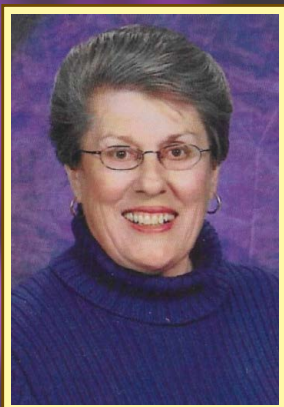

Truth be told it's pretty great here most of the year.

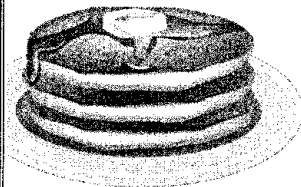

Dr. Toshi Is In!

Dear Dr. Toshi,

What is the GI tract and what's the difference between the GI tract and the digestive system?

You may have heard your doctor or other medical provider use the term "the GI tract," and may have wondered what that exactly means. So, today, we'll talk about your GI tract and also how it's related to your digestive system.

"GI" is short for "gastrointestinal." "Gastro" means stomach and "intestinal," of course, means your intestine, or gut. So, your GI tract is basically a pipeline that starts at your mouth and ends at your anus. When you eat something, obviously you put your food into your mouth, and then the food goes down your esophagus (the pipeline that goes from your mouth down to your stomach), then it goes into the stomach. Your stomach is located in your upper abdomen right below your ribs. Then the food goes down through the small intestine, then through the large intestine (which includes the cecum and the colon), and ends up at the rectum to anus, where you get rid of it. So, the GI tract connects like this: mouth to esophagus to stomach to small intestine to large intestine to rectum to anus.

Your GI tract is a surprisingly long pipeline that goes through your body! I say it's very long because the small intestine is three-and-a-half times your height, which is 22 feet on average in adults! Yes, the small intestine is actually jammed in your tummy! The cecum connects the small intestine to the

colon which is located in the right lower area of your abdomen. From there the colon goes straight up to where your ribs are on your right side, then it goes across toward your left side above your belly button, and then goes down to your left side and connects to your rectum and anus. Can you picture that?

Because the mouth and the anus are open to the outside world, the GI tract is considered "outside of your body" even though it runs right through the inside your body. Interesting, isn't it?

Now I'll talk a little about your digestive system. You know that it has something to do with digestion, but you might have wondered what the difference is between the digestive system and the GI tract. The digestive system is more than just the GI tract. It also includes your liver, pancreas, and gallbladder because those three organs play key roles in digestion, which is the processing of your food so your body can use it.

So, if you ever have problems with your liver, you could go see a GI doctor, a doctor who specializes in the entire digestive system, including the liver, pancreas, gallbladder and GI tract.

I'll talk about some problems that can happen with the GI tract next week. But for now, I hope you got a picture of the GI tract and found out a little about the difference between the GI tract and the digestive system!



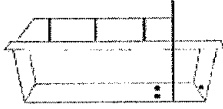

Cloud Seeding Operations Summary For June 1-6, 2021

BISMARCK, N.D. - The 2021 North Dakota Cloud Modification Project (NDCMP) began operations for the season on June 1. The southwestern corner of North Dakota including Bowman and Slope Counties has experienced long-term drought conditions since last year and recent record-breaking heat has worsened conditions. For this reason, rain enhancement operations were requested in addition to hail suppression to start the program.

In the District 1 operations area, which includes Bowman and part of Slope Counties, aircraft conducted seeding operations on the evening of June 5. During the first six days of June, three flights were flown by project aircraft.

This week brings more frequent chances for thunderstorms as North Dakota sees a favorable upper-level pattern change. Temperatures will remain above normal though with high temperatures in the upper 80s to lower 90s.

