I have a story to tell. Some may think it's dumb, some absurd, some uncanny. Some will think it's cool, and some may not like it at all. But - - to me stories are exciting, adventurous, interesting and part of our heritage - our history - - so here goes.

First stop - Scranton - - unloaded and noticed Scranton's Community Center - - small community with much going on. Next stop Bowman, still dark, unloaded, but on the way out we notice someone must have bought former Super Valu - something is happening.

Next stop -- unloaded in Rhame and right across from Post Office is a restaurant - - people - pickups lights - - activity. Erv reaches into his **pocket** - takes out phone and a photo - people are alive and it's still dark. Wanted to stop, sure we would know someone, but time not allowing.

Marmarth, next stop. We have an opportunity to see all Post Offices in small communities. We smile and comment about the community and how they use to have theatre plays in this community. On way out we notice beautiful painting on Marmarth Museum.

Remember now- it's still dark as we journey on to

Baker. Now construction of bridge takes us into back roads. We laugh as we pass a few houses - - Erv says, "bet this is the most traffic they have ever seen." Reach the Baker Post Office, greeted by some very special ladies. Treat us as though we were dignitary - -leaving as daylight is slowly creeping in and we can vision a few stores. Baker has much to offer.

Final destination - Plevna - now what could that little community have to offer - - drive to Post Office and on corner of street - halloween decorations. By now it's light out, but can you imagine all the work someone did to brighten up that corner - - amazing. Deliver papers and as we are about to leave we meet the Post Office personal, a special person, who told us how Plevna came to be- railroads brought some of our communities into being.

We thought the trip was over but there was more to come.

On our way home between Baker and Marmarth, as sun was beginning to scan the horizon, asked Erv why the land was so different - - it looked like someone had sprinkled chocolate chips across the area and they grew - - hills shaped as chocolate chips without the curl on the top covers the land. I could only see amazement.

As the sun creeps higher in the sky we begin to see more - Rhame - a Pro-Point Convenience store on the corner in Rhame. People still believing in our small communities - still love them enough to invest.

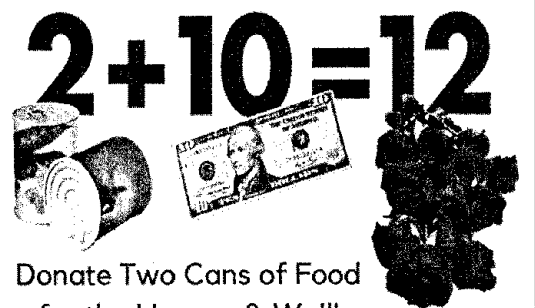

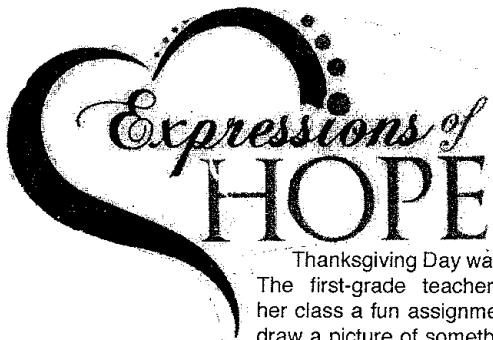

## November A Good Month

I have always liked the month of November and I still do. The month is unique for a number of reasons: the cooler temperatures, the colors of the season (while that last), and the days leading up to Thanksgiving are a precursor of what is to come, or at least they used to be. In our world today, Thanksgiving for me, is almost a forgotten holiday. Instead of preparing to give thanks to God for the blessings we have received the season has become the benchmark for the Christmas shopping season. Thanksgiving, it would appear, is less about giving thanks and more about getting ready to spend. It is with this thought in mind that I want to share a story about giving thanks, a story that reflects the importance of sharing what God has given to each one of us, the gift of life in service to one another.

**The Hand of a Teacher:  
A Thanksgiving Story

At first it sounded like a Thanksgiving story, but the more I reflected on it, the more appropriate it seemed for any time of the year. The way I heard it; the story went like this:

Thanksgiving Day was near. The first-grade teacher gave her class a fun assignment—to draw a picture of something for which they were thankful. Most of the class might be considered economically disadvantaged, but still, many would celebrate the holiday with turkey and other traditional goodies of the season. These, the teacher thought, would be the subjects of most of her student's art. And they were.

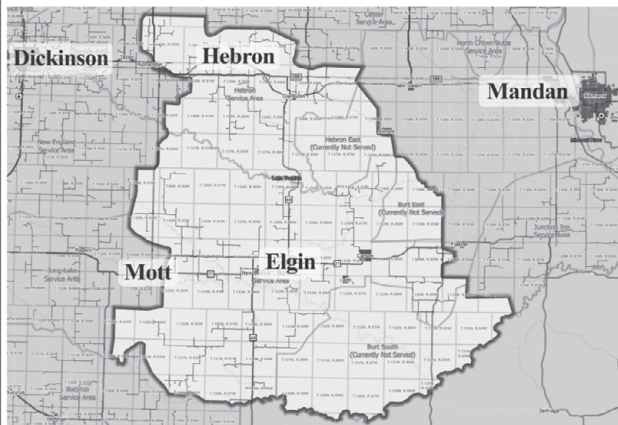
But Douglas made a different kind of picture. Douglas was a different kind of boy. He was the teacher's true child of misery, frail and unhappy. As other children played at recess, Douglas was likely to stand close by her side. One could only guess at the pain Douglas felt behind those sad eyes. Yes, his picture was different. When asked to draw a picture of something for which he was thankful, he drew a hand. Nothing else. Just an empty hand.

