### Cloud Seeding Operations Summary For August 9-15, 2021

BISMARCK, N.D. - Southwestern North Dakota had a continuation of dry conditions and above average temperatures last week. High temperatures soared into the 90s and even topped the 100-degree mark once again on Sunday.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, no operational flights took place last week.

Looking ahead, a much-needed change in the upper-level weather pattern is forecast to occur midweek. The dominant upper-level ridge should break down and allow for numerous troughs to move from the Pacific Northwest through the Northern Plains. North Dakota should benefit from moisture and cooler temperatures. Above average high temperatures early this week cool into the 70s for Thursday through the weekend.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at <http://www.dwr.nd.gov/arb>. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

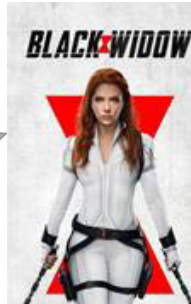

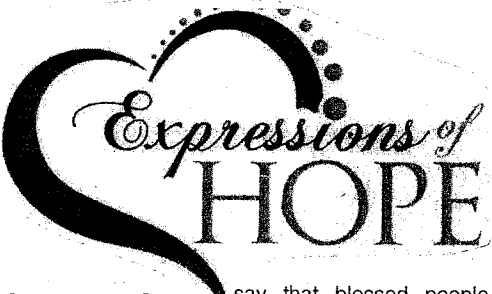

### Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last week we began to consider the subject of revival and noted that the first sign of revival in an area is that people become convicted of sin. Conviction of sin drives believers in Christ to seek a holier life and drives unbelievers to seek salvation in Jesus Christ, the only Savior.

But there are other characteristics of revival as well, and one of those is a hunger and thirst for righteousness. When God the Holy Spirit comes upon a people, He breathes into them an intense longing for the things of God. In one of the beatitudes the Lord Jesus said, "Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be filled" (Matthew 5:6). Notice how expressive are the words Jesus used. He did not simply

say that blessed people are those who desire righteousness. He said that the blessed ones are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness. These are words that convey very strong desire.

What does this mean at the practical level? It means that when God's people are revived by the Holy Spirit, they have a hearty appetite for the things of God. One of the greatest thinkers ever born in our country was Jonathan Edwards, who was a pastor in Massachusetts during the period called the "Great Awakening" in the 1750's. Edwards said he knew that revival must have come to his town when he could hear the teenagers on the street outside his house discussing the Bible and the things of God.

This leads me to suggest that we ask ourselves, "How hungry are we for the things of God?" Do we try to come up with excuses to neglect wor-

ship? If we do attend worship, do we keep looking at the clock while God's Word is being proclaimed? Do we complain if the pastor's message is too long for our liking? Do we spend time in prayer each day, praising and thanking the Lord and asking Him to work in our lives and in the lives of others? Do we spend time daily reading and meditating on the Bible? How we answer such questions is something of an indicator of whether or not we hunger and thirst for righteousness.

Why is it that some can enjoy sitting for hours at a concert or sporting event and are sad to see it end, yet when it comes to the worship of God, their main concern is when it will be over? Friends, we need revival. We need a penetrating and deep work of the Holy Spirit in our hearts which will cause a spiri-

tual hunger within us like that of the psalmist, who said in Psalm 119:14-16, "I have rejoiced in the way of Your testimonies, as much as in all riches. I will meditate on Your precepts, and contemplate Your ways. I will delight myself in Your statutes; I will not forget Your word."

How will we know when revival comes? We will hear people praising God and discussing the truths of His Word and the salvation He has provided through Jesus Christ. The excitement that comes from God's working in hearts and lives will lead to a hunger and thirst to enjoy the things of the Lord more and more. The churches which are true to God's Word will fill up with those eager to praise the Lord and learn more of Him. Oh, that God would send a revival to us!

**O'Fallon Historical Museum**

O'Fallon Historical Museum is located at 723 South Main in Baker, Montana and consists of a six building complex. A star attraction at this museum is Steer Montana, the world's largest steer. Born six miles east of Baker in 1923, the steer grew to 5 feet 11 inches in height and had a top certified weight of 3,980 pounds, although he is said to have weighed as much as 4290 pounds. Both Steer Montana's skeleton and taxidermy mount are on display.

The old Fallon County Jail building was built in 1916. It originally housed the sheriff's quarters on the main level and the jail upstairs and was in use until 1974. This building is now listed on the National Register of Historical Places and contains displays that include a vintage kitchen, a camera and photo room, a toy room, Lawler Drug store items, a dress shop, World War I and II military displays, and a 1920's parlor.

The Forrest Duffield Museum was moved to Baker from the Fertile Prairie community. The building itself is a reproduction of a claim shack from the homestead era and is furnished with heirlooms from the Duffield family dating back to the late 1800's.

