Bill tore up the letter, took out his shovel and buried the pieces. Sun coming up, he smiled and went to work.

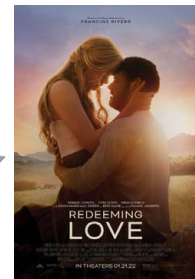

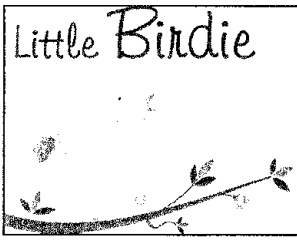

Claudius thought men were unwilling to join the army because of their strong attachment to their wives and family. Claudius banned engagements and marriages; St. Valentine felt the decree was unjust. St. Valentine performed weddings in secret for young lovers. Claudius had Valentine arrested and ordered him put to death. Valentine was dragged before the Prefect of Rome beaten to death and beheaded on February 14, around 270 AD. Legend says while in prison St. Valentine befriended the jailer's daughter: In a farewell note to her he signed it, "From Your Valentine." In 496 AD Pope Gelasius declared February 14th St. Valentine's Day to replace the Feast of Lupercalia a pagan festival of love: A rather gruesome beginning to one of the most beloved and celebrated days of the year.

Valentine's Day is now very commercialized, and heaven forbid a husband should forget! My Parents were married for 73 years; I don't think my Dad ev-



ery brought home chocolates, flowers or champagne. I never heard them say "I Love You" and I was around 12 years old before I saw them kiss each other. That being said I never questioned their love for each other. They lived out their marriage vows everyday of their life together. Their commitment to each other got them through WWII, crop failures, raising 12 children, burying 3 sons and the challenges of old age. This

is the kind of love we should be celebrating on St. Valentine's Day: Christ like Love. The unconditional love God has for us: He sent his Only Begotten Son into the world to die on The Cross for Love of Us.

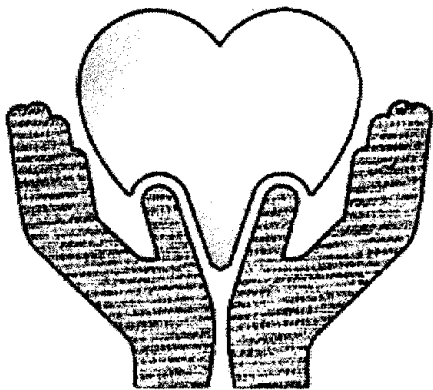

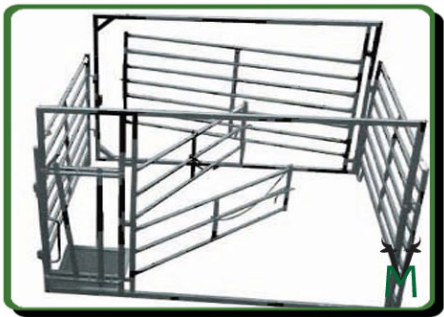



Thoughts for the week

What is it really like living in a small town. Well first of all, small is relative to what you know. To someone who is or was born into a city of a million people, small is 30 or maybe 50 thousand people. When someone says small town to me, Mott is not the first thought that comes to mind. I was raised in a town of about 50 - 70 people, give or take the summer arrivals and coming and going of students, so I don't think Mott is small. Smaller than a lot, but there are a lot of smaller towns out there as well. Take for example, Marshall, ND which is the home of Brad Gjermunson, who if you are into Rodeo at all, you know as a 4 times saddle bronc World Champion that boasts a current population of 60.

Part of the charm of a small town is that there is a lot of peace and quiet. We don't have a lot of traffic and except for the occasional jake brake coming into town, it is pretty restful and sleeping is easier. There are not a lot of horns and honking from car alarms unless somebody accidentally hits an alarm instead of the car starter and there are still people who don't lock their cars in the first place. We don't see many thefts, but I can remember one in the last 30 years when someone came thru town hitchhiking and found an unlocked car at the school, keys included, drove it north of town and rolled it. As in many small towns, these kind of things get remembered by someone, whether the owner wants to have it known or not.

Another advantage is the fact that you can raise kids relatively safely. Children generally are friends from grade school on through high school and sometimes keep those friendships throughout their whole lives. Children moving into town often find friends to be with as long as they are willing to accept that things here are a bit slower moving. Technology may actually be a bit better than in the larger areas as we have broadband capabilities and with the advent of computer learning, access to laptops and cell phones of today, we are at the forefront. Teachers today utilize all at their means to educate children younger and younger, which can be a plus or minus since it may be that more computer learning means less physical learning and more dependence upon technology with less actual physical interaction. However, the student to teacher ratio is quite low and teachers have more contact with their students than in a larger school. Smaller town means less ability to find dangerous situations, but as in all communities, there are still some things that cannot be avoided. God willing that they remain low and that our children continue to be as safe as we can make them.