Radar facilities in Bowman operate around the clock during the NDCMP. Radar images can be viewed on the Atmospheric Resource Board's web site at <http://www.swc.nd.gov/arb>. The NDCMP will continue through the end of August.





adopting the thoughts and ways of the world. They are calling good evil and evil good (see Isaiah 5:20).
 Not only do we need to be able to resist the wrong thinking which is so pervasive, but we also need to know the truth. And the only infallible source of the truth is the Bible. Jesus said in His prayer to God the Father in John 17:17, "Sanctify them by Your truth. Your word is truth." Let me encourage you to make a steady effort to read and study God's word. This is His means for renewing the mind and transforming the life. The Scriptures have principles which cover every area of life. They tell us how we may know God better and love and serve

Him more. They also tell us how to think, how to speak, how to act, and how to develop right priorities.
 And finally, we need the power of the indwelling Holy Spirit to enable us to live out what the word of God teaches. It is the Holy Spirit who lives and works in the believer both to will and to do God's good pleasure (see Philippians 2:13). We can't do it on our own. We need God's strength to live a godly life.
 As never before, the world needs to see true believers living godly lives, and Romans 12:1-2 gives us God's prescription for doing just that. May the Lord give His grace to all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus.



Reflections on the Words of Life

In most of our reflections on the words of life, we have seen what the Bible teaches about man's sinfulness and inability to make himself right with God. We have seen that God provided a solution for restoring man to a right relationship with Himself. He sent His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, who paid in full the debt of sin for all who would place their trust in Him alone for salvation.

But what about living the Christian life? What does the Bible say about those who have trusted in Christ as their Savior and Lord and want to know how they should live in this world? There is far too much to deal with in one article, but I would like to address just one passage found in Romans 12:1-2: "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

There are two main points to deal with in these verses. The first one is that the believer in Jesus Christ is to devote himself or herself to God. It is crucial that the believer understands that once he believes on the Lord Jesus Christ, he doesn't belong to himself or anyone else in this world, but to God alone. Making the very same point, the apostle Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 6:20,

"For you were bought at a price; therefore glorify God in your body and in your spirit, which are God's." That is why it is the believer's reasonable service to give his or her whole being to God. God purchased believers for Himself with the precious blood of Christ. Once we realize that, we have the whole course of life set out for us. I am to live to please and glorify God, even in the little things of life. For we read in 1 Corinthians 10:31, "Therefore, whether you eat or drink, or whatever you do, do all to the glory of God."

The second main point in Romans 12:2 is that we are told NOT to be conformed to this world but to be transformed by the renewing of our minds. Thank God that He has given believers in Jesus Christ a way to avoid becoming victims to the wrong and evil thinking that permeates this world. He has given us His precious word, the Bible, in order that it may transform the way we look at everything. Sad to say, the world is full of thinking which is ungodly. But even worse, there are many in the so-called church who are

Coyote Corner – Impasse

Some of you may have heard the district is having an impasse hearing on June 15, 2021, at 3 PM Mountain Time at the Elgin Community Center. You may be wondering what that is and why we are having it. The short version is that it is a part of the negotiations process here at the school. The school board and teacher union have been annually negotiating teacher contracts which includes things like leave, pay, and various benefits. This year the school board and teacher union were not able to settle on base pay and thus, an impasse was declared.

So what happens now?

The teacher union and the school board were required to prepare binders, which are considered open record, for what is called the Fact-Finding Commission. The binders provide the commission with information regarding the district's financials, current teacher contracts, and other relevant data to help

them do two things. The first is to make a recommendation to the teacher union and school board to reach an agreement. The second is make a determination should an agreement not be reached as to who is to blame for being at impasse. If no agreement is reached by June 28th this finding will be published as a full-page in the Grant County Press.

So, what is the Fact-Finding Commission? They are a group established by century code who are tasked with conducting these hearings and providing a third-party opinion in hopes of resolving impasses. This commission consists of three people. All of them have experience in education, some as instructors and some as board members. This commission conducts the hearing and acts as mediator between the school board and teacher union. The purpose of the hearing is to allow the commission to ask questions of the teacher union, school board, and the school's fiscal managers to clear up any

questions they may have had after reviewing the binders mentioned above. It also provides members of the public a chance to voice their opinions as well.

