



Cloud Seeding Operations Summary For Aug. 25 - Aug. 31, 2025

BISMARCK, N.D. - Dry conditions and seasonal high temperatures in the upper 70s and low 80s dominated the weather last week in southwestern North Dakota.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, no operational flights were flown last week. Rain enhancement operations remained suspend-

This week, a cold front will move through southwestern North Dakota on Tuesday bringing a brief chance for rain and then conditions dry out for the remainder of the week. High temperatures should cool off into the 60s and 70s.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Department of Water Resources' web site at http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb. The NDCMP will be extended to September 8 due to wet conditions delaying harvest.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time in our study of 1 Peter, we saw that when believ-

ers live according to the Word of God, they will have an impact on society that will silence the critics of Christianity. We move on today to 1 Peter 2:16: "As free, yet not using liberty as a cloak

God." Peter is still concerned here with the believer's testimony in this world, and he speaks in this verse of the proper uses of Christian liberty, as we see from the words "as free." How believers use their liberty will have a great effect on their testimony with those outside the church, and even with those who are part of the church.

Let us begin with something of a definition of Christian liberty. Peter is speaking about a special area of freedom which ONLY the Christian has. We say that America is a free country, and compared with many other countries, it indeed is a place of great freedom. In theory, every citizen of this country enjoys the privileges of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness. But this verse is not dealing with the liberty which someone may have as citizen of a certain country. In fact, many of the people to whom Peter was originally writing were not living in a free country. They were slaves and servants, as we see from verse 18 of this chapter. Christian liberty belongs to a person who is a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ, regardless of whether he or she enjoys freedom in other areas of life. We read in John 8:31-36: "Then Jesus said to those Jews who believed Him, 'If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed. And you shall know the truth, and the truth shall make you free.' They answered Him, 'We are Abraham's descendants, and have never been in bondage to anyone. How can you say, "You will be made free"?' Jesus answered them, 'Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever commits sin is a slave of sin. And a slave does not abide in the house forever, but a son abides forever. Therefore if the Son makes you free, you shall be free indeed."

The most wonderful aspect of Christian liberty is that the believer is free from the slavery of sin and the condemnation from God which sin brings.

God's Word teaches that all of us are born sinful, and we all sin as a result (Romans 3:10-19). This brings us into a type of slavery. Jesus said in John 8:34, "Most assuredly, I say to you, whoever commits sin is a slave of sin." Because our minds, emotions, and wills are all affected by sin, we keep giving in to sin. It is a bondage

which no person can break on his or her own. This slavery to sin results in guilt and condemnation. God has given all people a conscience. Even people who have never read a Bible have a sense of right and wrong, which comes from being made in the image of God. That is why we feel guilty when we give in to sin. Because God is holy, He cannot overlook a single sin. In His holy eyes, our sin makes us deserving of His wrath and punishment. As Paul explains in Romans 1:18, "For the wrath

of God is revealed from heaven against all ungodliness and unrighteousness of men."

The glorious good news of the gospel is that Christ sets the believer free from the slavery of sin. Next time we shall see more about this, but I close by appealing to each of us to be sure that we have placed our trust in Christ alone. Only His perfect payment for sin on the cross is sufficient to erase the infinite debt we were under, making us slaves to sin. May we all be set free by the Son!

"Coffee Cake Recipe (from 1887)"

The calendar tells us that the fall season is coming our way again, and when it does, may I suggest baking the "Coffee Cake Recipe (from 1887)"? The warmth from the kitchen oven will feel 'GOOD'! Note: A yummy, sizeable slice of coffee cake and a hot cup of 'Morning Coffee' or 'Evening Tea'-either choice calls me into feeling grateful for a quiet, peaceful

.."Coffee Cake Recipe (from 1887)".....

'Maybe to some cooks, it will seem a little dry, but the raisins and spices really shine through.' Ingredients

- 1 cup brown sugar
- 1 cup butter
- 2 eggs
- 1/2 cup molasses 1 cup strong cold coffee
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 2 teaspoons cinnamon
- 1 teaspoon cloves 1 cup raisins or currants
- 5 cups flour

Instructions

"One cup of brown sugar, one cup of butter, two eggs, one-half cup of molasses, one cup of strong, cold coffee, one teaspoonful of soda, two teaspoonfuls of cinnamon, one teaspoonful of cloves, one cup of raisins or currants, and five cups of sifted flour. Add the fruit last rubbed in a little of the flour Bake for about one hour."

