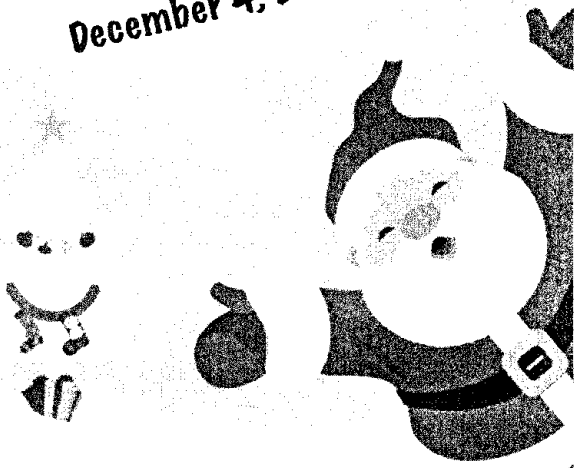

### Flower Shops Will Collect Tons of Food for Charity

Florists across central United States will gather over 20 tons of food for those in need November 8-13, 2021. Dubbed "Caring Rose Week," the stores are deeply discounting bouquets of one dozen roses and accepting canned goods as partial payment.

Florists in each community designate a food-distribution charity in their area. The canned goods collected are distributed to feed those within the community whom cannot otherwise meet their nutritional needs. Coming at the onset of seasonally cold weather, the program helps food-distribution programs when families begin to experience the greatest financial pressure.

The food contributed by Caring Rose Week donors is significant, not only in quantity, but in quality. Food pantries get wholesome foods not available from their traditional sources, and it goes to work in the communities where it is gathered.

Now in its 23rd year, "Caring Rose Week" has distributed over one-half million pounds of food since its inception. The concept is the brainchild of Harry Whelden, General Manager of North American Wholesale Florists in Sioux Falls, SD. "Almost 225 flower shops across the Great Plains are taking the time and energy to help meet this need, and I'm truly grateful,"

says Whelden. "While many are buying toys and other Christmas gifts, many across America are without food."

## Overwintered Cattle May Spread Weed Seeds

Producers who have relocated their cattle out of state for winter feeding this year should consider having a weed management protocol in place when the cattle return, say North Dakota State University Extension specialists.

"If you have sent your cattle to areas where there are known Palmer amaranth, waterhemp or other noxious or troublesome weed issues, it will be important to allow a 'cleanout period' upon return," says Joe Ikley, NDSU Extension weed specialist. "Crop fields are not the preferred area for this period, since weeds like Palmer amaranth are generally more difficult to control in crops compared to bare ground, pastures or a corral."

"The retention time of potential weed seeds in the gastrointestinal tract is heavily dependent on the digestibility of the diet," says Zac Carlson, NDSU Extension beef cattle specialist. "When we turn cattle out to green, lush cover crop, the passage rate of that feed is high compared to lower digestible forages, such as prairie hay. That does not mean some seeds couldn't get held up longer in the gastrointestinal tract."

Mary Keena, NDSU Extension livestock environmental management specialist based at the Carrington Research Extension Center, suggests confining cattle to one area for at least one week upon return.

"The manure, which includes feces, bedding and spilled or uneaten feedstuffs, should be kept in that area and composted," Keena advises. "Composting manure has been shown not only to reduce the volume of manure and kill parasites and pathogens, but also is an effective weed seed management strategy."

"Piling manure and turning it five to six times every 10 to 14 days should achieve temperatures between 130-160 degrees Fahrenheit," says Keena. "The high temperatures along with proper pile moisture will kill both large and small weed seeds."

"Livestock owners will want to keep a close eye on the area where the manure is managed to make sure escaped weed seeds that grow in the spring and summer of 2022 are pulled

and properly disposed of," warns Ikley. "Before the plants develop seeds, pull and destroy them by burying them deeply or burning them."

Keena adds, "If producers are going to spread the compost from that area, they will want to closely monitor the area where they spread it and practice similar monitoring and disposal techniques as in the feeding area."

