Then returned the knight, "I am he whom thou seekest."


When Offero heard these words he was right glad and took Satan to be his lord and



their spokesman, Simon, "believest thou not that we should worship the infant King! Let us now go to Bethlehem, and see this thing which has come to



Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leiozia

Last time in our study of the book of Daniel we began to look at the results of Daniel's and his three friends' obedience to God despite the pressures they were facing to bow to the strategies of King Nebuchadnezzar of Baby-Ion. We saw first that they were given permission to forego the king's diet, which likely included foods which were forbidden by God's law, and to eat only vegetables and drink only water. To the surprise of the Babylonian official in charge of the four young men, they were healthier than all the others who ate the king's delicacies.

Today we come to Daniel 1:17, where we see another result of the young men's obedience: "As for these four young men, God gave them knowledge and skill in all literature and wisdom; and Daniel had understanding in all visions and dreams." Daniel and his companions received special gifts from God. All four were gifted in knowledge and skill in all literature and wisdom, but Daniel was given an additional gift-the ability to understand all dreams and visions. This gift demonstrates that Daniel was a prophet of God, one who was chosen by God to reveal His

Why did God give such wonderful gifts to these young men? I believe the Holy Spirit is showing us a principle—that the one who is faithful in small things (as these were in the matter of their diet) will be given greater opportunities and greater gifts with which to serve the Lord. Doing what we know to be right in the little things of life in the present circumstances will lead

spheres of greater influence. It is tempting to think, "If I were only in this place or in that position, what an influence I would have for Christ." But our passage is showing us that the way to have a more influential place or position is to serve Him faithfully where we are at the present time in our present state. If we are unwilling to stand up and be counted for Him in the small things, what makes us think we will do so when the situation is more difficult and the consequences more serious?

God is even now sending trials and testing into His people's lives for this very purpose. He wants us to learn to rely upon Him in the smaller tests. This will cause our faith to grow and make us ready for greater opportunities to serve Him. But it is important to have a right perspective about our trials. Let us not respond to them with anger or frustration but rather pray that we might use them as an opportunity to trust and honor God, as Daniel and his friends did. .

Lord willing, we shall continue to consider the results of these young men's obedience to God next time. But to conclude, let us turn our attention for a moment toward the Great Prophet of whom the prophet Daniel is but a shadow. The writer of Hebrews tells us, "God, who at various times and in various ways spoke in time past to the fathers by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed heir of all things, through whom also He made the worlds; who being the brightness of His glory and the express image of His person, and upholding all things by the word of His power, when He had by Himself purged our sins, sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high" (Hebrews 1:1-3). 





3/4 cup cold butter

1 1/2 cups chopped pecans 1 (12 oz.) jar caramel ice cream topping, warmed





The Bock Family Farm/ Ranch is located just west of New England at the base of the West Rainy Butte. Wade & Jill Bock is a 4th generation Farm/Ranch Family. The Bock's grow as much of their feed as possible, which has been a challenge, in these dry years. In an effort to make the farm/ranch more sustainable for future generations in April of 2020 Wade & Jill began investigating their options. Jill started by reaching out on Facebook and the response was overwhelming: people were very interested in locally grown beef. The entire family got involved, Wade called butcher shops to make appointments to have their beef processed. Jill took on the licensing end of the busi-

It was at this same time that the South 40 meat processing plant in Mott was being built. Wade was excited to talk with them and have the option to have their beef processed so close to home. Wade contact-

ed the South 40 to get the ball rolling and states "They've been amazing to work with!" The Bocks have also had beef processed at 701 Meats in South Heart before obtaining their resale license. Their beef is now processed at the South 40 and Sturgis Meats. The next step was to visit with board members of the New England Community Store and get the homegrown beef in the freezers. The board members were excited about the idea.

Bock Ranch Meats are now available in the New England Community Store and upon request. The beef is available in any quantity and the Bocks have several finished animals ready to butcher. The ability to have the beef processed and sold locally gives the Bock Familv more control of their market and provides the community wonderful homegrown products. Other items available

are beef sticks & jerky, which have beef flying off the shelf.

Bock Ranch Meats is planning an open house at the McKenzie Mercantile 24 8th St. West, New England on December 15th from 6-8 pm. It's your chance to sample the beef sticks, jerky and visit with Wade & Jill. If you're interested in more information go to the Bock Ranch page on Facebook.

South 40 Beef's meat processing plant, located just west of Mott, ND, has been in operation since April 3rd, 2021. They relocated six families to Mott to work at the facility, which currently employs 21 people. With the business doing well, they are always looking for skilled workers to add to their team.

South 40 Beef's most popular cuts of meat are NY Strips, Ribeyes, Sirloins, Hamburger, and Chuck Roasts. The facility processes about 130 head of beef per/month. South 40 also smokes beef ierky and beef sticks daily under USDA inspection. You can purchase locally grown and processed beef at Cashwise stores throughout North Dakota, Regent Co-op, Star Grocery in New Leipzig, and the Bis/Man Co-op. South 40 Beef also provides beef to several restaurants in North Dakota. Some restaurants include

To date, South 40 Beef only processes beef. However, they are in the process of making some modifications to start pork and lamb in the coming months.

The City of Mott is considering annexing South 40 Beef; this would save South 40 Beef thousands of dollars in utilities every

Since South 40 Beef processes all beef under USDA inspection, local ranchers like Wade Bock can market their beef directly to consumers. Bock Ranch, just West of New England, brings in around five finished animals at a time and gets the best cuts and roasts. Bock ranch also gets jerky and snack sticks custom smoked. 
