Office of Scranton Equity a minimum of 30 days prior to the annual meeting.

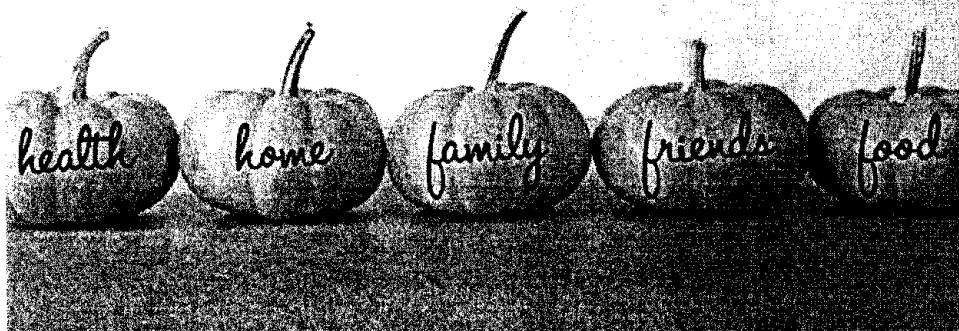

"Jack Stope, The Thanksgiving Rabbit"

"Jack Stope" came and stopped visibly by my front deck on an early dawning Fall 'n' chilly morning a few years ago, after the cool midnight brought

forth a clearing day. I was calmly drinking my first cup of coffee while looking outside the east patio door. Actually, I was looking just past the deck into the grass when suddenly our eyes met one-on-one sincerely. The eyes that I was then looking into- were those known as a prairie hare; a/k/a white-tailed

jackrabbit who I instantly decided to call "Jack Stope".

I named him "Jack Stope" because 'His Look' at me on that 4th Tuesday in November, seemed to communicate openly that he was asking for permission to stay around for the coming harsh winter- just ahead. I believe in his mind that he was hoping for a safe place to find a residence, escaping a rabbit hunter's bullet; and possibly a coyote's captured meal. It turned out that his thoughts about me and this place were right.

"Jack Stope" was slowly starting to change into his white coat of camouflaged fur as he and I both knew the snowy winter season was near. While looking at him, I judged his length to be around 20 inches, his sitting height about the size of an adult house cat, and he maybe weighed in at about 7 pounds. Perhaps he was a senior-aged jackrabbit, 5 or six years old.

Mr. "Jack Stope" decided two days before Thanksgiving to share his winter residency

with me on this 10-acre spread. By using his good eyesight, excellent hearing, and sensitive whiskers, he'd nudge out grass stems and weeds towering above the blown away snow patches and ate leaves, bark, and seeds on or around woody shrubs during the evening hours, and often he continued throughout the night into the early morning. I'd often see him in the moonlight. He sheltered himself in and around, & under farm buildings.

For me, "Jack Stope" became a shadowy winter friend, yet still wild in his natural spirit! When spring came, so did a nosy coyote. The last time I saw "Jack Stope", he was outstretched 'n' running in a zigzag style, moving fast - possibly at a speed of about 40 miles per hour... taking 10 foot leaps, presumably to somehow lose the coyote predator.

In closing, let me offer this quote by Robert Brault:

Answers - Never Ending Gratitude During Pandemic

West River Health Services remains committed to the health and safety of our patients, our employees, and communities that we serve. As a leader in rural healthcare we are fortunate to care for some of our service areas most vulnerable individuals. It is with this in mind that all employees under the West River Health Services Foundation and Subsidiaries (WRHSF) umbrella must adhere to the Covid Vaccine Policy recently approved by our Boards of Directors.

This policy was put into place in response to the continuing pandemic that has had a lasting impact on our patients and employees alike; as well as our continued ability to provide necessary healthcare services

Recent regulation published by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services which require adherence by those who agree to their Conditions of Participation, have made it a necessity that WRHSF ensures its employees are either vaccinated against Covid-19, or have the proper exemptions in place and follow additional measures for the safety of our patient and fellow co-workers alike. Refusal to adhere to the Conditions of Participation would threaten our ability to provide care to our communities in their time of need.

WRHSF remains committed to our patients that we will provide the safest possible environment for them to receive their care. To do so we are working with our employees to make sure they have all of the necessary information to make an informed personal choice on whether to receive the vaccine or not. For those employees who choose not to receive the vaccine, there will be a process to apply for an exemption. The exemption decision making process will be completed in such a way that each request is based on the merit and not the individual making the request. We believe this is the fairest process to ensure that every employee request is given a fair and impartial view. Our goal is to work with every employee of this organization to make sure they understand the policy, the exemption process, their rights as an employee, and the impact they have on those we serve.

As a healthcare system we believe that the vaccine remains our best tool in the fight against Covid-19. We would urge those on the fence regarding whether or not to receive

the vaccine to speak with their healthcare provider so that they can have the correct information to make such a decision.

Up until this point we have been very fortunate that our supply of monoclonal antibody treatments have been sufficient to treat those who meet the criteria. But we cannot rely on the hope that those will always be available. In recent weeks our facility has been down to less than 1 days' worth of treatments on multiple occasions.

Heading into the winter months would also like to remind and urge the public to wash your hands, practice safe respiratory/cough etiquette, and when possible to utilize proper personal protective equipment such as masks.

