



Hettinger County Chemical Dispersal Tuesday, September 7th DRIVE - THROUGH THIS YEAR

NORTH OF COURTHOUSE -336 PACIFIC AVENUE IN MOTT

The Hettinger County Weed Control Board will be dispersing Tordon, Curtail, and Milestone at the STORAGE BUILDING LOCATED NORTH OF THE COURTHOUSE IN MOTT at 336 Pacific Avenue in Mott, from 9 AM to Noon, or until all chemicals on hand is dispersed, on Tuesday, September 7th, 2021. We will be having a "DRIVE-THROUGH" operation again for the fall dispersal, so you will not have to get out of your vehicle. Bringing your own pens will be helpful.

All landowners / operators must supply a land / FSA map of the area that is to be treated. The Weed Board will need to keep the map.

The cost for chemical will be \$35.00 per gallon of Tordon, \$75.00 per 2 ½ gallon for Curtail, and \$40.00 for a quart of Milestone, with a limit 10 gallons of Curtail, 4 quarts of Milestone, and 5 gallons of Tordon.

EACH PERSON WILL BE ALLOWED TO PICK UP CHEMICAL AT THE LIMIT ES-TABLISHED BY THE WEED BOARD. YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PICK UP CHEMICAL FOR ANYONE ELSE, ALTHOUGH A WIFE MAY PICK UP CHEMICAL FOR HER HUSBAND.

LANDOWNER SIGNATURE IS REQUIRED WITH PAYMENT ALONG WITH THE MAPS AT TIME OF DISTRIBUTION. CONTACT THE COUNTY EXTENSION OFFICE OR COUNTY AUDITOR'S OFFICE TO PICK UP THE FORM PRIOR TO

School has begun and with it the fall sports season! I know that I, personally, enjoy taking in the games at the collegiate. professional, and high school levels

But it is also a time that a silly tendency which I possess as a fan becomes apparent to me. This time of year, I as a fan notice how easily I complain about calls missed against my team and yet how quickly I laugh when my team gets away with one!

Now, don't get me wrong, I am not naive and I am not recommending naivete. I am confident the missed calls this upcoming sports season which "get my Irish up" will be in fact horrible missed calls, and I sincerely hope Jesus figures out some just compensation at His Second Coming. But it is something to be noted not just small things, but also in large - the tendency of the human heart to respond vigorously to injustice and to my rights and to what should be, and yet to respond slowly when the rights of others are injured. Or again to respond vigorously and harshly when the faults of others are displayed, and yet slowly with shrugging

You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye." (Matthew 7:3-5, Revised Standard Version)


The clear message for the disciple of Jesus: work on you before you work on others and the world.

It would be an error to see this message as one of self-condemnation! In fact, I would be breaking the 2nd great commandment "to love one's neighbor as yourself". In this passage Jesus offers not self-condemnation, but freedom. How often is the peace which is a fruit of the spirit lost through concern with things totally beyond our control? How often is Christian joy sucked dry via anxiety with global problems while our own attitudes, thoughts, and behaviors lie unexamined?

Or to return to the words of Jesus in the Gospel of Luke, "He also told them a parable: 'Can a blind man lead a blind man? Will they not both fall into a pit?" (Luke 6:39, Revised Standard Version)

The question this Gospel puts to us is this: to whom have I entrusted the guidance of my soul? Who do I pick as a guide to my spiritual life? Who acts as a teacher to the way I interpret the world and its events? Whom do I allow to point out and to take out the speck in my eye?

revealed. Or still yet, how willing the human heart is to become the guide to others even when we ourselves are lost. To point out the wrong, to offer advice meant to fix others and the world at large.

The Gospel addresses this tendency.

To take Jesus' words from the Sermon on the Mount:

"Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, 'Let me take the speck out of your eye,' when there is the log in your own eye?

I am? Do they recognize the primacy of Jesus, the need for a Savior? Are they people and sources who themselves have repented and sought to live faithful Christian life? Have they sought to first take the log out of their own eve?

