Last week was...well...weird. A phenomenon which used to be rare is becoming more commonplace in the courthouse. Initially, I would point out that passing the Bar exam in North Dakota is what makes a person competent to present a legal interpretation in court not, one's feelings or personal opinions. Yet, what I am observing are litigants who have the mindset that their personal OPINION is established fact and, anyone who disagrees with them is in contempt of court. Case-in-point are the North Dakota vehicle registration requirements which are pretty specific. Our Century Code states that if a motor vehicle (regardless as to where it was originally purchased, licensed or registered) is being habitually driven on our roads, particularly to make a living in our state, it must (at least) have a valid, current license plate from its home state as well as not travel more than 20 miles into North Dakota or, it has to be registered annually in our state too. If the driver is merely traveling through our state, the vehicle is exempt but, if that vehicle is being used to make a living IN North Dakota, it needs to pay its fair share of road taxes. End of story.

Of course, there are exceptions for traveling to the nearest railway shipping station or college attendance from out-of-state but, if the owner of a vehicle owns, leases or rents a residence in North Dakota, his/her vehicle has to be registered with our state's dept. of transportation and that registration carried in the vehicle. And, if a driver has been gainfully employed or lived in North Dakota for at least 90 consecutive days, he/she is presumed to be a North Dakota resident who must register their vehicle here. So, that's what the "law" says on the subject. And, the fines and fees can add up. Which begs the question—"Why didn't the driver just check with our sheriff, the highway patrol or the Dept. of Transportation BEFORE running afoul of the statute?" The answer? "My Google search says..."

I'm not sure that a Google search trumps a law degree but, at the end of the day, when traveling through a foreign state or country, I always check up on any quirks in the law to make sure I don't get cross-wise with the locals. Case-in-point would have to be WNBA player Brittney Griner. When she tried to get a small amount of marijuana through Russian screening, she should have checked up on the subject beforehand because her 9-year prison sentence (she actually served 293 days in jail) revealed her flawed, personal opinion on the subject. Her subjective opinion did not impress (or trump) the Russian authorities and, at the end of the day, she's the one who sat in jail because her personal opinion ran afoul of their law. I guess the Russians got the last word on the subject. Who knew? Have a great week.

Adams County Weed Cutting and Hay Removal Policy

Therefore, all weeds and grass along Township roads, designated by each Township (Organized and Unorganized) and the Village of North Lemmon, shall be mowed no later than October 1st of each year.

The prescribed height of the stubble to be left shall not exceed six inches. The minimum width of the cut shall be nine feet. A windrow may not be left on the roadway or shoulder of the roadway.

Maps provided by the Townships or the County for Unorganized Townships designating the roads to be mowed will be on file on the County Website for the landowner or operators review.

The Adams County Road Department will mow County roads by October 15th of each year.

All hay bales on County road right-of-ways shall be removed by October 1st of each year. Failure to comply will result in Adams County assuming ownership and removal of the bales by Adams County or its designee.

Grateful Givers Club Drive Leads to 442 Members!

Grateful Givers Club, the annual fundraising club at West River Health Services Foundation, has finalized its official 2023-2024 membership list at 442 members! All 442 members have given \$100 or more to any fund at the WRHS Foundation this past year. We are full of gratitude.

Historically, our Grateful Givers Club was called Partners In Health Club. It began in 2002 as an annual giving club for needed medical equipment (over and above the Capital Budget) for West River Health Services and Western Horizons Living Centers (Care Center & Assisted Living Center). Over the last 23 years, over \$788,000 worth of needed medical equipment has been gifted via this Club's funds to our local healthcare system. A year ago, we were asked to stop using the name Partners

In Health Club, as it had been trademarked by another organization. We came up with a new name, Grateful Givers Club, versus spending thousands in court.

