ND Lions Hall of Fame

Two Lions were inducted into the North Dakota Lions Hall of Fame on Friday, April 23 at a banquet sponsored by the North Dakota Past District Governors. The two honorees are Past International Director Pat Vannett of the Mandan Lions Club and Past District Governor Lewellyn Rustan of the New England Lions Club.

Lion Lewellyn Rustan was born in rural North Dakota. He jokes that the cancelled check to the doctor who delivered him was for \$20.00, probably all he was worth! During his life he has had many careers and community experiences which

he credits for making leadership in Lions a natural progression. His first six years of education were in a one-room country schoolhouse, and he later graduated from New England Public School in 1959. His experience in Future Farmers of America at a young age led to a state FFA office, where he first experienced public speaking to crowds.

Lion Lewellyn attended North Dakota State University for two years, and was inducted into the US Army the day after President Kennedy's funeral. He served in a Military Police unit in Fort Sam Houston, TX. He was discharged in 1965 with a dual Military Police and Cler-

ical MOS. Lewellyn returned home to the family farm raising small grains and cattle. He is still the manager of a family partnership, with tenants farming the land.

Community service has always been close to his heart, beginning with the New England Jaycees. Over the years, he established two non-profit corporations, a cemetery association and the New England Community Arts Committee. He has served on the boards of his church, township, and Badlands Ministries.

It wasn't until 1997 that Lewellyn joined the New England Lions Club, bringing with him this wealth of community service experience. He has been active in many Lions positions in his club, district, and state. He became a District Governor in 2012. In 2013 he spearheaded a public relations project utilizing a \$3333 LCIF Grant to place Lions advertisements in every newspaper (35) in District 5NW, and wrote letters to all clubs encouraging them to share information about their club activities in their communities. He has spent 15 years on the District Cabinet in differ-

ent positions, and wrote president, treasurer, membership, and parliamentary procedure manuals. He has served as secretary of the Lions Foundation of North Dakota, creating a Board Member handbook, bringing organizational records up to date, and certifying and clarifying the 501 (c) (3) IRS tax status of the organization. While also on the Foundation, he worked with the committee to secure a \$55,000 LCIF matching grant for Sight 4 Kidz.


He has had a many-faceted career, including working into a top management position with a national company with more than 225 sales representatives. He later began a roofing and painting business utilizing that product line. He has also worked in journalism as a writer and ad salesman. In 2000 Lewellyn and a partner began a tree transplanting business, which he continues to operate, relocating very large trees. Lewellyn was instrumental in establishing the Dakota Women's Correctional Rehab Center in New England, utilizing the vacant former New England St. Mary's School. It has been stated that without his involvement, it could not have happened. PDG Lewellyn has two daughters, a son-in-law, and two grandchildren, who live nearby.

Dr. Toshi Is In!

Dear Dr. Toshi,
 I heard that the skin renews itself. If that's the case, then why do we get scars when we get an injury or acne?
 There are two big reasons for scarring. One reason is damage to the deeper layers of the skin and another reason is related to the healing process.
 The upper layers of the skin that are renewed are called the epidermis, and they are constantly replacing themselves by shedding. The upper layers shed, but the deeper layers (called the dermis) don't. So, if you damage the deep layers of the dermis, they don't turn over. Unfortunately, as we get older, it takes longer for the upper layers to turn over, too. For example, people in their twenties shed and renew their skin in just 14 to 21 days, while it can take up to 60 days for people in their fifties! Anyway, if you damage the deep

layers, they don't turn over, and the damage results in scar tissue.
 Another reason for scar tissue is the healing process of the skin. Our skin contains a protein called collagen, which you've probably heard of. We're born with cells in our skin that make collagen. When you get injured, our warrior cells, called white blood cells, come to the site of the injury and start the process of wound healing. This process involves production of collagen, but unfortunately, the collagen that's used for wound healing is different from your normal skin collagen (which is fetal collagen). Interestingly, as you might have guessed from the name, fetuses (unborn babies) don't get scars! But for you and me the scar collagen comes to the wound quickly, and it remains there while skin cells are renewed, and that produces scars.

