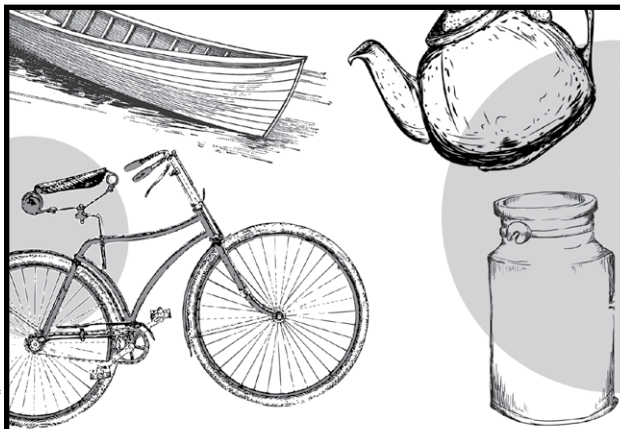



What are the "items" I am

I want to encourage you
today to get rid of your "trash"!
These "items" that slowly take

from the inside out!

Many years ago, I was there
and to say the least it was ex-
ceedingly difficult especially
when you have been hurt as
a pastor! I literally had to force
myself to get out of bed on Sun-
days to get ready for church. I
cried many a tear while taking
a shower crying out to God for
help to get through church ser-
vices.

I placed that hurt in the
depths of my heart or into the
basement. That hurt became
so infected with dust and spi-
ders that I almost couldn't make
it. I kept crying out to God and
somewhere in my crying out
He came and removed those
"items" that had infected me.

There are times that each
of us get depressed with all the
goings on around us. We see so
much hatred in our world today
that it causes us to grieve!

I don't know what is in your
"basement" collecting dust, but
God gave me a passage of
scripture that found me where I
was living and this is it: 1 Peter
5:7, "Cast all your anxiety upon
him because he cares for you."
(NIV)

In our moments of sadness,
depression and hurting we need
to get rid of "our trash" and give
it to Jesus! I want you to know
that no matter what you are
facing today, it is not too big for
God!

That passage above says
cast "all" your anxiety, hurt,
anger, hatred, loss, grudges,
hard feelings, etc. on Him! Lis-

Paul writes in Philippians

perfect in weakness."


Don't try to get rid of the

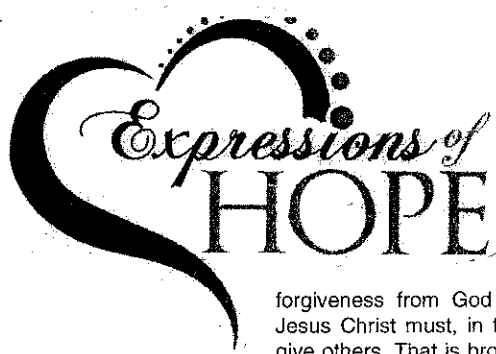

Reflections on the Words of Life

Jesus, New Leipzig

Last time in our Scripture
reflections we considered to-
gether how a holy God can for-
give a sinful person. The verse
we focused on was Ephesians
4:32: "And be kind to one an-
other, tenderhearted, forgiving
one another, even as God in
Christ forgave you." We saw
that forgiveness of sins is the
greatest blessing a human be-
ing can have. Today, let us go
to the other side of the issue
and see that those who enjoy

forgiveness from God through
Jesus Christ must, in turn, for-
give others. That is brought out
by the apostle Paul in the last
half of our verse: "Forgiving one
another even as God in Christ
has forgiven you." If you are the
object of God's forgiveness in
Jesus Christ, then you are un-
der obligation to forgive those
who wrong you.

There are many people who
know how to hold a grudge.
Twenty, thirty, forty, or more
years they have not spoken to
someone who wronged them.
But there is no place for such a
thing among true Christian be-
lievers. Forgiveness, while not
easy, ought to come very natu-
rally to them.

Why? Because we who are
Christians have been forgiven
so much by God. The Christian
believer realizes that God has
forgiven him or her for a great
"mountain" of sin. How can he
then turn around and fail to for-
give the relatively small offens-
es which others commit against
him?

