Well you know me - whatever you told me not to do. I did. I tried to prove you wrong. So my stubborn attitude kicked in and I began my 21 days of "Hope".

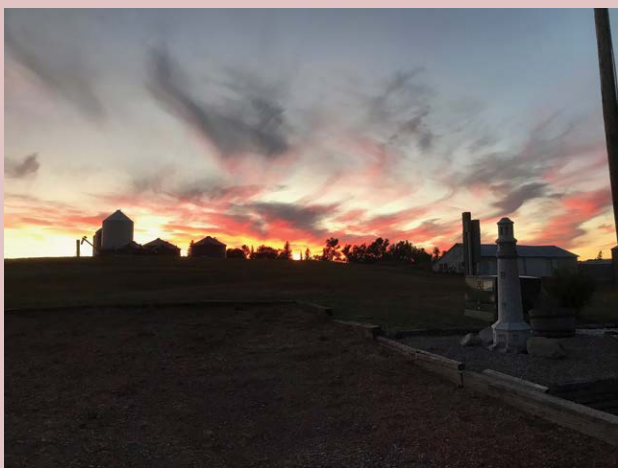
Every day I had to write the first negative thought

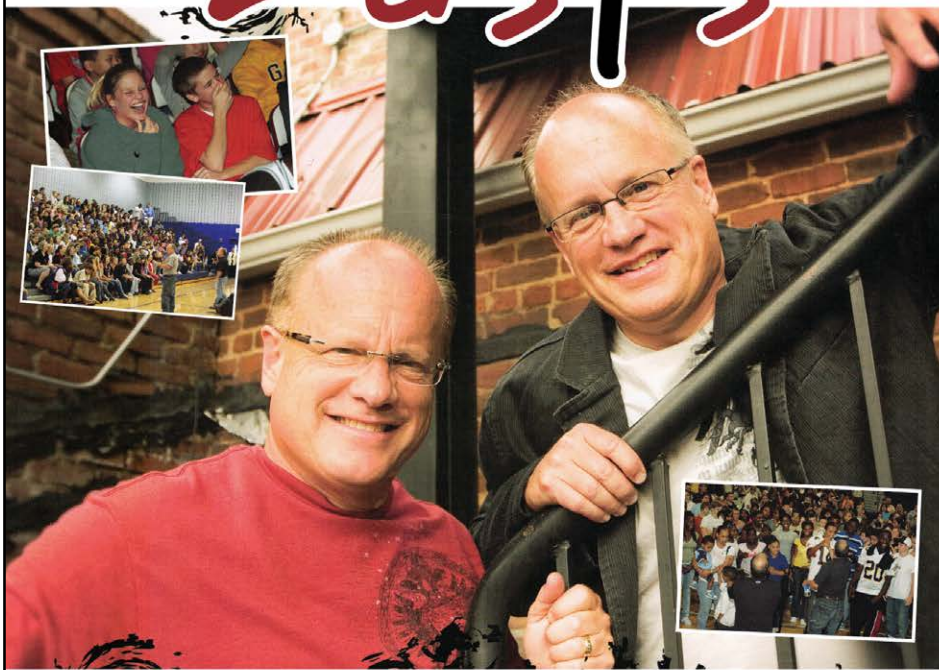

Cloud Seeding Operations Summary for August 22-28, 2022

BISMARCK, N.D. – Most locations in southwestern North Dakota received between a quarter inch and half inch of rain

last week as an active weather pattern brought several weather systems through the region. There were ten operational flights between August 23 and 26-27, five for hail suppression, one for rain enhancement, and four for repositioning in the Bowman and Slope County project area.

An upper-level ridge of high pressure will build into the region this week, keeping southwestern North Dakota hot and dry. High temperatures should reach the 90s by midweek.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at www.dwr.nd.gov/arb.

