



If you haven't had a PSA or are due for a PSA screening, why are you waiting?

The goal of screening for prostate cancer is to find cancers that may be at high risk for spreading if not treated, and to find them early before they spread.

Screening for prostate cancer begins with a blood test called a prostate specific antigen (PSA) test. This test measures the level of PSA in the blood. PSA is a substance made by the prostate. The levels of PSA in the blood can be higher in men who have prostate cancer. The PSA level may also be elevated in other conditions that affect the prostate.

Out of every 100 American men, about 13 will get prostate cancer during their lifetime, and about 2 to 3 men will die from prostate cancer. The most common risk factor is age.



I noticed blood in my stool. Does that mean I have a hemorrhoid?

Maybe. Maybe not. You may think that blood in stool is from hemorrhoids because you often hear about them, but that's not the only reason you may have blood in your stool. Until you're evaluated by your doctor or provider, no one can say for sure what's causing the blood in the

Blood in stool can be caused by many things. It can come from hemorrhoids as you may have heard, but it can also come from other conditions such as anal fissures (small cracks in the skin around the anus), infections, inflammatory bowel disease (such as ulcerative colitis and Crohn's disease), diverticulosis and diverticulitis, ulcers, gastritis, vascular problems, benign polyps, and colorectal (colon and rectal) cancer, to name a few. The point is that rectal bleeding is not nor-

Even moderate amount of blood from the rectum can lower the amount of blood in your body

and you may notice dizziness. weakness, fainting, and pale skin color if this happens. You may have abdominal pain, too. It's wise not to wait and see, but to see your doctor or other provider right away if you notice blood in your stool.

It's also important to look at your stool to see what it looks like and to notice what symptoms are associated with your bowel movement. This information can give your doctor a lot of important clues. It's helpful if you note your stool's color, hardness or softness, whether it's watery or not, if there's blood mixed in with the stool or is just on the outside of the stool, if it was on the toilet paper when you wiped, or if you saw a lot of blood in the toilet, for instance. Blood that's bright red in color generally comes from somewhere closer to your anus, whereas darker blood comes from somewhere up higher in the GI tract since it's partially digested. So, blood in the stool isn't always bright red. It can be a maroon color or even black and tarry

By the way, some medications and supplements can also cause black-colored stool, so it's important to tell your doctor or other provider what medications and supplements you're taking.

Blood can come from the upper GI tract, which includes the esophagus, stomach, and the first part of the small intestine called the duodenum. The lower GI tract includes the cecum,

colon, rectum, and anus. The rectum is the last 6 inches of the colon. Last week I talked about how long the small intestine is, but it's not as common for blood to come from the small intestine as it is from other parts of the GI

mentioned above

colorectal cancer can cause blood in the stool, and it's the third most common cancer in both men and women in the United States. There are several things that can increase your risk of getting colorectal cancer, which you can actually change. (There are also other risk factors that you can't change, such as your age, genetics, and ethnicity, for instance.) The risk factors you can change include your diet, weight, and exercise. A bad diet, being overweight and lack of exercise are strongly linked to the risk of getting any cancer, but certain types of diets raise the risk of colorectal cancer specifically. For example, many studies have shown that a diet high in red meat (beef, pork, lamb, or liver), processed meat (like hot dogs and lunch meat), and cooking meat at high temperatures (frying, broiling, grilling, or charring/blackening) increases the risk of colorectal cancer. Smoking and moderate to heavy alcohol use are linked to an increased risk of colorectal

cancer, too. I hope this article helped you realize that blood in the stool isn't always from hemorrhoids. So, if you see blood in your stool, please make a visit with your doctor or other provider right away



Early Weaning a Drought Management Strategy

Early weaning can help reduce pressure on native pastures and extend forage supplies for adult beef cows.

Rainfall is one of the most important factors that influence management decisions on the ranch, according to North Dakota State University Extension livestock specialists.

