



TRAFFICKED IN THE HEARTLAND

Kelly Patterson

While shame and pain kept her quiet for years, Kelly Patterson's journey of healing and freedom from sexual exploitation are giving her a loud voice today. Believing that unity is key, she enjoys collaborating with others to battle against sex slavery. One of the many ways Kelly engages in this war is by working alongside Law Makers in writing and/or changing trafficking laws.

She desires to be an aid in freeing those wounded from the effects of all forms of sexual trauma, with a specific emphasis on sex trafficking. Coming from the perspective of one who has walked the long road out, Kelly has a dynamic style and ability to relate to her audience. As a speaker, she is engaging and unafraid to tell it like it is. Withholding the hard truths is not a road she has chosen to take.

Kelly was trafficked within the state of South Dakota and the surrounding states. In addition to the Midwest, trafficking

eventually took her into several other states and countries. Her experiential knowledge of how ring trafficking a.k.a. organized crime commercial sexual exploitation operates is incredibly valuable to those hoping to make a difference in this very real war. She details her captivity in the dark world of sex trafficking and the journey out in her book "From Trafficked to Treasured". Kelly is also currently authoring a workbook and facilitator manual for sexual trauma support groups titled "The Pendulum"; and is co-authoring a book titled "Freedom Cry".

Kelly Patterson is the Founder and Director of Treasured Lives, a survivor-led anti-trafficking organization in the Black Hills of South Dakota. She is a wife, mother, and grandmother. Kelly is also a lead pastor, speaker, consultant, and an active advocate in freeing those wounded from the effects of sexual crimes such as abuse, assault, and trafficking.

This presentation will contain Kelly Patterson's personal story of being sex trafficked in the Midwest.



The listener will receive Sex Trafficking (Commercial Sexual Exploitation) 101 basics interwoven into her personal story. The participants can expect to learn relevant details regarding the prevalence of ring trafficking in the Midwest/Heartland of the USA. The audience will also gain an

understanding of the different forms of sex trafficking found in the Midwest plus the signs and symptoms of CSE.

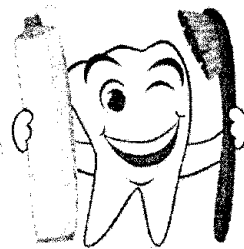

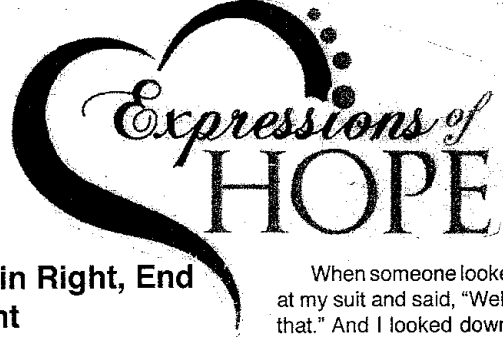

Begin Right, End Right

Back in the mid-80's (dating myself here) I heard this amazing speaker by the name of Bob Benson. Bob has since passed away, but his books are still around, and I happen to have one of them!

Bob was an ordained elder and a wonderful writer as well! I would like to share some of his writing with you from his book called, "He Speaks Softly":

Paul is echoing the theme of Jesus, "...seek first his kingdom and his righteousness and all these things will be given to you as well" (Matthew 6:33). The calling is to a trust in the Father and simplicity of life that does make us free. And I hear those words coming to me as a gracious invitation. Here is the way I heard them recently:

I was invited out to a college to speak the other day - you always want to do your best at a college. They are such reservoirs of knowledge and erudition - at least it seems they certainly should be when one considers how much learning the freshmen bring with them and how little the seniors actually take away.

There was also the added disadvantage of being in my own hometown - five hundred miles is about the distance at which I begin to change into a downright expert on any number of important topics and subjects.