It is not recommended to spread fresh manure on fields if it is known to contain noxious or troublesome weeds. However, if producers need to graze before weeds seeds have been passed or if producers need to spread the fresh manure on a field, we recommend spreading weed seed-heavy manure on tame grass pastures or grass hayfields, because more options

are available to control on them, says Miranda Meehan, NDSU Extension livestock environmental stewardship specialist.

"It is never recommended to spread manure on native rangeland," says Meehan. "Adding additional nutrients can benefit invasive grass species such as Kentucky bluegrass and smooth brome."

After receiving and Honorable Discharge from the Army, Richard returned to Hettinger: He and his wife Holly raised 2 girls and a boy. Several years ago while attending

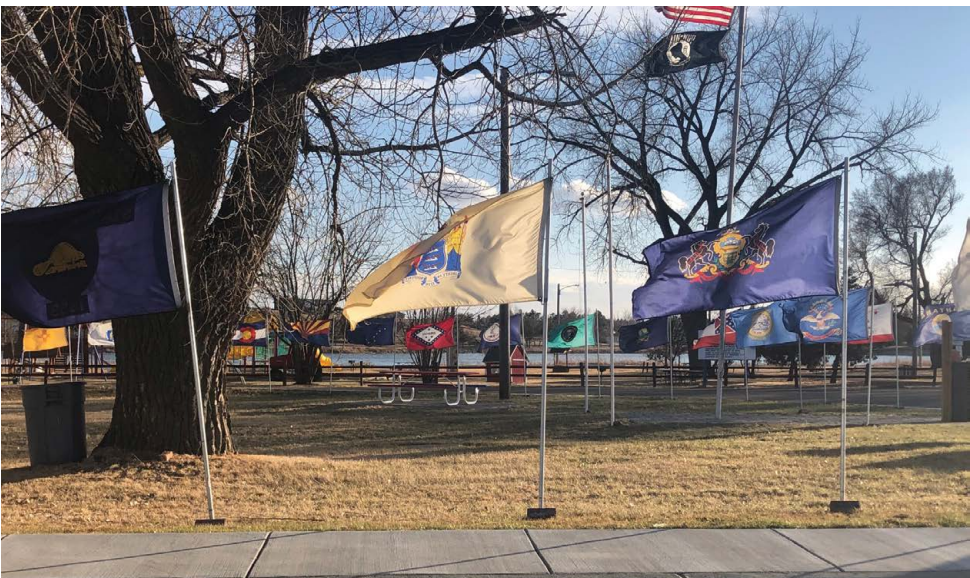
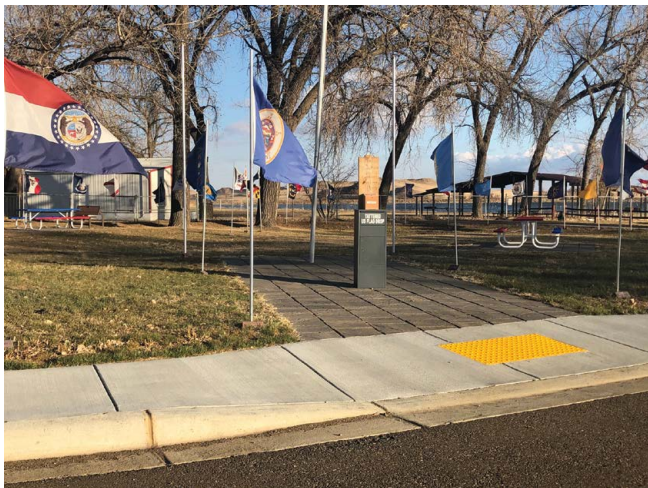
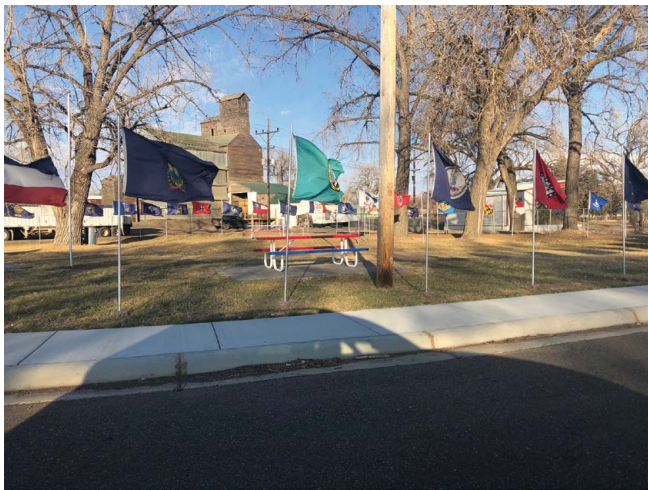
a football game in Belfield he was inspired to create the Flag Plaza at Mirror Lake Park in Hettinger.

