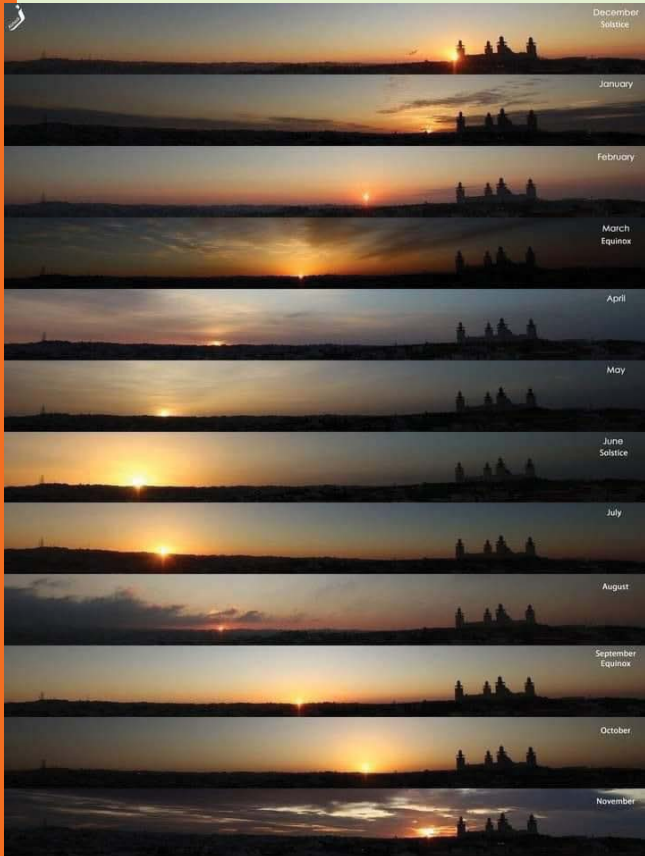
"Joey, Joey, you okay?" questioned the garbage man - - have to much to drink last night?"

Bowman's To Be Honored At Ag Appreciation Banquet

BOWMAN, N.D. (October 7, 2021) - The annual Agriculture Appreciation Banquet hosted by Bowman Area Chamber of Commerce is set for Wednesday, October 27, 2021 with the social at 5:00 pm and dinner at 6:00 pm at the 4 Seasons Pavilion in Bowman, ND. Everyone is welcome to join in celebrating the farmers and ranchers in Bowman, Slope, and Harding Counties. Enjoy a free meal, entertainment by Comedian Jerry Carroll, and the honoring of the 2021 Farmer/Rancher of the Year.

This year's honorees are Bruce and Teresa Bowman of Rhame, ND. Bruce graduated

from Rhame High School, then attended Montana State University where he received a degree in Business Management and took as many agriculture electives as he could put in his schedule. Following graduation Bruce returned home to Rhame to begin ranching with his parents, Albert and Lorraine. In 1974, Bruce married Teresa Fischer. A few years later Bruce bought the ranch from his parents.

Bruce and Teresa have always raised Angus cattle, both registered and commercial herds. They have been utilizing artificial insemination since the early 70's to constantly improve the genetics of their cows. Bruce bred to many different breeds over the years, including Charolais, Maine Anjou, Limousin, Simmental, Chianina, and Tarentaise. Bruce was also

successful raising females and club calf prospects, selling them to Iowa, Nebraska, Illinois, and Canada. Bruce began custom feeding calves about thirty years ago when he took in Bruce and Tina Ketchum's Red Angus bulls, a relationship that continues today.

In 2001, Eric moved back to the ranch and expanded the feedlot to background their own calves as well as offering additional custom feeding for other ranchers. Today, under Eric and Andrea's ownership, the ranch runs a commercial and registered Angus herd, raising yearling Angus bulls and a few F1 baldies. The Bowman Ranch bull sale is held at the ranch every February. In 2020, the Bowman Ranch received the Bowman County Tree Award and if you've ever driven past their place you understand why. Bruce and Teresa are quick to mention that this has always been a family operation, where Bruce and Teresa's children and now their grandchildren, have always worked with them, whether they are haying, fencing, or working cattle.

