Water Quality and Drought Management

Drought persists throughout all of the North Dakota and Grant County. One major impact from continued drought conditions is the increased levels of minerals in the dugouts and streams used for livestock water consumption. Some of these levels can become toxic and have lasting impacts on herd health. If you have questions about what you can do or if you want a sample taken, consider attending the Water Quality and Drought Management Program at Lake Tschida on Tuesday, June 29th!

In addition to having a round table discussion on drought

management practices with producers and cooperating agencies (USDA- FSA, NRCS, SCD and Extension), there will be an update from USGS on a water quality study taking place locally in the Heart River Basin and what has been found on salinity and nutrients present in the water. Including answers to questions such as:

- How has water-quality in the Basin changed through time?
- How have dam operations, irrigation practices, and other agricultural management practices affected water-quality?
- How has geology, soils, and land use affected salinity and nutrients?
- How have conservation practices affected nutrient concentrations in the Heart River over time?
- How does water-quality vary across the Basin?
- What was done for this study and what are the next steps?

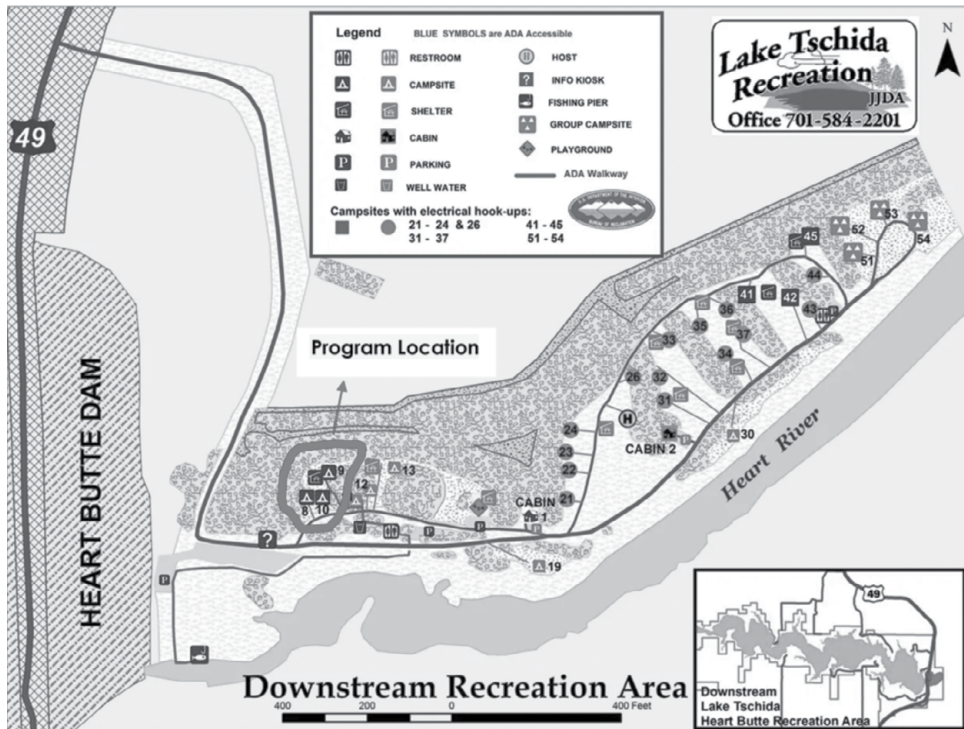

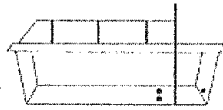

Hettinger County Agent's News

Heidi Marxen, NDSU Extension, Hettinger County ANR agent

There comes a time in everyone's lives that you end up being pulled in different directions or have multiple things happening all at once. That proved to be true this past week in the county agent's office. The phone was constant with questions regarding trees, weed control concerns, to horses foundering, and 4-H preparation for the fair. With so much going on it is tough to pick just one topic for this week's article. Many producers are starting or getting ready to cut that first batch of hay. However, some producers may not have adequate production to justify haying. With 99% of the state experiencing some level of drought, southwest North Dakota has recently been categorized as Moderate to Severe Drought. As a result of the rains at the end of May and first part of June, our native rangeland benefitted since these species were in the vegetative stage. Once these grasses produce a seed head, the plant has limited potential to produce additional biomass. If the plants were grazed in the vegetative stage, you may have noticed