At the beginning, gifts to this Club were utilized strictly for needed equipment here. Now, you can belong to the Club by giving \$100+ over one year's time (only \$8.33/month or 27 cents/day!) to any fund here! Of course, if you select our Grateful Givers Club Fund, then your gift goes directly toward needed equipment at WRHS and WHLC. But now you can also give toward West River Ambulance, Western Horizons Living Centers, Healthcare Heroes Endowment, Physician Recruitment Endowment, General Endowment, Scholarship, Surgery Center, General Fund and more – and become a Member, too. There are still three giving levels: \$500+ Gold; \$250-\$499 Silver and \$100-\$249 Bronze. Kind of like the Olympics! Except the winner here is you – as needed equipment is then avail-

able here to take better care of you.

This past year, our Grateful Givers Club Fund gifted \$54,200 toward a pediatric colonoscope (\$26.7K), a cystoscope (\$8K), traction table (\$9K), vaccine refrigerator (\$7.5K) and a patient lift (\$3K). These needed pieces of equipment were determined to be the next greatest needs by our Administrative Team, after the Capital Budget had been approved. The very first year of this Club in 2002, two portable defibrillators were purchased for \$25,000 and given to West River Ambulance Service.

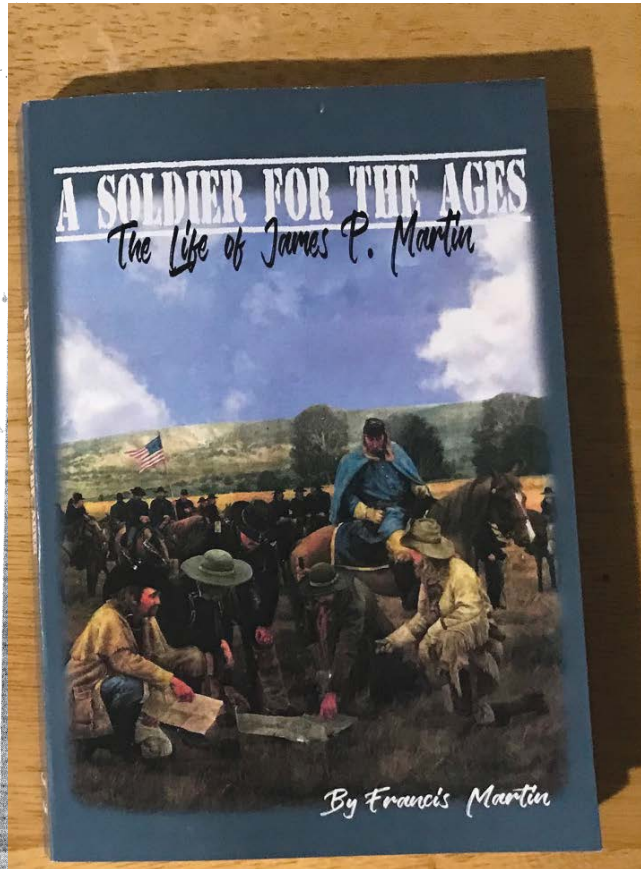

"When the works all done this fall."

"Do you mind if I change the subject for a minute?"

"Go ahead."

"Dan'l was diagnosed with cancer yesterday."

Paul just sat there, dumbfounded. "Well, he doesn't smoke or drink, so what is it?"

"Bone. It's something to do with all the damage that was done to his body when he was in Vietnam."

"Well, they didn't have to do that for James."

In October of 2003, Shorty received a large envelope in the mail from Frank Morris, the superintendent at the Custer Battlefield. Shorty hadn't forgotten about the talk he'd had with Morris, he just stored it with all the other information he'd gathered on his brother, James. It had been 25 years. He had to think about that. Had it really been that long since they'd talked, and he'd left his brothers' dog tags with him? He once again thanked Daniel for what he had done for him. Morris had said that he was finally at peace over the loss of his brother in Vietnam and that Shorty's words had given him closure. The envelope also contained some copies of some oral his-

tory from a Northern Cheyenne Indian warrior who had fought at the Last Stand Hill toward the southern edge of the hillside. They said this soldier was taller and fitter than the other soldiers and that he fired his big Enfield gun constantly and with deadly accuracy. They added that the other soldiers would fire their big guns and they would jam so they were easier to kill. 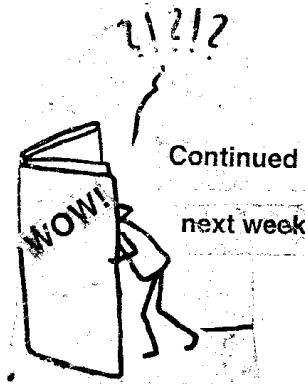