These are some tips that the American Academy of Dermatology gives people to help reduce scarring:
 • Clean your cut, scrape, or other skin injury with mild soap and water.
 • After cleaning it, apply a layer of petroleum jelly (like Vaseline) over it to keep it moist. Then use a bandage to cover the wound.
 • Clean the wound, reapply petroleum jelly, and change the bandage daily.
 • See your doctor or provider right away if it looks like you need stitches or if your injury is deep, very painful, or if it looks like it might be infected (redness, swelling, painful, warm, and/or pus is coming out of it).
 • After the wound heals, apply sunscreen to it. That will help the redness of the wound fade faster, and of course it also protects from skin cancer. According to the American Academy of Dermatology, skin wounds are more likely than healthy skin to become cancerous.
 I hope this helps for you to have a safer summer with fewer scars!

stopped serving lunch. Everyone placed their orders and we got a chance to wonder around the greenhouses.

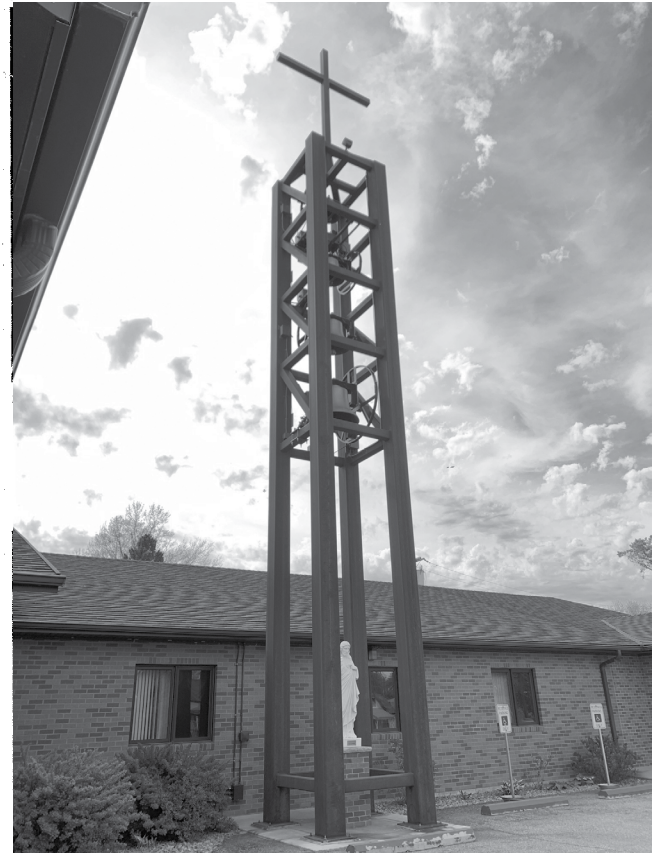

At sunrise on Thursday, May 6th, 2021, Darlene Ila Kolb (91) was taken to her heavenly home



by her precious Lord and Savior.

Darlene was born on June 28, 1929, the first of four children to Gerhard and Minnie (Beskow) Giese in Watertown, South Dakota. She grew up on the farm of her parents, daily helping her father hand-milk cows. They separated the cream, which they sold and fed the skimmed milk to "skimmer" calves.

Every summer, Darlene helped her Dad with the labor-intensive harvest of wheat and oats, gathering the bundles into shocks, which would later be hauled to the thrashing machine with the horse-drawn wagons. Darlene knew and respected this hard work from an early age and expected the same from her children.

She was baptized and confirmed at St. John's Evangelical Lutheran Church of rural Mazepa Township. She attended rural grade school, and graduated high school from Northwestern Lutheran Academy at Mobridge, SD. Following graduation, she attended Northern State Teacher's College in Aberdeen, SD where she received a short course teaching certificate for elementary schools. After college, she returned to live on her parent's farm while she taught at Lura #5 township, a one-room school, where she always looked forward to Fridays when Ernest "buzzed" the school with his plane, alerting her he had arrived for the weekend.