As passionate as Bruce is about his ranch and livestock, he is just as passionate about improving his community. Bruce has served on the 1st Lutheran Church board and the Dakota Western Bank Shareholders Board. He has also been on the Farmer's Union Oil Board and the Farmer's Equity Elevator Board, serving both as President. Bruce was President of the Little Missouri Grazing Association and the North Dakota Chairman for the Bureau of Land Management Advisory Board. Rural healthcare has always held a special place in Bruce's heart as he has served on the Sunset Care Board (past President), the Southwest Healthcare Board (past President), and the Sunrise Foundation Board. He was also a member of the Capital Campaigns for Sunset Care, Sunrise Village, and Southwest Healthcare. Bruce isn't quite done yet as he is currently on the Bridger Creek Golf Course Advisory Board (Bozeman, MT) and the Badlands Ministries Board (Medora).

Bruce and Teresa are the proud parents of Duane, his wife Shannon and their kids Kenley, Warner, Thomas, and Branick; Eric, his wife Andrea and their kids Dillon, Livia, and Grayson; and Rebecca, her husband Brandon, and their kids Annastyn, Maci, Maddox, and Finley.

The agricultural business is at the very heart of Bowman, Slope, and Harding Counties. Help us show them all just how much we appreciate the long hours and hard work they put in. The life of a farmer/rancher is never easy, but the gift they give to all of us is worth it.

Get in a little laughter as Comedian Jerry Carroll takes the stage at 7:30 pm. Jerry Carroll found comedy growing up on his family's farm in Willow Spring, NC. From the time he could walk, he joined his father and uncle to farm tobacco, corn, small grain, soybeans, cattle, and hogs. 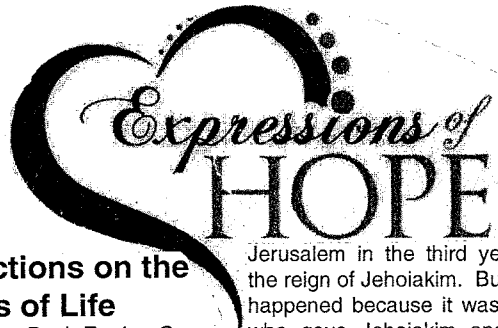

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been considering together some introductory information about the book of Daniel. As we delve into the content of the book, we find in the first two verses two ways of viewing history: "In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim king of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came to Jerusalem and besieged it. And the Lord gave Jehoiakim king of Judah into his hand, with some of the articles of the house of God, which he carried into the land of Shinar to the house of his god; and he brought the articles into the treasure house of his god." The first brief statement in verse one is such as we would expect to read in any secular history book. It is a straightforward account answering for us the typical who, what, when, and where questions about the occurrence of an important event: In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim king of Judah, which was about 605 BC, the Babylonian king Nebuchadnezzar, came to Jerusalem and besieged it. At that time, Nebuchadnezzar took and did what he wanted. He thought it best for the accomplishment of his goals to leave Jehoiakim as a puppet king. After this siege of Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar, Jehoiakim still held the title of king, but was supposed to do only what Nebuchadnezzar told him to do. Now what we have just described about verse one is commonly called history. We have seen the facts surrounding what took place at that time.

But believers in Jesus Christ should never be satisfied to look at history ONLY in that way. For them, history is not complete without looking behind the bare facts in order to see the purposes of God. And so Daniel tells us about the same event from a different perspective in verse two. He tells us that it was THE LORD who gave Jehoiakim into Nebuchadnezzar's hands. The difference is immediately obvious. This is the same event being described in verse one, but the perspective is entirely different. In verse one, the record is all about what men and nations were doing. The statement in verse two is about what God was doing.

We are seeing this difference in our days because of the efforts of many to "rewrite" history in an entirely secular manner. Man's natural tendency, because of sin, is to look at things from a man-centered point of view.

But Scripture calls us away from a man-centered view of the world to a God-centered one. Yes, Nebuchadnezzar, mighty king of Babylon, took control of

Jerusalem in the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim. But that happened because it was God who gave Jehoiakim and the people of Judah into his hands.

If we read the Scriptural account of the history which preceded this event, it becomes clear why God did this. Jerusalem was allowed to fall into the hands of Nebuchadnezzar for one primary reason, and that reason was not the awesome power and vast armies of Nebuchadnezzar. This happened to the rulers and people of Judah because they had not listened to God. They had rejected God's faithful messengers, the prophets, who time and time again warned them to repent of their idolatry. They even warned them that a failure to repent of their sins would lead to their being defeated and taken captive by a foreign power.

It is important that believers in Christ learn to look at the unfolding of life around us with a God-centered point of view. Most of the media will give us a "verse one" account of history, but we should learn to add the "verse two" version. When news reporters tell us about wildfires, floods, riots, and rampant crime, Christians should be driven to prayer: "Oh God, these are Your judgments that have fallen on our land. Oh Lord, forgive our sins. Oh Lord, heal our land. Oh Lord, draw people to Yourself through these tragedies."