Participation in the NDCMP was determined through a county-level public process. District 1 is comprised of Bowman County and seven townships in Slope County. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

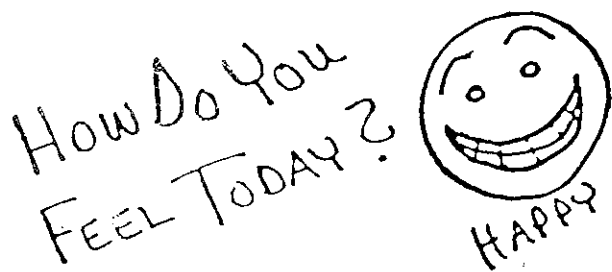

NOTICE Hettinger County Chemical Dispersal

DRIVE - THROUGH
NORTH OF COURTHOUSE -336 PACIFIC AVENUE IN MOTT

The Hettinger County Weed Control Board will be dispersing Tordon, Curtail, and Milestone at the **STORAGE BUILDING LOCATED NORTH OF THE COURTHOUSE IN MOTT** at 336 Pacific Avenue in Mott, from 9 AM to Noon, or until all chemicals on hand is dispersed, on **Thursday, September 15, 2022**. We will be having a "DRIVE-THROUGH" operation again this year, so you will not have to get out of your vehicle. Bringing your own pens will be helpful.

All landowners / operators must supply a land / FSA map of the area that is to be treated. The Weed Board will need to keep the map.

The cost for chemical will be \$35.00 per gallon of Tordon, \$75.00 per 2 1/2 gallon for Curtail, and \$40.00 for a quart of Milestone, with a limit 10 gallons of Curtail, 4 quarts of Milestone, and 5 gallons of Tordon, per producer.

EACH PERSON WILL BE ALLOWED TO PICK UP CHEMICAL AT THE LIMIT ESTABLISHED BY THE WEED BOARD. YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PICK UP CHEMICAL FOR ANYONE ELSE, ALTHOUGH A WIFE MAY PICK UP CHEMICAL FOR HER HUSBAND IF NOT RESTRICTED USE.

LANDOWNER SIGNATURE IS REQUIRED WITH PAYMENT ALONG WITH THE MAPS AT TIME OF DISTRIBUTION. CONTACT THE COUNTY EXTENSION OFFICE OR COUNTY AUDITOR'S OFFICE TO PICK UP THE FORM PRIOR TO DISTRIBUTION DAY IF NEEDED.

THIS WILL BE A FIRST COME FIRST SERVED DISPERSAL AND WILL BE HELD IN THE ABOVE STATED LOCATION ONLY. IF THE ENTIRE CHEMICAL SUPPLY IS GIVEN OUT THE DISPERSAL WILL BE OVER. SOME ITEMS ARE LIMITED SUPPLY ON HAND.

IF CHEMICAL IS LEFT AFTER THIS DISPERSAL DATE, PRODUCERS THAT HAVE NOT PICKED UP THEIR MAXIMUM OF CHEMICAL, WILL HAVE ONE (1) WEEK ONLY AFTER THIS DISPERSAL DAY TO PICK UP AT THESE LIMITS. Note: If you have picked up your maximum allotment of chemical, you are NOT allowed to get more.

Reflections on the Words of Life

By Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We continue today in the narrative of Daniel 6. Last time we saw that Daniel, in obedience to the higher law of God, defied the law that all prayer must be made to the king for thirty days. We saw in verse 10 something of the content of Daniel's prayer: He "gave thanks before his God." We read in verse 11, "Then these men assembled and found Daniel praying and making supplication before his God."

First let us notice that Daniel had a definite priority in prayer. He first thanked and praised God and then made his requests. If ever anyone was in a predicament that would justify fervent supplication, it was Daniel here. Certainly he did cry out fervently for God to help him. But since his early days, he had learned how to pray. He had learned that the most important thing we can do in prayer is to extol and thank God, and so that was how he began. Then he made supplication.

