Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been considering together some introductory information about the book of Daniel. As we delve into the content of the book, we find in the first two verses two ways of viewing history: "In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim king of Judah, Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came to Jerusalem and besieged it. And the Lord gave Jehoiakim king of Judah into his hand, with some of the articles of the house of God, which he carried into the land of Shinar to the house of his god; and he brought the articles into the treasure house of his god." The first brief statement in verse one is such as we would expect to read in any secular history book. It is a straightforward account answering for us the typical who, what, when, and where questions about the occurrence of an important event: In the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim king of Judah, which was about 605 BC, the Babylonian king Nebuchadnezzar, came to Jerusalem and besieged it. At that time, Nebuchadnezzar took and did what he wanted. He thought it best for the accomplishment of his goals to leave Jehoiakim as a puppet king. After this siege of Jerusalem by Nebuchadnezzar, Jehoiakim still held the title of king, but was supposed to do only what Nebuchadnezzar told him to do. Now what we have just described about verse one is commonly called history. We have seen the facts surrounding what took place at that time.

But believers in Jesus Christ should never be satisfied to look at history ONLY in that way. For them, history is not complete without looking behind the bare facts in order to see the purposes of God. And so Daniel tells us about the same event from a different perspective in verse two. He tells us that it was THE LORD who gave Jehoiakim into Nebuchadnezzar's hands. The difference is immediately obvious. This is the same event being described in verse one, but the perspective is entirely different. In verse one, the record is all about what men and nations were doing. The statement in verse two is about what God was doing

We are seeing this difference in our days because of the efforts of many to "rewrite" history in an entirely secular manner. Man's natural tendency, because of sin, is to look at things from a man-centered point of view.

But Scripture calls us away from a man-centered view of the world to a God-centered one. Yes, Nebuchadnezzar, mighty king of Babylon, took control of

Jerusalem in the third year of the reign of Jehoiakim. But that happened because it was God who gave Jehoiakim and the people of Judah into his hands.

If we read the Scriptural account of the history which preceded this event, it becomes clear why God did this. Jerusalem was allowed to fall into the hands of Nebuchadnezzar for one primary reason, and that reason was not the awesome power and vast armies of Nebuchadnezzar. This happened to the rulers and people of Judah because they had not listened to God. They had rejected God's faithful messengers, the prophets, who time and time again warned them to repent of their idolatry. They even warned them that a failure to repent of their sins would lead to their being defeated and taken captive by a foreign power.

It is important that believers in Christ learn to look at the unfolding of life around us with a God-centered point of view. Most of the media will give us a "verse one" account of history, but we should learn to add the "verse two" version. When news reporters tell us about wildfires, floods, riots, and rampant crime, Christians should be driven to prayer: "Oh God, these are Your judgments that have fallen on our land. Oh Lord, forgive our sins. Oh Lord, heal our land. Oh Lord, draw people to Yourself through these tragedies."

From outward appearances, Nebuchadnezzar's victory could not have been more complete. Yet we will see. Lord willing.

2 small pkgs. instant vanilla pudding mix


15 oz. pumpkin puree