- Preheat oven to 330° F. Grease a loaf pan or small Bundt pan.
- Beat butter and sugar until light and fluffy.
- Stir in eggs, molasses, and

- Add flour, spices, and soda Stir until well mixed.
- Add raisins or currants, and stir until well incorporated.
- Spread into the prepared pan. Bake 1 hour (possibly less), or until the center is set.
- Cool, and frost if desired Cooking Notes:
- .. Considering the baking time, an hour could be a bit much. Finding the right combination of temperature and the choice of the baking pan's depth.

...The "Coffee Cake Recipe (from 1887)" appears to require a temperature of 330°F. The baking time of one hour is probably too lengthy for a 350° oven, regardless of the type of baking pan used. When the toothpick test comes out clean and the center is well set, you know the cake is done.

.....My first recommendation is to make this "Coffee Cake Recipe (from 1887)" in a loaf baking pan, which was customary for cakes in the 1800s. It still would be delicious in a shallow pan, but remember that you'll need to shorten the baking time, as I indicated before. Make sure the pan you use is well-greased.


...I suggest using a very light hand when weighing out the flour, and also fluff it before measuring. A little bit more flour than the recipe specifies won't be what you want.

......In the 1800s, frosting cakes of this kind was rather widespread. Making frosting for the "Coffee Cake Recipe (from 1887)" won't be going out on a limb too much. Use a simple frosting or glaze.

Estate Planning Seminar Draws 41 Area Residents to Hettinger!

To help educate our area public, the West River Health Services Foundation hosted the first of three free seminars on financial planning on Wednesday, August 20, at the NDSU Research and Extension Center. Steve Anderson and Jesse Sailer from Morgan Stanley in Bismarck made the 300-mile roundtrip to share their expertise with our eagerto-learn community.

At 6 p.m. sharp, forty-one attendees from seven area communities checked in for the seminar (on about the hottest day of the year!) and enjoyed a super tasty meal from Kennedy's Fresh Foods - bacon-wrapped pork tenderloins, peppered corn, dinner rolls and ice cold water. (Ted forgot to bring the potato salad out of the refrigerator! It was still scrumptious and much appreciated by all). Thanks to our friends at the nearby Hettinger Methodist Church, participants were also treated to real plates, forks and knives.

Once everyone was nourished, our guest speakers were introduced. Steve Anderson, Senior Vice President at Morgan Stanley and Branch Manager for the West Dakota Group, grew up in Grand Forks, graduated from UND, worked for eight years with a business management company in Bismarck, and has now been with Morgan Stanley for 31 years. His colleague, Jesse Sailer, carried the main portion of the evening's presentation. Born in Jamestown, she graduated from Jamestown High School, earned both her undergraduate and MBA degrees at the University of Mary, and spent nine years as a Senior Wealth Advisor at a local bank trust department before joining Morgan Stanley. She now serves as Senior Vice President at Morgan Stanley and as Vice President of the Western Dakota Estate Planning Council.

Anderson began with a brief overview of the current state of the marketplace. He noted that the market has rebounded and is currently thriving. He also pointed out

that lower interest rates have helped balance the bonds vs. stocks ratio in many portfolios. Still, he cautioned that a correction could be on the horizon this fall, as September and October have historically seen such shifts. He then handed things over to Sailer.

Sailer made it clear that her purpose was purely educational, not to tell people what to do with their finances. She approached the seminar holistically, encouraging attendees to explore their options, as each individual or family has unique circumstances and goals for their assets and estate. She emphasized that there is no onesize-fits-all approach.


Her presentation covered goal setting, assets, wills, trusts, and more, while also fielding audience questions along the way. She explained the differences between revocable and irrevocable trusts, IRA and Roth IRA accounts, CD's, the "Big Beautiful Bill," federal estate and gift tax exemptions, qualified charitable distributions, and tax benefits tied to charitable giving. She wrapped up with five key takeaways: get organized, build your team, consider your choices, document your plan, and communicate.