June 13, 1949 Darlene married Ernest Kolb, her high school sweetheart in a double wedding with lifelong friends Calvin Frey and Dorothy Kriesel at St. John's Lutheran Church, Mazepa, SD. The first year of married life was spent living with Ernest's parents on the Kolb family farm south of Bison. Ernest partnered with his Dad while Darlene taught at

the Reder School. The following summer, they moved a house 1.5 miles east of the Kolb Family Farm, along Antelope Creek, to develop their own ranch. To this union, five children were born: Marlene, Jeffrey, Cheryl, Brian and David.

Darlene settled into "West River" life and grew to love the wide-open spaces, farming and ranching. She helped Ernest in the fields, summer fallowing and putting up hay, often with the children playing with their toys in the old '48 Chevy car (the baby-sitter) at the end of the field.

Darlene had a passion for farm life and was involved in every aspect of it. During calving season, she could be counted on for heifer night-checks, but when morning came, she was up and ready for the hustle and bustle of the day. Ernest and Darlene worked hand-in-hand from morning until the time they went to bed, doing chores, milking cows, working in the fields and raising their children. At branding time, she was in the middle of the action meticulously recording the tag numbers.

She always raised a large garden filled with vegetables for fall canning and countless family meals from scratch. She was an exceptional cook known for her legendary homemade buns and caramel rolls. Her pies (especially chocolate chip) were a special request of many, and if you were in the yard at meal-time, you were a guest at her table. To all that knew Darlene, it was no secret her love and passion for chickens. That affection continued throughout her entire life.

Darlene was a life-long member of Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church in Bison, teaching Sunday school and had an active leadership role in the Ladies Aid. Darlene's dedication to being the best mother to her children was secondary only to her support and loyalty to Ernest. She insisted on piano lessons, encouraged their schoolwork, supported their education, but prioritized their memory work for Sunday school and confirmation class.

Shortly after Ernest's death in 2015, Darlene moved into an apartment at Edgewood Senior Living in Pierre, SD. She admitted it was a wonderful place to live, but she clearly missed the country life of her beloved "West River". She always anticipated the arrival of the weekly Bison Courier and asked daily for current news on what her boys were doing. Darlene's heart never left the ranch.

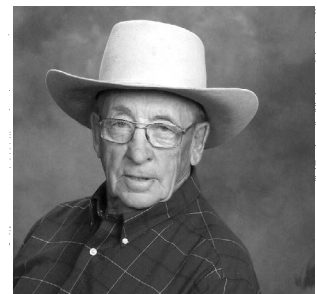

During the 30's several Carsonites moved to California, consequently, Butch was born in Sacramento. They returned to Carson in the early 40's and raised their family there. Butch attended school in Carson, participating in the usual sports along with the Golden Gloves program, and area rodeos, graduating in 1956. He continued to rodeo, entering saddle bronc, bareback, bull riding and steer wrestling. He was most proficient in bareback and steer wrestling, competing mainly in those two events until we could convince him that he was just getting too old.

After graduating he worked for the North Dakota State Highway Department working on the overpasses for I-94. After that he worked for Fat McLaughlin and Dick Balliet until his mother asked him to come home to help her run the farm. He returned to Carson and has been ranching until 2019 when he "retired" after selling the ranch to 3 of his sons. He hated leafy spurge. He spent many years spraying that ugly weed. When the county finally formed a weed board, he was the first to volunteer to be on it. He served as a board member 25-30 years when he suggested that his son, Dick, take his place.

He met Jean Buchholz, a teacher at Roosevelt Public School in 1963. They married in 1966 on Ground Hog's Day, so that the day would never go by without notice, remembering their anniversary. They raised 4 active boys. He was not an affectionate man but he loved his boys dearly and they meant the world to him and he was very proud of them. He finally admitted when he was older that he could not have accomplished what he did without their help, especially Jerry, who started following him around when he was 3 and stayed with him to the end.

He was a gambler at heart, not only at cards, but also with the business and his life in general, which seems to have paid off.

