A New Past

by Father Paul Eberle St. Charles Catholic Church Bowman, North Dakota


I have been reading a book by Fr. Wilfred Stinissen entitled, "Into Your Hands, Father: Abandoning Ourselves to the God Who Loves Us". A section of the book speaks of a "new past" and how we not only have the ability to form and shape our present and future, but that we also have power over our past. Fr. Stinissen writes, "When we see our past in the light of the Holy Spirit, with the eyes of God, it is created anew." This seems so important.

All too often we see our past through the eyes of our emotional wounds. The pain of past hurts, especially if inflicted by family and friends, makes the present and the future look fuzzy and less bright and cheerful. Jesus, however, is the healer of our wounds.

We read in 1 Peter 2:24. "By his wounds you have been healed." Jesus has the power to restore our peace and even to help us be grateful for our past, wounds included. When Jesus appeared to the disciples in the upper room after his Resurrection and showed them his wounds, he did so not to bring shame upon them for abandoning him in his greatest need, but to show his mercy, forgiveness, and peace. Jesus' first words to them in that moment are, "Peace be with you".

When I have a painful memory that comes back to my attention, I try to welcome it in Jesus' name and remember that it is Jesus' memory too, and that he was with me then – even though I was not aware of it – and is with me now. It helps me give

the memory and the pain over to him so as to be transformed. Everything that wounds us has wounded Jesus first. God has truly gone through all of our pain with us, and so we can in faith and trust pray God's message to us in Isaiah 43:1-2,5 "I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters I will be with you; and through rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire, you shall not be burned; the flame will not consume you...Fear not, for I am with you." May your heart be filled with a new confidence in God's loving presence in your

Does eating too much sugar cause diabetes?

We talked about diabetes last week and I'd like to continue a little bit more on that topic today. Many people think that if you eat too much sugar, you'll get diabetes, but does eating sugar really cause diabetes?

Before getting into details, I'd like to introduce a very important concept when it comes to talking about risks today, namely the difference between "causality" and "association." You might have heard a sentence like this in the past: "A causes B," or "B is caused by A." For instance, smoking causes lung cancer. You may also have heard "A is associated with B." For instance, when I was in medical school, my professor gave this example: "Driving BMWs in this city is associated with a

cer in women." Well, of course it's unlikely that just driving a BMW in that city is what causes breast cancer. They just found that there was an association. It maybe that women who drive BMWs tend to do something else more than other women that leads to their higher incidence of breast cancer, e.g., maybe they go to tanning salons more, or eating more rich, high-fat food, or smoke more, or sunbathe on beaches more than other women. The researchers have to do more research and sort out many factors to find out more about this association.

The relationship between sugar intake (particularly sugar-sweetened beverages) and risks of diabetes (Type 2 diabetes in this case) has been studies quite extensively, but we don't know that sugar-sweet-

ened beverages cause diabetes. However, many studies show that sugary beverages are associated with an increased risk of developing diabetes. The important point is that it shows increased risk. Studies show that higher consumption of sugar-sweetened beverages is strongly associated with both greater weight gain and type 2 diabetes, and obesity is also associated with diabetes. So, to be scientifically accurate, we have to say that high consumption of sugary beverages is strongly associated with diabetes, but we can't say for sure-at least yet-that drinking sugary bever-

ages causes diabetes. There are many other factors that are associated with de-

veloping Type 2 diabetes, too. Pre-diabetes is very strongly associated. Other factors include family members who have diabetes, your ethnicity (there's more diabetes among Asians, Latinos, and Black Americans than among White Americans), obesity, "abdominal obesity" (having a large waist size), high childhood weight, lifestyle (poor exercise and diet), smoking, and inadequate sleep. A lower risk of developing Type 2 diabetes is associated with a Mediterranean diet, eating nuts every day, and a high fiber diet, for example.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Today I would like for us to consider together the subject of Christian forgiveness, using Ephesians 4:32: "And be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, just as God in Christ forgave you." If I can sum up Paul's instructions to the Ephesians in my own words, he is saying that Christian believers should forgive one another because they have been forgiven so much by God.

What many people do not realize is that experiencing the forgiveness of God is the greatest blessing any human being can have. Why is that? Because there is not a single one of us who DESERVES God's forgiveness. The Bible is very explicit in its teaching that every single human being is born in a state of sinfulness. Romans 3 states, "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God" (verse 23) and, "As it is written: 'There is none righteous, no, not one; there is none who understands: there is none who seeks after God. They have all turned aside; they have together become unprofitable; there is none who does good, no, not one" (verses 10-12). This is the human predicament. Every human being is born a sinner, and we add to our sinfulness by the sins we commit every day.