So I had studied hard - and prayed earnestly - for seriously, it is a deep challenge to speak to people of that age. To try to add some direction to them from out here where I am - these thirty-odd years from commencement. And to try to do so in a way that will not tarnish the brightness of their optimism. It is not a task that I take lightly.

And I put on my best three-piece navy pinstriped suit - thinking maybe I would at least look like "a wise man from the east." And I went out to chapel and spoke. They were courteous and they listened attentively to me. Afterward I was down talking to some students - I wasn't mobbed or anything like that - my safety was never endangered.

right. There is just one place to begin your life. There will always be a button left over or an extra hole - when you start wrong. But if you begin right, if you seek first His kingdom and His righteousness - the Father and I will guarantee that the rest will find their rightful places.

If I could have told them anything that morning - I mean in a way that it really stayed with them I guess it would have been about the place to start. I don't know if they heard my words that morning, I just hope they heard my vest. (p. 119-20)

I don't know about you but in reading what Bob wrote here I am becoming more aware that I don't always have the answers to the questions that are being asked and I am not smart enough to make all the decisions that have to be made!

With the Covid virus, the delta variant, the omicron variant and then whatever else they come up with concerning this virus, the problems with Russia and Ukraine, China, empty grocery shelves, and on and on.

To be honest with you I am not strong enough to do all the things I should be doing, and I am not nearly wise enough to choose the right path when life comes falling in all around me.

The consolation comes in a myriad of ways but one that stands out to me is this...even if I begin wrong, I know that He will be there to help me find my way to Him and if I will begin right and if I live in the Spirit and seek to be just like Him...He [Jesus] will see to the endings!

When someone looked down at my suit and said, "Well look at that." And I looked down to see what that was - only to see that my vest was buttoned wrong. All the time I had been standing in front of those students not to mention the faculty and the administration thinking I was looking reasonably important. And all the time they must have been sitting there thinking where did they get this guy who doesn't even know how to button his clothes?

Since it happened - let me try to salvage a bit of my wounded pride and honor by philosophizing about it for a moment or two. It is not hard to button your vest wrong you know - all you have to do is put the second button in the top hole. Or else slip the second hole over the top button. From then on it is as easy as falling off a log. Because the rest will follow along slick as a whistle - all you have to do is start wrong - ending wrong will take care of itself.

And do you know how I hear the words of Christ coming to me these days? Very simply. I guess they would have to be for a fifty-four-year-old who hasn't passed buttoning yet. But I hear Him saying to me...there is just one way to button your vest

Trent Loos Speaks To Crowds

People kept streaming through the doors to hear the popular speaker for the evening and his topic that involves all of us. Free chili was donated until it ran out but they had plenty left over.

Well-known Nebraska rancher Trent Loos spoke to about 350 people at the Biesiot Activity Center in Dickinson on January 25. His topic was the 30x30 plan. He also spoke to about the same amount of people in New Salem the following night.

The 30x30 plan is a plan to permanently protect 30% of America's land and oceans by 2030. It was adopted by the Administration through Executive Order #14008 "Tackling the Climate Crisis at Home and Abroad" and signed on January 27, 2021.

"They want to control 30 percent of our nation's land but one in 3 acres already is owned by the government and 12 percent is in easements," Trent com-



mented. "They want to get the land out of control of the people and give to state control. One fire put more particulate in the air than 10 years of car emissions. In fact in 2000, there was less particulate in the air than in the 1930s. The difference was conservation. Individuals make the difference."

In 2021, American farmers produced more with less hours. The government is currently buying up property and lots of it. National wilderness is expanding in areas.

Handouts on each table gave more information on the 30x30 plan. Proponents argue that climate change impacts are human-caused and this bill is necessary to reverse climate change. They want it immediately to avoid impacts on the ecosystem and wildlife. But there is no science to their plan.

