TREE FACTS

The Right Time to Prune a Tree

Whether you are trying to improve the health of a tree, remove suckers or water sprouts, or remove dead or dying branches there is a right time to do it. It may seem a little surprising that different types of pruning, such as removing dead branches vs. removing suckers, ideally need to be done at different times. Pruning a tree at the correct time can make the difference between spreading fungus and pests and having a healthy tree. Starting with a healthy tree that may need to be trained for a purpose, need thinning for health, or have rubbing branches re-

moved; it is best to prune them in the dormant season. This would be in the winter time when all the leaves have fallen off or early spring before the new leaf growth has started. At this time the tree will be less stressed and a lot of the fungus and pests that can be spread by pruning are also dormant. The tree will also heal the wound caused by the cut better and faster in the dormant season when it can focus more energy on the healing than when it is also producing leaves. When it comes to suckers or

water sprouts it is best to prune them in the early summer right after the spring growth is finished. If you prune them during dormant season, like you would with a live branch, it will promote more to grow the following spring. If they are pruned in early summer, it will limit new growth of suckers or water sprouts.

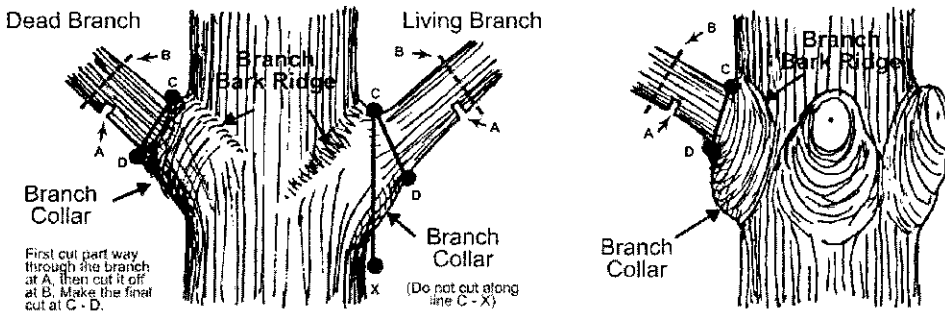
When dealing with dead or dying branches, especially ones that are hazardous such as widow makers, you can remove them at any time. The thing to remember with branches that are dead is 1: safety and 2: don't cut it flush to the trunk. A dead branch can be dangerous, always use caution and wear proper safety gear. For the tree to heal properly it's important that you don't damage the collar of the branch. The collar is where the branch meets the tree; a damaged collar can lead to decay and disease.

When making the cut, cut close to the collar and for larger branches use the 3-point method. First make a cut half way through the underside of the branch a foot or so out from the collar, second make a cut from the top side of the branch a little farther out than the first cut, this will help prevent the cut branch from tearing the bark of the tree. Finish up by cutting off the stub close to the collar.

Reflections on the Words of Life

Last week we began to look together at the book of Daniel. We saw that Daniel was among a group of Jews from the Southern Kingdom of Judah who were taken captive by the Babylonians. Daniel was probably around 14-years-old when he was taken in one of the first waves of the captivity under the

Babylonian King Nebuchadnezzar. Over the next several years, many more people of Judah would be taken captive to Babylon.

Why had this happened? The Old Testament prophets over and over again tell us that God allowed both the Northern Kingdom of Israel and the Southern Kingdom of Judah to come into captivity because they had, for the most part, turned their backs on the Lord. They had turned a deaf ear to the numerous warnings God sent through prophet after prophet.

The Northern Kingdom had fallen over a hundred years earlier to Assyria. But now the time of God's patience with the Southern Kingdom was over. The judgment we can read about in the book of Lamentations had come. Jerusalem had fallen, and the people of Judah were the captives of Babylon.

Yet among those who had been taken, there was a handful of people who had not become ungodly and idolatrous along with most of the people of Judah. As the prophets had foretold, there was a small but faithful remnant that remained true to the Lord. These few continued to love God and to strive to please Him, even in the hostile surroundings of distant Babylon. Among this small group were Daniel and his three friends Hannaniah, Mishael, and Azariah. At a time when no one else seemed to care, this small group continued to love God and His Word.