regrowth with the small amounts of moisture our area has received. Statewide though, producers should expect 50% to 60% of normal production on native pastures. In the D4 areas of the state, forage production on pasture will be 25% to 30% of normal at best. This reduction in forage production will shorten the grazing season, bringing it to a close sometime this summer instead of in the fall unless destocking of livestock occurs. To account for the deficit in forage production, producers will need to adjust their management plan to provide supplemental forage and/or reduce the forage requirements of their herd. "At this point in the growing season, the best options for hay are warm-season grasses," Kevin Sedivec, Extension rangeland management specialist. "We recommend Siberian foxtail millet if available. If Siberian it is not available, use German foxtail millet. The next best option is sudangrass; however, sudangrass has an increased potential for prussic acid toxicity when drought stressed. "If the intent is to establish an annual forage for grazing, we recommend planting a diverse cover crop mix that includes both cool-season and warm-season species," he adds. "This will increase the chance of

establishment and reduce the overall risk of a total failed crop. A diverse cover crop also will have the potential to produce a higher-quality forage with less risk of toxicity."

The higher amounts of rain at the end of May brought on issues for our horses. Grass founder is common when drought stressed grasses grow at an increased rate due to larger amounts of moisture. One would think that the nice, lush green grass of cool-season pastures would be good for grazing. However, the plants collect sugar and these sugars (carbohydrates) cause founder or laminitis. Laminitis is the swelling of the tissues that connect the hoof wall to the coffin bone. Typical signs of founder include: pain in the feet, increase digital pulses in the lamina and swelling in the lamina that may cause the coffin bone to rotate or sink. Susceptible horse include, but are not limited to: overweight, easy keeping horses, ponies, horses with metabolic syndrome or horses that have foundered before. Horses affected by founder should have limited grazing or no grazing at all. A dry lot situation with hay is best. Sugar (carbohydrate) content is at its highest in immature grass (early spring and during re-growth), during periods of cool nights and warm sunny days, after a hard freeze or during drought conditions. Grazing is best in the early morning hours. Grazing muzzle is another way to allow the horse to exercise and limit the amount of forage consumed. Connect with your veterinarian or treatment of horses that develop founder. Hay crops with mixture of cool-season grasses, warm-season grasses, alfalfa and cereal grains generally do not pose a risk for high carbohydrates since the plants are closer to maturity when the first cutting takes place. Best practice for managing pastures is to not overgraze, (the lower part of a plant may contain the highest amount of sugar) avoid grazing pastures with a lot of seed heads, (seed heads can contain

high amounts of carbohydrates), limit grazing during times of environmental stress on plants, and gradually introduce horses to lush spring pasture.

There are many drought webinars available to producers through the NDSU Extension website, along with resources on selling/purchasing hay. Water quality testing and hay samples may be collected for those that have concerns. Contact the county agent to schedule a time for those samples to be collect-

ed.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Most people probably have an opinion on who the worst sinners in the world are. But let us ask an important question: Who would God say are the worst sinners? I would like to suggest to you that the worst sinners in God's eyes are those who do not see their need for Jesus Christ to save them from their sins. This comes out very strikingly in one of Jesus' encounters with the Pharisees. The Pharisees were very religious people. In fact, they were viewed by most Jews in Jesus' day as the religious giants. They were meticulous students of Scripture and lived lives that were outwardly impressive. But the big problem with the Pharisees, as Jesus saw it, was that they did not realize that their outward practice of religion was not enough. While impressing people with an outward display of righteousness—on the inside, their hearts were corrupt and full of sin. Jesus described them this way in Matthew 23:27-28: "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which indeed appear beautiful outwardly, but inside are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness. Even so you also outwardly appear righteous to men, but inside you are full of

hypocrisy and lawlessness." What would the parallel in our day be? The parallel to the Pharisees in our day would be moral, churchgoing people who pride themselves on their decency. They are not guilty of any crimes or any of the gross immorality that now characterizes so much of our society. They are quite happy with themselves, and they think that God should be too. They believe that God should receive them on the merits of their personal goodness.

