BOWMAN COUNTY BURN BAN

Bowman County Commission has placed a county wide burn ban effective until further notice.

Any individual who willfully violates this burn ban by local order NDCC 37-17.1-10.1 is guilty of a Class B Misdemeanor. The maximum penalties for a Class B Misdemeanor are up to 30 days in jail and up to a \$1500 fine.

Adams County Farm Service Agency is Accepting Emergency Conservation Program Applications

FARGO, N.D., April 6, 2021 – U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Farm Service Agency (FSA) Executive Director Brooke Kessel today announced that Adams County is accepting applications for the Emergency Conservation Program (ECP) to address damages from the recent "Windy Fire" on January 14, 2021. ECP signup will begin on April 6, 2021 and end on May 14, 2021.

The approved ECP practices under this authorization include restoring permanent fences. ECP assists producers with the recovery cost to restore the farmland to pre-disaster conditions. Approved ECP applicants may receive up to 75 percent of the cost of approved restoration activity. Limited resource, socially disadvantaged and beginning farmers and ranchers may receive up to 90 percent cost-share.

"Dealing with natural disasters is never easy, especially when you have to consider the health and safety of livestock, but it's important for producers to call our office before they take any action," said Kessel.

Producers with damage from such events must apply for assistance prior to beginning reconstructive work. FSA's National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and environmental compliance review process is required to be completed before

any actions are taken. Submitting an application after reconstructive work has been completed may not qualify for ECP.

FSA county committees will evaluate applications based on an on-site inspection of the damaged land, taking into consideration the type and extent of the damage. An on-site inspection does not guarantee that cost-share funding will be provided.

The 2018 Farm Bill increased the payment limitation for ECP to \$500,000 per disaster. The use of ECP funds is limited to activities to return the land to the relative pre-disaster condition. Conservation concerns that were present on the land prior to the disaster are not eligible for ECP assistance.

With the current drought conditions, and shortages of hay and forage around the area, the Bowman County Weed Department would just like to remind everyone of the following.

4.1-47-02. Control of noxious weeds.

1. Each person shall do all things necessary and proper to control the spread of noxious weeds.
2. No person may distribute, sell, or offer for sale within this state a noxious weed.

4.1-47-30. Preventing the dissemination of noxious weeds - Penalty.

1. a. A person may not willfully transport any material that contains noxious weed seeds or propagating parts, on a public road, in a manner that allows for the dissemination of noxious weeds.
 - b. A person may not willfully drive or transport any equipment, on a public road, in a manner that allows for the dissemination of noxious weeds.
 - c. A person may not willfully dispose of any material that contains noxious weed seeds or propagating parts in a manner that allows for the dissemination of noxious weeds.
2. Any person who violates this section is guilty of a class B misdemeanor.

So, if you are buying or selling hay just be careful and aware of the North Dakota State laws on noxious weed control. The Bowman County Weed Department would like to thank everyone for their efforts in controlling the spread of noxious weeds.

Expressions of HOPE

Reflections on the Words of Life

Is your Bible gathering dust? Probably most American homes have a Bible, if not several. But it is likely that many of these Bibles are seldom or never opened or used. Why? Because for many years there has been a growing belief among Americans that the Bible is just a left-over from a bygone day when Americans were more religious. Many believe it is outdated and really has nothing to say to a society which is centuries removed from the people and times for which it was originally written.

But what I've discovered as I've read and studied and meditated upon the Bible for over forty years is that it is just as relevant to people today as it was to those to whom it was first written. In fact, I find that it is the MOST relevant and the most enlightening book. It analyzes people perfectly and gives us solid reasons which explain why the world is the way it is.

You see, the nature of the Bible is different from that of other books. This is because the ultimate author of the Bible is not people. Of course I'm not saying that people were not involved in the writing of the Bible. The Bible itself claims to be the work of many people like Moses, David, Isaiah, Matthew, John, Paul, and many others. But what is different about the human authors of the Bible is that they were divinely inspired to write what they wrote. And in the process, God the Holy Spirit so guarded their writing that what we have in the Bible is the inerrant and infallible Word of God Himself.

Peter spells this out for us in 2 Peter 1:19-21: "And so we

have the prophetic word confirmed, which you do well to heed as a light that shines in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts; knowing this first, that no prophecy of Scripture is of any private interpretation, for prophecy never came by the will of man, but holy men of God spoke as they were moved by the Holy Spirit." What Peter is saying is that God used men to write what He wanted them to write. The apostle Paul echoes this thought in 1 Timothy 3:16-17: "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work."

Why is this so important? It is vitally important because the Bible is the only infallible source we have on this earth to find out the truth about God and our relationship to Him. All other religions are the inventions of people and have no direct divine authority. The Bible makes it clear that a catastrophe has happened to the human race. The first human being that God created rebelled by sinning against Him. As a result of that, every human being who comes into this world is in the predicament of being estranged from God and under His wrath because the sin of Adam is passed down to each of us (Romans 5:12). The proof that we are born with a sinful nature is that we go on to commit our own sins against God. Just take a close look at the world, and you will see that the conditions that exist confirm everything the Bible is saying. And the Bible reveals to us the only hope for mankind: the salvation which God Himself has provided through the Lord Jesus Christ. Yes, it's all in the Bible. God sent His Son into this world to die for sinners in order to save them from sin and make them His beloved children. By simply placing our trust in the



Incident: On March 29, 2021 at 6:10 pm, the Prairie City and Bison Fire Departments responded to a report of a major grass fire four miles northeast of Prairie City and twelve miles northwest of Bison in Perkins County, South Dakota. At the time of the call winds at the Bison Airport were in excess of 40 to 50 miles per hour sustained winds, with a high gust of 60 recorded on Monday, March 29th. Prairie City and Bison Fire Departments immediately responded

and requested mutual aid from around the region.