From outward appearances, Nebuchadnezzar's victory could not have been more complete. Yet we will see, Lord willing,

Investing For The Future

Do you like the interest rate of your savings account or CD's? If not, you should have attended the session on investing that was held in the Enchanted Castle of Regent on October 4. Titled "Rules of the Road", Blake Wilson of Edward Jones in Dick-
inson gave the presentation and answered questions from the audience. They can help you with checking accounts, money market accounts, savings accounts, Roths, IRAs, various bonds and CDs annuities, how to open an account, how interest rates vary from 11% to 17% on various mutual funds and much more. Most mutual funds are made up of about 200 companies so it is not likely they will all fail at the same time and the result is profit.

The "Rules of the Road" are actually 1. Develop your strategy, 2. Understand your risk, 3. Diversify for a solid foundation, 4. Stick with quality, 5. Invest for the long term, 6. Have realistic expectations, 7. Maintain your balance, 8. Prepare for the unexpected, 9. Focus on what you can control, 10. Review your strategy regularly.

You can choose investments on three different levels—1. Income and Growth, 2. Growth or 3. Aggressive. Inflation erodes your purchasing power just like these examples: In 1992 a new car cost \$15,000, a tank of gas cost \$18, groceries for a month cost \$215 and health care cost \$2,763. In 2020 the car cost \$25,000, gas was \$39, groceries were \$690 and health care was \$11,582.

Crisis events affect the DOW and your investments. One member who has invested said she was told when taking

a class on investing that if you worry about your money--then don't invest. She showed a graph showing how she has only lost some money in September 2015 (Chinese market turmoil), September 2018 (Oil shocks) and March 2020 (coronavirus) but the funds rebounded and have grown steadily since 2009 by more than three times from that date. The growth was through the markets, interest, dividends and reinvestments.

Market declines can test the nerves of even the most patient investors. If you own a diversified mix of quality investments, resist the temptation to sell or make changes based on short-term events. If you are a long-term investor, the difference between success and failure may be determined by your actions during a stock market decline.

Shares of stock are a great

gift for birthdays or Christmas and are a good investment for the recipient's future, especially for children as they can see their money grow and can add to it as they mature or withdraw to buy a car, start a business or go to college. Some people withdraw the interest for living expenses while others reinvest to keep the fund growing.

Participants receive monthly statements showing their growth and/or loss. At the end of the year, they receive a form that tells them how to file their taxes on the funds.

NO BAKE TRIPLE LAYER PUMPKIN PIE

CRUST:

1 1/2 cup graham cracker crumbs
7 tablespoons butter, melted
1/4 cup sugar

FILLING:

1 tablespoon sugar
4 oz. softened cream cheese
1 cup + 1 tablespoon heavy cream, divided
12 oz. thawed Cool Whip, divided
2 small pkgs. instant vanilla pudding mix
15 oz. pumpkin puree
2 teaspoons pumpkin pie spice

Whisk together graham cracker crumbs and sugar in a bowl. Add melted butter and stir with a fork until combined. Press mixture firmly into bottom and up sides of 9" glass pie plate. Refrigerate for at least 1 hour. Blend together cream cheese, 1 tablespoon heavy cream and sugar until smooth. Fold in 1 1/2 cups whipped topping. Spread mixture on pie crust. Whisk together 1 cup heavy cream and pudding mixes. Add in Pumpkin and pumpkin pie spice and whisk until blended. Spread over cream cheese layer. Place in refrigerator for at least one hour until set. Top with remaining Cool Whip.



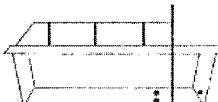

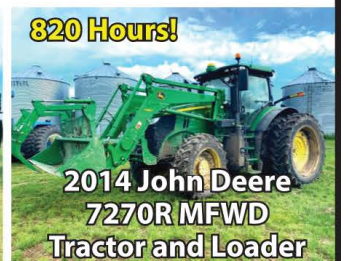

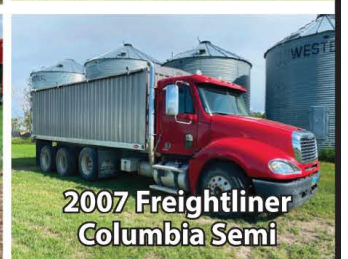
