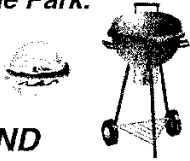

Dr. Toshi Is In!

Dear Dr. Toshi,
What's the best way to describe my pain to my doctor?

In a previous article I talked about how you can take advantage of your clinic time. Today, I'd like to explain a little bit about pain and how to describe it to your doctor or other medical provider.

People describe pain in many different ways, but if you give your doctor or provider certain information, it could help them figure out what's causing it. After all, a doctor or a provider needs to find out what's going on and make a mental list of possible causes (called a "differential diagnosis") in order from the most likely causes to less likely causes. Doctors and providers talk to you first to get those pieces of information and then decide to order lab tests or

imaging such as X-rays to get more information to help narrow down the "differential diagnosis" and find the actual cause to be able to treat it effectively.

The first question is, "Where does it hurt?" Then you can describe it in more detail, such as when it started, if it's constant or comes and goes, how it feels to you (which is called the "quality" of the pain), and how long each episode of pain lasts if it isn't constant.

Pain can have different "qualities." For example, it can be described as "aching," "cramping," "gnawing," "burning" (or "hot"), "sharp," "shooting," "heavy," "splitting" (like in a headache), "stabbing," "tender" (painful to the touch), "throbbing," or "radiating" (pain that spreads to other parts of the body). If it's not really pain, you may want to say

something like, "discomfort," or "It's not really pain, but feels like xyz" (using your own words).

Then your doctor or provider may ask you to rate your pain "on a scale from zero to ten." Zero means no pain, and ten is the worst pain you've ever had in your life or the worst pain you can imagine. If the patient is a child, the doctor or provider (or nurse) may show some simple drawings of faces with different expressions and ask the child to pick one that describes how he or she feels.

You can also mention other characteristics. What activities make the pain worse or better? How does your pain limit what you can do? Does it prevent you from doing your work or hobbies? Does it wake you up in the middle of the night? Do certain movements cause the

pain? Also, what have you done for the pain? For example, have you taken any over-the-counter medications? Have you seen a chiropractor, or tried stretching? Did any of those things help? Is the pain associated with other symptoms such as nausea or vomiting? Dizziness? Tingling? Weakness? All of these things can help your doctor or other medical provider narrow down the differential diagnosis to determine the actual cause so he or she will know what the most effective treatments are.

I hope this helps prepare you next time you see your doctor or provider for something that causes pain!

MAXIMUM \$500 REIMBURSEMENT PER FARM/RANCH OPERATION FOR ALL PROGRAMS COMBINED EXCEPT THE EQUIPMENT REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM HAS A SEPARATE LIMIT FOR NOXIOUS WEED CONTROL ONLY IN BOWMAN COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA

Pesticide* Distribution Days -Reduced prices already figure cost-share- (please purchase only as much as needed)

- * Milestone herbicide: \$20/Qt- (treats 5-6 acres) (Limit 10 per farm/ranch)
 - Or a 2.5 gallon jug for \$200 (treats 50-60 acres) (Limit 1)
 - Controls Canada and musk thistle, wormwood, & knapweeds.
- * Method herbicide for leafy spurge control (not labeled on grazing or hay land)
 - \$200 per 2.5 gallon jug (treats 20-40 acres) sorry, method is no longer made in quarts (limit 1)
- * Escort herbicide: \$5 per 8 ounce container, for control of babys breath.

- Sprayer for UTV, ATV, Pickup, Tractor, backpack, etc
- 25% rebate for the purchase of NEW noxious weed spraying equipment.
- Maximum reimbursement: \$500
- One time opportunity per farm/ranch operation