If you are reading this far and are still wondering what I mean by negotiations, here is a quick summary. Teachers in the state of North Dakota can form a union and have input on the Negotiated Agreement. The Negotiated Agreement is the document that governs teacher contracts. This document contains salary schedules, leave provisions, fringe benefits, and other aspects of teacher contracts. The Negotiated Agreement is not in and of itself a contract for employment, it simply governs the contracts issued by the school board. In short, it spells out what a teacher who is offered a contract will be making, what benefits they have, and a few other miscellaneous items such as the length of the workday. Negotiations allow teachers to have input on what is contained within this Negotiated Agreement and thus, some of the terms of their contracts. The school cannot issue teacher contracts until matters are settled regarding the Negotiated Agreement. This means until the teacher union and school board reach an agreement, or the impasse process is completed, no teacher contracts can be issued.

So, what remains to be resolved? At this time the school board offered another \$500 on the base salary for each year of a two-year agreement which could make starting pay for a teacher \$38,500 for 21-22 and \$39,000 for 22-23. The teach-

er union's last request was to have \$1,250 added to the base for the 21-22 school year, making the new base \$39,250 (one-year agreement). In the second scenario, the Negotiated Agreement would have to be negotiated again next year. The Fact-Finding Commission will weigh in on the board's and union's stances on changes to base pay with their own recommendation based on the binder's mentioned above and information gained from the hearing. This recommendation is not binding, however, and either a different agreement could be reached between both sides or it is possible unilateral contracts would be issued.

So that is what it means to be at impasse and what happens now because we are at impasse. Feel free to call the school if you have more questions. Please attend the hearing for yourself on June 15 at 3:00 PM Mountain time.

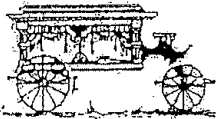

Dear God: I went to a wedding, and they kissed right in church. Is that okay?



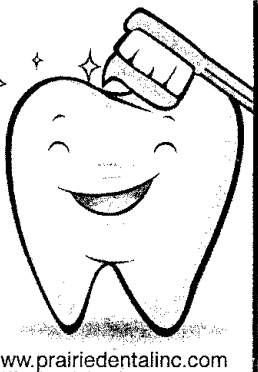

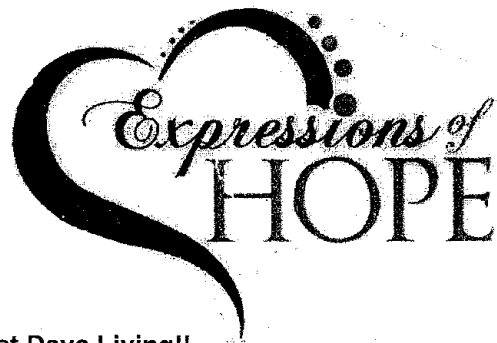

vs 17 "Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air and so shall we ever be with the Lord."

vs 18 So then comfort one another with these words."

The Word that we translate for the "caught up" is "harpado". In explanation. Carried away like the fish hawk carries it prey away, only in a good sense.

Note: the Apostle Paul considered the possibility of his being in those that, are alive and remain, using the 'WE' including himself. How much more does this apply to us this far removed for those times. Especially for these "Shakey Times!!"

As a sinner, 'Romans 3:23 "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God. Romans 6: 23." The wages of sin is death but the GIFT of God is eternal life through JESUS CHRIST OUR LORD!!! Pray and tell Him you will take the Gift of forgiveness of you as a sinner!!!

