Ben stuck his hands in his **pockets**, drug his feet slowly across the cold, snowy patch and circled his way to the top. His home had been a small box under the bridge. No family and just out of prison - - no one -- what else was he to do but sleep wherever there seemed to be a safe place. Stomach growling, for lack of food, he would get up early scan the garbage outside the food stores, find a little, enough to survive - - that was his life

Walking around town, Ben enjoyed seeing lite up houses - reminded him of being little, warm blankets, food, something else - - but he could never get to what it was he were missing cuz that missing piece is what led him to prison. That missing piece -- prison counselors told him he was a good man - - he would question them - - "then why am I in prison?" They couldn't respond with an answer - - only another question - - "what's missing?"

Walking down the streets Ben noticed the beautiful lights- each street was a little different. but --

seems like he could stand for hours and gaze at he beauty, and there was one place he especially like - a park bench, where trees/brush had taken over and the bench now lay hidden in the brush. That was his daytime home for no one saw him and he could sit for hours. Thought many times of moving his home up there but - - well his box would take up to much space so, for now he was content with the arrangement he

"Hey Mister! - - Hey You" - - Ben turned and there stood a little boy - - "What you doing out here in the dark - it's not even daylight yet." "My kitty got away and I'm looking for it." was his reply. "I'll help you find it - what does it look like?" "Um, it's this big" - - and his little fingers curled around Ben's hand.

Warmth shot thru Ben's body. What happened - what was it - was this little boy some kind of - - questions ran thru his mind. He wanted to run, but had promised the little boy he would help him find his kitty.

Backing away and pretending to help, Ben spotted





Ending the Stigma

Mental Health Stigma. The general public believes if you struggle with depression, anxiety or problems in your marriage or something more serious such as schizophrenia or a traumatic brain injury...you must be weak. I am here to inform you; everyday more and more published research solidifies the fact mental health is just as important as physical health and much more closely related than you might think. They are connected. The mind is connected to the body and the body to the mind, they are not separate. One is not more important than the other. The current and unprecedented belief seems to be that if you have an issue with your physical health, go get diagnosed and prescribed your pill, but if it is depression, anxiety or fear.... you should suck it up and deal with it. Why? Why is it perceived as being more macho to have high blood pressure, bad cholesterol, diabetes or cancer, than it is to be suffering from uncontrollable depression, fear and anxiety?? Why do we believe we need to only support one another in times of medical crisis but not when someone cannot get out of bed because of depression? We need to urge the ones we care about to seek mental health when needed, just as you would urge someone you love to go get medical attention for a broken bone.

Over the next month, I will be confidentially quoting the clients from Compass Counseling Center, and how counseling has helped them. Let us all lift one another up for DE-stigmatizing mental health in our community!

When we kids had been running around playing hard and our faces were red- "Grandma would say... Go Drink Some Wa-


Approximately 400 billion gallons of water are used in the United States every day.

Humility is a difficult concept to explain, one that we say we want and yet one that we sometimes misunderstand and misapply as we reach for it. Humility is not false modesty or self-degradation. Yes, we need to be aware of our weaknesses and seek Jesus for growth and strength that we do not possess. However having a low opinion of oneself is not humility, nor is thinking our giftings are less valuable than others. C.S. Lewis in the Screwtape Letters says it best that God wants to bring us "to a state of mind in which he could design the best cathedral in the world, and know it to be the best, and rejoice in the fact, without being any more or less or otherwise glad at having done it than he would be if it had

Jesus defines humility for us by His actions. Paul describes Jesus's servant attitude defined by His humility in Philippians 2:1-11. Humility is "counting others more significant than yourselves" [v. 3] and "let each of you look not only to his own interests, but also to the interests of others" [v. 4]. Paul spends the next few verses describing Jesus becoming a servant, living a

fering humiliation because He put our needs before His own. Jesus shows us exactly how to consider others better than ourselves and how to look out for the interests of others and not just our own. Jesus shows us how to have a truly self-sacrificing love.

Not only does Jesus show us the way, but He will empower us to live this way. Jesus can and will transform us. We however, need to recognize our need for empowerment that comes from outside of ourselves. We will never be good enough, but we do not have to degrade ourselves to achieve the transformation Jesus desires. Let us come to Jesus to be transformed into the image of the men and women we have been created to be. We are called to humility, but we have also been called to great works through the empowerment of the Holy Spirit as we submit to a humble Savior who came that first Christmas because He wanted to rescue and redeem His people. 



