






Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Today, my friends, I'd like for us to think together about what it means to have a purposeful life. You might expect a pastor to say that the way to have a purposeful, meaningful life is by becoming a missionary or engaging in some other form of what is called "full-time Christian work." But for all of you who are believers in the Lord Jesus Christ, I want to encourage you by pointing out that the Bible teaches that you can have a meaningful life doing whatever God has called you to do, by doing it unto Him. Notice what the apostle Paul told the Colossian Christians in Colossians 3:17: "And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through Him." In a similar manner, note what the same apostle told the Corinthian Christians in 1 Corinthians 10:31: "Therefore, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God."

What is so encouraging about these passages is that they teach us that it is possible to turn ANYTHING and EVERY-THING a believer does into something that brings glory to God. Even things as simple as eating our meals can be done to the glory of God. And if the Christian goes about his or her daily work with the deliberate purpose of serving the Lord in the way he or she does it, then that work is a means of glorify-

ing the Lord. Am I saying that Christians should not pursue full-time Christian work? Of course not! There is an urgent need for believers to go to the many parts of the world where people have never heard the gospel of Jesus Christ and to tell them how they can be saved by trusting in the sacrifice of our Lord to make them right with God. But becoming a full-time missionary involves a special calling from God, and most believers are not called in that way. So we make a great mistake if we think that missionaries are the ONLY ones who are serving the Lord with their lives.

To me, friends, it is very exciting to think that the Christian truck driver or carpenter or waitress or doctor or nurse or farmer or rancher or homemaker or teacher or who seeks to honor God in his or her calling is glorifying God just as much as the missionary. What matters is whether or not one's work is done as unto the Lord. Of course, a Christian can go to work and NOT do it as unto the Lord. If he thinks only of himself and the money he is trying to earn and the things he would like to do with his money, then it is unlikely that he will do his job as unto the Lord.

You see, my friends, for the Christian to do his or her work as unto the Lord, he or she must have a DUAL purpose. One of those purposes must be to do the job to the best of his ability, seeking to honor the Lord in the WAY he does his work. But the Christian must also seek to be a witness for Christ as he or she



Dr. Toshi Is In!

Recently, I heard of something called "Health Adjusted Life Expectancy (HALE)." What is that?

HALE stands for Health Adjusted Life Expectancy, which I'll cail health expectancy. But before going into that topic, I'd like to ask you a question. Why do you go see your doctor? And why do you think doctors and providers ask you to be seen regularly even when you're feeling well?

Of course, when you get sick or don't feel well or get injured, you go to a doctor or other healthcare provider or to a hospital. You want to get the problem fixed. But what about going to the doctor when you're feeling well? Why do we have to get health screening tests like a colonoscopy, mammogram, cervical cancer screening (PAP smear) as we get older even though we may feel just fine? Why do we do that? Some people think it's because the doctors, other providers, and hospitals just want money, and it's actually just a waste of time and money. I can understand why someone might feel that way.

So, let's talk about "Healthy Expectancy' today, which has a lot to do with why you should see your doctor or other provider regularly even when everything is going well.

No one knows about his or her future, and no one knows when their life will end. Even well-trained doctors in fields like oncology (cancer medicine) aren't good at predicting this for individuals. There are many faccal conditions and your health, including your activities (including exercise, smoking, alcohol, etc.), the environment you live in (which might be stressful, or have exposure to toxins, etc.), and your genes (so choose your parents wisely! ;-). So, as you can see, you have control over many of these things. You and I would want the best possible likelihood to have a long, healthy

I'm sure you've heard of "life expectancy." Older people who look into Social Security certainly have seen this term for planning purposes. In fact, there is a Social Security website where you can get an estimated life expectancy calculated for yourself based on a lot of statistical data collected in research. (If you're interested, you can to go a website called "Life Expectancy Calculator" at https://www.ssa.gov/ oact/population/longevity.html. You don't have to be a certain age to use this calculator; you can even use it for newborn babies! Now, this is just a general, statistical life expectancy - how many years you may expect to live based on general population data. It doesn't take into consideration your genetics, your environment, or other important factors like smoking, exercise, your weight, or medical conditions you may have.

"Health Adjusted Life Expectancy (HALE)" (health expectancy) is a little different. It's the "average number of years that a person can expect to live in full health." Just be aware that it's the "average number of years"

for a population, but it's different for each individual depending on the personal factors I mentioned

As you might have guessed, a person's health expectancy is shorter than their "life expectancy." In the US in 2020, life expectancy at birth is 75.2 years old for men and 80.5 years old for women. (By the way, it went down a little in 2020 from 2019. Population researchers think it's due to COVID-19 as well as a surge in drug overdoses from opioids.)

In 2019, health expectancy at birth in the US was 65.2 years old for men and 67.0 years old for women. That means that for an average person who is just born can expect to have full health for that many years and continue to live with health problems for 10-13 more years after that. There is another health adjusted life expectancy called, "Health Life Expectancy at age 60." That's the average of number of years of full health left at age 60 for someone who is healthy when they're 60, and that is 15.6 years for men and 17.1 years for women. In other words, if you made it to 60 years old in good health, you can expect to continue to be in full health for that many more years on average.