It is a power shift from our private property principles to one controlled by the administration. There is no constitutional or statutory authority for the President, the Department of the Interior, or the Department of Agriculture to set aside and permanently preserve 30 percent of all land and oceans of the United States and no such authority is referenced in the Executive Order or the President's 30x30 report on it. They want to remove local government's veto power over federal land acquisitions.

This is just the first step. Advocates are working towards the international goal to permanently conserve 50 percent of our lands and oceans by 2050. In October of 2020, Governor Newsom decided that 24 percent of their state met the 30x30 definition and he signed it. On September 22, 2021, the

IUCN Conservation Congress in France called for 70 percent of the world's lands and oceans be protected.

If proponents were truly concerned about the welfare of species and habitat, they would oppose placing more land under the control of federal management or environmental elites and instead remove the regulatory restrictions on America's landowners who provide the best managed lands, while producing the food, fiber, minerals, and energy we depend on to live free.

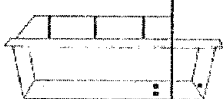

Giving Hearts Day Feb. 10: JMHCC raising funds for ER project

Give from the heart on Giving Hearts Day Feb. 10 and help the Jacobson Memorial Hospital Foundation (JMHF) with a fundraising campaign, "Working TogethER to Reach a Dream," to renovate the entrance to Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center's (JMHCC) emergency room.

On Thursday, Feb. 10, the JMHF will participate in Giving Hearts Day, a 24-hour online fundraising event.

With your generosity, the JMHF hopes to raise funds during Giving Hearts Day to support JMHCC in Elgin to complete a \$190,000 renovation to construct a covered outside emergency entrance to the hospital.

The entrance would then lead patients directly into the emergency room, rather than through the lobby and hallways of the facility. It would also offer protection from the weather as patients are being taken in and out of the emergency room to the ambulance or other transportation.

"Providing a more secure, private entrance out of the elements has been a goal of JMHCC for many years," said JMHCC CEO Theo Stoller.

Completion of the entrance is Phase 1A and 1B of a proposed project. Phase 2 then includes renovating the emergency room area inside the building.

Grants and other funding are also being sought to complete other phases of the project, which is estimated to cost more than \$1 million in total.

Or visit the JMHCC website at www.jacobsonhospital.org and click on the "donate" button, which will take you to the Giving Hearts Day website also. Do you wish to donate before Feb. 10? Donors may also schedule their online gifts for Giving Hearts Day by going online before Feb. 10! Visit www.givingheartsday.org, and add a donation to JMHF. From there, simply search for the Jacobson Memorial Hospital Foundation, then follow the instructions to complete the checkout process to have your donation processed on the morning of Giving Hearts Day, so it counts toward the Giving Hearts Day total.

All donations are tax-deductible. You will receive a receipt via email immediately following your online donation.

Donors are also encouraged to honor a loved one with a donation in their memory or to honor a parent or grandparent. Families are encouraged to join together to donate to honor a loved one.

Those who do not wish to participate in Giving Hearts Day, but who want to donate to this vital project, are welcome to send a check at any time to JMHF, with a note that the donation is for the campaign.

The Elgin Lions Club has donated a \$4,000 match to the Giving Hearts Day event.

"We thank the Elgin Lions Club for their generous donation in support of this project," Stoller said.

Giving Hearts Day is hosted by the Dakota Medical Foundation, the High Impact Institute and the Alex Stern Family Foundation.

This is the second year that Giving Hearts Day donations are being directed toward the emergency entrance fundraising campaign.

Last year, JMHF raised more than \$53,000 during its partici-

pation in Giving Hearts Day.

"We want to thank everyone who donated during this event last year," Stoller said. "The support displayed during Giving Hearts Day was truly heart-warming."

With last year's Giving Hearts Day, JMHF has raised approximately \$97,000 toward its \$190,000 goal thus far.

The Foundation began participating in Giving Hearts Day in 2015, when just over \$10,000 was raised in a single day.

Phases of ER project:

The three phases to renovate the entire emergency room area include:

- Phase 1A: Moving parking lot 10 feet to the west to allow for a canopy and emergency room entrance to be created.