God has promised that He will never leave Himself without a witness in the world. True religion continues uninterrupted, even though there are times when its adherents can be numbered in little more than handfuls. While most of the people of Judah had turned away from God, we see a young teenager,

uprooted from his homeland and put through a most powerful and subtle indoctrination in the ways of Babylon. But by God's enabling grace, Daniel remained faithful to his Lord.

Dear people, it is not true that we would do better spiritually if we had it easier. We might be tempted to look over at the other guy and think to ourselves, "If I were in his or her shoes, I would be a better Christian." The book of Daniel shows us that true spirituality does not depend upon circumstances being easy. The stronger the winds of life, the deeper our roots should go into the Lord.

We are told of two things that kept Daniel from capitulating amid the constant temptations that he faced in an environment that was hostile toward God. First, he was a man of prayer. Every time we find Daniel in a tough situation, we find him praying. We read in chapter 6, "He knelt down on his knees three times that day, and prayed and gave thanks before his God, as was his custom since early days." In addition, Daniel was an avid student of the

Scriptures. We are told in Daniel 9:2, "I, Daniel, understood by the books the number of the years specified by the word of the LORD through Jeremiah the prophet, that He would accomplish seventy years in the desolations of Jerusalem." It starts with faith in the Lord Jesus Christ. For only in Him can there be restoration between a depraved sinner (which is all of us as we come into this world) and the holy God. And then we, like Daniel, as reconciled children of God, can go on to become men and women who are fervent in prayer and grounded in the Scriptures. May this be true of each of us.

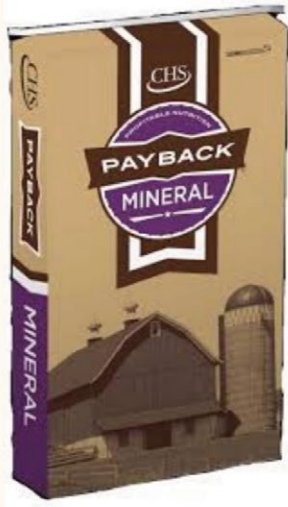

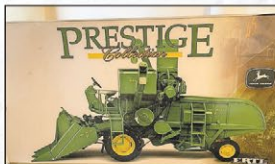

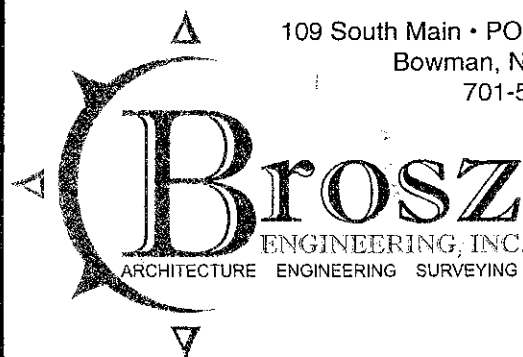

“23 Days Early; Happy Birthday Larry Woiwode”

23 Days Early; Happy 80th Birthday Larry Woiwode (wy-woody) this October 30th!

Larry Woiwode, in full Larry Alfred Woiwode, was born in Carrington, North Dakota, in 1941 before the Japanese surprise attack on Pearl Harbor, Hawaii on December 7th.

American Writer, Novelist; Poet; Professor... Larry Woiwode (North Dakotan, from 5 generations) returned to Hettinger County, North Dakota (Rural Mott, ND) in 1978; to extend his writing career and raise registered quarterhorses.

