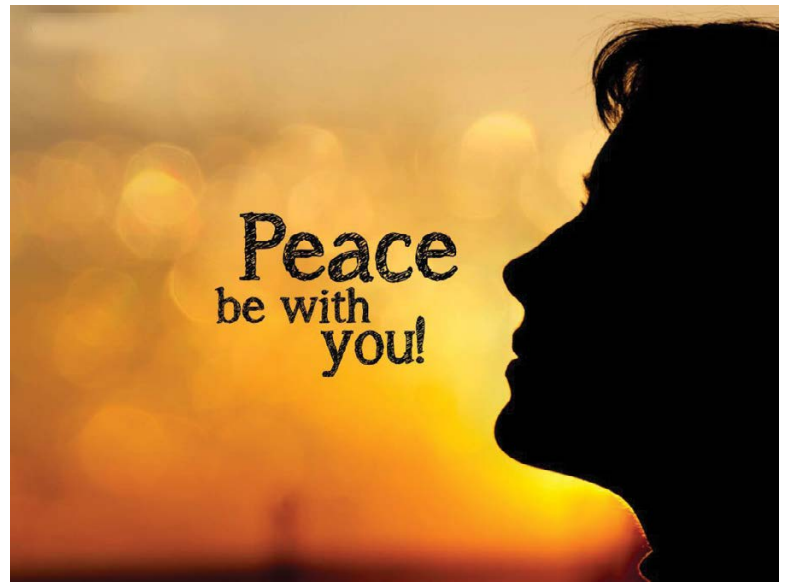



We congratulate John on his retirement, and wish him all the best as he spends time at the lake and with the grand-kids. Please feel free to extend your heartfelt wishes directly to John.

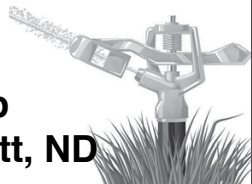

Compass Connection

What am I so angry about?

Do you feel like you are angry or mad all the time? Have others told you to 'calm down' or 'not be so angry' about topics and discussions you are involved in? Do you need to feel right or win a fight to have validation for your emotions?

Well, I have some information about anger for you to ponder in the upcoming days, about whether this anger is IN you, or you see it in others around you. First, I need you to know ANGER is a secondary emotion. This means there are other emotions happening first, which lead you to get angry. These emotions are primarily HURT and FEAR. This hurt can be physical, amental, spiritual, or sexual. When another person hurts us in one of these ways, we get scared. Scared they will do it again. Scared the pain will be just as bad or worse than the first time. Scared others will know we have been 'damaged' or 'weakened' in some way. Confused why this person we trusted, hurt us in this way. We don't set boundaries. Fear of a never-ending cycle appears. We allow others actions upon us to fester and linger, causing us to think about the hurt and fear over and over again.... finally leading us to being tired of these thoughts and feelings controlling our happiness. Our protective instincts kick in and we fight back, With ANGER. Anger helps us feel in control and have the perception that we are no longer weak and will not be able to get hurt. Anger often assists us in feeling powerful and strong, however it is mostly just intimidation. Over time, if trying to find happiness and peace are unsuccessful, depression often sets in under the disguise of anger. Depression and hopelessness are often first identified as anger.

Next time you encounter someone that is angry, instead of getting angry back at them, ask yourself..."How can I help them and not hurt them?"

Dr. Toshi Is In!

Dear Dr. Toshi,

I know that the heart and the lungs along with trachea (the windpipe that goes to the lungs for breathing) and esophagus (the "pipe" that goes to the stomach for food and fluids) are in the chest, but what's in the abdomen?

Many people wonder what organs are in the abdomen (tummy) and aren't quite sure where they're located. So, I thought I'd give you a quick tour of your abdomen today.

When you look at yourself in the mirror, you know roughly where your chest is and your abdomen is. If you press on the center of your chest between your ribs, you can feel your breastbone (which is called the sternum), and if you follow it down to the bottom, that's about where the chest ends and the abdomen begins.

Doctors and other medical providers often talk about the anatomy of the abdomen using unfamiliar terminology, so let's talk about what you see in the mirror. Using your belly but-

ton (the medical term for this is the "umbilicus") as the center of your abdomen, you can draw imaginary lines horizontally and vertically through it to make a big plus sign. In medical terms, you just created four areas: your right upper quadrant, right lower quadrant, left upper quadrant, and left lower quadrant. In addition to those four "quadrants," doctors and providers also use the words, "epigastric" and "periumbilical." The epigastric area is the upper abdomen just under the bottom of your sternum, and periumbilical means the area around your belly button.