Sure there are some disadvantages, but overall, people in a small town are friendly and willing to help out their neighbors, new or not. May take a while to get to know some of the older residents especially if you are younger and have school age children and they do not, but mostly if you take the time to visit with some of the people, you may find that there are some really great people in a small town. I know that people who move

from a larger community, find it a bit harder to fit in as they are not used to the constant waving when people drive by whether you know who they are or not. I actually had one person tell me they were floored when people just stopped outside their house and walked in to talk to them just cause they saw them inside their garage. This was unheard of where they came from as it might have signaled that they would be attacked by the local gang on a home invasion. So I guess it might take some getting used to if you did come from the

city, but I think its worth it in the long run.

The whole point of this is that small town life may not be perfectly idyllic but it has many positive aspects and fewer negative ones overall. If you can get used to the waving and smiling from people you have no idea who they are and start to wave and smile back, you may be pleasantly surprised at the results. In any case, I encourage you to give it a try and if you see me on the street, wave and smile and I shall do my best to do the same. God Bless you all.

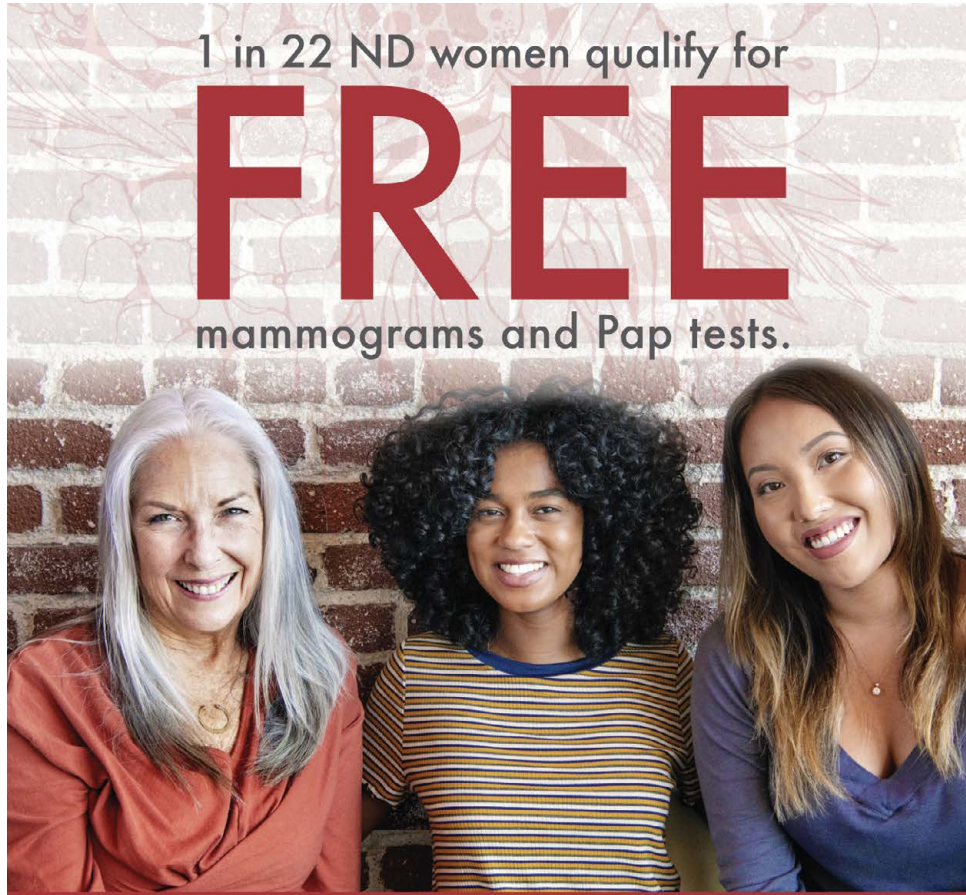

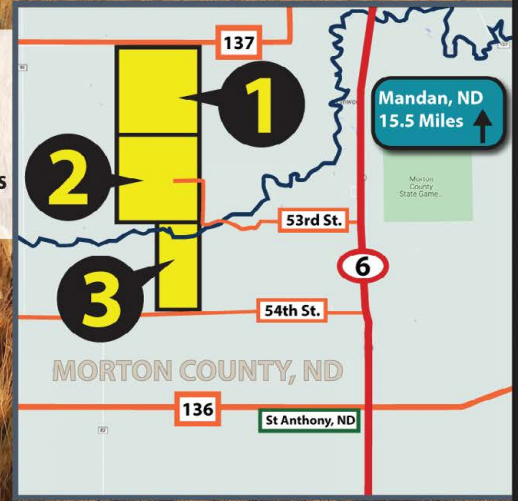

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time in our study of the book of Daniel, we saw that after Daniel explained the meaning of King Nebuchadnezzar's dream to him, the king made a remarkable confession: "Truly your God is the God of gods, the Lord of kings" (Daniel 2:47). As we look now at the first verse of chapter three, we ask, "Was Nebuchadnezzar's confession a reflection of a true change of heart?" Sadly, the answer is a resounding NO. Instead of turning to God, the king hardens into

deeper pride. We read in Daniel 3:1, "Nebuchadnezzar the king made an image of gold, whose height was sixty cubits and its width six cubits. He set it up in the plain of Dura, in the province of Babylon."

Now consider that Nebuchadnezzar saw in his dream a statue with a head of gold. As Daniel explained, this represented the king and the Babylonian Empire. And while his kingdom was perhaps the greatest of all, it would be replaced by future kingdoms which were represented by other materials in the statue. By having a statue of gold built, measuring about ninety feet tall by nine feet wide, Nebuchadnezzar seems to be saying that he would not be just the head of gold; he will be the entire statue. And as we shall see next time, Lord willing, he is determined have the whole empire bow down to him. He has gone from what appeared to be a humble worshiper of God to a bold, defiant competitor with God.