His abstract image captured the imagination of his peers. Whose hand could it be? One child guessed it was the hand of a farmer because farmers raise turkeys. Another suggested a police officer because the police protect and care for people. Still, others guessed it was the hand of God, for God feeds us. And so, the discussion went—until the teacher almost forgot the young artist himself.

When the children had gone on to other assignments, she paused at Douglas' desk, bent down, and asked him whose hand it was. The little boy looked away and murmured, "It's yours, teacher." She recalled the times she had taken his hand and walked with him here or there, as she had the other students. How often had she said, "Take my hand, Douglas, we'll go outside." Or "Let me show you how to hold your pencil." Or "Let's do this together." Douglas was most thankful for his teacher's hand. Brushing aside a tear, she went on with her work.

The story speaks of more than thankfulness. It says something about teachers

## Reflections on the Words of Life

We have been looking together at the first chapter of the book of Daniel. Last time we saw that King Nebuchadnezzar developed a master plan for making loyal Babylonian citizens out of the young Jewish boys who had been captured and transported from their homeland. We saw that two of the tactics he employed to reach this goal were isolation and indoctrination. By removing these young men from all exposure to the worship of the true God, Nebuchadnezzar hoped to eradicate thoughts of God from their minds. By indoctrination, he determined to replace the teachings of their youth with the beliefs of pagan Babylon.

Today we go on to see the third tactic Nebuchadnezzar employed, which was pressure to compromise. We read in Daniel 1:5, "And the king appointed for them a daily provision of the king's delicacies and of the wine which he drank, and three years of training for them, so that at the end of that time they might serve before the king." We are not told precisely the nature of the temptation that was being presented to the Jewish youths. It is possible that the contents of the king's diet included foods that were unclean according to the law of God and which therefore were forbidden to them. But it is also possible that this was a more subtle temptation to be seduced into a lifestyle of comfort and pleasure which would dull the sharp edge of a believer in Jehovah.

There is, of course, nothing wrong with occasionally enjoying a few exotic and delicious delicacies. There's nothing wrong with celebrating special occasions with fine food and drink. But there is a great danger in a person's giving himself to these things. Such a person would likely become averse to the life of self-denial to which Jesus calls all His followers. Furthermore, a life of pleasure and ease would encourage one to focus upon personal enjoyment rather than being a servant of the Lord and of others. We do not read anything in our passage which says that the beliefs of the Hebrews were specifically challenged. Nebuchadnezzar knew that he would not have to refute their beliefs if he could simply cause the Jews to forget about them.

Believers in the Lord Jesus, if we can be lulled by the wiles of Satan to compromise and settle into a life of comfort or pleasure or self-esteem or position in society, our beliefs can be successfully neutralized without

being directly attacked. Let us beware of both the overt and the covert bombardments that we might face in this area.

As for those who have not placed their trust in the Lord Jesus Christ—the Bible tells us that Satan has blinded their minds to the gospel. The apostle Paul writes in 2 Corinthians 4:3-4, "But even if our gospel is veiled, it is veiled to those who are perishing, whose minds the god of this age has blinded, who do not believe, lest the light of the gospel of the glory of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine on them." Friends, this is such a darkness as will lead a person who continues in it straight to an eternity in hell. But how thankful we can be that Jesus, the light of the world, is omnipotent to overcome such darkness. For we read just two verses later, "For it is the God who commanded light to shine out of darkness, who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ." May God reveal to each of us our desperate need for what Jesus did in His substitutionary death on the cross. He bore the punishment of sin for all who will ever place their trust in Him. His payment for sin is the only one that God will accept. I hope that each reader is relying on that payment alone to make you right with God. What a blessing

to be able to say with the apostle Paul, "He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love" (Colossians 1:13).

Every day is a new beginning. Take a deep breath smile and start again.

Never did find out who put it there although there were quite a few tired boys in school the following day.

Many people find it to be the best holiday of the year, allowing for a time of dress up and frivolity that is unparalleled by any other. ## RECIPE OF THE DAY

### BEEF STROGANOFF

1/4 cup flour  
1/2 tsp. Mrs. Dash seasoning  
1/4 tsp. pepper  
2 lbs. beef stew meat, cut into 1 inch cubes  
1 - 10 3.4 oz. can low fat cream of mushroom soup  
1 cup nonfat half and half  
1/2 cup frozen chopped onions, thawed and drained  
1 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce  
2 tsp. beef bouillon granules  
1 tsp. garlic powder  
1 - 8 oz. pkg. nonfat cream cheese, softened and cubed  
3 cups cooked noodles or rice

Spray large nonstick skillet with cooking spray. Combine flour, Mrs. Dash seasoning, and pepper to zip-top bag and shake until mixed. Drop stew meat into bag and shake to coat with flour mixture. Add meat to skillet and cook over medium heat, stirring frequently, until browned on all sides. Drain well. Spray inside of slow cooker with cooking spray. Place meat in slow cooker. Combine soup, half and half, onions, Worcestershire sauce, bouillon granules, and garlic powder in a medium bowl and mix well. Pour soup mixture over meat. Cover and cook on low heat for 5-6 hours. Increase heat to high; add cream cheese and cook, stirring occasionally, until cheese is melted. Serve over cooked noodles or rice.

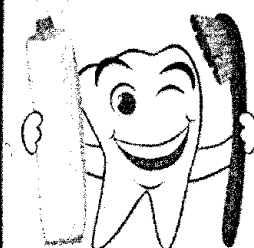