Do you remember in the
life of Jesus that there was an
occasion when a woman came
into the house where Jesus was
dining and started weeping over
His feet and wiping His feet with
her hair? Many of those present
simply could not understand
why Jesus was letting such a
sinful woman touch Him like
that. Jesus' answer to them is
recorded in Luke 7:47, which
says, "Therefore I say to you,
her sins, which are many, are
forgiven, for she loved much.
But to whom little is forgiven,
the same loves little." Basically,
Jesus was saying that this woman
understands that her deep and
numerous sins have all been
forgiven, and she is so over-
whelmed and full of gratitude
that she cannot but express it in
this act of loving devotion.

Once a person truly under-
stands how serious his or her
sins are in God's holy eyes
and that they have been freely
pardoned by God through the
blood of Jesus Christ, that per-
son's heart should overflow with
gratitude and love. And because
of this, forgiving others should
be practically instantaneous.
Dear friends, if you claim to be a
Christian believer and are hold-
ing a grudge, you need to let the
gospel sink in and let it lead you
to forgive.

But before I conclude this
message, I need to say a word
about how urgent it is that
each one of us makes sure he
or she has come to Christ and
enjoys the forgiveness of God
BEFORE HE DIES! I say that
because once a person dies,

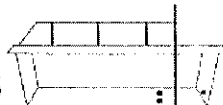

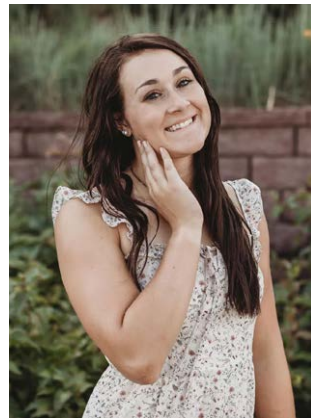

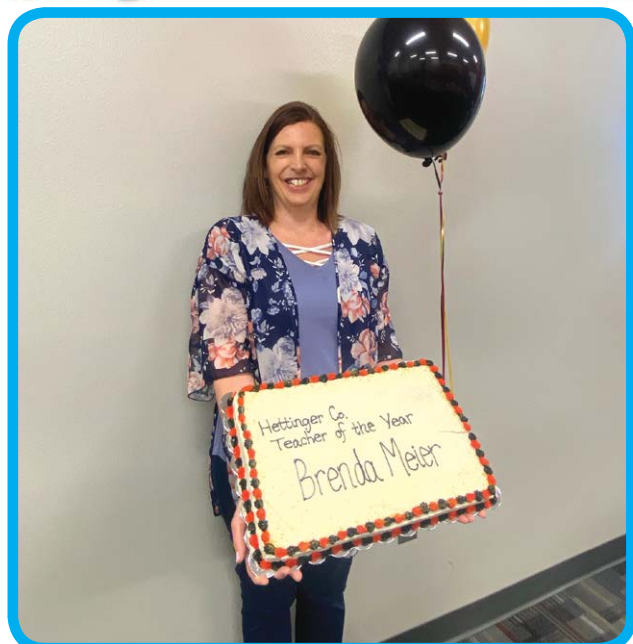

The program was delivered in-person, online, and via North Dakota's Interactive Television Network. The online version was the first online course offered in Mayville State's history.

In 2002, Hirning moved to California to begin his more than 18-year career in higher educa-

tion administration. He served as Associate Regional Dean and Regional Associate Vice President for National University, the second largest private, non-profit university in California. He started as a lead campus administrator for the Redding Campus in Northern California. After successfully growing that campus, he relocated to Central California to lead campuses in Fresno, Bakersfield and Porterville. With successful growth at those locations, he was promoted to Regional Associate Vice President, overseeing operations for ten regional campuses across a 44-county area in central and northern California, through on-site and online instruction.