What makes human sinfulness such a huge issue to almighty God is that He is just the opposite of us. He is holy, and it is not even possible that He could sin (1 Samuel 2:2; Habakkuk 1:13). From God's perspective, our sin is absolutely repulsive because it offends His holy character. On top of

we disobey God, we are deliberately rebelling against Him. For God to overlook sin

is rebellion against Him. When

would be a denial of His own holy character. For God to be able to forgive sin, His holiness must be upheld. And amazingly, God found a way to forgive sinners without compromising His holiness. He did it by the most amazing act of love and grace the world has ever seen. Let me put into my own words the way God might have expressed His plan: "I realize that the human race is in a helpless and hopeless situation. They have all sinned against Me and have nothing with which to pay for their sins and no way of gaining My forgiveness. Therefore, I will PAY THE DEBT OF THEIR SINS FOR THEM, I will send my eternal Son, the Lord Jesus Christ, into the world to take the place of all who will trust in Him for their salvation. I will have Him die upon a horrible cross: as He is hanging there, I will put their sins upon Him, and He will pay for those sins. His resurrection from the dead will be proof that His payment was sufficient. Then, as time goes by, I will cause those for whom My Son will die to hear the gospel. I will send My Holy Spirit to convict them of their sin and to see their need of My forgiveness. And then I will put my Holy Spirit within them and enable them to trust in Christ alone for their sal-

And thus, when a person hears the gospel message and is enabled by the Holy Spirit to trust only and exclusively in the saving work of Jesus Christ for salvation, that person is instantly declared forgiven and righteous by a holy God. There is no compromise of His character because all requirements for the debt of sin have been paid. God and the believing sinner are reconciled forever!

Do you see, friends, why I refer to God's forgiveness as



the greatest blessing there is? Without His forgiveness, the sinner will go to hell forever as the just penalty for his or her sin. But with God's forgiveness, the believer will enjoy God's loving presence in heaven for all eternity. It's no wonder that the psalmist wrote those wonderful words which begin the 32nd Psalm: "Blessed is he whose transgression is forgiven, whose sin is covered. Mothers are extremely important. They're the first people we know when we enter the world, and they 'Love and Care' for us as we grow up to adulthood, and even beyond that-their loving and caring nature never stops. Thank GOD.

But how did Mother's Day come to be in the United States of America?

America's Mother's Day came into being through the resulting efforts of three notable women: Ann Reeves Jarvis, Julia Ward Howe, and "Anna" Jarvis (the unmarried daughter of 1st mentioned, Ann Reeves Jarvis).

Ann Reeves Jarvis... (Born: September 30, 1832, in Culpeper, Virginia Died: 116 years ago this (2021) Mother's Day... on May 9th, 1905, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania at the age of 72.) "She was" a social activist and community organizer during the American Civil War era. She is recognized as the mother who inspired Mother's Day and as a founder of Mother's Day Movements going forward.

Julia Ward Howe...
(Born: May 27, 1819, in New York City Died: October 17, 1910, in Portsmouth, Rhode Island, age 91) "She was" an American poet and author, known for writing "The Battle Hymn of the Republic" and the original 1870 Pacifist (a person who believes that war and violence are unjustifiable) Mother's Day Proclamation. She was also an advocate for abolition-

ism (the movement to end slavery) and a social activist, particularly for women's suffrage (the right of women to vote in elections).

"Anna" Jarvis... was the unmarried daughter of previously mentioned, Ann Reeves Jarvis. "Anna" is recognized as 'The Founder' of the American Mother's Day Holiday. (Born: May 1, 1864, in Webster, Taylor County, West Virginla Died: November 24, 1948, at age 84 in West Chester, Pennsylvania) "Anna" inspired by her mother (Ann Reeves Jarvis) who frequently expressed a desire for the establishment of such a holiday; so- after her mother's death, "Anna" led the movement for the commemoration which finally started taking place on May 10, 1913, when the U.S. House of Representatives passed a resolution calling on all federal government officials (from the president down) to wear a white carnation the following day in observance of Mother's Day.