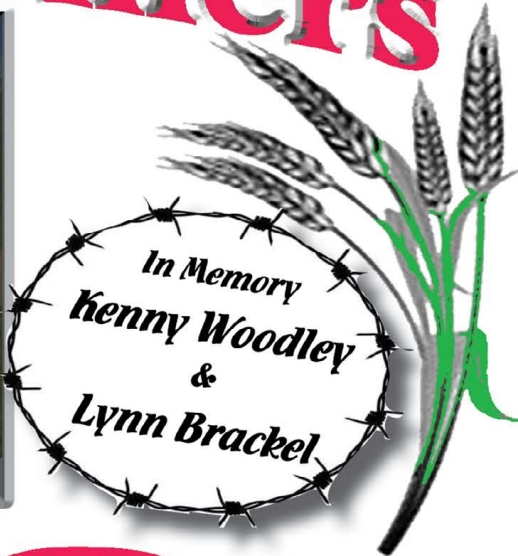



Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been looking together at the apostle Peter's teaching about suffering in 1 Peter 1:7: "that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ." Last time we saw that a main purpose of suffering is to purify the believer's faith. Faith is singled out because it is the very heart of what makes a true Christian. The Scripture tells us that it is by grace we are saved THROUGH FAITH. Faith is that God-given ability to

abandon all hope in one's self for salvation and to rely entirely upon the saving work of Jesus Christ on the cross (Ephesians 2:8-9). Faith, therefore, is what distinguishes a believer from an unbeliever. And it is that very faith which the Lord wants to purify and cause to grow by the trials He brings into our lives. God delights in the faith He has placed within His children, and so He purifies and refines it. As believers are put through trials, our faith muscles grow, and we learn to depend upon God more and more.

Peter says in our verse that faith is more precious than gold that perishes. Men go through much trouble to get gold. Many have moved across the continent to gain it. Some have

worked themselves to the bone, and others have lost their lives in its pursuit. But gold, in the end, perishes, for it is part of this temporary world. Faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, on the other hand, is the only thing that makes a person right with God and thus the only way to enter eternal life with Christ. If a man should acquire all the riches this world has to offer and die without faith in the Lord Jesus, he will go on to an eternity without God in hell.

We might at times imagine ourselves as people of great faith and think that we have made significant strides in spiritual growth. But let a little testing come along, and we may just find how quickly we fall apart. We discover that the gold of our faith still has much dross in it. It is good for us to see that, as it will drive us more to the Lord. As the Psalmist said in Psalm 119:67, "Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I keep Your word."

Finally, we learn from our

verse that God sends trials into believers' lives for the ultimate purpose of bringing glory, praise, and honor to Himself at Christ's return. The Lord Jesus Christ is coming once more to this earth. He is not coming, as the first time, in humility and relative obscurity. When He comes the second time, it will be in the full majesty of His glory. He will gather all His people to Himself, and there will be no more suffering for them. Instead, Jesus is going to give praise, honor, and glory to believers for their faith in Him. This is a mystery of God's grace. Remember that the believer's faith is the gift of God, and it is God who purifies it. Yet He delights to bestow upon it praise and honor and glory. But the praise and honor and glory which God gives to the faith of His people will ultimately redound to Himself. The reason why God created a universe and the reason why He saves sinners are ultimately to bring glory to Himself. Friends, have you placed your faith in the Lord Jesus Christ?

He shared his wit and sense of humor with all those around him, constantly brightening the days of those in his midst.