He first published fiction while attending the University of Illinois (Urbana-Champaign) for 4-1/2 years, 1959 to 1964. Also, he served as a copywriter and voice-over, and live talent for a CBS affiliate in Illinois. His short stories and poetry later appeared in such magazines as Harper's, Partisan Review, The Atlantic Monthly, The New Yorker... Esquire, Gentleman's Quarterly, and Paris Review. Beginning in 1965, The New Yorker gave the first reading to all his work, an arrangement that lasted for several



including Words for Readers and Writers (2013), and a children's book, The Invention of Lefse (2011). What I Think I Did (2000) and A Step from Death (2008) are memoirs.

Larry Woiwode was the recipient of numerous honors (many more distinctive honors not mentioned here), including a Guggenheim fellowship (1971). In 1995 he received the Award of Merit Medal from the American Academy of Arts and Letters for distinction in the art of the short story. Also in 1995, he was designated Poet Laureate of North Dakota by the Legislative Assembly in 1995: Senate CR No 4039, the House unanimously concurring, the office conferred by Governor Schafer in a ceremony on March 29, 1995.

In my closing words- I would like to say, it has been an honor for me to research and write about Larry Woiwode. He stands out as being very proficient at his crafted career. I didn't start out writing good stuff. I started out writing crap and thinking it was good accomplished writing. Hopefully, gradually, I may get better at it.

decades. Woiwode taught and led writing workshops at Dartmouth College, an Ivy League School (having a reputation for high scholastic achievement and social prestige) in Hanover, New Hampshire, and various universities, including the State University of New York at Binghamton, where (1985-88) he was a tenured full Professor and Director of the creative writing program.

Besides his tenure at SUNY-Binghamton, he has served as writer in residence at the University of Wisconsin, at Madison, and conducted summer sessions as a Professor at Wheaton College, Chicago, and the C.S. Lewis Seminars at Cambridge, England; he has also conducted seminars and workshops in fourteen states of the United States, in the Canadian provinces, and in England, Lithuania, and Scandinavia. Larry Woiwode is the author of several novels and short stories; a commentary titled Acts; a biography of the Gold Seal Founder and Entrepreneur, Harold Schafer, Aristocrat of the West; a book of poetry, Even Tide; and 2 well-received memoirs, What I Think I Did and A Step From Death. Woiwode has written books in a variety of genres, 6 of which have been named notable books of the year by the New York Times Book Review.

Woiwode's critically acclaimed first novel, What I'm Going to Do, I Think (1969), is a study of a newly married couple. Beyond the Bedroom Wall: A Family Album (1975) is a multigenerational saga of a North Dakota family; Born Brothers (1988) continues the story of Charles and Jerome Neumiller, characters from Beyond the Bedroom Wall who also

appear in The Neumiller Stories (1989). Poppa John (1981) concerns an out-of-work television actor, and Indian Affairs (1992) is a sequel to What I'm Going to Do, I think.

In 1977 Woiwode's collected poems were published in Even Tide, and a volume of short stories, Silent Passengers, appeared in 1993. He wrote several essay collections,

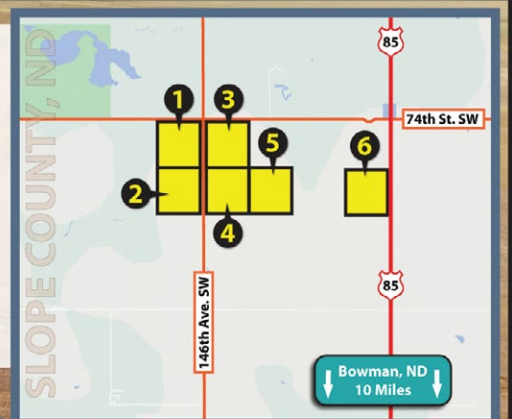

Coyote Corner Supply Chain Shortages

Greetings residents of Grant County. I wanted to inform you that schools are facing an unprecedented problem and it is not COVID. Nation wide we are experiencing extreme shortages in our supply chains for food distribution. This shortage is coming from a lack of workers to deliver, prepare, and ship goods. As a result of these shortages, a major vender for schools has discontinued their contract with the state. The state went into emergency procurement to secure another supplier for foods and was unable to even get a bid. This is particularly troublesome for those schools in the eastern part of the state, as they are struggling to even find a supplier. Fortunately for us, we are receiving supplies and have vendors, but we are far from untouched.

