

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

I remember a conversation with a lady in a restaurant in which we exchanged comments about our occupations. When I told her I was a pastor, she responded by saying, "I'm not very religious, but my grandfather is. I'm sort of religious."

This may sound puzzling, but being religious can be very dangerous. Religion, even religion that has something to do with Jesus Christ, has often kept people from enjoying a true saving relationship with God.

Here is how it happens: People go to church or participate in some ordinance like baptism or confirmation. Perhaps they take an interest in some religious activity or service and assume that such religious exercises make them right with God. Their underlying assumption is that being a moral or religious person is what God requires from us in order to be saved. But that is where the danger comes in. For the Bible tells us that it is possieven extremely religious, and vet not be saved.

Jesus ran into this very thing quite often during His earthly ministry. In John 3 we find Him speaking to a man named Nicodemus. Now Nicodemus was a Pharisee, and Pharisees were about the most religious group of people in Israel at the time Jesus walked this earth. They were meticulous observers of the Law which God had given through Moses. So meticulous were these people, that when they gave a portion of their things to God in the form of tithes, they did not neglect even the smallest herbs in their gardens. They prayed; they memorized Scripture; they attended many services; they observed the Sabbath with greatest care.

And yet, Jesus said to this Pharisee named Nicodemus in John 3:7, "Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again." In other words, all the religion of Nicodemus was not enough to put him into a right relationship with God. He needed to be born again. In other words, Nicodemus needed a complete change in the very essence of his being, which only God could

accomplish. That is because Nicodemus, like every other member of the human race, was born into this world in a state of sin. And there is no way that any of us can free himself/herself from the bondage to sin we are

We need a miracle of God's grace to change our hard, rebellious hearts and make us see that we have been sinning against God all our lives and deeply offending Him by that sin. Only the Holy Spirit can do such a work. Jesus went on to tell Nicodemus in John 3:8, "The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear the sound of it, but cannot tell where it comes from and where it goes. So is everyone who is born of the Spirit."

Someone might ask, "How do I know if I have been born again?" The person who is born again always sees his or her need for the saving work of Jesus Christ and relies on that alone to restore him or her to a right relationship with God. You see, the problem with Nicodemus is that he thought his good works and religious lifestyle were going to earn him the fa-

vor of God. But the Bible says that none of us could ever earn God's favor because we have nothing with which to pay for our sins. There is only one thing that can adequately deal with our sins to God's satisfaction, and that is the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross.

Salvation is a free gift. It does not come to us on the basis of what we do. It comes only to those who admit they can do NOTHING to save themselves and who rely ONLY on what Jesus did on the cross to make them right with God. And so what about you, my friend? Are you religious, or are you born again? Are you relying upon being good enough to get to heaven? If so, I can assure you on the basis of the Bible that you will never get there. We have this promise in Ephesians 2:8-9: "For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." Look to Jesus and Him alone to save you and to make you right with God. He is the perfect Savior. He is the ONLY Savior.

Cloud Seeding Operations Summary For July 26-Aug. 1, 2021

Eido/Connect Country

BISMARCK, N.D. – After beginning the week with high temperatures topping 100 degrees, cloud cover and smoke helped cool southwestern North Dakota down into the upper 80s and low 90s last week. Unfortunately, conditions remained dry due to an upper-level ridge and surface high pressure.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, no operational flights took place last week.

This week the upper-level pattern changes, allowing for the ridge to flatten and chances for thunderstorms to return by Wednesday and continue through the weekend. High temperatures should hover in the low 90s, maintaining the trend of above normal heat.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at http://www.dwr.nd.gov/arb. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.

Sawyer Gilbert Crowned First-Ever WPRA/PRCA Earnings **Champion at 125th Cheyenne Frontier Days**

Sawyer Gilbert, who earned \$17,525 as the second Cheyenne Frontier Days Breakaway Roping Champion, is the first woman to have those earnings count towards the WPRA/PRCA standings.

Sawyer Gilbert drew up in the 125th Cheyenne (Wyoming) Frontier Days Championship Sunday performance as the fifth breakaway roper out on Sunday, August 1, 2021, determined to leave the arena with the championship title. By the event's end, she completed the course, winning the sudden-death Championship Sunday performance with a 4.4-second run, worth \$12,175.

Gilbert, 19, earned a total of \$17,525 in CFD earnings from the final round earnings, plus placing in rounds throughout the week. She is the second CFD breakaway roping champion, but the first-ever competitor to have her breakaway earnings count towards the WPRA/PRCA standings.

Before competing at the Cheyenne Frontier Days, Gilbert was 19th in the WPRA Pro Rodeo World standings with \$10,393.44 in season earnings and is now third in the standings with \$27,918.44, unofficially.