The Bismarck State College (BSC) Mystics Clay Dusters trapshooting squad put on a dominant performance at the Minnesota Collegiate Athletic Conference (MCAC) 2021 Clay Target Championship on Oct. 19

in Alexandria, Minn., with sophomore Ayden Kautzman posting a perfect 100 to lead the team to its first championship and earn him

the men's and overall high gun awards for the event.

Kautzman's 100 was followed by teammate Bryer Erickson's total of 99 which tied him for second place on the day along with Jacob Schemp of Lake Region State College (Duluth, MN) and Carson Mattern of NDSCS (Wahpeton, ND). BSC's William Gebhardt posted a 98 to tie for fifth overall, and Ethan Oswald notched a 96 to help launch the Mystics Clay Dusters squad to their first-place team finish. Jenna Thompson posted a 92 for a seventh-place finish in the ladies' division at the Championship.

"It was my first 100 I've ever hit in my life and to hit it at a college championship was pretty amazing, those last ten birds I could barely even say 'pull' my heart was beating so fast," Kautzman recalls of his peak at the season ending-event, adding, "throughout the year I didn't do very well, but on BSC's team we had four shooters in the top five in the whole conference, which is pretty awesome to say that our team did that well over the season and then went to the MCAC Championship and won the championship too."

With a team total of 487, BSC bested the 480 posted by both Ridgewater College (Willmar, MN) and Alexandria (MN) Technical and Community College. Ridgewater took second place on the day based on high gun tiebreaker. Top shooters for BSC at the MCAC Championship were:

Joining the MCAC this fall for regional trap and skeet shooting competition, BSC brought some of western and central North Dakota's top clay target shooting talent together in just its second year since being organized in the fall of 2020, when it captured the USA College Clay Target League's Division 1A-1 regular season title in its inaugural season. The team quickly gelled and a strong sense of camaraderie along with a serious work ethic has driven the team to its meteoric success, according to head coach Darryl Howard.

"It's an amazing group of kids that just want the whole works, and they'll work as hard as they have to to get there, and they build on one another. It's not just five individual shooters going out there and shooting good scores, they are cheering each other on and that's what it takes to make the whole world go round in a team atmosphere and tournament," Howard states.

BSC's growing shooting sports program continues to draw competitors from around North Dakota and the surrounding region to a school offering a wide array of post-secondary education options. Strong support from administration for the trap and skeet shooting programs has also helped drive the program's success and is spurring continued interest from incoming students, explains assistant coach Eric Thompson.

"The sky is the limit with this program, but first and foremost we need shooters. We need to continue to recruit, we need to tap in on the surrounding communities as well as our own backyard. Even just in Bismarck-Mandan we have between 250 and 300 high school shooters and word travels fast. People are asking questions, people want

to be part of this program, there's no doubt, and we've got a spring league right that's around the corner and we're already starting the planning and starting the talks on that, and hoping to even pick up a few new shooters," Thompson states of the continuing efforts.