Your chest and your abdomen are divided by your diaphragm. You've probably heard of the diaphragm, but do you know what it actually is? Your diaphragm is simply a large dome-shaped muscle that separates your chest and abdomen. In other words, it's the floor of your chest, and the roof of your abdomen. It's also the major muscle that helps you breathe. The diaphragm muscle also has three openings in it: one for the esoph-

agus, one for the aorta (the giant artery the size of a garden hose that comes from your heart), and one for a major vein going back up to the heart called the inferior vena cava. Those three "pipes" run through both your chest and abdomen, so they have to go through your diaphragm. As I mentioned above, the esophagus is the pipe for food and fluids and after right after going through your diaphragm, it connects to your stomach, which is right under your diaphragm. Sometimes people have a condition called a "hiatal hernia," where the opening in the diaphragm for the esophagus gets loose and larger, and the stomach protrudes up a little into the chest cavity where it doesn't belong.

Now let's look at the four areas in your abdomen. First, in your right upper quadrant (under the right side of your chest), you have your liver and gall bladder. In your right lower quadrant, you have your intestines and your appendix, which is a small offshoot from your intestine about the size of your little finger. Women also have their right ovary in that area (actually, ovaries are on both sides). Then, in your left upper quadrant, you have your spleen and a big part of your stomach. Your stomach extends over to the upper central area of your abdomen, the epigastric area. So, sometimes doctors call stomach pain "epigastric pain." (In Greek, "epi" means "on, near, or on top of," and gastric means the stomach, so, "epigastric" means "near the stomach.") In your left lower quadrant, you have the last part of your large intestine before it becomes your rectum.

Your pancreas also sits in the upper middle part of your abdomen, but it's a little deeper inside. Your kidneys are in the middle of your back right under your ribs on both sides of your spine. So, doctors check for kidney infections by tapping the middle of your back. Kidneys

can also give you "flank pain" in your sides if you ever get a kidney stone.

The lowest area of the abdomen is called the pelvic area and that's where the reproductive organs are.

I hope this little tour of your abdomen helped you know where your internal organs are!

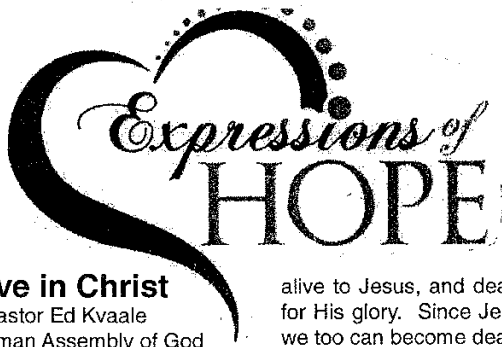

Alive in Christ

Resurrection Sunday (Easter) is just behind us but the importance of Jesus' resurrection to the life of a Christian continues. Jesus' death and resurrection and His call for us to take up our cross and follow Him remind us that we need to ask ourselves questions like "Are we willing to sin less?" "Are we willing to live life differently?" After all, Jesus has called us to "put off the old self" and "put on the new self" through the power of the Holy Spirit working in us to transform us through Jesus' resurrection power.

Paul challenges us in Romans 6:11 "So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin alive to God in Christ Jesus". Yes, we receive our salvation through grace alone and faith alone. Yet, we have been created to serve Jesus and others and do works of service for others. These works do not merit special grace to us, but like some in the early New Testament church we also need to be reminded that our salvation came at great cost to Jesus. His death and resurrection have given us the opportunity to live a new life alive in the Holy Spirit,

alive to Jesus, and dead to sin for His glory. Since Jesus died we too can become dead to sin, allow the freedom of Jesus to set us free from sinful habits, and alive to Jesus.

Lutheran theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer in his book *Cost of Discipleship* reminds us of one of the dangers of what he calls "cheap grace". Bonhoeffer said "Grace alone does everything, they say, and so everything can remain as it was before". Paul agreed wholeheartedly with Bonhoeffer in Romans 6:1 when he says "What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means"! Rather Bonhoeffer says this about costly grace: "Such grace is costly because it calls us to follow Jesus Christ. It is costly because it costs us our life, and it is grace because it gives us the only true life. It is costly because it condemns sin, and grace because it justifies the sinner. Above all, it is costly because it cost God the life of God's Son" 'you were bought at a price', and what has cost God much cannot be cheap for us". Let us continue to follow Jesus even if it means dying to self, because He has the power to resurrect us and make us fully alive in God!