So, all this is about the likelihood of having a long, healthy life. And when you talk about a longer, healthier life, preventive medicine becomes extremely important. Your primary care physicians and providers can help you stay healthy.



Vaccines encouraged by JMHCC

Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center (JMHCC) continues to remind residents to schedule a COVID-19 vaccination with a local clinic. Either the Moderna or the Pfizer vaccine will be available to anyone 18

Those wishing to receive the COVID-19 vaccine are reminded to call one of JMHCC's local clinics to be vaccinated. The vaccine is followed with a booster shot 21 to 28 days later.

Clinics include the Elgin Community Clinic at 584-3338, the Glen Ullin Family Medical Clinic at 348-9175 or the Richardton Clinic at 974-3372.

Dr. Elizabeth Sundberg is just one provider recommending the vaccine to her patients.

'One of the most amazing things is most vaccines are considered to be great successes if they are 50 to 70 percent effective. Both the Moderna and the Pfizer, based on the studies we have so far, are running 90-plus. That's unheard of," Sundberg said when the vaccine became available in January.

The country is not past the COVID-19 pandemic, and vaccination is one of the best methods of protecting yourself and your family.

"Increased compliance with public health mitigation strategies, such as vaccination, physical distancing, masks, hand hygiene and isolation, is essential to limit spread of the virus and protect public health. Vaccines,

free and available to the public, remain the best intervention for ending the pandemic," said JMHCC Director of Nursing Jill

"Multiple variants of the virus that causes COVID-19 are circulating globally and within the United States. These variants seem to spread more easily and rapidly than other variants, particularly in children and young adults. An increase in the number of cases will put more strain on health care resources, lead to more hospitalizations, and potentially more deaths. While research suggests that COVID-19 vaccines have lower efficacy against these variants, the vaccines still appear to provide protection against severe COVID-19," Feser said.

The N.D. Department of Health has immunization guidance on its website, https://www. health.nd.gov/covid-19-vaccine-information, answering common questions about the COVID-19 vaccinations, with fact sheets on the three common vaccines.

Several misconceptions regarding the vaccine may be keeping the public from getting immunized. Many of those misconceptions are addressed within the N.D. Department of Health question-and-answer format, so the public is encouraged to read that information.

If you have other questions or would like to speak to a provider or nurse prior to vaccination, contact your local health care provider at the clinic num-

Legislative News for District 31

Eido/Connect Country

by Representative Karen Rohr

As of the writing of this update, all the senate bills have been introduced in the Human Services and Government and Affairs Committees. Human Services has SB 2124 left to act on in committee. This bill relates to permitting virtual session of the legislative assembly during an emergency or disaster and to the state health officer's and governor's authority during a declared emergency or disaster. Government and Veterans Affairs has SB 2046 left to act on which relates to employee and employer contributions to Public Employees Retirement system. Below is a summary of interesting bills and action taken in each of the committees.

Human Services Committee

SB 2145 Relating to access to long term care facilities. The bill allows a resident of a long-term care (LTC) facility to designate one or more individuals as the resident's essential caregiver during a declaration of disaster or emergency. The essential caregiver must meet the necessary qualifications to enter the LTC facility to provide in-person physical, spiritual, or emotional support to the resident. The bili was amended to address liability and that the facility may require the essential caregiver to provide personal protective equipment and undergo any related training or assume the cost of the PPE and training. This bill will probably end up in conference committee for further discussion and amendments. Six other states are currently looking at similar legislation. Committee voted 13-1 Do Pass as Amended

SB 2212 To provide for a legislative management study of prescription drug pricing, importation, and reference pricing. The study must include input from the public employee's retirement system, workforce safety and insurance, the insurance commissioner, state board of pharmacy, prescription drug wholesalers in Canada and the public. Committee voted 13-1 Do Pass

Government and Veterans Affairs

SB 2271 An act to provide a statement of legislative intent regarding presidential elections

and to provide a directive. Section 1 and section 2 of this bill were amended. Section 1 states that it is the intent of the 67th legislative assembly to oppose the national popular vote interstate compact, which will circumvent the electoral process set forth in the US constitution. The 67th legislative assembly urges congress not to consent interstate compact and to oppose any efforts to seek a national popular election of the president other than an amendment to the constitution. Section

> Pray for Rain

2 directs the secretary of state to forward a copy of the enrolled version of the bill to president of the US Senate, speaker of the US Representatives and each member of the ND delegation. Committee voted 12-1-1 Do Pass as Amended.

SCR 2282 Relating to membership of the board of university and school lands. This bill would have added the ND Agriculture Commissioner to the board. This board has existed for over 100 years and its purpose is to generate funding to support the public education system. Board membership includes the governor, secretary of state, attorney general, state treasurer, and superintendent of public instruction. Adding the ag commissioner to this board would increase the membership to six and committee was informed that includes three of the three members of the Industrial Commission. The committee heard no strong testimony

in support of this bill. The bill was amended directing legislative management to study the membership of the board of university and school lands and Industrial Commission. The study is to include consideration of potential conflicts of interest relating to memberships, possible changes to the composition of the memberships and possible changes to Article IX of the ND Constitution, Committee voted 13-0-1 Do Pass as Amended

This is a summary of interesting bills heard in each of the committees. Conference committees are meeting to reconcile differing versions of bills passed in both chambers. thought about what she was doing constructively and waymore than formal titles and degrees. Also, I realized that many of us are leaders in our walks of life whether we are aware of it or not.