- Phase 1B: During this phase, a canopy will be constructed to fit two ambulances and shield patients and staff from weather and scrutiny. This is the portion of Phase 1B the Jacobson Memorial Hospital Foundation hopes to fund through Giving Hearts Day donations. Also in this phase, an ER entrance through a vestibule will be created, with ER waiting available, a nurses' station within the ER area and controlled access into the ER. An area will be used for COVID-19 outpatient infusions.

- Phase 2: This phase entails moving the nurses' station to its final destination, adding a bathroom to the COVID-19 ambulatory space, adding two ER bays, adding a bathroom within the ER and adding a soiled utility room. The nurses' station will be expanded to have direct oversight over patients and to register incoming emergency patients.

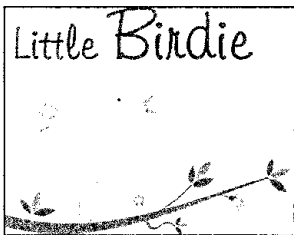

A Little Birdie Told Me: "Never Underestimate the Power of Prayer." I've often wondered what people who have no faith in God do in times of trouble. I look back over the events in my life and I'm so grateful for having prayer to turn to in times of great sadness, anxiety & joy. When our Son was injured in a golfing accident as the ambulance sped to Bismarck I held his hand and clung to my rosary. Most recently after waiting 8 years to adopt a baby our Daughter and her Husband were blessed with Nikolai. Nikolai Joel Raphael was born on Dec. 21, 2021, they brought him home the next day. With tears of joy prayers of gratitude filled our hearts. Many

prayers were answered that day, prayers from family, friends and people we don't even know. Many times I was angry with God, questioning His time, asking "WHY, WHY, WHY?" I cried many tears as I prayed, begging God to bless them with a child. My heart broke for them each time they weren't chosen by the birth mother. Prayer helped me persevere especially at times when I felt I might despair.

Looking back over my childhood and beyond my Parents were great examples of living their faith in good times and bad. Devote Catholics they attended Sunday Mass come hell or high water. When my Dad retired they attending daily Mass and Dad lead the Rosary until his memory began to fail when he was close to 90 years old. Dad developed dementia but remained at home until he died at age 96. I would take my Dad on walks in his wheelchair; we often stopped at the Church just to pray a few Hail Marys. One day he told me, "I thank God everyday sometimes a dozen times a day for Josie (my Mom)." Dad would often ask us,

"When can I go home?" We all knew he wanted to go home to be with God. After Dad died Mom continued to live at home until she died at nearly 97. Every night after she was tucked in bed the last thing she would ask, "Where's my Rosary?" Prayer continued to be a refuge for my parents until they passed away. I now pray the Rosary daily: it has been a great comfort, especially in times when I felt completely helpless.

Christmas 2021 would prove to be one of the most joyful and difficult we have ever experienced. The whole family was together to welcome home Nikolai and celebrate the Birth of Jesus. Without being invited Covid came to visit. All 8 of the adults became very ill with the virus. Our Daughter Breanne was hit the hardest. Breanne with a brand new baby, ended up in ICU for 5 days, Darrell the new Dad took on caring for Nikolai. We called and sent texts to everyone we know and requested prayers. By the grace of God and prayer we are all on the mend, Breanne is home, loving Nikolai.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Our last few times together in the book of Daniel were devoted to the largest part of chapter two, which gives the content and the interpretation of the dream that God gave to Nebuchadnezzar. Today we pick up with the final verses of the chapter. What we see there is Nebu-

chadnezzar's response to Daniel's having given him both the content and interpretation of his dream. Verses 46-47 seem to be somewhat confusing: "Then King Nebuchadnezzar fell on his face, prostrate before Daniel, and commanded that they should present an offering and incense to him. The king answered Daniel, and said, 'Truly your God is the God of gods, the Lord of kings, and a revealer of secrets, since you could re-

veal this secret." What appears confusing is that we find Nebuchadnezzar first giving worship to Daniel and then giving praise to Daniel's God. But for a Babylonian this would not be a problem. For not only did the Babylonians have a multitude of gods which they worshiped, but they also believed that certain men could actually be gods.