In verse 11 we see how the plot against Daniel starts to materialize. We should consider the pressing temptation that was upon him every time he went to his knees. In the first place, there was now a law against praying to God, and Daniel was a model law-abiding citizen. Though he knew he must obey God rather than man on this point, yet no doubt it added to the difficulty of the situation to be thought a law-breaker when he had been so faithful in his civil service. Besides that, Daniel's life was on the line, and can you imagine the temptations that Satan would bring to him? Perhaps he whispered things like, "Look at the influence you can have if you comply with the law and save your life. Don't make an issue of yourself by praying publicly; just go where no one can see you." Satan knows that a frontal assault will not work with many believers. Therefore he tries to erode their resistance by constant, wearying attacks. Though Satan prowls about like a roar-

ing lion, he can also be subtle in his persistent temptations. Sad to say, all too often a believer's resolve begins to crumble under such continual pressure.

But Daniel also knew what we have observed in him previously. He knew that the believer must always do what is right and leave the consequences with God. If we obey God, then we will have peace with Him and know that He will handle the consequences. Such knowledge strengthened Daniel to resist the attacks of the devil.

Friends, let us be aware that every person, as we naturally come into this world, is in Satan's kingdom. We learn from Ephesians 2:2 that before God saved any of us, we lived "according to the prince of the power of the air" (a reference to Satan). 1 John 5:19 states, "We know that we are of God, and the whole world lies under the sway of the wicked one." If we do not come out from under the sway of the wicked one, we will share his destiny, which is to spend eternity in the fires of hell. But God in His matchless grace devised a plan to free us from Satan's captivity. Jesus Christ, the eternal Son of God, became a man. He lived a life of perfect obedience to God's law. Then He willingly offered that life as a sacrifice to pay the penalty for all the sins of all who would place their trust in Him. Only by relying on what Christ did to make us right with God can we be transferred from Satan's kingdom of darkness and eternal death to God's Kingdom of everlasting life. It is my hope that all of us have been given grace to make this most important transfer.

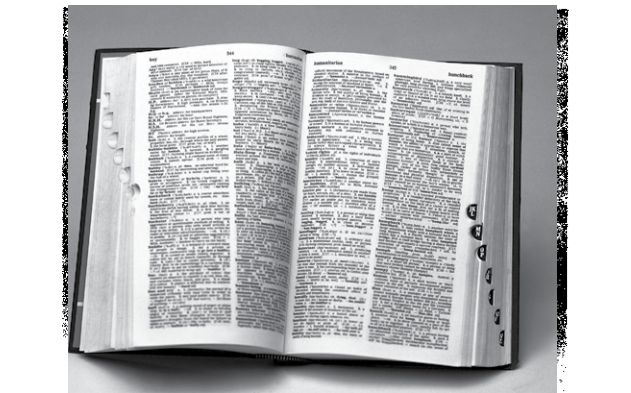

Praise You In The Storm

Yesterday evening I was surfing through Facebook on my iPhone and came across a 2-minute video from the Brooklyn Tabernacle Church in Brooklyn NY. The pastor is Jim Cymbala and he was sharing with his congregation about a prayer found in 2 Chronicles 20.

Now I know some of you out there might hesitate to read 1 and 2 Chronicles because you think it is all about who begat who and how many men were in each tribe, etc. But there are some amazing stories in these two books and Jim Cymbala found this extraordinary story.

Let me give you the 25-cent version: Jehoshaphat was the king of Judah following in his father's place, King Asa. Jehoshaphat was a good king though he did get himself into some trouble which God.

God sent the prophet, Hanani, to let Jehoshaphat know of his misdeeds, but also to thank him for getting rid of the idols in Judah, which was more than any king had done before him in some time.

Jehoshaphat got wind that 3 different armies were coming to fight against Judah and Jerusalem. The armies were only about 50 miles from Jerusalem and Jehoshaphat got scared and decided he was going to seek the Lord. He proclaimed a fast for Jerusalem and all of Judah came together and prayed for God's leading.

Jerusalem and Judah were

in trouble and were facing some massive foes...but Jehoshaphat had learned to rely on the LORD and had taught his people the same. Jehoshaphat had over 1 million soldiers under his command, which was enormous, but he was aware that neither the size of the army nor the depth of his fortification could protect him without the Lord's intervention.