Butch was a good friend and family man with a good heart. He will be missed by many including his wife of 55 years, Jean, 4 sons, John (Julie) and their children Katie, J.D., and Wyatt; Ross, ND; (Whitey) James Jason, Jerry (special friend Barb), and Dick (Jessica) and their children Colton, Dylan, and Layton all of Carson, ND; sister, Elaine Tyson in AZ; 3 brothers, Claire in AZ; Alan, Dickinson, ND; and Larry, Mpls, MN; and many others including sisters-in-law, special friends, extended family and great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his parents, 2 brothers Dale and Robert, and the majority of his best friends.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

I still remember hearing the theme song of a children's program on public television that said, "I can do anything." Increasingly our young people are taught that they can do anything they put their minds to. And to be sure, God has blessed human beings with great gifts, talents, and abilities. But a problem occurs when we try to apply this same type of reasoning to the spiritual realm and to the way of salvation. Let me explain.

The Bible clearly teaches that all human beings are sinful in God's sight. In Romans 3 we read, "There is none righteous, no, not one," and, "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God." This teaching is fundamental to a right understanding of why mankind and the world in general are the way they are. But there is another biblical doctrine which is the corollary to it. That doctrine is the inability of man. It is hard to imagine just how much damage occurred when mankind fell into sin. The fall affects every part of man. It affects his mind, emotions, and will. The fall of man into sin gave to man a natural disposition which is against God. It also destroyed man's capability to understand spiritual truth or to do things that are good in God's eyes.


Let us consider a few passages of Scripture on these points. Paul writes in 1 Corinthians 2:14, "But the natural man does not receive the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; nor can he know them, because they are spiritually discerned." As people come into this world, they don't have the capacity to grasp spiritual truth. The fall has so affected man's mind that the things of God seem like foolishness to him. Consider next what is said by the prophet Jeremiah in Jeremiah 13:23: "Can the Ethiopian change his skin or the leopard its spots? Then may you also do good who are accustomed to do evil." Here we see that the fall of man has incapacitated man from changing his own spiritual nature. Neither can he do anything that earns merit from God. Since everything sinful human beings do is contaminated by sin, even our good works are unacceptable to God. Isaiah put this very bluntly when he said in Isaiah 64:6, "But we are all like an unclean thing, and all our righteousneses are like filthy rags; we all fade as a leaf, and our iniquities, like the wind, have taken us away."

Let one more passage be sufficient to make the point. Ephesians 2:1 says, "And you He made alive, who were dead in trespasses and sins." Here we see the full extent of human inability. Sin has made man spiritually dead. This means that there is no spiritual life in us the way we come into this world. We can do nothing to make ourselves alive spiritually. And we can do nothing to merit God's favor or pay for our sins

against Him.

Does this sound like a hopeless situation? Well, it is when we look at it from the human point of view. But as Jesus said in Luke 18:27, "The things which are impossible with men are possible with God." God is able to overcome all of these obstacles of human inability and bring people into a saving relationship with Himself. But make no mistake about it—it requires a mighty miracle of His grace. It requires what the Bible calls the new birth. Only the Holy Spirit can make a spiritually dead person alive. Only He can make a person see how serious and how hopeless is his situation as a sinner against God, facing God's wrath. And only He can enable us to see that we need what Jesus Christ did on the cross to save us from our sins.


Has this happened to you? To use Jesus' words, have you been born again? Have you realized the utter hopelessness of your trying to save yourself or to do anything to merit God's favor? The starting point in God's way of salvation is for a person to realize he is helpless and hopeless to save himself. For only then will he see how desperately he needs a Savior. Only then will he be quick to abandon all hope in himself and turn to the only One who can do for him what he needs most. Only then will he repent and believe on the Lord Jesus Christ.





Update immunizations to keep children healthy

This fall, you'll pick out just the right backpack, and fill it with all the back-to-school supplies. But as the new school year arrives, Jacobson Memorial Hospital Care Center (JM-HCC) and the N.D. Department of Health (NDDoH) remind parents to also make sure their children are up-to-date on immunizations.