During Hirning's tenure at National University, community outreach and partnerships served as a pillar of his success. He developed over 50 cohort partnerships by collaborating with city and county governments, school districts, businesses, and community colleges, to allow entities to grow and develop their own talent. He served as a champion within the university community in terms of high success rates with student starts, retention, persistence, and completion. By collaborating with campus faculty and staff, he developed recognition programs to showcase performance excellence for faculty, staff, students, and alumni. He also added academic programs to spur campus growth as market demand dictated. Hirning worked with faculty and academic leadership to create the university's only Nurse Anesthesia program at its Fresno Campus, one of only five in the entire State of California.

He also served on numerous internal Presidential Commissions and committees.

Through his community outreach, Hirning served on numerous external governing boards and executive committees. He was a governing board and executive committee member of the Central Valley Higher Education Consortium; a partnership consisting of 27 university and college leaders in Central California. Hirning was also invited to serve on Fresno City College's Business and Technical Education Department advisory board to advise on curriculum development and efficacy. RECIPE OF THE DAY

APPLE SLAB PIE

- 1 box refrigerated pie crusts, softened as directed on box
- 1 cup granulated sugar
- 3 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1 1/2 tablespoons lemon juice
- 9 cups thinly sliced, peeled apples (9 medium)
- 1 cup powdered sugar
- 2 tablespoons milk

Heat oven to 450°. Remove pie crusts from pouches, Unroll and stack crusts one on top of the other on lightly floured surface. Roll to 17x12-inch rectangle. Fit crust into 15x10x1-inch pan, pressing into corners. Fold extra pastry crust under, even with edge of pan. Crimp edges. Mix granulated sugar, flour, cinnamon, nutmeg, salt and lemon juice Stir in apples to coat. Spoon apple mixture into crust-lined pan. Bake 33 to 38 minutes or until crust in golden brown and filling is bubbling. Cool on rack 45 minutes. Mix powdered sugar and milk until well blended. Drizzle over pie; Allow glaze to set before serving, about 30 minutes.

A Corny Story

Did you know there are over 8000 food items plus many more everyday items that are made from corn? That was the topic of an Ag in the Classroom presentation by Marlene Kouba of Regent in the Mott/Regent School for grades K-6 on May 3, 2021. Due to limited time and space at this time, classes will be held in New England later in the fall.

Petrified corn has been found in Central Americas that is over 5,000 years old. Indians grew corn before Columbus arrived. They gave him some to take home to Spain and now it is grown in every continent except Antarctica. Indians also gave corn to early settlers and showed them how to grow it and use it. Later corn was used as money to trade for food and furs.

There are four kinds of corn-field or dent corn, sweet corn, popcorn and flint corn. She showed some of each plus some distillers dried grain, a by-product of ethanol. The United States now raises nearly one-half of the world's corn with China in second place.

Her bulletin board showed a kernel of corn, where corn is raised in the nation, a corn picker on a combine, growing corn and lists of items made from corn.

Numerous food items were displayed. Some of the non-food items were paper, adhesive, lotion, floor cleaner, spot remover, aspirin, toothpaste, gum, soap, packing peanuts, golf tees, shopping bag, pens, and even clothing.

A bushel of corn weighs 56 pounds, has 72,800 kernels and can produce 32 pounds of cornstarch, for 325 cans of soda or oil for 2 pounds of margarine, enough starch for a ton of paper or 2.8 gallons of ethanol. Each ob has an even number of rows with an average of 16 on each one.

She gave older students a math problem to figure out how much a farmer would make per acre at today's price for a bushel of corn. She also challenged all students to look in their mother's cupboards for items made from corn, under the names of corn oil, corn starch, corn meal, corn syrup, dextrose or sorbitol. What do you have in yours?

Kouba said "I had previously taught similar classes for 21 years with two or three others and we taught different commodities each year for students in K-6 grades. We covered over 50 commodities during that time so students learned about three or four new topics each year." The classes were held in all of the schools in the county plus she taught some in Elgin, New Leipzig, Hettinger and Dickinson.

Each teacher received a bag of products from the North Dakota Corn Council to give each child and some that Kouba had made from corn syrup.