For 45 years, NDSU Extension county offices have provided local opportunities to take certification exams. However, while county offices are part of the NDSU Extension system.

their operations and practices are governed by county government. Thus, each office may have different requirements and procedures for issuing exams. Applicators/dealers seeking to take exams should call ahead for an appointment and visit with county staff regarding availability and local policies.

made pies were awesome but don't let that get out, I'm happy not being asked to bring pies to church socials.

The table is made ready with a rust colored tablecloth that's a bit to short: plates, silverware and napkins are in a stack. The turkeys are carved and the feast is spread across the counters, stovetop: every inch of space is covered. Dave leads the meal prayer and the grandsons yell out "AMEN!"

After several trips through the

buffet, everyone is ready for naps the pies will have to wait. It's time to scrape dishes and load the dishwasher. The turkeys are deboned, the hunt for Tupperware and any container with a lid to store leftovers. The kitchen looks like a war zone, Norm Rockwell probably turned over in his grave!







When children are little, they love without question or discrimination, whether its people or the cat that refuses to sit still for the hugs. At some point, whether by direction or by ex-



Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

In our last study, we focused on Daniel 1:8: "But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank; therefore he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself." Daniel, not letting the possible consequences of his decision deter him, made a covenant with God. His love for God and desire to please Him were his first considerations. So he decided that come what may, he would not defile himself. And it is obvious from the verses that follow that his three friends, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah, went

along with Daniel's decision. Today let us begin to focus on the results of this decision. They can be summed up in the words of the unnamed prophet whom God sent to rebuke Eli, the high priest, for allowing his wicked sons to continue serving as priests. He told Eli that God would cut off his family line from the priesthood and gave this reason: "For those who honor Me I will honor, and those who despise Me shall be lightly esteemed" (1 Samuel 2:30).

We are not saying that obeying and honoring God makes one worthy to be honored by God-nothing of the sort. Jesus summed up the matter in Luke 17:10: "So likewise you, when you have done all those things which you are commanded, say, 'We are unprofitable servants. We have done what was our duty to do." If a Christian were

single thought, word, and deed of his life, he would only be doing his duty. Furthermore, we must also realize that it is God Himself who enables a person to do what pleases Him. Jesus said in John 15:5, "He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing." And the apostle Paul wrote in Philippians 2:13, "For it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure." Yet God is so gracious that He delights to bless those who, as a result of His work in them, obey Him. The blessing God gives to obedience is not earned, vet it is His gracious response to it.

Let us see how God blessed and honored Daniel and his three friends because they honored Him. The chief eunuch's first response to Daniel's request was that he feared they might appear unhealthy because of their diet, causing the king to become angry. Daniel then respectfully requested that an experiment be conductedthat he and his friends might try a vegetarian diet for ten days. The chief eunuch agreed to this, and we find the result in Daniel 1:15-16: "And at the end of ten days their features appeared better and fatter in flesh than all the young men who ate the portion of the king's delicacies. Thus the steward took away their portion of delicacies and the wine that they were to drink,

and gave them vegetables." Do we not have to ask, "How could Daniel and his friends look better than those eating the king's diet?" A vegetarian might say, "What do you expect from eating so healthily?" But there is a point here that we should not ignore. God must bless any diet. It is possible for someone to eat the most nutritious food on earth and yet still have poor health. Daniel knew that the experiment he planned would work only if God blessed it. Nothing ultimately prospers without God's blessing. If we believe this, we will find ourselves praying much more about the things we do and the decisions we make.

Lord willing, we shall look at some other results from Daniel's and his friends' obedience next time. But to conclude today, let us remember that obedience to God is never a MEANS of being made right with Him. Obedience to God is the RESULT of being made right with Him. The only way any person can become acceptable to God is by coming to Him through the Lord Jesus Christ. While hanging on the cross, Jesus bore the wrath of God to pay for all the sins of all His people and provided salvation for them. Only the person who has been saved by relying exclusively on that payment can then please and honor God. I hope that is the case with all who are reading this.