When it comes to silly things such as referee calls, not much is at stake. But when it comes to important questions such as "how ought I live" or "whom can I trust" or "what is true", much more is. Let it be for us the one the disciples called with devotion "Teacher". Let it be for us Jesus.

I think or suppose that his personal quotes, his exact words- sayings; writings; could entrust "Us" to form the changing opinions within ourselves that we're often- 'Positively Looking For'. Certainly, enlisting prayer always helps too!

"Others have seen what is and asked why. I have seen what could be and asked why not.'

"Only put off until tomorrow what you are willing to die having left undone."

"When I was a child my mother said to me, 'If you become a soldier, you'll be a General. If you become a monk, you'll be The Pope.' Instead, I became a painter and wound up as Picasso."

"I am always doing that which I can not do, in order that I may learn how to do it."

Born October 25th, 1881 in Malaga, Spain, "Pablo Ruiz Picasso" (Note: In his Spanish name- the first or paternal surname is "Ruiz" and the second or maternal family name is "Picasso".) He was a Spanish Painter- Printmaker- Ceramicist and Theater Designer who spent most of his adult life in France, where at the age of 91 he passed away in Mougins, France on April 8th, 1973. He was an exceptionally prolific artist throughout the course of his long life and was regarded

as one of the most influential. Picasso achieved an immense fortune for his revolutionary artistic accomplishments and became one of the best-known figures in 20th-Century Art.

At first, Picasso's paintings were not well-received by critics or the public, as they viewed them as depressing, somber works of art that presented the likes of beggars, cabaret performers, and frail, older people. One such Picasso Painting from his recognized Blue Period: 'The Old Guitarist' (Pictured, along with a separate photo of Pablo Picasso) is an oil painting which he creating in late 1903 and early 1904 which depicts an elderly musician, a blind, haggard man with threadbare clothing who is weakly hunched over his guitar while playing in the streets of Barcelona, Spain. Picasso's Painting- 'The Old Guitarist', Today sits at the Art Institute of Chicago where thousands of people view it daily. Some art appraisal experts in the field believe the painting is worth more than 100,000,000 Million U.S. Dollars, but because this work of art is likely never going to be sold, it might actually be considered "Priceless".







Why Plant Bareroot?

When it is time for tree sales from the Conservation District, there are two types of trees that they sell: potted and bareroot. Potted is usually what everyone asks for and are trees and shrubs of varying heights and varying pot sizes. People are more hesitant about buying bareroot because it is a little vaguer. So, lets dispel some of the vagueness and give you some more planting options.

First off, what are bareroots? They are tree's that have been grown in soil for at least one season. Then they are dug up when they are dormant, and all the soil is removed from the roots before they are stored in a cool place and shipped out to the Conservation Districts and customers. They are ready to be planted straight into the ground, taking into consideration to make sure the roots are going straight down, the tree is upright, and the soil is packed in tightiy.

Why would you want to plant bareroots? A lot of the time what people ask for is the biggest plant possible, thinking of large potted plants. This gets you the instant satisfaction of having a decent size little tree compared to a smaller bare root. The thing about the potted plants is they can become root bound in the pots and grow slower or not as well once it is planted. A bareroot hasn't had the chance to become rootbound and has been growing freely for at least a year. This means once you plant the tree it should take off and often grow faster and better than a potted plant. Within a year or two a bareroot can catch up to and outgrow a potted plant.

Need a few more things to consider when debating on whether or not to buy bareroot. Bareroots on average are cheaper and not all of them are tiny little sticks. You can get tall bareroots that are up to 5 feet tall! They can be easier to handle since you aren't carrying or maneuvering a pot of soil around along with the tree itself. They are lightweight and can be laid down in your vehicle. Plus, if you are planting a shelterbelt the Conservation District can plant the trees for you!

this is r potted plants are horrible, and you should never plant them. They are great if you are planting a yard tree or just a singular bush. They also tend to bare fruit sooner than a bareroot. When they are in pots, they can become a little root bound which tricks the tree into thinking it needs to bear fruit sooner. They can produce up to two years sooner than a bareroot! Whether you chose to go with bareroot or potted both can be ordered through the Conservation District. organization until his last days. He was a Pack Master for the Boy Scouts of America, Grand Knight for the Knights of Columbus, and President of the Bowman Hospital Board.