Approaching 2 years since this pandemic first impacted our service area, I couldn't be more proud of our staff and their efforts on behalf of those we serve. Across our health system individuals have stepped up to meet the needs of patients and they deserve our never-ending gratitude.

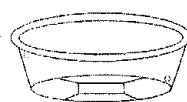

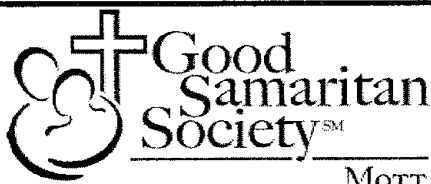

Thoughts for the Day

Thanksgiving is just around the corner and so that's what's on my mind this week. Time for families to get together around the table and give thanks for what we have been given and who we are able to share it with. Not that this lasted for very long as the more settlers that came to this country, the more the Natives were moved over to accommodate them.

When we are children, thanksgiving is mostly about the food and whether we get to sit at the 'big table' or get relegated to the card table with the rest of the kids. Not having a lot of kids in our family, I didn't experience that, but in the years I celebrated with my In-Law's I did see that happening. Once you were old enough to sit with the Adults it was a big deal rather than having to sit with the little ones or worse, have to be responsible for taking care of the little ones. 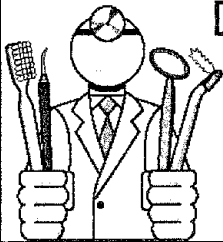

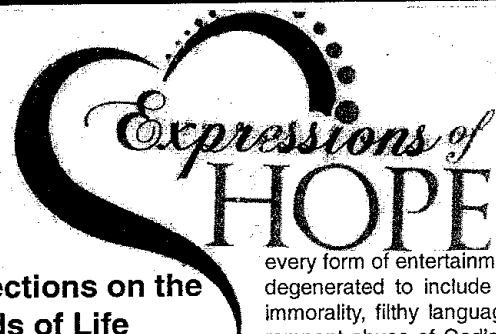

In our study of Daniel, we saw last time that Daniel did not give in to the pressures and temptations that he was being bombarded with. These were all part of King Nebuchadnezzar's master plan to make pagan Babylonians out of the young Jewish men who had been captured and brought to Babylon. And we saw the reason for the failure of the king's plan in Daniel 1:8: "But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank; therefore he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself."

What we notice first about Daniel's decision is that it was not made on the spur of the moment. Look at the tense of the verb; it's in the past. Daniel had already purposed that he would not defile himself. He knew that tests and temptations were coming, but he had already determined not to compromise. Let's be clear that Daniel wasn't promising God that he wouldn't sin. Sin is something all believers will struggle with as long as we are in these bodies of flesh. Rather, Daniel was making a solemn covenant with God that could be kept only by God's enabling grace working in him. Scottish preacher Robert Murray M'Cheyne, who lived during the first half of the 19th century, used to pray, "Lord, make me as holy as it is possible for a saved sinner to be in this life." That is something similar to what Daniel was doing by purposing in his heart that he would not defile himself.

Dear friends, Christianity in our country is at a low ebb. The standard of holiness has become shallow. There is so much about our society that threatens to strip us of integrity. Nearly

every form of entertainment has degenerated to include blatant immorality, filthy language, and rampant abuse of God's name. The Bible and Christianity are ignored and ridiculed. Believers in Christ, let us not allow this tide of wickedness to sway us. Let us never swallow the idea that times have changed and we have to go along with them. Yes, times change, but the standards of God's word do not. Now is the time for us to plant our feet and purpose as Daniel did not to defile ourselves.

Finally, let us take a moment to consider Daniel's demeanor—the manner in which he conducted himself. Equally impressive as the stand that he took is the way he went about it. There is no pride or harshness here—only a picture of humility and respect. Daniel politely explained to the chief eunuch his desire to be faithful to the Lord and asked permission to be exempt from the king's diet. And we read the result in the next verse, "God had brought Daniel into the favor and goodwill of the chief of the eunuchs" (Daniel 1:9). There is something very attractive about a humble and upright person.

It is essential to realize that what Daniel did sprang from his relationship with God. Before a person can honor God with his life, he or she must be made right with God. Daniel and all other Old Testament believers were saved by faith in the Savior who was to come, just as New Testament believers are saved by faith in the Savior who has come. Jesus died on the cross to pay the penalty for all the sins of all His people of all time. Whoever believes in Him will enter into an eternal relationship with God as his or her Father. If you have not done so, please come to God through Christ while there is still time. And for those who have been brought savingly to God through Christ, may we dare to be a Daniel. Let us seek grace to glorify our heavenly Father by living a life of faith and obedience to Him.

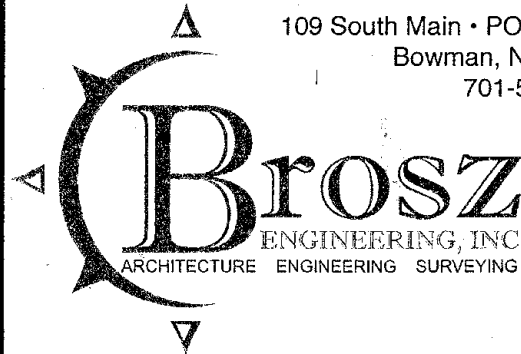