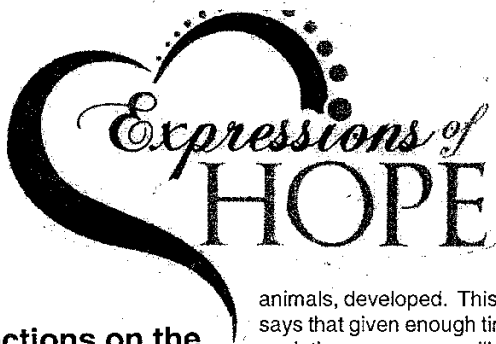
Pastor Barb Koenig

One Day Listening Tour

Modern day Medora, North Dakota is knit together with the people of hundreds of small towns and cities throughout the Upper Midwest. With an eye towards reinvigorating regional tourism and cooperation, Medora entrepreneur Wally Owen has been encouraging Western North Dakota's community and tourism leaders to communicate, cooperate, and prepare for the impact and opportunities that will come with the expected 2025 opening of the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library. Tens of thousands of more visitors will likely make their way to Medora. Some will come from the populated regions of the Midwest to our east and many more from the millions of tourists who tour the Black Hills and Yellowstone National Park every year.

Recently, I joined Mr. Owen and Theodore Roosevelt Medora Foundation President Randy Hatzenbuehler on a one day listening tour, visiting just a few of our region's wonderful tourism destinations. We drove the Enchanted Highway – home to the world's largest metal sculptures – from Flying Geese along Interstate 94 to the Knight & Dragon on the front lawn of the old Regent School, now the Enchanted Castle Hotel & Steak House. In Regent, we toured the Hettinger County History Museum and met with sculptor Gary Greff and Museum Board Members Don Wagendorf and Paula Anderson.

Asked about her aspirations for regional tourism, Mrs. Anderson, who is also involved with Mott Visionary Committee said, "My heart is for Main Street of our small towns. We have to do something to keep our small towns alive. I'm married to a farmer. I've got a young son, and he's going to have a family, and I'll have grandkids. We want to keep the region going, and that's my heart for doing what I do."

At Hettinger, we met with Francie Berg, author of Buffalo Trails and inspiration for the multi-location telling of the story of the bison, the last great buffalo hunt, and more. We were joined by Loren Lucow of the Dakota Buttes History Museum who gave us a tour of one of the most interesting, cleanest, and most colorful history museums I've seen in a long time. Dakota Buttes Visitor's Council President Cindy Ham and other Hettinger community leaders including Ted Ueker, Kim Schalesky, Jasmin Fosheim, and McKenzie Sigvaldsen, filled us in on

the many things to see and even more things to do in or nearby Hettinger – think Frisbee golf, year round ice skating, and kayaking on Mirror Lake for a start.

Our one day goodwill tour concluded in Lemmon, South Dakota at the Kokomo Gallery of rancher and sculptor John Lopez. We are proud that Mr. Lopez's Theodore Roosevelt bronze statue keeps watch outside Medora's Old Town Hall Theater. Today, Mr. Lopez specializes in hybrid metal art, combining bronzes with the most amazing scrap weldings to create bison, grizzly bears, horses, and more. Lemmon Mayor Neal Pinnow, Chamber Executive Director Jennifer Suter, Community Enthusiast Judy Larson and others welcomed us to town. Our friend Tom Brosseau, host of this summer's Great American Folk Show in Medora played guitar and sang some beautiful songs, including one about Little Doggies, quite appropriate for a town that hosts the Boss Cowman Days Rodeo. Did you know about Lemmon's historic Petrified Wood Park and the Hugh Glass Mountain Man Rendezvous?

We heard some great success stories, listened to concerns, and committed ourselves to continued efforts to assist in building cooperative regional tourism during the few short years that will pass before the planned opening of the Theodore Roosevelt Presidential Library in Medora.

We give thanks for those good people who took time out of their busy schedules to see us as we travelled. We plan more trips throughout the region. We know that Dickinson, Mott, and Richardton are

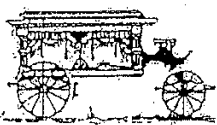

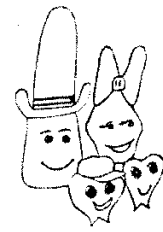

Expressions of HOPE

Sneezing leads to pondering the mystery of incarnation

Hacking cough, running nose, itchy watering eyes. A summer cold. Yuck! But there is nothing like feeling miserable, honking like a goose, and leaking from your nose to remind you that being human is messy and humbling. "Woe is me," is the ancient lament that sounds new when I cry it into the hundredth tissue. Wallowing in self-pity leads me to howl, "Why me?" and "Why now?" and the same answer keeps coming back: "Why not you and why not now?" None of which help me feel better.