N.D. Conifers Struggling
Tessa Osterbauer, Grant County Extension Agent/Agriculture and Natural Resources

You may notice a lot of evergreens show some brown needles and characteristics as you drive through your neighborhood this time of year. While trees are not the only thing looking brown during our ongoing drought, they might be something you want to keep an eye on. It is not all together uncommon to see our trees exhibiting signs of stress or "winter injury." During the past month, pines and spruce trees throughout much of North Dakota have shown symptoms of decline.

"The causes are varied, and treatment recommendations are equally diverse," North Dakota State University Extension forester Joe Zeleznik says.

In 2020, many ponderosa pine trees across the state died in shelterbelts or yards.

"We believe that the extremely wet fall of 2019 is to blame," Zeleznik says. "Soils were saturated in many areas, especially following the big snowstorm on Oct. 10-13, 2019. Even areas that were not necessarily low spots accumulated a large amount of moisture. The saturated soil either killed the pines' root systems directly or else kept the trees from developing full hardiness before the winter."

Symptoms on pines were dramatic. Entire trees died, showing symptoms throughout the whole tree, seemingly all at once. In most cases, the trees showed no progression of symptoms from bottom to top or interior to exterior. Instead, trees began to grow in the spring of 2020, then simply stopped, with the needles turning brown.

Additional deaths of ponderosa

pine trees are expected in 2021.

More recently, spruce trees have been showing a variety of symptoms that have been diagnosed with the broad term of "winter injury." Winter injury generally shows up as early as February but is more commonly seen in March or April.

Needles often turn a purplish-brown as they die. This dieback often has no pattern. The needles that die may be on one side of the tree or on the bottoms of branches, but they also may be scattered throughout the tree crowns. Sometimes, only needle tips are dead, while in other cases, entire needles die outright.

Affected trees can be right next to trees that are showing no symptoms. On occasion, entire trees may turn brown and die.

"Wildly fluctuating temperatures in February and March are often to blame for winter injury," Zeleznik says. "This year, the drought of 2020 is likely a major factor in the damage. Additionally, pests such as spider mites or pine needle scale may play a part, especially in those trees where the damage doesn't follow a pattern."

Treating trees is difficult because most of the damage is due to environmental problems. "Where trees lost most of their needles, they likely will not recover no matter what we do," Zeleznik notes. "For those trees that retain most of their needles, we need to make sure that we keep the trees otherwise healthy."

"Specifically, water those trees that are suffering from drought," he adds. "A long, slow soaking is better than multiple, brief additions of water. Move the hose around because the tree's roots extend in all direc-

tions from the stem."

The roots go out far beyond the drip line of the tree crown, extending to as far as four or five times the height of the tree. The ground should be moist, not saturated, after watering.

Zeleznik also recommends scouting for pests such as insects and diseases, and being prepared to treat them appropriately. Scouting is important because treatment timing is critical to be effective. Spraying for a pest at the wrong time of year is ineffective and a waste of time and money.

These classes provided accountability in a time when my unpredictable sleep schedule and coursework proved major obstacles in my workout routine and a chance to meet new friends during the lonely transition to college life. Group fitness classes were integral to my physical, emotional, and social well-being.

When I arrived in Hettinger, I began taking water aerobics and yoga classes. These classes were more than just workouts: they were a welcome chance to meet others and engage with my community. I enjoyed them immensely and slowly my social circle grew. But then the pool shut down,

the yoga classes ended, and COVID-19 descended upon the world. Suddenly group fitness classes were no longer available in Hettinger.

Understanding the value of group fitness classes and craving a return to the physical challenge and social support they offer, I partnered with the local hospital and applied for grant funding for group fitness instructor certifications. Several community members and I then embarked on the coursework required prior to certification. I studied and practiced and passed the certification exam this winter. 

Terry Messmer's Story

Terry Messmer, son of Victor and the late Clara Messmer, former of Mott.

"There were dark times of despair, confusion and isolation," wrote Terry Messmer about his battle with COVID. He is a professor at Utah State University, a wildlife specialist and retired military veteran. He and his wife, Linda, went to St. George in January for a short sabbatical to work on some high priority projects. Instead he ended up fighting for his life.

"In the military I was a commander for a combat stress control unit," Terry said. "I couldn't help but observe similarities between the stressors faced by COVID caregivers and the soldiers we worked with on that unit. Some of the caregivers who were taking care of me and other patients had contracted COVID while doing their jobs. Still their commitment to the care of those of us in the COVID unit was unconditional. They went out of their way to do the little things to help me and others feel human. The respect and dignity I felt was unparalleled. They became my new family and I owe them a debt I can never repay."