An initial attack was made and the fire was nearly contained at the Bixby Road southwest of Bison, near the Bison Golf Course. Due to the extreme and critical fire conditions the fire spread further east and the head was ultimately stopped four miles south of Bison at 3:30 am, Tuesday March 30, 2021. Both South Dakota Highway 20 and the Bixby Road were closed as fire crews battled the blaze and reopened several hours later.

Twenty seven fire departments, with an unknown number of personnel and equipment, fought the fire along with several agencies and individuals providing crucial support supplying water and fire brakes. No injuries or fatalities have been reported.

The fire was approximately twelve miles long and two miles wide in places. The initial estimated number of acres burned was between 7,000 and 8,000 and total currently after the Tuesday flare-up is estimated between 10,800 and 11,800.

At approximately 2:20 pm, Tuesday afternoon, March 30th, the fire flared-up on the southwest flank near the junction of South Dakota Highways 20 and 75. Crews were immediately on

scene but could not contain the outbreak. With sustained winds of nearly 40 mph the fire skirted along the southwest flank and ran nearly nine miles to the southeast. South Dakota Highway 20 and the Bixby Road were closed once again. The head of the fire was stopped in cropland at approximately 5:50 pm after burning nearly an additional 4,000 acres. Extreme windy conditions made fighting efforts difficult. Major damage was caused to a Bison Fire Apparatus and there are several reports of other damages to fire-fighting equipment. Most mutual aid departments returned to extinguish this fast moving intense fire. All roads were later reopened.

On Wednesday, March 31st the fire continued to burn within the perimeter of the burned area and did not pose a threat. Several departments including Bison, Prairie City, Lodgepole, Hettinger and Lemmon continued to monitor and conduct mop-up operations. All highways remained open Wednesday. Containment remained at 80% Wednesday afternoon. Progress was made extinguishing hot spots and ensuring the fire did not jump the established perimeter. While there were some islands of grass burning inside the line, there were no threats of significant flare-up. Additional fire brakes were created around the fire boundary with farm equipment. Local fire departments continued to monitor the area. The Divide Fire on Wednesday was deemed to be 95% contained.

After poor conditions on Thursday the Divide Fire remained at 95% contained. After a day of extremely dry conditions and a high wind gust of 28 mph recorded at Bison, the fire line remained largely intact. A brief flare-up occurred at 2:45 pm on the north flank and was quickly extinguished by fire crews with only a nominal amount of grass burned.

The Divide Fire remained at 95% containment on Friday April 2nd. Fire crews were on scene to respond to active burning within the fire perimeter. Grass islands and hotspots continued to produce smoke throughout the day. The Bison Fire Department and area departments continued to monitor and respond.

No residences were lost during the duration of this fire, however several outbuildings were destroyed. Injury and death to livestock have been reported. Several producers have experienced staggering hay loss as well.

"The Divide Fire has challenged us all, but I believe we have met this challenge head-on with hours of hard work and commitment. I sincerely thank the countless volunteers from around the entire area and all the members of the Bison Fire Department that have stood

watch over this disaster making sure it stayed in its boundary. Many other businesses and individuals need our thanks as well for stepping up and providing water, equipment and food for this operation. We were able to spare every occupied residence in this massive fire and this is a testament to the dedication of all that assisted in so many ways," stated Incident Commander and Bison Fire Chief David Kopren. Chief Kopren determined the fire to be 100% contained Saturday evening, April 3, 2021.

"Since the very beginning of this horrific prairie fire, the assistance response has been overwhelming. The Bison Fire De-

partment under the leadership of Chief Kopren has ensured that there was not a single residence lost and the fire stopped. All of our area communities should be proud of how their fire departments responded in the worst of conditions and were ultimately successful in their objective. The Bison Fire Department thanks all the agencies, individuals and mutual aid departments that responded to the Divide Fire," commented Bison Fire Department Public Information Officer Shane Penfield.

The nature of the ignition of the fire has been determined as accidental and a result of the customary use of equipment.




A LITTLE BIRDIE TOLD ME

RECIPE OF THE DAY

TRIPLE CHOCOLATE BANANA BREAD

- 1 cup sugar
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1/2 cup unsweetened cocoa
- 2 tired bananas
- 2 eggs
- 7 tablespoons Almond Breeze Chocolate Almondmilk
- 1 teaspoon vinegar
- 1 teaspoon baking soda
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 3/4 cups all-purpose flour
- 1 cup chocolate chips plus a few more for the top of the bread

Preheat oven to 350°. Spray 9x5" loaf pan with nonstick cooking spray. Stir sugar, oil, and cocoa in a large bowl. Set aside. Add the bananas, eggs, almond milk, vinegar, and baking soda to a blender. Mix until liquefied. Pour half of the banana mixture into the sugar mixture with 1 cup of flour and mix until just combined. Repeat with the rest of the liquid and flour. Do not over mix! Stir in the chocolate chips. Pour into loaf pan. Sprinkle top with a sprinkling of chocolate chips. Bake approximately 40-50 minutes, or until a toothpick comes out almost clean from the center of the bread.