Such people are in the most dangerous position. Let me tell you why. People who think of themselves as being good don't realize that they need a Savior. They do not realize how far short their external righteousness falls from the perfect standards of the holy God. They are like the Pharisees. On one occasion Jesus was enjoying a meal at the home of Matthew, one of His disciples. Matthew had been a tax collector prior to becoming a disciple. He and his friends were considered the "lowlifes" of society. Some of the Pharisees asked Jesus' disciples why He was keeping company with such sinful people. Jesus overheard their question and made this statement in reply: "It is not those who are healthy who need a physician, but those who are sick" (Matthew 9:12). Basically, what Jesus told them was that only people who realize how sinful they are will come to Him

for the cure which only He can provide.

I ask you, friend, how do you view yourself? Do you view yourself as basically good and think that you will be able to get by on judgment day in the merits of your own good life? If so, I can assure you on the basis of Jesus' teaching that you are in a terrible position. The only way you can be cured of the disease of sin is by realizing how sinful you are on the inside and by coming to Jesus and asking Him to save you from your sins.

We are all sinners. There is not a one of us who is good enough to earn God's favor. Jesus Christ came to this world and died on the cross to save those who couldn't save themselves. While on the cross He paid the price for every sin of all who would place their trust in Him alone for salvation. But coming to Him starts with the realization of how much we need Him. Dear friend, if you can see how sinful your heart is and how deeply you need a Savior, then come to Jesus. He will never turn away anyone who comes to Him realizing his or her great need.



Our first child, Cahan was born in 2012, in 2014 Citti the only girl came along and in 2016 Conway joined the crew. The kids experience farming and ranching first hand spending many hours along side their parents

either in farming equipment or checking cattle on horseback. They love the farm/ranch as much as Jordan and Jacki with the hope of taking over the operation as soon as possible.

On the farming side we use no-till and in the last few years have added soil mapping, precision Ag, and variable rate technology. We are very diverse

wheat, corn, canola, soybeans, sunflowers and cover crops. It has improved weed management along with improving soil health.

On the ranching side we have worked hard to get together a nice herd of commercial Black Angus with good disposition and proven genetics. This past year a little store has been added to our farm: JC Country Store we sell our own home raised corn finished JC Beef. We sell USDA certified JC Beef by the individual package or by 1/4, 1/2 or whole: We ship JC Beef all over the USA. It's been

a great experience; our young cattle are fed our good quality corn to create a great finished product. The kids also have a little side gig selling their farm fresh eggs and garden produce.

JC Farms employees three full-time employees: Kyle Brackel has been with us the longest: JC Farms' Right-Hand Man. Sage Ohm and Ricky Irwin started at the same time. We recently completed surveys with high schoolers and interviews with community leaders, and still, after a few years of projects and progress, responses about the community still center largely on that lack of recreational opportunities.

As a shaper of the community and an outsider-turned-insider, however, I challenge this idea. Having grown up in a community 10 times the size of Hettinger and spent my college years in a town over 100 times bigger, I have experienced communities with trampoline parks and breweries and laser tag. These spaces are often packed,

frequented by the much larger populations they engage. These places are bustling and bright, ripe with opportunities for community and fun. These activities and venues, however, are no nicer than those that you can find in Hettinger: the Pastime patio rivals Monks in Sioux Falls. The seats at the State 123 Theater in Pierre are no more comfortable than ours. And the baskets on our disc golf course, still shiny and new, catch discs just as well and are even prettier to look at than those at Steamboat Park along the Missouri.

