Next stop -- unloaded in Rhame and right across from Post Office is a restaurant - - people - pickups lights - - activity. Erv reaches into his **pocket** - takes out phone and a photo - people are alive and it's still dark. Wanted to stop, sure we would know someone, but time not allowing.

Marmarth, next stop. We have an opportunity to see all Post Offices in small communities. We smile and comment about the community and how they use to have theatre plays in this community. On way out we notice beautiful painting on Marmarth Museum.

Remember now- it's still dark as we journey on to

Baker. Now construction of bridge takes us into back roads. We laugh as we pass a few houses - - Erv says, "bet this is the most traffic they have ever seen." Reach the Baker Post Office, greeted by some very special ladies. Treat us as though we were dignitary - -leaving as daylight is slowly creeping in and we can vision a few stores. Baker has much to offer.

Final destination - Plevna - now what could that little community have to offer - - drive to Post Office and on corner of street - halloween decorations. By now it's light out, but can you imagine all the work someone did to brighten up that corner - - amazing. Deliver papers and as we are about to leave we meet the Post Office personal, a special person, who told us how Plevna came to be- railroads brought some of our communities into being.

We thought the trip was over but there was more to come.

On our way home between Baker and Marmarth, as sun was beginning to scan the horizon, asked Erv why the land was so different - - it looked like someone had sprinkled chocolate chips across the area and they grew - - hills shaped as chocolate chips without the curl on the top covers the land. I could only see amazement.

As the sun creeps higher in the sky we begin to see more - Rhame - a Pro-Point Convenience store on the corner in Rhame. People still believing in our small communities - still love them enough to invest.

Want a special one day vacation - try the one we took - it was amazing what our people have done, are doing and will continue to do. Take your cell phone out of your pocket and take one picture that will create a



I have always liked the month of November and I still do. The month is unique for a number of reasons: the cooler temperatures, the colors of the season (while that last), and the days leading up to Thanksgiving are a precursor of what is to come, or at least they used to be. In our world today, Thanksgiving for me, is almost a forgotten holiday. Instead of preparing to give thanks to God for the blessings we have received the season has become the benchmark for the Christmas shopping season. Thanksgiving, it would appear, is less about giving thanks and more about getting ready to spend. It is with this thought in mind that I want to share a story about giving thanks, a story that reflects the importance of sharing what God has given to each one of us, the gift of life in service to one an-


But Douglas made a different kind of picture. Douglas was a different kind of boy. He was the teacher's true child of misery, frail and unhappy. As other children played at recess, Douglas was likely to stand close by her side. One could only guess at the pain Douglas felt behind those sad eyes. Yes, his picture was different. When asked to draw a picture of something for which he was thankful, he drew a hand. Nothing else. Just an empty hand.

His abstract image captured the imagination of his peers. Whose hand could it be? One child guessed it was the hand of a farmer because farmers raise turkeys. Another suggested a police officer because the police protect and care for people. Still, others guessed it was the hand of God, for God feeds us. And so, the discussion wentuntil the teacher almost forgot the young artist himself.

When the children had gone on to other assignments, she paused at Douglas' desk, bent down, and asked him whose hand it was. The little boy looked away and murmured, "It's yours, teacher." She recalled the times she had taken his hand and walked with him here or there, as she had the other students. How often had she said, "Take my hand, Douglas, we'll go outside." Or "Let me show you how to hold your pencil." Or "Let's do this together." Douglas was most thankful for his teacher's hand. Brushing aside a tear, she went on with her work.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been looking together at the first chapter of the book of Daniel. Last time we saw that King Nebuchadnezzar developed a master plan for making loyal Babylonian citizens out of the young Jewish boys who had been captured and transported from their homeland. We saw that two of the tactics he employed to reach this goal were isolation and indoctrination. By removing these young men from all exposure to the worship of the true God, Nebuchadnezzar hoped to eradicate thoughts of God from their minds. By indoctrination, he determined to replace the teachings of their youth with the beliefs of pagan Babylon.

Today we go on to see the third tactic Nebuchadnezzar employed, which was pressure to compromise. We read in Daniel 1.5, "And the king appointed for them a daily provision of the king's delicacies and of the wine which he drank, and three years of training for them, so that at the end of that time they might serve before the king." We are not told precisely the nature of the temptation that was being presented to the Jewish youths. It is possible that the contents of the king's diet included foods that were unclean according to the law of God and which therefore were forbidden to them. But it is also possible that this was a more subtle temptation to be seduced into a lifestyle of comfort and pleasure which would dull the sharp edge of a believer in Jehovah.

There is, of course, nothing wrong with occasionally enjoying a few exotic and delicious delicacies. There's nothing wrong with celebrating special occasions with fine food and drink. But there is a great danger in a person's giving himself to these things. Such a person would likely become averse to the life of self-denial to which Jesus calls all His followers. Furthermore, a life of pleasure and ease would encourage one to focus upon personal enjoyment rather than being a servant of the Lord and of others. vve do not read anything in our passage which says that the beliefs of the Hebrews were specifically challenged. Nebuchadnezzar knew that he would not have to refute their beliefs if he could simply cause the Jews to forget about them.

Believers in the Lord Jesus. if we can be allured by the wiles of Satan to compromise and settle into a life of comfort or pleasure or self-esteem or position in society, our beliefs can be successfully neutralized without to be able to say with the apostle Paul. "He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love" (Colossians







RECIPE OF THE DAY

BEEF STROGANOFF

1/4 cup flour

1/2 tsp. Mrs. Dash seasoning

1/4 tsp. pepper

2 lbs. beef stew meat, cut into 1 inch cubes

1 - 10 3.4 oz. can low fat cream of mushroom soup 1 cup nonfat half and half

1/2 cup frozen chopped onions, thawed and drained

1 Tbsp. Worcestershire sauce

2 tsp. beef bouillon granules

1 tsp. garlic powder

1 - 8 oz. pkg. nonfat cream cheese, softened and cubed

3 cups cooked noodles or rice

Spray large nonstick skillet with cooking spray. Combine flour, Mrs. Dash seasoning, and pepper to zip-top bag and shake until mixed. Drop stew meat into bag and shake to coat with flour mixture. Add meat to skillet and cook over medium heat, stirring frequently, until browned on all sides. Drain well. Spray inside of slow cooker with cooking spray. Place meat in slow cooker. Combine soup, half and half, onions, Worcestershire sauce, bouillon granules, and garlic powder in a medium bowl and mix well. Pour soup mixture over meat. Cover and cook on low heat for 5-6 hours. Increase heat to high; add cream cheese and cook, stirring occasionally, until cheese is melted. Serve over cooked noodles or rice.