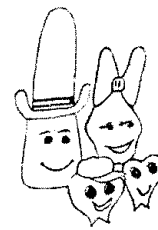

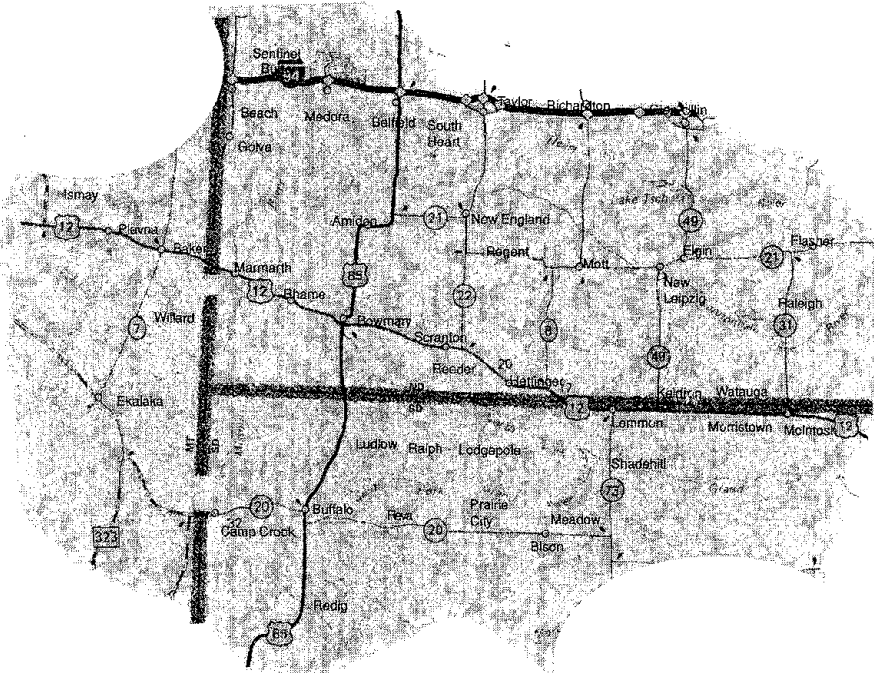

with just a house and a stack of bales that served as an out-house until they got plumbing. Often, Jerry and Linda would tear down old buildings, and used the lumber they salvaged to build new.

During his career he won numerous county fair 1st place trophies. One of the most memorable sheep shearing contests he was in was during the Tri-state Sheep Days in Belle Fourche, SD. Among the contestants was a national sheep shearing champion. Jerry, who consistently sheared each sheep within a minute, easily beat the reigning champion. A couple months later the reigning national shearing champion entered the Harding County Fair seeking retribution... Jerry beat him again, winning 1st place! Jerry's sheep shearing career was also highlighted by shearing along side two of his brothers, Karl, and Joe, and also through teaching his son, Jason, who also sheared alongside Jerry. Jerry was also known as a great, and patient teacher, having given many pointers and taught numerous others how to shear. After 40 years of shearing sheep professionally, Jerry retired at the age of 60, hanging up his hand piece.

While running the farm and ranch Jerry also did a lot of mechanic work for others and was able to repair all of his own equipment. He was always willing to lend a helping hand to neighbors whose equipment had broken down. He also enjoyed teaching mechanics every Friday at the Painter elementary school.

Jerry enjoyed watching his sons grow up and turn into respectable men, and was proud of their achievements in life. Often, as young sons often do, his boys would ask him for help... one of Jerry's best pieces of advice that he would often give both of his sons was: "If you can't do it, how do you expect me to."

Jerry also adored his grandsons, Trae, and Jae. He taught them a lot, and through his grandchildren, Jerry was able to relive a lot of his childhood by participating and mentoring each of the boys through their ever changing interests in life.

RECIPE OF THE DAY

LEMON RICOTTA PANCAKES

1 1/2 cups all purpose flour
1 tablespoon baking powder
3 tablespoons sugar
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 cup milk
1/2 cup ricotta cheese
2 eggs
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
2 tablespoons fresh lemon juice
1 tablespoon fresh lemon zest
2 tablespoons butter for cooking

OPTIONAL FOR SERVING: Extra ricotta, lemon zest, powdered sugar and blueberries.

In a large bowl, whisk together the dry ingredients: flour, baking powder, sugar and salt until well combined. In a medium bowl, add the milk and ricotta and whisk until well blended. Then add the eggs, beating between each. Then add the vanilla, lemon juice and lemon zest. Make a well in the dry ingredients and add the blended wet ingredients - just fold it gently, until JUST combined. Don't over mix or you will have tough pancakes. Melt or brush butter onto a large griddle and heat to medium. Add pancake batter, a cup at a time (or smaller if you want smaller pancakes). When you get bubbles, flip the pancakes over and cook on the other side a minute or two or until golden brown. Serve with extra ricotta, lemon zest, powdered sugar and blueberries.