The main difference I see? The people—or, I should say, the lack of people. We don't need more things to do, and we don't need nicer things. In fact, a recent inventory of recreational opportunities I completed for a relocation guide reveals that for a town of 1,200, we are abun-

dant with recreational opportunities. Take a trip to the movie theater or have a chat with a country club board member, and you will realize that the single most limiting factor of our area, at least in terms of recreation, is our lack of support for the amazing amenities we already have. We as a community are too eager to pack up for the lake, make a quick trip to Bismarck, or stay home complaining about having nothing to do, all while the gems of our community struggle to keep the lights on. So the next time you find your kids griping about being bored or you lament the date

nights that come and go without so much as a meal out, consider celebrating what our community has to offer rather than surrendering our assets to this imagined inevitable demise that we ourselves are fueling. Not sure where to start? Check out all that our area has to offer:

- 9-hole golf course: golfers love the Hettinger Country Club, complete with a clubhouse, grass greens, youth golf lessons, and cart & club rentals.

- Adams County Library: with a growing collection of children's, traditional, audio and e-books, as well as community programming, the Adams County Library is a local favorite!

- Mirror Lake: Mirror Lake is perfect for swimming the dogs, strolling along the walking path, paddling around, or soaking in the most beautiful sunsets in the region.

- Birding: Hettinger and Adams County have top-notch birding, with the record number of species identified in one year topping 285!

- Hettinger Theater: since its opening in 2002, the Hettinger Theater has brought thousands

of hours of entertainment to Hettinger & the surrounding communities.

- Parks: with 6 different parks featuring a baseball diamond, a bandshell, basketball courts, a flag plaza, and picnic shelters, outdoor recreation is always readily accessible in Hettinger!

- Rod & Gun club: with league and open shooting, the Hettinger Rod & Gun Club is the perfect spot for hunting & shooting enthusiasts.

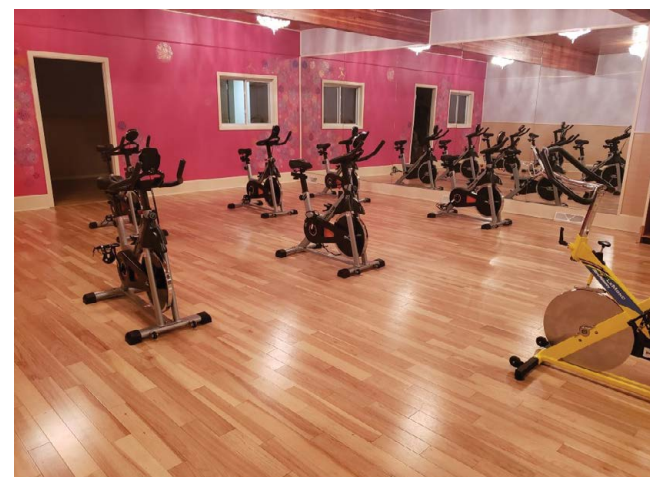
- Disc Golf Course: created and installed by 4-h youth in 2019, the 9-hole disc golf course

Mel & Dee Maxon Rites To Be Held

Delaine "Dee" May Maxon and Melvin "Mel" Joseph Maxon, high school sweethearts, were married on July 6, 1953 in McLaughlin, South Dakota and were married 67 years before COVID complications took their lives in December 2020. Mel, age 86, died on December 11 at Monument hospital in Rapid City, SD. Dee, age 85, died December 13 at West River Regional Health Center in Hettinger, ND.

Mel was born October 19, 1934 to Laurence and Mary (Ament) Maxon at Athboy, SD.

In 1939, the family moved to a ranch 7 miles south of McLaughlin, SD. Mel grew up with a big family and his children grew up with many interesting and funny stories from life on the ranch. One of the songs he often sang to his kids was "Ghost Riders in the Sky." He was also an excellent yodeler and some of the kids have fond memories of his yodeling on the way to school.