This year is no different because most of North Dakota is experiencing severe dry weather. Drought conditions drive management of native pasture, crop residue and cover crop acres. Typically, even with good moisture during mid to late summer, the nutritional value of native pasture is in decline. This decline is accelerated under dry conditions.

Early weaning is one of the management decisions that can help reduce pressure on native pastures and extend forage supplies for adult beef cows," says Janna Block, Extension livestock systems specialist at NDSU's Hettinger Research Extension Center. "Early weaning simply means weaning calves at an earlier age to reduce forage usage while not compromising calf health and performance."

Dairy calves often are weaned as early as 8 weeks of age. This is achieved through proper nutrition with feeds that promote rumen development. This enhances the development of the rumen so the calf can survive very well without the nursing milk diet. From the standpoint of feed efficiency, feeding calves directly is more efficient than feeding cows to sustain milk production.

Beef calves can be early weaned successfully from 60 to 150 days of age.

Most producers notice that nursing calves also will consume forage, whether through grazing or being fed harvested forages. Research shows that early weaned cows will consume as much as 35% to

45% less forage than normally weaned cow-calf pairs.

Eido/Connect Country

Early weaning typically results in improved body condition of dams due to decreased nutrient requirements. A cow weighing 1,400 pounds would require about 16 pounds of energy (total digestible nutrients, or TDN) and 2.5 pounds of crude protein (CP) on a daily basis in late lactation. This same cow's requirements would decrease to 12 pounds of TDN and 1.7 pounds of protein after weaning. In addition, water requirements would decrease by about 55% to 60%.

"It is important to distinguish between early weaning and creep feeding based on the goals of each strategy," says Zac Carlson, Extension beef cattle specialist.

"Creep feeding is the act of providing supplemental feed to nursing calves," he notes. "The primary goal of creep feeding is to increase weaning weight of calves. While creep feeding may result in some substitution of forage for creep feed, it does not reduce nursing pressure on cows. Therefore, this practice will not provide the same forage savings and increases in cow condition that can be gained from early weaning."

Early weaning should not compromise calf health and it should enhance performance. The key to successful early weaning is to treat groups of calves as unique. Weaning by pasture group is preferred, with no commingling of other groups after weaning for at least 45 days. Even though all calves have been born and raised on the same ranch, the pasture group is the stable unit as it relates to shared organisms and social pecking order.

"If weaning includes commingling all pasture groups at the same time into a common weaning pen or pasture, be prepared to begin treating calves for respiratory disease 10 to 14 days postweaning," says Gerald Stokka, Extension veterinarian and livestock stewardship specialist. "Alternatively, make provisions to bring all cows and calves together such that the social order and shared organisms of calves can be re-established prior to the stress of weaning. The more space that is provided (i.e., pasture weaning), the less the pressure on re-establishing social structure and the less transmission of organisms during this stressful time."

Other potential risk factors may influence health at this time as well. Lack of passive immunity, temperature fluctuations, heat stress, nutritional stress prior to weaning, dusty pens and handling stress the healthy transition to weaning negatively. The lack of adequate passive transfer of immunity from the birth mother to the calf increases the risk of postweaning death.

Temperature fluctuations may compromise the normal respiratory defense mechanisms of calves, as do heat stress and dusty pen conditions. Dry conditions may result in nutritional stress prior to weaning, so make sure that appropriate protein, energy, and mineral supplements are provided prior to and after weaning.

If calves need processing, such as for vaccinations or deworming, do it early in the morning or delay processing until temperatures moderate. Processing can be done at the time of weaning; however, only products that benefit the animal at weaning and do not compromise the immune response should be used. Processina done at least three weeks prior to early weaning is preferred and provides the opportunity to administer booster doses postweaning if necessary.

Facilities may need some remodeling if weaning calves that are significantly smaller than normal. Calves become adept at finding ways to return to their dams or at least escaping the weaning facility. Because smaller and younger calves may have difficulty competing for feed and water, sorting them into several pen groups based on size and age may be necessary.