What this means is that schools will no longer be able to lock in prices for commodities and will be paying the same market prices as everyone else. This means the cost to provide school lunches will increase. While the USDA is providing free school lunches, it is reimbursed at a set level. If schools are forced to go outside state bidding systems to provide lunch to their students, they will

not be able to produce a lunch at the cost it takes to provide that lunch.

This also means you can expect changes in the meal patterns here at school. Items on the menu may have to change based on the availability of product. While we plan to continue providing balanced meal options for students, they are unlikely to exactly follow the meal pattern requirements of typical school years. To be clear, we may have to make due with the resources available to us.

Those of you who grow produce locally are encouraged to reach out to the school. Since produce does not have to be USDA approved, we are able to buy directly from farmers here in Grant County. We will also be working with South 40 Beef in Mott to purchase meat directly from our local ranchers to make sure we are able to continue to provide high quality protein to our students. Please contact the school if you are interested in selling food items to the school for our lunch program. Keep in mind any meat products have to be USDA approved which is why we will be working with South 40 Beef. We are very grateful for their partnership.

A special thanks to Mona


Hands who is working with the school's current suppliers to provide lunches to our students. We are fortunate they are continuing to sell to the school district, but they are not guaranteeing the sort of prices we have come to expect. Even with these supplies, we are still subject to product shortages as they affect our vendors. Please be patient as lunches may have to change on short notice.

While we continue to face unprecedented challenges, it only continues to be true that we can either chose to make each other stronger or let these challenges wear us down. I believe we are Pack Strong and that we can make our school and community stronger and that our school and community can make us stronger. I know we have people out there that will step up in these unusual times and that we will persevere in the end. Calm seas never made a skilled sailor, and we will become skilled in these waters.

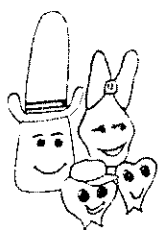

Jeffrey "Jeff" Lee Johnson was born on June 6th, 1955 in Bowman, ND to Wayne & Ramona (Peterson) Johnson. Jeff grew up in Scranton, ND on a farm south of Scranton and then as he grew older, on a farm

northeast of Scranton. He joined a family of three older siblings, sisters Mona and Jawayne and brother Curtis. Living down the road from his Deutscher family gave Jeff one of his greatest and lifelong friends, his cousin Tom.

Growing up on the farms, Jeff experienced many mishaps and adventures that shaped him into the person his friends and family experienced later in life. He was first introduced to one of the great loves of his life, riding motorcycle, at an early age and continued the love affair throughout his life. RECIPE OF THE DAY

CARAMEL APPLE ALMOND QUICK BREAD

1 cup sour cream
1 cup brown sugar
2 eggs
2 teaspoons vanilla
2 cups all purpose flour
2 teaspoons baking powder
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
1 1/2 cups apples, finely diced
1 cup sliced almonds, divided

BUTTERY CARAMEL SAUCE:

1/4 cup brown sugar
1/4 cup butter

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Lightly grease a 9x5x3 loaf pan and set aside. Using an electric mixer on low, beat together the sour cream, brown sugar, eggs and vanilla until combined. Then add the flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt, beat on low until well combined. Fold in the apples and 1/2 cup almonds. Pour the batter into the loaf pan and top with remaining 1/2 cup almonds. Lightly press the almonds into the top of the batter. Bake for about 1 hour, until toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool in the loaf pan for 20 minutes, then remove loaf and cool completely on a wire rack.

SAUCE:

In a small saucepan over medium heat, combine the butter and brown sugar. Bring to a light boil, reduce heat, and stir constantly for 1 minute until sauce starts to thicken. Remove from heat and drizzle over the top of the loaf.

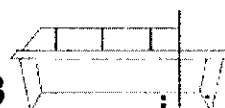