Mel loved basketball. He played with the McLaughlin Midgets in high school and with the Wolves and the legendary Bob Wachs at Northern State College. He played with the amateur basketball league for 30 years, assisting the Lemmon and Hettinger teams win in the state tournaments for SD and ND and was inducted into the SD Amateur Hall of Fame in 2000. He coached basketball, football and track throughout his educational career in Gettysburg and Lemmon and received a 25 year coaching award from the South Dakota High School Coaches Association in 1986 at the State A Basketball Tournament. Mel also loved golf and was proud to have two "hole-in-ones". A real card shark, he enjoyed playing rummy, pinochle and bridge and was a regular at the rummy table on Friday night at the Legion.

Mel accepted his first position in 1958 with the Gettysburg Public School System. In 1965 he accepted a job with the Lemmon Public School system to teach, coach and serve as the Athletic Director. In 1990 he became high school principal and was chosen Administrator of the year by the South Dakota

Association of Student Councils in 1993. In 1997 he was chosen Region Principal of the Year by the South Dakota Association of Secondary Principals. He retired from the school system in 1999. Mel was popular with the students in all of his roles as a teacher, coach and principal. LHS students have shared many positive comments and stories over the years.

During the summer months Mel worked as a crop adjuster for Federal Crop Insurance for 28 years. He and Dee managed the Lemmon Country Club and Golf Course with their friends, Bill and Dee Kohn, for three years during the summer season. Mel also was the auditor for the Municipal Liquor Store and Ranger Bar for a number of years.

Mel's community service activities included: President of the Country Club Golf Course, President of Lion's Club, member of the Board of Directors for Five Counties Hospital and Nursing Home, member of St. Mary's Catholic Church, serving on the Church Council, in the church choir, and as Grand Knight of the Knights of Columbus. In 2002 he was recognized by Modern Woodmen of America for contributions of volunteer community service.

Dee was born November 17, 1935 to Jacob and Selma (Dockett) Dietrich at McLaughlin, SD and grew up on her parents' farm 17 miles east of McLaughlin.

Dee was a working mom while Mel earned his college degree, raising three young girls while working as a secretary. She took some time off from the work world as the family grew to seven and was a great cook serving up food from her German-Russian heritage (borscht, stoodles, keekla and kuken) and fresh baked treats were usually waiting for her kids when they came home from

school. Her children and their friends have fond memories of after school treats and late night raids of the refrigerator for her leftovers.

She was a creative seamstress, sewing her daughters matching dresses (including one set made from a prom dress she wore) and later kept the Barbie and Ken dolls well-stocked with clothes. Dee knit each of her kids and grandkids a personalized Christmas stocking, did ceramics, and planned fun activities for her sons' Cub Scout troop when she served as Den Mother. She loved playing cards, especially bridge and pinochle.

Dee inherited her mother's kindness and concern for others as well as her strong commitment to family ties. Her parents, Jacob and Selma, moved to a small home across the alley so she could care for them and her sister, Lorraine, moved to Lemmon for Dee's support. Newcomers to Lemmon who needed extra help could count on Dee and her loving support was also given to students who joined the household while attending high school.

Dee served as the Food Stamp Cashier for Perkins County when the program began in 1967 until the program was integrated into the grocery stores. She also worked for Wheeler Mfg. Jewelry Company for 30 years, retiring in 1999.

They were preceded in death by a daughter, Brenda Nelson; Dee's parents, Selma and Jacob Dietrich, three sisters (Aurelia, Lucy and Lorraine), and four brothers (Elmer, Martin, Marvin, Jay and Elwood); Mel's parents, Mary and Laurence Maxon, two sisters (Ariene and Lois), and six brothers (Bud, Dick, Lyle, Frank, Charles, and Kenny).

The family of Mel and Dee Maxon are saddened to have