"Early weaning is a management tool that can significantly reduce forage and water demand," Block says. "In addition, with proper preparation, calf

health and performance are not compromised."

Coyote Corner – School Receives Excellent Review

Some of you may have been aware or even involved in our recent review by the state. The process by which our school is evaluated and scored, which is done by a company called Cognia. I will cut to the chase and share we scored a whopping 304.68. Now I know this number by itself really doesn't mean a lot. First off it is out of 400 and second, the highest score the review panel that scored us had seen before was a 320. The average score on this review for schools across the nation is between 278.34 and 283.33. We scored a solid 27 points above that mark. This score was given by a panel of three reviewers. These reviewers reviewed data provided by the school as well as interviewed students, teachers, parents, administration, board members, and community members. For the quality of our performance, our leadership team was invited to present at the fall Cognia (the organization who does school reviews) Conference on the good things we are doing at our school.

I will take a minute to remind everyone reading this that in 2019-2020 we were selected as one of 10 schools making larger than expected gains closing the achievement gap by the National Dropout Prevention Center. Between 2017 and 2019 we held the second-highest growth scores in the state for reading. In 2014-2015 we were

recognized as a Nationally Recognized Title I School. In 2016-2017 our title coordinator, Roxann Tietz, was recognized as an Expectational Title I Educator. In 2020 our high school principal, Terry Bentz, was recognized as the ND Principal of the Year. I think it is good to remind ourselves once in a while of the good work we do.

I believe it is easy to think about the things we'd like to have. To find ourselves saying, "if only we had one of those slick career and technical centers Bismarck, has top of the line electronic devices, the newest curricular material, or a host of other things we can find ourselves envious of, then we could be special." Resources certainly help, but alone they do not provide the world-class education we do in our fine institution. You do not need to be a big district to accomplish big things.

We were specifically praised in our review for two things. One was the strength of our culture. The Cognia team was impressed with how we embodied our message of providing a positive and safe environment that promotes lifelong learning. They commended us for not only being worried about the academic wellbeing of our students but the child as a whole. We were also commended in how we involved our stakeholders in the operation of our school in a transparent manner. The review team said we truly had a caring and supportive environment.

Now we did have things to improve upon, of course. One

of which was the integration of technology within our instruction. An area we have already put into our improvement goals for next year. The team also wanted to see our professional development more informed and guided by data. They complimented us on having a strong foundation and encouraged us to continue to build upon that foundation. But let this not detract from the fact we outperformed the majority of the schools in the nation reviewed by Cognia.

We thank all of the parents, students, teachers, board members, and administration who participated in this review and made it a success. We thank all of our community members who make us a better school and we always strive to make our community a better place. We want to embody what it means to be Pack Strong and without the good work everyone does, that would not be possible. I believe we can safely say we are living up to that commitment.

Donald Wilford Merriman was born December 24, 1922 in a sod house south of Lemmon, SD to parents Arthur and



Edith (Thorpe) Merriman. There were 10 children, with 7 surviving beyond childhood. The family moved to the community of Seim (now under water at Shadehill Reservoir) to work on farmland Don's grandfather Wilford had purchased. Don enjoyed school with a few of his brothers and sisters in the Seim one-room schoolhouse, and his love of learning persisted throughout his lifetime. He graduated from high school in Lemmon, SD after boarding "in town" with his brother Russell. Don worked for Boeing Aircraft in Seattle Washington in 1941, and on to San Diego for more work in the aviation industry. He enlisted in the Navy in 1942 during WWII.