Roger was a social organizer throughout his life. One of his most successful recurring social events was Bonzer's happy hour with the teachers on Friday night. He loved his dollar schoolers and cheese popcorn, and his daughters often said, "It's your turn to go to Bonzer's with dad!" He was super proud when

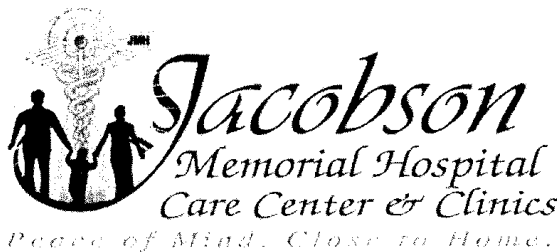

Dying in One's Own Sin

In the first Chapter of the Book of Numbers the Lord spoke to Moses in the Wilderness of Sinai, in the tabernacle of meeting, on the first day of the second month, in the second year after they had come out of the land of Egypt, saying: Take a census of all the congregation of the Children of Israel, by their families, by their fathers' houses, according to the number of names, every male individually, from 20 years old and above—all who are able to go to war in Israel. You and Aaron shall number them by their armies.

Then we go to Chapter 26 of Numbers and it came to pass, after the plague, that the Lord spoke to Moses and Eleazar the son of Aaron the priest, saying: Take a census of all the congregation of the Children of Israel from 20 years old and above, by their fathers' houses, all who are able to go to war in Israel. Only this time the census was taken in the plains of Moab by the Jordan, across from Jericho, just as the Lord commanded Moses and the children of Israel who came out of the land of Egypt.

Between the time of the first census and the second census the children of Israel had refused to be obedient to God by not entering the Promise Land after the spies had gone in to the land and surveyed the land and the cities for the Children of Israel, to go in and take the land as their possession, promised by God to them.

Numbers 26:64 says but among these there was not one man of those numbered by Moses and Aaron the priest when they numbered the children of Israel in the Wilderness of Sinia. For the Lord had said to them, they shall surely die in the wilderness.

After the census was done and the inheritance of each Tribe and family was being allotted. Zelophehad did not have sons but 5 daughters. He was the son of Hephher, son of Gilead, son of Machir, son of Manasseh of the son of Joseph. The daughters' names were Mahlah, Noah, Hoglah, Milcah and Tirzah. They brought to Moses and Eleazar attention the fact that their father died with no sons, just the daughters.

Asking why their fathers name should be removed from among his family because he had no sons. They ask for a possession among our father's brothers. One fact that they made quite clear about their father, Numbers 27:3 our father died in the wilderness; but he was not in the company of those who gathered against the Lord, in company of Korah, he died in his own sins. That right there is a powerful statement. It is not known when he died or how he died, because of Israel's many sins of disobedience, it could have been any number of

things, but not in the rebellion of Korah, the daughters made that clear. He died in his own sin.

John 8:24 Jesus said to the Jews of His day, I said therefore unto you, that ye shall die in your own sins: for if ye believe not that I am He, ye shall die in your sins. Colossians 3:5-7 says therefore put to death your members which are on earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. Because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience, in which you yourselves once walked when you lived in them.

Ephesians 2:1-2 And you He made alive who were dead in trespasses and sins, in which you once walked according to the course of this world, according to the prince of the power of the air, the spirit who now works in the sons of disobedience, among whom also we all once conducted ourselves in the lust of our flesh, fulfilling the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were by nature children of wrath, just as the others. But God has given us a way to escape our sins and the ways of this world that satan is continuously trying to pull us into. Through God's Grace, Mercy, Hope and most importantly His Forgiveness. He gave us His Son, His only begotten Son Jesus Christ. John 3:16 for God so loved the world the He gave His only begotten Son that whosoever calls on His name should not perish but have everlasting life.