The BSC Mystics Clay Dusters trap and skeet shooting squads are open to all active students at the college, and registration for the spring season will begin in January of 2022. The teams compete in the USA College Clay Target League nationwide against schools sporting similar-sized squads and in the MCAC in divisions within the conference, based on participant numbers at each school. ## Encompass Therapy

Alex and Kathleen Thompson moved to Hettinger in 1996 sight unseen. After receiving their Masters Degrees from UND, they had started their careers as physical therapists in Tampa FL. Knowing that at some point they would be back North. "Our families are in eastern North Dakota and Wyoming, so as our son was approaching school age it seemed time to get back closer to home." So in the spring of 1996 they packed their belongings and headed north.

"We chose Hettinger because it was just about the midpoint between our families." For 25 years they have provided physical therapy services in the area. Alex, as rehab director built a department of a dozen employees serving 4 community clinics. Then in 2018, they began looking ahead. "Our parents had all passed away and our children were well on their way to independent lives, it seemed a good time to challenge ourselves." The Thompsons then reached out to a large trauma center in the Florida panhandle. The area had been destroyed by hurricane that October and the facility was in need of help. This seemed a great opportunity to step outside their comfort zone. So, in the winters of 2019 and 2020, they spent a couple of months working at this facility. It also gave Alex some great fishing opportunities and Kathleen took art classes on their off days.

In March of 2020 everyone's lives changed with the pandemic lock down. They drove back from Florida across an eerily desolate country to return home to quarantine. However, as things shut down their em-

ployment situation changed and Alex and Kathleen were given the opportunity to rethink how to provide care to the patients of Hettinger and surrounding communities. "We had a friend who had been doing a mobile therapy practice in California for years and it seemed like just the type of practice that would be appropriate at a time when everyone was anxious about going out of their homes."

The summer of 2020 was spent buried in paperwork to become Medicare certified, BCBS and Sanford Health in network providers, as well as Medicaid and Worker's Compensation providers. Then in August 2020, as Encompass Therapy LLC, they saw their first patient as in-home physical therapy providers. "People were so appreciative to have the service brought

to them. Whether difficulty with mobility or transportation, or anxious about COVID the response to what we were offering was so positive!" The Thompsons service area encompasses a 60 mile radius of Hettinger, working in both North and South Dakota.

Since that time, they have made over 2,500 in-home visits. Encompass Therapy has added staff and now has an outpatient physical therapy clinic. "We recognize not everyone wants treatment in their home, also we see it as an opportunity for patients to progress through care. The first few weeks after surgery, for instance, we will see them in their home. As they progress, they can come into the clinic for therapy. This provides functional activities such as getting dressed, getting in



and out of the car and the therapeutic benefit of seeing others working on their rehab as well. But we have the flexibility to continue to see people in the home who are unable to get to the clinic."

The clinic will be located at 110 Adams Ave, next to the Family Dollar Store. "We are really excited about the space! Kathleen and Dugan Poss did an amazing job updating. The main thing we were looking for was a level entrance for those with walkers, crutches or wheelchairs to safely and easily access physical therapy."

The pandemic changed many people's lives. For the Thompsons, it presented an opportunity to continue to serve these communities in a way they never would have imagined.

## RECIPE OF THE DAY

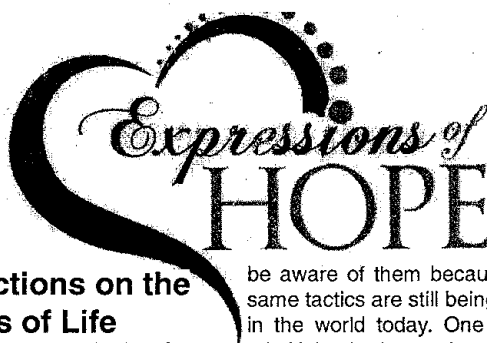
### CROCKPOT STUFF PEPPER SOUP

- 1 pound ground beef (browned and drained)
- 1/2 onion (diced)
- 1 red bell pepper (diced)
- 1 green bell pepper (diced)
- 1 can diced tomatoes (14 oz)
- 1 can tomato sauce (14 oz)
- 1 tsp oregano
- 1 tsp garlic salt
- 1 Tbsp Worcestershire sauce
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 3 cups beef broth
- 2 cups white rice (cooked)

Place everything (except the rice in the crockpot). Cover and cook on low for 6-8 hours or on high for 3-4 hours. Spoon into a bowl and top with a spoonful of cooked rice. Enjoy!