Don enlisted in the Navy in 1942 during World War II, began basic training in San Diego and had additional schooling to become an Aviation Radioman before receiving his dispatch orders to the Solomon Islands in the South Pacific. Don remembered the journey as very tense, sailing on a fuel-supplying merchant ship, a prime target for enemy aircraft. He was moved from island to is-

doing cleanup after the battles that had ensued. In the spring of 1944 Don got emergency leave to return home after his father died. He received leave in two segments to plant and harvest for his mother in South Dakota. Due to this arrangement, he served much of his service at Fallon, Nevada, There he met Frances Waltz, from Akron, Ohio who was teaching in Fallon. Thus began a relationship that spanned 73 years. Don and Frances became engaged in 1945, and in November of 1945 Don received his Honorable Discharge.

The couple was married in Brookings, South Dakota on May 31, 1946. The initial years of the marriage were busy with farming, creating a home, establishing a garden, and over time from 1947 to 1963, growing a family that included two daughters and two sons. The community around Shadehill grew with both people and activity as the Shadehill Reservoir started to be developed beyond the initial planning stages in 1948. It was also the time that Don took over a rural route mail contract, and Don and Frances retained that route for 49 years. In the summer of 1949, crews began to move in to start the initial phases of construction of the Shadehill Reservoir. Much of the housing and staging for the Dam took place at the nearby Hager home and Shadehill

The Shadehill Reservoir and Grand River figured heavily in the next stages of Don's life. Providing for a growing family by farming on the reduced acreage lost to the dam was challenging. Don had been interested in irrigation for some time, since his father had been enthusiastic about irrigation. He learned everything he could, and eventually went on to irrigate his own land. Shortly thereafter, he started promoting and selling irrigation equipment part-time in the

By 1981 all four children were married and grand-parenting and occasional golfing were added interests.

In the 1980s Don and Frances visited Hawaii and Australia. Later Don and Frances traveled to Fullerton, California to spend the winter months with Frances' brother. After 2000, broken bones and extended recoveries for both Don and Frances dictated it was time to leave the farm. Don and Frances moved to Lemmon in 2002.

Living away from the farm, Don found ways to get involved in town life. He started to take an interest in local municipal events, the Senior Center, and the American Legion. In his 80's he learned to use the computer, mostly on his own, and soon became an avid researcher. He had such a thirst for knowledge that the internet opened up a whole new world for him. He believed in healthy living, exercise of both mind and body and tried his best to practice both.

Donald loved visits from his grandchildren and great grandchildren, and playing "Donald Duck" with his name, taught them to call him Grandpa Quack Quack. He enjoyed teaching them to play dominos and card games, and encouraged them to think big in their dreams for the future.



Reflections on the Words of Life

Eido/Connect Country

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

From even a cursory reading of the gospel accounts of Jesus' life in the New Testament, there can be no question that He was often misunderstood and frequently the object of scoffing. But one of the most ironic scoffs Jesus ever received came while He was hanging on the cross. Matthew tells us this in Matthew 27:41-42: "Likewise the chief priests also, mocking with the scribes and elders, said, 'He saved others; Himself He cannot save. If He is the King of Israel, let Him now come down from the cross, and we will believe Him."

On the one hand, this scoff is a tremendous "dig" at Jesus. It is an attempt to entirely discredit Him. These religious leaders in the nation of Israel wanted to make it plain to all onlookers that Jesus was a sham and that His miracles were a hoax. Of course, the evidence for Jesus' numerous miracles was everywhere. The blind were seeing; the lame were walking: lepers were healed. And then there was Lazarus. Jesus had raised Lazarus from the dead, and it was hard to deny the miraculous with Lazarus walking around in public. Yet these religious leaders thought they would use this opportunity to attempt to discredit all that Jesus had done.

After all, if He were really such a miracle worker, couldn't He just take Himself off the cross?

