• Golva Grocery - \$61,190

"These grants are a lifeline for small-town grocers who serve as anchors in their communities," said Commerce Community Development and Rural Prosperity representative Nicolette Blumler. "We're proud to help support these towns in keeping shelves stocked and doors open."

Famous Dave's in Bismarck closed! KXNET reports that "after more than two decades of serving ribs, brisket, and backyard-style hospitality", the popular restaurant closed its doors, for good, this past summer, in our neighbor to the east. And, as relocated southerners, my wife and I now have one less reason to trip down there for our shopping needs. Originally, founded in the Midwest, the restaurant served pork ribs, chicken, beef brisket, and several flavors of barbecue sauce. And, many people didn't know that the original founder, Dave Anderson, was an Ojibwe-Choctaw who served as the head of the federal Bureau of Indian Affairs from 2004 to 2005, and, he also started the first Famous Dave's restaurant near Hayward, Wisconsin in 1994.

Coming from the South, I can honestly say that when I wanted good barbecue as a kid, my dad just drove to the local gas station and, viola, BBQ ribs from a trailer. Add to that, in Kansas City, Arthur Bryant's, Slap's, LC's, and Joe's; and, my formative years would be hard to rival when it came to good BBQ. One of my karate students just asked the other night what the secret to cooking a good piece of meat

was and, I recalled my grandma Vera. Every Sunday, she started smoking the roast beef at 6 AM and, by lunch, after church, we all headed over for Sunday dinner and, that was the status quo. So I told my student... "time". Smoking meat is time consuming but, anything good is worth waiting for and, in a culture that prizes instant, immediate gratification, it just gets harder and harder to find good food regardless as to the price. And, folks, a microwave is NOT a cooking device, right?

Well, in my humble opinion, based on the samplings that I have taken since I got up here in 2013, Famous Dave's had no equal within a 3-hour, roundtrip drive. My favorite antic was to have my wife call ahead when we were at Costco, order a slab (or 2) of ribs and a quart of baked beans to go. I can only say that the eventual meal was the highlight of the week. I'm going to miss Famous Dave's and, can only hope that someone else does us the privilege of replacing that BBQ. Sorry...but, that's my addiction and, love me some BBQ. Have a great week and, keep your fingers crossed! Maybe we'll get lucky with a new



Reflections on the Words of Life

Eido/Connect Country

We are deviating once more from our regular study of 1 Peter, due to the recent tragedies that have occurred in our nation. Such disasters tend to cause despair and make people wonder whether there is any hope in this dark place. There is hope, and we find it in God's Word. So today we turn our thoughts to a wonderful event that happened shortly after the Lord Jesus was born into this world as the God-man. It is described for us in Luke 2:25-30: "And behold, there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon, and this man was just and devout, waiting for the Consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was upon him. And it had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Christ. So he came by the Spirit into the temple. And when the parents brought in the Child Jesus, to do for Him according to the custom of the law, he took Him up in his arms and blessed God and said: 'Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace according to Your word; for my eyes have seen Your salvation.'

Simeon was a godly old man. He was eagerly waiting for the long-expected Messiah whom God had promised much earlier in Israel's history. But Simeon had received a most unusual gift-a special revelation from the Lord that he would not die until he had seen the Messiah. And our passage unfolds that this happened just as God had promised. In God's amazing providence, Simeon was at the temple exactly when Mary and Joseph arrived there with their Baby. Note this man's response after taking the Baby in his arms and praising God: "Lord, now You are letting Your servant depart in peace." Simeon is not plagued with the fear that most find crippling: fear of dying. We read in Hebrews 2:14-15 that one of the reasons why eternal God became the man Christ Jesus, was that He "through death might destroy has the power death, that is, the devil, and deliver all those who through fear of death were subject to lifelong slavery." Living with constant fear of death is indeed slavery. But Simeon would depart in peace, without such fear. The same is true of the apostle Paul. who said, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain" (Philippians 1:21).

How is it possible to be delivered from this gripping fear of death, enabling one both to live in peace and to die in peace? First we must be partakers of the greatest and most important peace there is, and that is peace with God. The Bible plainly tells us that we are not born at peace with God, but in fact are at enmity with Him (Romans 8:5-8), But Jesus Christ, the promised Messiah, came to pay the penalty for the sins of all who would place their trust in Him. And for those who are trusting in Him: "Therefore, since we have been justified by faith, we have peace with

God through our Lord Jesus Christ" (Romans 5:1). Once a person has this greatest peace, he or she can live with hope. For the believer in Christ, no matter what difficulties might be faced in this life, an eternity of endless joy awaits.

Simeon explains the source of his peace: "For my eyes have seen Your salvation." That salvation his eyes saw was a Person. Simeon knew that this Baby he was holding was the

NOTICE

Weed cutting notice to all landowners or Operators that weeds must be cut

Notice is hereby given to all landowners or operators to cut all weeds and grasses adjoining their lands along those roads defined as roadways by the Township supervisors and the Hettinger County Board of Commissioners including weeds and grasses growing within the public right-of-way bordering such highways and their lands. Such cutting shall be completed by October 1, 2025. Cutting with a swather is not adequate, maximum stubble height of 4 inches and a minimum of 13 feet must be cut using a mower. If the weeds and grasses are not cut along county roads or is not cut adequately to prevent snow buildup, the county will mow the weeds and grasses and charge the adjacent landowner at a rate of \$150.00 per one/half mile. The county will begin cutting ditches on October 1, 2025. If the landowner fails to cut the weeds and grasses along township roads adjoining their lands, the township Board of Supervisors may cause such weeds and grasses to be cut and the actual cost shall be charged against the land of the landowner and shall become part of the taxes levied against the land in the ensuing year. Also if hay bales remain in the ditches of county roads after October 15, 2024 the county will remove the hay bales and the landowner may redeem them by paying the cost of removal. If not redeemed by November the hay will be sold to pay the cost of removal.