"Everyone wants to run one here. It's the 'Daddy of 'Em All'," said Gilbert, of Buffalo, South Dakota. "It's even cooler to say that you ever won it."

Fortunately for Gilbert, she had seen her calf run in that arena before and knew she had

a good chance at obtaining the winning title.

"I got to watch [him] one other time in person," Gilbert said. "I got the video from the girl who had ran it. He was straight down the pen. I had a real chance. I just had to make sure I saw my start and go get him."

What made this coveted win more special for the young talent was following in the footsteps of her traveling partner, Jordan Jo Fabrizio, who won the inaugural CFD title in 2019.

"It's amazing that two of the Cheyenne Frontier Days Champions are in the same rig," Gilbert said with excitement. "I had to wear a red shirt. It's Jordan's favorite color and she won it in a red shirt.'

Gilbert's trip to Cheyenne began on Wednesday, July 21, with the breakaway roping slack, where she advanced to the semi-finals with a 4.8-second run, to advance her to the performances. She drew up in the sixth performance and roped her calf in 6-flat, which was quick enough to garner a top-4 spot, worth \$738, to advance to the semi-finals.

"It was one of those deals where I was tired. It was 7 o'clock in the morning," Gilbert said. "Walking into this I figured, 'If I just get out at the barrier ... I don't have to be close to the barrier ... Just get out and, with my first shot, catch.

In the first set of the semi-finals performance, she made a smooth run in 4.6 seconds to place second, worth \$4,612.

"I get to have more fuel mon-



ey," Gilbert said. "This is tough competition. The money is so spread out. You can be doing good and placing two or three holes out because you're not drawing the right calf or something, and you don't get any money. I think winning this takes some of the pressure off, but it's also a little kick in the butt."

Gilbert started out on a mare that she's been riding throughout the summer, but the mare came up sore after the slack, which sent Gilbert home for a horse swap.

"She crossed over and hit herself pretty hard," Gilbert said, explaining her mare's injury. "I had a couple days off and went back to Buffalo. South Dakota. and I got to steal [my brother's] horse from him. That horse has spent a lot of time in [the CFD]

Big Enough, her brother's 12-year-old gelding, was previously owned by CFD arena director Frank Thompson, so between her CFD-seasoned mount and traveling with the rodeo's reigning breakaway roping champion, Gilbert's stars aligned.

"I don't walk in here with a chip on my shoulder," she said. "I felt like I had a chance, I just had to keep it going for myself."

'Droughty 2021' equals lowto-no past Winter snow, it calculated its Spring into Summer Sunsets without the needed rainfall. There are dry pasture conditions and coming hay shortages for livestock; crop failures and greatly reduced harvest yields. "Hats off to Ranchers and Farmers," I'm writing this to give each one of "You" praise and credit. "You" are 'The Backbone of America'. You're the 'Men & Women' who work in the extremely hot and dangerously cold temperatures putting food in our stomachs and 'The World's Breadbasket' too. "You" rise with 'The Sun' and tend to the various crops and livestock, all the while- fighting off insects, battling wind and unpredictable weather conditions.

Ranchers and Farmers are 'The MAIN Connection' to the agricultural industry as it then continues forward, processing and transporting the need for

food Worldwide. Every person alive needs suitable food for their lifestyle. "You", Ranchers and Farmers all have significant qualities of worthy attention; you're of great importance to the communities that make up 'Life'.

Ranchers and Farmers are nvolved in planting, cultivating, performing post-harvest duties; overseeing the nutritional health, well-being, and growth of livestock production, supervising labor, and keeping accurate records- both financial & administrative.

Agriculture is North Dakota's largest industry. About 90 percent of the state's land is used for crop farming and cattle ranching with about 24 million acres of cropland. On average, North Dakota producers plant about 7.5 million acres of wheat with production totaling 320 million bushels. North Dakota and Kansas are most often the top two wheat-producing states, whereas an acre of wheat produces enough bread to feed nearly 9,000 people for one day. Normally in good grass years, there are about 1.83 million beef cattle and calves in North Dakota. That's more than two cattle for every person in the state. Beef cattle are raised in every North Dakota county.

Ranchers and Farmers are responsible for all crops and livestock that are needed for us to survive. Without food, 'The World' would slowly die, "You" work hard every day to keep plenty of crops and animal products in the marketplace.

"If you eat Today, Thank Ranchers and Farmers because they produce food... despite advances in modern agricultural technology, 'The World' still needs them."

Agriculture was invented between 7,000 and 10,000 years ago, during the Neolithic era, or the New Stone Age, and- without question, it has undergone significant developments since the time of the earliest cultivation.