But on the other hand, there is something very ironic about this scoff of the chief priests, scribes, and elders. For there is a great truth contained in it which they no doubt never intended to convey. Yes, it is true that Jesus had saved others. But it was also true that He could not save Himself. Now, don't misunderstand me. I am not saying that Jesus did not have the ability to save Himself. He could have come down from the cross at any time if He wanted to. He told the disciple who was trying to defend Him when the soldiers came to arrest Him in the Garden of Gethsemane, "Put your sword in its place, for all who take the sword will perish by the sword. Or do you think that I cannot now pray to My Father, and He will provide Me with more than twelve legions of angels?" (Matthew 26:52-53).

The truth is, Jesus decided not to come down from the cross. Jesus made this clear when He said in John 10:17-18, "I lay down My life that I may take it again. No one takes it from Me, but I lay it down of Myself. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again." In fact, the main reason why He came to this earth is so that He could be put on the cross. And here is where the unintentional truth of the scoffers' statement comes in. He couldn't save Himself if He were going

to save us. Jesus came to save sinners. Let us see this in His own words in Mark 10:45: "For even the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many.'

Jesus came to die for sinners because it was only in this way that our sins could be pardoned by a holy God. Perhaps you have heard the line in the old hymn, "What can wash away my sin? Nothing but the blood of Jesus!" Thank God for such

a wonderful Savior! Praise His name for such willingness to die in the place of sinners.

Dear friend, don't seek a relationship with God on any other basis than the sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross. To ask God to receive you any other way is an insult to His holiness. Remember Jesus' words from John 14:6: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through





2 cups all purpose flour

2 cups chopped pecans

1 cup light corn syrup

3/4 cup packed light brown sugar

4 tablespoons butter, melted 2 teaspoons vanilla extract

3/4 cup butter, cold

4 tablespoons milk 4 large eggs

1/2 cup granulated sugar 1/4 teaspoon salt

PECAN PIE BARS

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Grease a 13×9 inch baking pan. Set aside. In small mixing bowl stir together the flour, sugar

and salt. Using either a pastry blender, fork, or butter knife cut in the 3/4 cup butter (slice the butter into tablespoon size slices,

add it to the flour mixture, and mash it up until the mixture resembles crumbs) Pour in the milk and mix with fork, then with hands to ensure the moisture is evenly distributed in the flour mixture. Press the dough into the greased baking pan. Bake at

350 for 20 minutes, the top of the crust will be a light brown color.


While the crust is baking, prepare the pecan pie topping. In a medium size bowl lightly beat the eggs. Add in the light brown sugar,

light corn syrup, melted butter, vanilla extract, and chopped pecans. Stir to combine. Spread this over the hot crust after it's baked for the 20 minutes. Bake again for another 20 minutes, or until the pecan pie filling has set (when you wiggle the pan the filling will no longer jiggle). Remove from oven and allow to cool.

2020 Community **Challenge Project Update** Splash Pad at Rotary Park

In 2020, Brosz Engineering was announced as the winner of the first ever Community Challenge put on by Bowman County Development Corporation! This project was submitted and won the community vote. During the plan development for this project, Brosz Engineering was approached by the Bowman Park & Rec Department about an opportunity to combine their Splash Path project with another project also planned at Rotary Park. The School of Promise has plans to install a new playground at Rotary Park designed for children in the 1 to 5 year age range. Combining a "dry" playground area with a "wet" playground area is becoming a common theme in recreational areas throughout the Unites States.

"Brosz Engineering is excited about the opportunity to partner with the School of Promise and Bowman Parks and Rec Department to bring this new vision for a wet and dry playground to reality," said Jon Brosz, 2020 Community Challenge Project Lead.

With a combined group effort, the project has increased in size and is even better than the original plan. Instead of a 10' sidewalk featuring several water features, the updated Splash Pad consists of a 35'x55' concrete area with 28 water features. Not only is the project larger, but it will also be able to cater to a larger age range.

As the project grew, the timeline was extended. The Splash Pad at Rotary Park is now expected to begin and complete construction in 2022. Brosz Engineering met with the Community Challenge Committee and had an extension approved through Bowman County Development Corporation.