And summer is the time to make those appointments.

North Dakota state law requires students in grades kindergarten through 12 to meet a minimum number of required immunizations before they are allowed to attend school.

The Elgin Community Clinic, Glen Ullin Family Medical

Clinic and Richardton Clinic offer childhood immunizations and encourage parents to make an appointment for their children to have any necessary immunizations before school starts.

The clinics offer immunizations as part of their well-child program and are working to make sure every child remains healthy.

"Ensuring children are up-to-date on immunizations is the best way to keep students healthy and stop the spread of infectious diseases such as measles, mumps and pertussis in our schools," said population health coordinator, TyAwna Ackerman, a registered nurse at JMHCC in Elgin. "Children who are not immunized are not only at risk of becoming ill from a variety of diseases, but are also able to transmit diseases to others, including those who

may not be able to be vaccinated due to various medical conditions."

Before entering school in North Dakota, children must have:

- five doses of DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus and acellular pertussis)
 - four doses of IPV (polio)
 - three doses of HBV (hepatitis B)
 - two doses of MMR (measles, mumps and rubella)
 - two doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine
- In addition, students entering seventh grade will need:
- one dose of Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria and acellular pertussis)
 - one dose of MCV4 (meningococcal disease)
- In addition, students entering the 11th grade will need:
- one additional dose of MCV4 (meningococcal disease)

MenB vaccine

A vaccine, called MenB, which protects against meningococcal disease, has been added to the recommended childhood vaccine schedule that providers follow. It is being recommended for those ages 16-23 to provide protection against strains of meningococcal disease, particularly for college-bound students or others who will be in close living quarters. Two doses are required.

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, meningococcal disease is a serious illness caused by bacteria which can lead to meningitis, or an infection of the lining of the brain and spinal cord, and infections of the blood. Adolescents and young adults are at increased risk of the disease. Symptoms progress rapidly and are often mistaken for the flu in early stages, but can lead to death within 24 hours in some patients.

This vaccine provides additional protection to vaccinations teens may have received earlier. Both meningococcal and MenB vaccines are recommended by the Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices.

HPV vaccine

JMHCC also reminds parents that everyone between the ages of 11 and 26 should receive the human papillomavirus vaccine for the prevention of cervical, throat and other cancers.

"We have an amazing opportunity to prevent certain types of cancer in future generations through HPV vaccinations," Ackerman said.

The HPV vaccine is recommended by providers for both girls and boys.

JMHCC encourages parents to schedule the first of the two-dose vaccine now, then the second dose can be administered during the student's sports physical later this summer.

Parents are also encouraged to have their children ages 12 and older to be vaccinated against COVID-19.

Cost should not be a barrier to getting children up-to-date on immunizations. Children who are uninsured or whose insurance does not cover vaccines can receive vaccine at no cost through the Vaccines for Children (VFC) program. Contact your health care provider or local public health unit if you believe your child could be eligible for VFC vaccines.

If you haven't done so, check with your health care provider to find out which immunizations your child needs. Once your child is up-to-date, be sure to get a copy of his or her immunization record to submit to the school. You can find more information about which vaccines are required for school at www.health.nd.gov/immunize.

Children who are not in compliance, either up-to-date or have a signed exemption form, by Oct. 1 will be excluded from school for not meeting requirements.

Well child visits, sports physicals

The Elgin Community Clinic, Glen Ullin Family Medical Clinic and Richardton Clinic also offer a well-child visit, which is a comprehensive appointment for parents to talk with providers one-on-one about their child. It covers a wide variety of health concerns, such as growth and development, nutrition, safety, emotional and physical health. The child's height and weight will be measured to determine appropriate growth patterns and milestones that the child should be reaching for their age, as well as discussing appropriate immunizations.

The Elgin Community Clinic (584-3338), Glen Ullin Family Medical Clinic (348-9175) and Richardton Clinic (974-3372) will also be offering discounted sports physicals July 1 through Aug. 31 so athletes can assure they are healthy and ready for practice, and encourage parents to schedule an appointment this summer.