If we can read between the lines here, it would seem that between verses 46 and 47, Daniel must have responded to Nebuchadnezzar in a manner similar to Peter when Cornelius attempted to worship him. In Acts 10:26 we read, "But Peter lifted him up, saying, 'Stand up; I myself am also a man.'" That something like this did actually occur is supported by the fact that verse 47 begins with the words, "The king answered Daniel and said." We know that Daniel had made it abundantly clear BEFORE he disclosed the dream that it was God who had revealed it.

Whether or not Daniel was able to correct the king, Nebuchadnezzar in verse 47 begins to give verbal glory to Daniel's God. He confesses to Daniel the same thing Daniel had confessed to him: "Truly your God is the God of gods, the Lord of kings, and a revealer of secrets, since you could reveal this secret." This is a remarkable statement. For Nebuchadnezzar, at least verbally, confesses that Daniel's God is the "Lord of kings," meaning that He is the one from whom all rulers derive their power AND that He is the

one to whom they are accountable. Next week, Lord willing, we shall see whether this praise reflects a true conversion of Nebuchadnezzar's heart.

In the next verse, we see how the king rewarded Daniel: "Then the king promoted Daniel and gave him many great gifts; and he made him ruler over the whole province of Babylon, and chief administrator over all the wise men of Babylon" (Daniel 2:48). This position was a very high one. But Daniel's promotion and great honor did not cause him to forget his friends. For verse 49 tells us, "Also Daniel petitioned the king, and he set Shadrach, Meshach, and Abed-Nego over the affairs of the province of Babylon; but Daniel sat in the gate of the king." Those who had helped Daniel with their prayers are now made to share with him in his honors. But there is something else in this action of Daniel besides a recognition and appreciation for his personal friends. He also shows great wisdom. For the wisest thing any civil ruler can do is to appoint men who know the Word of God and who will make decisions based upon it. Daniel, now having such a high and responsible position, wanted to be surrounded by men who were godly and could help him fulfill his great responsibility as unto the Lord. Oh, that God would raise up such rulers in our land.

RECIPE OF THE DAY

CHICKEN FAJITAS CASSEROLE

1 lb. cooked boneless, skinless chicken breasts, shredded
1 tablespoon olive oil
1 small green bell pepper, sliced into thin strips
1 small red bell pepper, sliced into thin strips
1 small yellow onion, thinly sliced
1/4 teaspoon salt
8 oz. cream cheese, softened, cut up into pieces for easier mixing
8 oz. shredded cheddar cheese
1 1/2 tablespoons fajita seasoning mix
Salt and fresh ground pepper, to taste
Fresh cilantro or parsley, for garnish

Preheat oven to 350°F. Lightly grease a 9x13 baking dish with cooking spray; set aside. Shred the baked chicken breast and then transfer to a large mixing bowl; set aside. Heat olive oil in a skillet set over medium-high heat. Add strips of peppers and onions to the hot oil; sprinkle with salt and cook for 4 to 5 minutes, or until softened. Stir frequently. Remove from heat and add to the chicken. Set aside. In a large bowl combine cream cheese, HALF of shredded cheddar, fajitas seasoning mix, salt, and pepper; mix until thoroughly combined. Add sour cream mixture to the chicken and peppers; mix until everything is well combined. Transfer chicken mixture to previously prepared baking dish and sprinkle with remaining shredded cheddar cheese. Bake for 25 to 30 minutes, or until hot and bubbly, and cheese is melted. Remove from oven and garnish with chopped cilantro or parsley. Serve and enjoy!