Ronald Duane VanSlooten Rites Held

April 25, 1948 - March 20, 2021 Raised to New Life!

Ronald D. VanSlooten, 72, of Federal Way, WA passed



away at St. Joseph Medical Center in Tacoma, WA. on Saturday evening, March 20, 2021 due to complications from several strokes and aneurysms.

Ron was born in Hettinger, ND on April 25, 1948 to Theodore (Ted) and Lila (Eggebo) VanSlooten. He grew up on his parent's sheep ranch near Lodgepole, SD and graduated from Hettinger High School in 1966. Ron continued his education in Auto Mechanics at the North Dakota State School of Science in Wahpeton, ND before enlisting in the US Air Force to the boom town of Gillette, WY in June 1968. He served in active duty until June 1972 in the many oil wells being drilled and 350th Munitions Maintenance Squadron. Three of the four years Ron was in the Air Force hand for Updike Brothers Well were spent overseas in Germa-

ny at Hahn Air Force Base located 60 miles west of Wiesbaden. It was there that Ron met his sweetheart and future wife, Sue Burgemeister, in October 1970 during her senior year in high

Ron took advantage of his time overseas by exploring as many different countries in Europe as he could. When he returned to SD his uncle asked if Ron had trouble communicating since there were so many languages. Ron said he often found someone who spoke English. Then Ron's Grandpa Ole Eggebo from Norway spoke up and said "Ya, But dey don't speeka da goot English like vee do!" Grandpa still had quite a Norwegian accent!

After being honorably discharged from the Air Force, Ron returned to his home in SD. Sue followed from Germany a month later and they were married in Rapid City, SD on Aug. 18, 1972. Ron's aircraft and mechanical interests led them to Tulsa, OK where he attended Spartan School of Aeronautics from September 1972 to February 1974.

Once school was completed, Ron and Sue moved to Rapid City, SD where Ron worked as an aircraft mechanic at the Rapid City Regional Airport until December 1976. In the dead of winter, they moved further west which was growing due to the open pit coal mines. Ron worked for a year as an oilfield derrick Servicing Company before re-

turning to his career in aviation. Ron worked as the Director of Maintenance for Executive Air Services in Gillette from 1978 to 1984, after which he opened his own aircraft maintenance facility of Aircraft Services, Inc. which was in operation until 1989.

Seeking more moderate temperatures and new adventures, Ron and Sue moved westward again in March 1989 to Federal Way, WA located 23 miles south of Seattle. Ron began working for the amphibious airplane company of Lake Aircraft at the Renton City Airport. The experience and knowledge Ron gained from his time with Lake were of great benefit when he joined with a partner and opened up a new business in April 1994 called Talon Aviation at the Pierce County Airport (Thun Field) in Puyallup, WA. In the fall of 2008, Ron's final career move as Director of Maintenance was to Avian Aeronautics at the Bremerton National Airport after which he retired in May 2013 to begin his life of lei-

Ron was a very gifted man. He thrived on designing and creating everything from furniture, to landscaping, from van conversions to sun rooms, from interior design to yard art. If he didn't have a tool needed to do the job, he'd make one. His "Man Cave" was his garage. His ability to fix nearly everything was a blessing and a help to

Ron was also a planner and an explorer. He should have been a vacation tour guide. He loved showing friends and family the many beautiful parts of the country where he lived. Being outdoors in God's creation was one of his greatest joys. On Monday mornings the people he worked with would often ask him what great adventures he'd been on the past weekend. He always got out, even if it was just for a Sunday drive or to go sit down at the park by the wa-

Ron was also in love with our Lord Jesus. Going beyond simply attending church, he served communion, was an usher, led a home group Bible study, and reached out to several men to have weekly breakfasts or lunches together. Whenever he gathered with a group of people, Ron had a joke or two to share. He was Norwegian himself, and had more Ole and Lena stories to tell than anyone we ever

knew! As Ron reflected on his life, he came to see how often the Lord's hand had guided his steps, and knew someday God would call him home. He is rejoicing with his Lord and is more alive now than ever before. Thank you Ron for the joy, love,

deep friendship, and blessings you gave to so many of us. We look forward to the day we will see you again.

Ron is survived by his wife Sue A. VanSlooten of Federal Way, WA; his sister Lois (James) Steiner of Belie Fourche, SD; and nephews Stoney Kilmer of Black Hawk, SD; and Chet (Kristen) Kilmer of Spearfish, SD; as well as his aunts Myna (VanSlooten) Tescher of Belle Fourche, SD; and Irene (Eggebo) Abelseth of Sturgis, SD; along with many grand nieces and cousins.

Ron was preceded in death by his father Ted, mother Lila, and brother Kevin.


EGG MCMUFFIN BREAKFAST **CASSEROLE**