That said, the Messmers' gratitude is taking shape as a very real benefit to caregivers. Terry and Linda are working with

the hospital foundation to establish a fund to support caregiver career advancement.

"It has been said a hero is someone who takes risks in the service of other," said Terry. "I lived and survived because I was in the company of heroes. Thank you, St. George Hospital caregivers."

Terry spent 22 days in the ICU at St. George, Utah recovering from COVID and that was 35 days ago and still fighting it but recovering.

Expressions of HOPE

Reflections on the Words of Life

One of the questions which every human being ought to be asking is: Why is there death? Evolutionists tell us that death is just a part of the cycle of life. People are born, people live, and then they die. They act as if dying is just part of a natural process. But for answers to such a vital question as this, we must turn to a more reliable source than evolution. We must turn to something we can count on. The Bible has answers to all of the vital questions concerning life and of death. And the Bible tells us that death is in fact NOT NATURAL. That is, it was not a part of the original creation when God created the heavens and the earth and all that is in them. The Bible tells us that when God finished creating, He looked upon all that He had made and said that it was "very good." If things would have remained as God originally creat-

ed them, there would have been no death.

But sadly, things did change. Something happened to the human race which brought in death to all creatures on earth, and that something is SIN. Adam and Eve were given a glorious garden to eat from. They were prohibited from eating of just one tree, the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. If you are familiar with the account in Genesis 3, you know that Adam and Eve disobeyed God and ate of the forbidden fruit. Now we might think, "So what's the big deal? They ate a piece of fruit." But the Bible says that it was an enormous deal to eat that forbidden fruit because by doing so Adam and Eve sinned against God.

Not only did they sin, but that sin of Adam is what brought death into the world. From that point on, death is the universal experience of people and animals. God had forewarned Adam and Eve that this would be the case. We read in Genesis 2:17, "But of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat, for in the day that

you eat of it you shall surely die." And God kept that promise. Adam and Eve immediately died spiritually, and the guarantee that they would die physically was put into place.

Now the next big question about death is: Is death final? Are we to assume that the person is put into the grave and will simply decay and go out of existence? That is what many evolutionists are telling us. They say that because death is just part of the cycle of existence, a person goes out of existence at death.

But that view is not even close to what the Bible teaches. The Bible says that death is the wages of sin (Romans 6:23). God brought death to the human race as a punishment for sin. While this sounds pretty dismal, there is some good news related to it. You see, the Bible says that death is NOT final, that even the body which we put into the grave will one day be raised. All people will be raised either to eternal judgment in hell or to the enjoyment of eternal life in heaven. The body will be reunited with the soul for that purpose.

That brings us to a third and final question: Is there a way to make sure that one will be raised to eternal life rather than to eternal judgment? Is there a way to live with the comfort of knowing that all will be well with us when we die? Yes, friends, there is. The answer is in what is probably the most familiar

verse in the Bible—John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have everlasting life." In these words of Jesus Himself, we are told that there is a way to be ready for death. There is a way to KNOW FOR SURE that when one dies, he or she will not perish but be assured of being raised to everlasting life.

And what is that way? It is to BELIEVE IN JESUS. Yes friends, that is the way and the ONLY way. People all over the world are trying all kinds of things and taking all kinds of ways to try to assure that they will have a place in their conception of heaven. But God has made it clear that no one will be in heaven whose sins have not been pardoned through the saving work of Jesus Christ on the cross. You can't get to heaven by good works. You can't get to heaven by church membership, baptism, confirmation, or living by the Golden Rule. You can't get to heaven by doing some dramatic act of self-sacrifice. The only way to overcome the negative effects of death and to be assured of a place with God in heaven is through trusting ONLY in Christ and His saving work for the pardon of your sins to make you right with God.

Friends, are you ready to die? Have you taken God up on His offer? If not, won't you turn to Jesus Christ as your only

hope of overcoming the effects of death? The one who trusts in Christ for salvation can look death in the face and say as the apostle Paul does in 1 Corinthians 15:55, "O Death, where is your sting? O Death, where is your victory?" By His resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ overcame the power of death.

And all who trust in Him for salvation will overcome it too. I close with the words of Jesus to a woman named Martha, John 11:25-26: "I am the resurrection and the life. He who believes in Me, though he may die, he shall live. And whoever lives and believes in Me shall never die. Do you believe this?"