#### NOTES:

Refrigerate the leftovers in an air tight container for up to 5 days. The peppers are soft in this recipe. If you prefer firm bell peppers, add them in for the last hour of the cooking time only.



### Reflections on the Words of Life

We continue our reflections on the first chapter of Daniel. Today we come to verses 3 and 4, where we read of Nebuchadnezzar's strategy: "Then the king instructed Ashpenaz, the master of his eunuchs, to bring some of the children of Israel and some of the king's descendants and some of the nobles, young men in whom there was no blemish, but good-looking, gifted in all wisdom, possessing knowledge and quick to understand, who had ability to serve in the king's palace, and whom they might teach the language and literature of the Chaldeans."

Nebuchadnezzar was not only a mighty military leader, but he was also an evil genius. He had a well-formulated plan to make the people of Judah bow to him in such a way that they might come to accept their new position as Babylonians. He wanted to do more than merely win a military victory over the peoples he conquered; he wanted those he conquered to become willing servants. And so, as part of his master plan, Nebuchadnezzar determined to take the cream of Judah's male youth and give them a thorough education and indoctrination in the ways of Babylon.

Nebuchadnezzar believed that the best way to get the results he was looking for was to send them to a "politically correct" university. In this way, he was hoping to make content and loyal subjects of the Jews. For the goal, as verse 4 tells us, is that these young Jews would eventually take their place "serving in the king's palace." To accomplish his goal, Nebuchadnezzar used some clever tactics. And we need to

be aware of them because the same tactics are still being used in the world today. One method Nebuchadnezzar's system involved was isolation. These young Jewish teenagers were taken away from the influences which had molded their lives under Judaism and the ways of the Lord. The plan was to separate them from the public worship of God, the teaching of the Word of God, and the fellowship of God's people. In this way, Nebuchadnezzar expected the last embers of faithfulness to Jehovah to die out.

The second tactic we recognize is that of indoctrination. The young Hebrews were taught "the language and literature of the Chaldeans." Now there is nothing wrong with studying foreign languages and literature. We couldn't have missionaries without it. But the aim of this indoctrination process was not merely academic; it was to make these young Hebrews think like Babylonians.

Parents, this shows the importance of nurturing your children in the training and admonition of the Lord. Certainly this is no guarantee that your children will turn out godly. But if God chooses to bless your efforts, a principle of godliness will be instilled in them which no man or system can eradicate.

ferring to the view that there are many ways to God. People find it very offensive and intolerant to say that Jesus is the only way. But that is exactly what Jesus Himself said: "I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6). All of us are born in a state of sin and enmity against God, and unless this changes, God's holiness will demand that we be cast out of His presence forever. The realization of this should cause us to overflow with gratitude that God in His amazing love and mercy has made ANY way whereby we can be restored to a right relationship with Him and granted eternal life. And this eternal life is a free gift. It cannot be earned or deserved. "For God so loved the world that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (John 3:16). God's free gift of eternal life is received by faith alone. It is my hope that everyone reading this has placed his or her trust in the Lord Jesus Christ alone for salvation. He is the only way to God.

The Babylonians were a pagan, idolatrous nation, and their language and literature had no content involving the true God. Tragically, the same thing has been happening in America. Friends, how important it is that we learn to think Biblically. We need to be able to recognize both the blatant and the subtle ungodly thinking that permeates our society. We must learn to think critically and to separate truth from error, to keep and practice the truth and to reject and put away the false.

Lord willing, we shall continue considering Nebuchadnezzar's techniques next time, but in closing let us think about one very prevalent belief that is eternally important to reject. I'm re-

The Johnsons and Clements operated the company until 1974 when the interest of the Johnsons was sold to Bernadette and Dennis Eckmann.
