As I sit here thinking this beautiful day of November, I am reminded that next week brings Veterans Day once again. Since my Father was a veteran of WWII we always were reminded of the date and when we were kids, we participated in the ceremonies of the day on November 11. Now I don't believe all schools actually celebrate anymore, but there are still celebrations every year for that event signifying the end of WWI, originally called Armistice Day, in honor of the 'eleventh hour of the eleventh day of the eleventh month' of 1918. In 1954 President Dwight D Eisenhower officially changed the name of the holiday from Armistice Day to Veterans Day.

But did you know that in 1968, the Uniform Holidays Bill was passed by Congress, which moved the celebration of Veterans Day to the 4th Month

in October? The law went into effect in 1971, however, in 1975 President Gerald Ford returned Veterans Day to November 11, due to the important historical significance of the date. Veterans Day commemorates veterans of all wars. Every Veterans Day and Memorial Day, Arlington National Cemetery holds an annual memorial service. The cemetery is home to the graves of over 400,000 people, most of whom served in the military.

Here are some facts about the veteran population of the United States. 18.2 million living veterans served during at least one war as of 2018, 9 percent of veterans are women, 7 million veterans served during the Vietnam War, 3 million veterans have served in support of the War on Terrorism, of the 16 million American who served during WWII, about 325,000 were still alive as of 2020, 2 million veterans served during the Korean War and as of 2019 the top 3 states with the highest

percentage of veterans were Virginia, Wyoming and Alaska.

There is something quite stirring as you attend a Veterans Day celebration when the Colors are presented. Every man who served, no matter his age, stands at attention when the flag is brought into the room. No matter their health, you can see in their stance and their expression, the dedication and the devotion that these men have to their Flag and their Country. When we were children there was no 'kneeling in protest' as regards the flag, but when the Vietnam War was in process, the burning of the flag and the wearing of the flag on jeans in protest of the war angered many who put their lives on the line for their country. My Father was one who was heartbroken to see videos of that happening and he would have been livid at the thought that anyone would 'take a knee' at the presenting of the flag or the singing of our National Anthem. I know that

there are many who feel the same way today and I must say I agree with them. Although we have the right to protest, I do not believe our flag or our anthem are areas that are open for protest, but that is my opinion and not shared by all. Every Veteran who falls will be honored by that flag being placed over their coffin and if you have ever been presented with a folded flag, you understand the honor when it is given to you in thanks for their





Reflections on the Words of Life

Eido/Connect Country

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been considering the first chapter of Daniel and the techniques that King Nebuchadnezzar employed to try to make loyal Babylonian subjects of his Jewish captives. Today we notice one final tactic in verses 6 and 7: "Now from among those of the sons of Judah were Daniel, Hananiah, Mishael, and Azariah. To them the chief of the eunuchs gave names: he gave Daniel the name Belteshazzar; to Hananiah, Shadrach; to Mishael, Meshach; and to Azariah, Abed-Nego."

Here we see the tactic of confusion. Notice that all four of the names of the young Hebrews end in either "el" or "iah." These are Hebrew words for God or Jehovah. Many of the Hebrew names ended with these suffixes as a testimony of their being worshippers of the true God.

But notice the new names that they were replaced with. These names all have to do with the pagan deities of the Baby-Ionians. Daniel, which means 'God is Judge," was changed to Belteshazzar, which means "keeper of the treasures of Bel." Hananiah, which means 'Jehovah has been gracious," is changed to Shadrach, which contains the name of Marduk, another pagan god. Mishael; which means "who is like God" was changed to Meshach, which contains one of the ancient forms of the name of Venus. And Azariah, which means "Jehovah has helped," was changed to Abed-nego, which means "the servant of Nebo," another pagan deity. Here was but another attempt to blur in the minds of these Hebrew teenagers their godly heritage and up-

portant question: Was Nebuchadnezzar's master plan to re-educate and re-indoctrinate successful in making Babylonian pagans of these four young men? Thank God it was not! And there is only one reason why: These four Hebrew teenagers kept their minds focused upon the word of God.

Friends, all that we have seen about Nebuchadnezzar's strategy these past few weeks has a very practical and important lesson for us. It demonstrates that the way we think about ourselves and the world will determine the way we live. Nebuchadnezzar tried to get these young Hebrews to THINK like Babylonians because he wanted them to LIVE like Babylonians. But as long as they thought of themselves as belonging to the true God, they would continue to live as His servants.

The principle is the same for you and me. The secret of faithfully living for God in our godless society lies in the way we think. Paul summarizes the matter very beautifully in Romans 12:1-2: "I beseech you therefore, brethren, by the mercies of God, that you present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable to God, which is your reasonable service. And do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind, that you may prove what is that good and acceptable and perfect will of God."

Living for God is a reasonable service because of His marvelous mercies. In sending the Lord Jesus Christ, "He made Him who knew no sin to be sin for us, that we might become the righteousness of God in Him" (2 Corinthians 5:21). When we place our trust in what Jesus did to pay for our sin, God is pleased to accept us as His dear, reconciled children. Then we can press on by His grace to pursue renewed minds that are transformed by His word, as Daniel and his three friends did. We may not be under a totalitarian regime like the four young men of Judah (though that may happen), but the subtlety of the pressures we face to conform to this world are equal to, if not greater than theirs. We live in a time when large numbers of Christians are giving in and conforming to the world. We live in a time when many do not dare to be different by following Christ.

Are we, dear people, adopting the way of thinking of the world around us? Are we accepting the world's standards of what is important and right? Are we willing to compromise and just half-heartedly live for God as long as we can remain comfortable? If so, we make a foolish trade. For "solid joys and lasting treasures," as hymnwriter John Newton wrote of, are for those who set their focus upon God's word and press toward His heavenly kingdom. May He grant each of us the grace to resist the world's pressure and to live boldly and unashamedly for

1 cup undiluted evaporated skim milk

Salt and pepper to taste

Parmesan cheese, sour cream and or fresh chopped parsley

In a 6 qt. saucepan, saute the onions, green onions, celery, and chili pepper in oil. Cook until onions begin to look translucent. Add broth, pumpkin, bay leaf, and cumin. Bring to a boil. Reduce heat and simmer, uncovered for about 20 minutes, stirring occasionally. Remove bay leaf, add evaporated milk and cook over low heat for 5 minutes. Don't boil. Taste and adjust seasoning, if necessary. Add 1/2 tsp. salt and 1/2 tsp. pepper if desired. Garnish with Parmesan cheese and chopped parsley.