Jehoshaphat stood publicly before the temple and on behalf of all the people, he pleaded with the Lord for deliverance. In his prayer he says in 2 Chronicles 20:9, "If disaster comes on us - sword or judgment, pestilence or famine - we will stand before this temple and before you, for your name is in this temple. We will cry out to you because of our distress, and you will hear and deliver." (CSB)

As he finished his prayer the Spirit of the LORD came on a priest, who was from the line and lineage of Asaph, one of King David's main musicians. He told the king to walk out to the place of confrontation with his army and to stand there and watch God bring the victory.

Jahaziel, the priest said in 2 Chronicles 20:17, "You do not have to fight this battle. Position yourselves, stand still, and see the salvation of the LORD. He is with you, Judah and Jerusalem. Do not be afraid or discouraged. Tomorrow, go out to face them, for the LORD is with you." (CSB)

Jehoshaphat believed that Jahaziel spoke God's message for them. There was nothing left to do but worship God, and a number of Levites took the lead in praising God. A meeting that was called together to deal with

some serious issues turned into a praise and worship service.

Jim Cymbala said these words, "God is saying...praise me despite your situations, and while you're praising me, you're going to see what great things I can do!"

Have you lost your praise because of the problem(s) you are facing? We all face different problems in our daily walk and sometimes they can seem as big as those 3 armies that Jehoshaphat was facing, but we have God who is with us! Hebrews 13:5b says, "I will never leave you or abandon you." (CSB)

I totally understand how different life situations and spiritual situations can cause us to be distraught, worried, and scared! I would like to share some lyrics from a song that Casting Crowns sang a few years ago. The title of this article is Praise You in The Storm and that is the title of the song.

Here are some of the lyrics:
I am sure by now God, You would have reached down and wiped our tears away
Stepped in and saved the day and once again I say, "Amen" and it's still raining
But as the thunder rolls, I barely hear Your whisper through the rain "I'm with you"
And as mercy falls, I'll raise my hands and praise the God who gives and takes away
I remember when I stumbled in the wind You heard my cry
You raised me up again, but my strength is almost gone
How can I carry on if I can't find You?
And I'll praise you in the storm and I will lift my hands
For You are who You are no

A Little Birdie Told Me

A Little Birdie Told Me: "If You're Headed West on I-94 into Montana You'll Want to Stop in Wibaux and Meet Pierre." Wibaux, MT was renamed in 1895 after Pierre Wibaux a prominent cattle rancher who had immigrated to the area from France in 1883. Pierre was born to a wealthy textile merchant in France, his Father sent him to England to study the textile industry. While in England he heard stories of fortunes being made in the American West: He returned to France 2 years later and informed his father he was going to America to be a cattle rancher.

Pierre arrived in Mungisville in 1883, a settlement in Eastern MT near the North Dakota border. He established his ranch headquarters the W-BAR on the Beaver Creek. By the mid 1890's his cattle ranch was one of the largest in the nation running some 65,000 head of cattle and 300 horses. Pierre Wibaux left funds in his will for a statue to be erected in his honor, "Overlooking the Land I Love so Well."

After visiting the statue of Pierre Wibaux I came upon the Catholic Church built in 1895. Pierre's Father was dismayed that his son's new home didn't have a Catholic Church and he instructed his son to build one. St. Peter's is a vernacular Gothic Revival structure: in 1938 the church was expanded and all the exterior walls covered in scoria rock. A new church was built in 1965 and the old converted to a catechism school. The church is listed on the Na-

tional Register of Historic Places.

Next stop the Pierre Wibaux Museum: Greeted by Lorena Qualley the tour began. The barbershop was our first stop then onto the Pierre Wibaux, W-Bar Ranch Headquarters. Everywhere you look there's Pierre Wibaux memorabilia. The rooms are beautifully adorned with period furnishings, including a picture of Queen Victoria belonging to Mrs. Wibaux.

The railcar was my favorite of the day: As we walked in I was amazed at the interior. The railcar was sent to the New York World's Fair in 1939 filled with Montana information, enticing people to "Go West Young Man." The railcar now proudly displays history of Wibaux and the surrounding area. Seated at the end of the car are two women enjoying a cup of coffee and maybe a bit of gossip?