cooking spray. If the breasts are uneven in thickness, pound them to an even 1" thickness using a meat pounder. Sprinkle both sides of meat with half the grated Parmesan cheese, salt and freshly ground black pepper. Place the chicken in the prepared baking dish. In a medium bowl, whisk together Ranch dressing and sour cream. Pour the mixture over the chicken breasts and sprinkle with remaining Parmesan cheese. Bake at 375°F for 20-30 minutes or until a meat thermometer inserted in the thickest part of the breast reads 150°F. Set oven to broil and broil the breast an additional 2-4 minutes or until the chicken turns golden. It will burn quickly so watch closely. The chicken is cooked through when the thermometer reads 160°F when inserted in the thickest part of the middle breast. Remove from the oven and sprinkle with cooked bacon crumbles. Allow the chicken to rest a few minutes before serving. Garnish with diced parsley, if desired.

Reflections on the Word of Life

For the past couple of weeks we have considered some indicators of revival. We've seen that true revival is a work of God the Holy Spirit. When the Spirit comes upon a people, He brings conviction of sin, leading believers to seek a life of greater holiness and leading unbelievers to see the need for Jesus as their Savior. In addition, the Holy Spirit creates in people a hunger and thirst for righteousness.

Today let us consider yet another characteristic of those who are experiencing true Godsent revival. Perhaps the most wonderful aspect of true revival is that people hunger to know God Himself. What I mean is that they do not stop at wanting to know **about** God. Knowing about God is important, and that is a part of hungering and thirsting for righteousness. But I'm speaking now about longing to know God personally and intimately.

Some people think that such a thing is not even possible. Since God is so great and awesome, they think mere creatures could not possibly have fellowship with the Almighty Creator. But this is the wonder of God's amazing grace--that although He is infinitely great, He seeks fellowship with His people through Jesus Christ. Yes, it is possible to know God intimately in a personal relationship. See this longing for intimate fellowship with God that the psalmist had: "As the deer pants for the water brooks, so pants my soul for You, O God. My soul thirsts for God, for the living God. When shall I come and appear before God?" (Psalm 42:1-2).

The reason why many Christians have shallow spiritual lives is that they have never tasted sweet and intimate fellowship with God. They are still trying to find fulfillment in such things as money or health or reputation or worldly comforts. But none of those things can fulfill the human soul because man is made in God's image. The only thing that can deeply fulfill the soul of man is God Himself!


Knowing God has a starting point. It starts by realizing that we do not know God the way we come into this world. We are born in sin, alienated from God. The apostle Paul explains in Romans 3:10-11, "There is none righteous, no, not one; there is none who understands; there is none who seeks after God." The first step in getting to know God is for a person to realize he or she has sinned against God. Then that person must turn from sin and trust in the sacrificial death of Christ on the cross to pay for his sins. The apostle John tells us in John 1:12 what happens when someone trusts in Christ as Savior: "But as many as received Him, to them He gave the right to become children of God, to those who believe in His name.'

But that's just the beginning. We can grow deeper and deeper in our relationship with God. God is so glorious, and fellowship with Him is the most wonderful experience a person can have. Israel's King David knew this. He wrote many of those Psalms which speak of the sweet and intimate fellowship he had with God. He also spoke of his passion to know God even more deeply. He says in Psalm 84:2, "My soul longs, yes, even faints for the courts of the LORD; my heart and my flesh cry out for the living God."

Friends, do you know anvthing of this? Have you tasted and seen that the Lord is good? Could it be that many of us are so busy filling up our lives with lesser things of this world that we are passing up the very best thing, which is intimate fellowship with God? When true revival comes, people set proper priorities. They long for God, and so they eliminate from their lives many of the things that keep them from seeking God. The results of this are wonderful. For they get what they truly long for. They come to a closer fellowship with the living God. Nothing else will truly satisfy. I like the way one hymn writer put it when he wrote, "Turn your eyes upon Jesus; look full in His wonderful face; and the things of earth will grow strangely dim in the light of His glory and grace.'




