The most unique and interesting was a “Negative Pressure Ventilator” or more commonly known as an “Iron Lung.” The Iron Lung on display was used in the Beach area during the 1950’s when polio was raging. The Iron Lung enabled the patient to breathe when normal muscle control was lost or the work of breathing exceeds the person ability due to the illness. Only the sickest of patients ended up in one for up to two weeks: if they survived a lifetime of disability was likely to follow.

A beautifully 1905-1906 Hearse, which spent many years as a chicken coop before loving hands, restored it: The

hearse was retrieved from the Al Irons farm near Alpha, ND. Overstad and Hoverson funeral directors owned the hearse, which was heavily decorated with tassels, curtains, shiny polished leather and brass. The bereaved could chose between a team of either black or white horses.

In an effort to preserve local family histories large display boxes with a glass front were made and sold. Families could purchase the box and display whatever family memorabilia they wanted to share with visitors.

I thanked my hostess and headed to Wild Vines Market – Flowers, Espresso & Wine owned by Michaela Ordahl. Wild Vines opened in June of 2017 and provides a full breakfast and lunch menu with a daily lunch special: take-out only. Wild Vines is a full-service florist shop and delivers to; Wibaux, MT, Sentinel Butte, Medora and Golva. Wild Vines also does catering on a case-by-case basis, so when you’re headed west on I-94 be sure to stop in Beach for a rich cup of coffee and a sweet treat.

He was an accomplished self-taught welder, mechanic and machinist that was able to repair any piece of equipment. He sold Standard Feeds throughout the area which introduced him to many farmers and ranchers. It seemed wherever he went, he made friends and business associates who never forgot him. In the late 1960s, Silver became interested in Simmental cattle

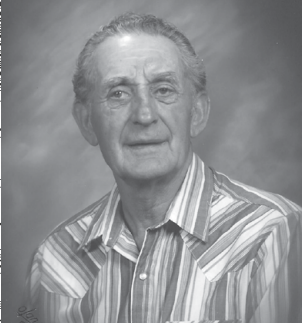

Silver's hobbies in later life were family functions and grandchildren's activities, traveling to visit friends, antique tractor restoration, NDSU football, and his beloved Haflinger draft horses. Silver's greatest joy in life was his family, consisting of five children, 15 grandchildren, 19 great-grandchildren and many more to come! As a family we are grieved by his passing but will be forever blessed by this man of great love, compassion and faith, that pointed each of us to our own relationship with Christ. We look forward to the Ziebarth reunion with him in heaven.

Silver was preceded in death by his parents, siblings Bernalda, Zelda, Dennis, Eugenie, Erna, Armin, Carl, Edith; and his great-grandson Logan Fried.