Last stop the blacksmith shop home to an 1880 French Tricycle: The likes of which I've never scene before. Only three of these existed in America. The tricycle got very little use due to its small tires and the fact that there were no sidewalks to ride it on.

It was time to find the coffee shop at the General Store: The Hot Iron. Owned by: Dr. Shane & Cherry Harrington. The General Store has hardware, paint & sporting goods and has added the coffee shop. Rebecca Anderson made me a wonderful berry smoothie, perfect for the hot day. Unfortunately time was running out so no stopping at the Beaver Creek Brewer and Historic Gem Theater.

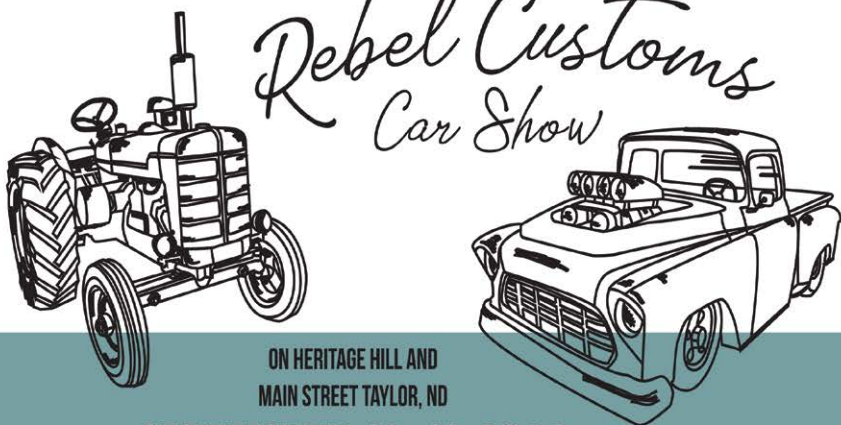

Scout for Palmer Amaranth Now The first step in managing Palmer Amaranth is to look for it and identify it

Palmer amaranth, the No. 1 weed problem in the U.S., has been located in a wheat field in Hettinger County this past week.

Palmer amaranth is a type of pigweed that has devastated crops in the South and Midwest, according to North Dakota State University Extension sugar beet agronomist Tom Peters. For example, it has reduced yield up to 91 percent in corn and 79 percent in soybeans.

Peters says this aggressive, competitive weed would pose a major threat to North Dakota crops because it can grow 2 to 3 inches per day in optimum conditions. The plants can grow to be 6 to 8 feet tall, and a single plant can produce up to 1 million seeds. Palmer amaranth also is hard to control because it is very prone to being resistant to herbicides.

Unlike other summer annual weeds that need to be controlled only through early summer, Palmer amaranth emerges throughout the growing season, notes Brian Jenks, weed scientist at NDSU's North Central Research Extension Center near Minot.

The first step in managing Palmer amaranth is to look for it and identify it. Local Hettinger County NDSU Extension Agent will assist in identification.

"Scout areas for plants that don't look right," Peters advises. Now is a good time to scout because Palmer amaranth is developing its distinctive long,

snaky seed heads, he says. The seed heads can grow up to 2 feet long.

Identifying Palmer amaranth can be difficult because it resembles redroot pigweed, smooth pigweed and waterhemp. Here are some ways to distinguish Palmer amaranth from similar-looking weeds:

- Seedlings have egg-shaped leaves and may have a hairlike protrusion on the leaf tip.

- The leaves and stem have few or no hairs.

- The petiole (leaf stem) will be as long as or longer than the leaf blade.

This time of year in western North Dakota, Palmer amaranth seeds are likely to be spread via custom harvest equipment as well as livestock feed, wildlife, wind and water. Seeds also have been found in native seed mixes used for pollinator or wildlife habitats and in hay. Peters noted that a lot of donated hay came into North Dakota in 2017 because of the severe drought the state was experiencing, so producers need to be on the lookout for Palmer amaranth and other weeds.

"This weed is a game changer and will be controlled only by a zero-tolerance policy," Jenks says.

People who see a plant they suspect is Palmer amaranth should contact the Hettinger County NDSU Extension agent at 701-824-2095.