These are all typical things  
in which our free and reduce  
numbers play a role in what  
we receive in funding. 2020  
and 2021 are not typical years,  
however, and these numbers  
are more important than ever.  
All of our Elementary & Secondary  
School Emergency Relief  
(ESSER) fund allocations are  
based on our free and reduced  
numbers using the title formula.  
There is a very high probability  
that additional funding will also  
go through this calculation to  
determine what we are allocated  
from federal coffers.

To summarize, even if a family  
does not want their lunch to  
be free or reduced it still benefits  
the school and even the community  
to be counted as such. It  
plays a major role in the allocation  
of government dollars both  
in school and in the community.  
It can be confusing how these  
numbers are used to distribute  
money to schools but it's important  
to just be aware.

Now you know why we make  
an effort every year to get people  
to fill out there free and reduced

Free and Reduce  
Funding, How Does  
it Work?

This year it is more important  
than ever to apply for Free & Reduced  
Lunch. This may come  
as a shock since school lunches  
are free for another school  
year, thanks to the USDA. Even  
though school lunches have  
been free since the outbreak of  
the pandemic in North Dakota,  
these numbers are still critical in  
the allocation of state and federal  
dollars. Even though your  
family will have free lunches  
whether or not they fill out a free  
and reduced application, it's still  
a vital application. COVID-19  
has negatively affected families  
and caused financial strain for  
many. The impacts on the economy  
have also been detrimental. It's  
important for people who are  
affected in these ways to be  
counted in these programs. These  
numbers determine funding for  
a wide range of dollars ranging  
from state, federal, and even  
other grant opportunities.

Let me explain some of the  
ways our Free and Reduced  
numbers affect funding. First  
and foremost, it goes directly  
into our funding formula under  
something called At-Risk funding.  
This is determined by a  
3-year rolling average of our  
free and reduced percentages  
from grades 3-8. This is then  
multiplied by our current student  
enrollment to generate an at-risk  
student number. This means  
for every 40 students generated  
towards this calculation

we receive an additional pupil  
payment. Another major funding  
source the uses free and reduced  
numbers is called Federal  
Title. Federal Title generates a  
weighted number that is used to  
divide up North Dakota's Federal  
Title allocation. This number  
is based on various percentages  
from our Free Numbers, Reduced  
Numbers, Census numbers of  
children between the ages of 5-17  
in poverty, and the number of  
foster children in the district. Each  
total is multiplied by its percentage  
towards the allocation and totaled,  
that becomes our weighted allocation  
number. This year we should be  
receiving a total of \$102,150 dollars  
to provide title services. We receive  
funding from both of these sources  
every year.

Another important funding  
source that we receive is called  
E-Rate which determines the  
reimbursement rate on technology  
infrastructure projects based on  
free and reduced numbers. These  
are figured on our free and reduced  
percentages grades K-12. Right  
now, we have 40-50% free and  
reduced in K-12 so we receive  
70% of the cost of a technology  
infrastructure project. This 70%  
is deducted from a total allocation  
based on pupil units for a five-year  
period. There are also many grants  
that use free and reduced numbers  
as a qualifying factor to receive  
grant funding. These numbers also  
play into grants our county may  
apply for outside of the actual school  
district.

his home on Thursday morning, August 12, 2021.



## RECIPE OF THE DAY

### ZUCCHINI BROWNIES

**FOR THE BROWNIES**

- 2 cups flour
- 1/2 cup cocoa powder
- 1 1/2 teaspoons baking soda
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup vegetable oil
- 1 1/2 cups sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 2 cups zucchini shredded
- 2 Tablespoons hot water

**FOR THE FROSTING**


- 1 1/2 tablespoons cocoa powder
- 2 Tablespoons coconut oil (or butter) melted
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 1/8 cup water
- splash of vanilla extract

**TO MAKE THE BROWNIES**

Preheat oven to 350 degrees and line a 9x13 inch baking pan with parchment paper. Spray with non-stick spray and set aside. In a medium bowl, whisk together flour, cocoa powder, baking soda, and salt. Set aside. In a large bowl, mix together the oil, sugar, and vanilla until well combined. Add the dry ingredients and stir. Fold in the zucchini. Add in 2 Tablespoons water and stir. If your mixture is still powdery, add more water, 1 Tablespoon at a time, until it comes together. The batter will be crumbly, but shouldn't be powdery. Spread evenly into your prepared baking dish. Bake 25-30 minutes until the brownies spring back when gently touched.

**TO MAKE THE FROSTING**

Add melted coconut oil (or butter) and cocoa powder to a small bowl, stir and set aside. In another small bowl, add the powdered sugar, water, and vanilla. Stir together. Stir in the cocoa mixture. Spread over cooled brownies.