Friends, it is possible to have religious experiences without undergoing a deep, lasting change of heart in conversion. The Puritan John Owen has described this as people who are taking a journey to a specific destination. Along the way, a severe storm forces them to leave the road and take shelter. But the storm has only brought them a brief scare. When it passes and the sun shines again, they are back on the road headed for their destination. So it is with the one who has a religious experi-

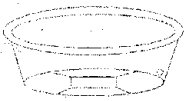
ence but is not converted. The Word of God may create a temporary turbulence in a person's life, which may cause him or her to turn aside from the sinful course he or she was pursuing. This person has been shaken up, but not changed. And so, when the period of fear or conviction has passed, he or she goes right back to pursuing a life of sin.

It is also possible for people to praise the Word of God or even the messenger of God's Word without having a true love for God Himself. Nebuchadnezzar admired Daniel and praised Daniel's God but had no personal love for God. Furthermore, those who have some sort of positive response to God's Word and then turn away from it, sometimes go deeper into sin and hardness of heart, as did Nebuchadnezzar.

Friends, we must beware of being deceived about the most

important issue in life—are we right with God? How can we know whether we have truly been converted and reconciled to God? First, we must realize that we all come into this world as sinners who are under God's holy wrath (Romans 3:10-19). We must be given eyes to see that we need a Savior to restore us to a right relationship with God. And then we must rely fully and exclusively on what the Lord Jesus Christ did on the cross in taking the punishment for our sins upon Himself as our Substitute. Salvation is a free gift of our gracious God. No one can earn or deserve it. It must be received by faith alone. John 3:36: "He who believes in the Son has everlasting life; and he who does not believe the Son shall not see life, but the wrath of God abides on him." Please be sure you have placed your trust in the Son.

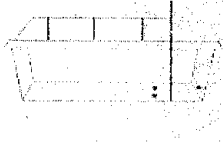

RECIPE OF THE DAY
5-INGREDIENT STRAWBERRY LEMON CRUMBLE BARS
 1 roll refrigerated sugar cookie dough
 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
 1 tablespoon grated lemon peel and 2 1/2 teaspoons lemon juice from 1 large lemon
 1/2 cup strawberry jam
 1/4 cup powdered sugar

Heat oven to 350°F. Line 8-inch square pan with foil, extending foil over sides of pan; spray with cooking spray. In medium bowl, break up cookie dough. Add flour and grated lemon peel; mix or knead until well blended. (DO NOT EAT RAW COOKIE DOUGH AFTER COMBINING WITH FLOUR.) Press 1 1/4 cups of the mixture into pan. Bake 15 minutes. In small bowl, mix jam and 1 teaspoon of the lemon juice; carefully spread jam on top of bar base. Crumble remaining cookie dough mixture on jam layer. Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until cookie dough top is golden brown. Cool completely, about 1 hour 30 minutes. In Small bowl, mix powdered sugar and 1 teaspoon of the remaining lemon juice until smooth. If necessary for drizzling consistency, add additional 1/2 teaspoon lemon juice. Using fork, drizzle glaze on top of bars. Let stand 15 minutes. Remove from pan using foil handles. Cut into 4 rows by 4 rows.
