Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzia

We have been looking together at the opening verses of the book of Daniel. We have seen that the Southern Kingdom of Israel, known as Judah, had been besieged by King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon and that many of its citizens had been captured and carried away as captives. Most of the Jews did not have a God-centered view of what was going on. They were living under the delusion that because the temple of God was in Jerusalem, they could not be ultimately defeated by any foreign power. Instead of listening to the prophets of God who were calling them to repentance, they kept right on in their idolatry, stealing, and lust, while at the same time viewing the temple as a sort of "lucky charm" that would make them indestructible.

The prophet Isaiah warned them very plainly in Isaiah 39:6-7: "Behold, the days are coming when all that is in your house, and what your fathers have accumulated until this day, shall be carried to Babylon; nothing shall be left,' says the LORD. 'And they shall take away some of your sons who will descend from you, whom ou will beget; and they be eunuchs in the palace of the

king of Babylon." You would think that these Jews would know better. The Northern Kingdom of Israel had fallen into pagan hands over a hundred years before. But they were mesmerized by the temple. They thought like this: "We have the temple; we can't be defeated. God could never allow the place of His special presence to be destroyed." And so, when the temple was in fact razed by the Babylonian army, the Jews were utterly devastated and thought that God had forsaken them.

Now if the people of Judah

really going on, the people of Babylon most certainly could not. When Nebuchadnezzar took over Jerusalem, he took some of the articles from the temple and brought them back to his own country and put them in the temple of his god. For this reason, Nebuchadnezzar and the people of Babylon assumed that they had demonstrated the superiority of their god over the God of the Jews. RECIPE OF THE DAY

GLUTEN-FREE PUMPKIN OAT PANCAKES

1 cup pumpkin puree

1/4 cup milk of choice

2 tablespoons coconut oil (or butter), melted

1 tablespoon lemon juice (about 1 small lemon, juiced)

teaspoon maple syrup (or honey) 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

2 eggs

1 cup oat flour (see notes for how to make your own oat flour out of old-fashioned oats)

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/2 teaspoon ground ginger

1/4 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1/4 teaspoon ground cloves or allspice

In a small mixing bowl, stir together the pumpkin puree, milk, coconut oil, lemon juice, maple syrup and vanilla. Beat in the eggs. (If your coconut oil goes back to its solid state like mine did at this point, just warm the mixture for short 20 second bursts in the microwave, stirring between each, until it is melted again.) In a medium bowl, whisk together the oat flour, baking soda, salt and spices. Form a well in the center of the dry ingredients and pour in the wet ingredients. With a big spoon, stir just until the dry ingredients are thoroughly moistened. Do not overmix! Let the batter sit for 10 minutes. Heat a heavy cast iron skillet/ non-stick pan over medium-low heat, or heat an electric griddle to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Lightly oil the surface of your pan with coconut oil, butter or cooking spray. If you're using a nonstick electric griddle like mine, you might not need any oil at all. Once the surface of the pan is hot enough that a drop of water sizzles on it, pour 1/4 cup of batter onto the pan. Let the pancake cook for about 3 minutes, until bubbles begin to form around the edges of the cake. Once the underside is lightly golden, flip it with a spatula and cook for another 90 seconds or so, until golden brown on both sides. You may need to adjust the heat up or down at this point. Serve the pancakes immediately or keep warm in a 200° F oven

TO MAKE OAT FLOUR: Pour one cup of old-fashioned oats (do not use quick cooking oats!) into a food processor and process until it is ground well. One cup before and after grinding measures just about the same, believe it or not!