The modern holiday of Mother's Day was first celebrated in 1907 when "Anna" Jarvis held a memorial for her mother at St. Andrew's Methodist Church in Grafton, West Virginia. St. Andrew's Methodist Church now holds the international Mother's Day Shrine. Her campaign to make Mother's Day a recognized holiday in the United States began in 1905, the year her mother, Ann Reeves Jarvis, died. Ann Reeves Jarvis had been a peace activist who cared for wounded soldiers on both sides of the American Civil War and created Mother's Day Work Clubs to address public health issues. She and another peace activist and suffragette Julia Ward Howe had been urging for the creation of a Mother's Day dedicated to peace. 40 years before it became an official holiday, Julia Ward Howe had made her Mother's Day Proclamation in 1870, which called upon mothers of all nationalities to band together to promote the "amicable settlement of international questions, the great and general interests of peace." Anna Jarvis wanted to honor this and to set aside a day to honor all mothers because she believed a mother is "the person who has done more for you than anyone in the

In 1908, the U.S. Congress rejected a proposal to make Mother's Day an official holiday, joking that they would also have to proclaim a "Mother-in-law's Day". However, owing to the efforts of "Anna" Jarvis, by 1911 all states in America observed the holiday, with some of them officially recognizing Mother's Day as a local holiday (the first being West Virginia, "Anna's" Home State, in 1910). Then on May 8, 1914, the U.S. Congress passed a law designating the second Sunday in May as Mother's Day and requesting a proclamation. The next day, 'May 9th', 1914, President Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation declaring the First National Mother's Day, as a holiday to honor mothers.

Child Abuse Prevention Month has never had more meaning



40 Years and Still Counting

white cowboy hat echoes a resemblance to a clean cut George Strait. He sits in his office at his home in Dickinson as posters of upcoming and long since passed auctions paint the walls in memorabilia marking 40 years of bid calling. Even at 83 years old, Ed Binstock's heart and mind yearn for the next sale on the list.

"Betty Botter bought some butter, but she said the butter's bitter. If I put it in my batter, it will make my batter bitter. So she bought a bitter better butter; put it in her bitter batter; made her bitter, better, better. So Betty Botter bought her bitter better butter," Binstock said, with a smile "It's just lingo that you got to practice once in a while."

Binstock, owner of Big E Auction Service of Dickinson, has served as an intermediary between buyer and seller through the southwest North Dakota's economic booms and busts. From household furnishings, farm equipment to antiques, Binstock has sold a little bit of everything. He has participated in several farm foreclosures or liquidations in southwest North Dakota over the years, and some he knew from childhood.

In December, Binstock was hit with a tripleheader challenge with being diagnosed with bladder cancer, viral pnemonia and contracting the coronavirus. But despite all of those complications, Binstock calls himself a survivor.

"I can't imagine that I'm still here. That's how sick I was," Binstock said. "...I still say prayers is what done it. Friends and family, that's about what it

Born on Oct. 27, 1937, in Regent, Binstock used to practice auctioneering on the dairy farm he ran for 24 years in his hometown. It was during that time Binstock decided he want-

ed to become an auctioneer. "I just wanted to be. I used to walk down the aisle when was milking cows and I used to auction every cow off," Binstock

Before picking up the bid-calling career. Binstock later worked as a tank truck petroleum salesman and managed a truck stop café in Lemmon, S.D.

In March 1981, Binstock earned his diploma from the Western College of Auctioneering in Billings, Mont., known as the "Cadillac of auction colleges." Binstock noted that is where he learned his style chant and overall values on how to be a good and successful auctioneer.

The name of his business was inspired by a lesson learned while attending auctioneering school, Binstock said, explaining that the instructors emphasized on the letter "E" with words such as equity, elaborate and energetic.

On June 27, 1981, Binstock conducted his first auction for the Regent Co-op Store.

"You could not believe the butterflies i had in my stomach," Binstock recalled in a previous Press article. "From then on, I loved to auction and sell anything and everything,"

Over the span of 40-year career as an auctioneer, Binstock said he has learned the act of "pleasing people" and "trying to do the best for the seller.'

"There's really no challenge, you just go talk to the people that want to have a sale and you book it. And then you go ahead and line it all up and, and try and do the best that you can for their merchandise. Do good advertising and try to get the most for their merchandise. It's really no challenge; it's just doing it," he said, laughing.

Now at 83, Binstock continues setting up sales with the help of two other colleagues. When asked if he will retire in