And then from that place where the cold medicine speeds and blurs thinking I wonder, "Did Jesus ever get a cold?" While I do not care to linger on the image of my Savior sneezing into a hanky, at the same time I am sharply reminded of the wondrous mystery of the incarnation: God in Jesus took on flesh—became like us in all the messiness that is being human—in order to love us and save us!

We say it every Sunday, "I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the virgin Mary." We may not think about it but there it is: incarnation, God taking on flesh. God, fully human and fully divine; fully God and fully flesh. God incarnate—God coming to dwell with us, in the flesh. Of course he sneezed.

Even without cold medicine clouding one's thinking, it is a deep mystery to ponder: God loving us so much that he came into this messiness that is human flesh in order to redeem and save us, in order to show us that God loves us not just a little but unto death, human death, on a cross. To begin to wrestle with the enormity of this love is to begin to live into it. And we live into it by returning it and by reflecting it.

In the face of God's awesome, overwhelming love for us we respond by loving God. And to see what that looks like we turn to the example of our incarnate God, Jesus. Jesus, in the middle of the messiness of being human, showed us how to love God by loving one another. He showed us how to feed the hungry, love the unlovable, bring the outsider in, offer peace instead of oppression, truth instead of lies. He showed us how to live a life of worship and prayer, of healing and service. He showed us how to love God by loving others.

Jesus laid it out for us in the gospel of Matthew when he said, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind." This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself" (Matt. 22:37-39). Jesus took on flesh becoming fully human and fully divine to show us the way to love God. How will you follow Jesus in loving God and loving others today?



New Amenities Coming to Lake Tschida

BISMARCK, N.D. - The Bureau of Reclamation in cooperation with managing partner, Tri-Cities Joint Job Development Authority (TCJJD), is implementing new recreation amenities at Heart Butte Reservoir, known locally as Lake Tschida, for the 2021 recreation season. Lake Tschida is located 17 miles south of Glen Ullin, N.D. on North Dakota Highway 49.

"To address the increased threat of aquatic invasive species, TCJJD has constructed three new boat washing stations located at Rimrock Recreation Area, Schatz Recreation Area, and Crappie Creek Recreation Area," said Reclamation's Dakotas Area Office Manager Joe Hall. "The boat wash stations will be open for use beginning this recreation season."

Additional new amenities at Lake Tschida include a fish cleaning table and RV dump station at the entrance to Crappie Creek Campground, and a new fishing pier at Schatz Point to address the growing need for shore fishing. These new amenities were made possible with federal cost-share funds and continuous collaboration with TCJJD.

Reclamation also reminds the public that the County-wide burn ban and fire restrictions remain in place until further notice.

"Restrictions are necessary due to limited winter moisture, continued dry weather conditions, and the fire restrictions enacted by Grant County," said Hall.

RECIPE OF THE DAY

RHUBARB DUMP CAKE

- 4 cups sliced fresh rhubarb
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 - 3 oz. pkg. strawberry jello
- 1 box white cake mix
- 1 cup water
- 1/3 cup butter, melted and cooled slightly

Preheat oven to 350°. Place sliced rhubarb in a 9x13 baking dish. Sprinkle evenly with sugar and dry jello mix. Add cake mix water and butter to a bowl and combine with a whisk until well blended. Pour over rhubarb and spread with a spatula to completely cover rhubarb. Bake for 45 minutes or until top is browned. Serve warm or room temperature with whipped cream or ice cream on top.

NOTE: If using frozen rhubarb, measure rhubarb frozen, then thaw completely before using. Drain any excess liquid before using. Yellow cake mix can also be used, as well as any flavor red jello. Store in an airtight container for up to three days.