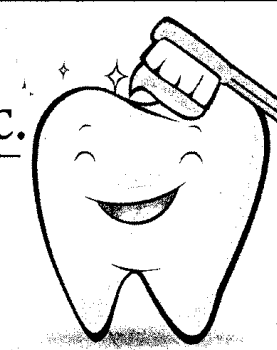

Thoughts for the Week

It is said that 'no good deed goes unpunished' and I am wondering if this is becoming more true than not in this current timeframe. There was a court case in which someone pulled an individual out of a car, assuming that they were doing the right thing to save their life, stating that they had seen smoke and in fear of their friends life, removed them from the car. Unfortunately, following the event, the rescued person is now paralyzed and feels that the friend that rescued her is at fault since they did not have medical training and their actions caused her paralysis. It was thought, prior to the court case, that a person in that situation was covered under the Good Samaritan Law, could not be sued as they were doing their best to save a life. However, it was determined in the court case that since the person had no medical training, they could be sued for damages if it was determined that their efforts to save had resulted in the paralysis.

Good samaritan laws are in place in all states and they were enacted to prevent people from civil liability for injuries when an attempt has been made to

aid someone needing medical attention. All 50 states and the District of Columbia have some form of the Good Samaritan Law. However, no two jurisdictions apply the same language in their laws. All states and the District of Columbia's Good Samaritan Laws exempt people from liability when using automated external defibrillators (AEDs) in an emergency. The Good Samaritan Law in California protects people who help others during emergencies from legal consequences in case of unintentional errors that might occur while providing aid. However, this protection has limitations. It only covers aid you perform in good faith. These laws do not protect against gross negligence or willfull actions. Gross negligence is a conscious and voluntary disregard of the need to use reasonable care, likely to cause foreseeable grave injury or harm to persons, property or both. Some states 'Good Samaritan' Laws protect all individuals who find themselves in an emergency situation where someone requires assistance, while other states laws only shield those who have completed basic first aid training and are certified by national health organizations.

Unfortunately, what this means is that if you come upon

an accident and wish to help, if you do not have the basic training to do so, even if you do your best, if the result is the person that you are helping claims you have injured them further than if you would have waited for professional care, you can be sued. If you do have professional certifications you would be protected from a lawsuit if you followed proper procedure from your training. I wonder if this means that if you yourself are in need of medical assistance, would someone stop and help you in your hour of need? I do believe

that there are more people that would hold you responsible these days if you were to accidentally injure someone in a bigger population area than ours, but I would hope that in our area, should there be an accident, that people would be willing to help and not consider consequences before doing so. That is part of the small town values that we here in the mid-west share, for the most part. It most probably stems from being in such a rural area that we quite often will help our neighbors when they are in need and we assume that they will do the same for us. It is quite sad to say that this is in the process of changing as our population demographics changes as those that move into our area sometimes never interact with anyone locally, choosing to keep to themselves or their close friends and family.

I guess what I am saying is that I believe in helping others and I am hoping that I am not in the minority. The only way to continue to have this type of community is to teach our children to help others and not expect to be paid for acts of kindness. Only by instilling small town values in the next generation

1/2 tsp. pepper

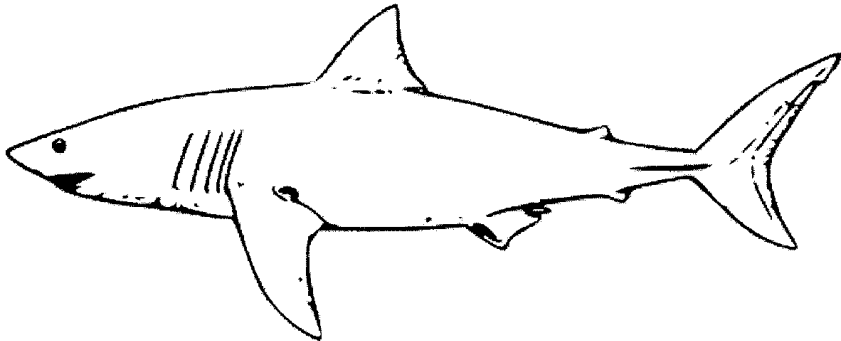
3 cups sugar
