“You can't do it- you'll never win, what makes you think you are good and the tournament is 6 weeks away, by then you'll want something different, give it up Bob and besides that you're so short you'll need a stool to look up to your opponents.” They laughed, messed his hair and said, “Come on lets go play some pool!”

Bob trapsed along with them, as usual, for they were all good friends, had lived in the same neighborhood most of their lives so harassing each other was the most fun they had, now that some would leave for college again, some had jobs and Bob - - well Bob was trying to find himself. Born with a small disability, short, he had been struggling to find out where, what, how, he fit into society. For now he was okay at his own home town. Others accepted him and he felt safe. But something was calling him to be more.

Then he saw the posters “Pool Tourney” scattered around town. “Be A Champion,” be a winner and give to your favorite charity. Bob knew how to play pool, hadn't for some time. They had a pool table in the basement. Uncle Joe came and played with him every night when he was in his adolescent years. Always told him he was good and he should never, never give up on who he was or how good he could be. He just had to believe in what he was doing and know that he was a special young man with many gifts and talents.

Thinking about the tournament and giving his proceeds to the children's fund in his community seemed to give Bob an excitement he hadn't experienced since Uncle Joe was killed when off to fight for his country. He really wanted to leave a legacy to his uncle so he began to practice - “this is fun, kinda forgot how much fun it was.” And practice he did - - early morning, late nights, sometimes even giving up on spending time with his friends, for when he was with them they would say, “Still got that crazy idea about winning the tourney?” All he would answer was “I'll try.” They in turn would again laugh and say “impossible.” But they were friends and he loved them all. Up to this point they just accepted him and never questioned his height.



The night before the big tourney, Bob went out with his friends and just before parting he said, “Will you come tomorrow and help me?”-- “Still going thru with it?” They all laughed but agreed they would come and support him.

The big day arrived. People from all walks of life were present. Pool sticks of every color were brought in by each player - - some very expensive, some plain, a wonderful - array of colors, shapes - - one even had a fancy hook on the end. Rules were given, judges introduced, bell rang - it began. Ten pool tables filled the room. Klick, bang, yeh's filled the room.

Bob was the last to play due to numbers that were drawn. Barely able to reach the top of the pool table, he began. Must clear the table was the final rule. So far no one had accomplished the feat.

Ball one into the **pocket**, ball two, ball three -- ball 14 into the **pocket**. Everyone cheered. His friends were cheering the loudest - “go Bob, go Bob.” Now judges ask for silence as the cue ball was lined up perfectly. Bob picked up the stick, chalked the tip - - then something strange happened -- he put down the pool stick and walked away.

When interviewed for story and questioned why he quit his answer was something his Uncle Joe always said, “Believe in what and who you are, but always remember, “It's not what you do, but who you are that counts.”

Bowman-Haley Dam Sampling Project

Bowman, ND, September 7, 2021: The Bowman-Slope Soil Conservation District (SCD) has partnered with the North Dakota Department of Environmental Quality (NDDEQ) to assess the water quality conditions in the Bowman-Haley Dam Reservoir and the tributaries to the reservoir. This project has been in response to the recent years of Harmful Algal Blooms (HABs) appearing in Bowman-Haley Reservoir during the summer.

HABs are the rapid growth of algae or cyanobacteria that can cause harm to people, animals, or the local ecology. These blooms can produce toxins that make people and animals sick. Blooms occur in fresh water, such as lakes, streams, and rivers.

The goal of this project is to collect data to provide information on possible causes for the HABs and to develop a watershed improvement plan to address and change possible causes. The Bowman-Slope SCD is a local political sub-division of ND State Government with a mission and purpose to improve and protect natural resources. The Bowman-Slope SCD has a long history of implementing voluntary conservation and watershed programs to improve water quality and natural resource concerns.

Water samples and data were collected in the tributaries in 2020 and 2021 and samples on the Bowman-Haley Reservoir will be collected in the years 2021, 2022 and 2023. The Bowman - Slope SCD will keep the public informed on project development and future information regarding this project. NDSU Extension Offering Education at Big Iron

Producers and others will have an opportunity to learn about crop production, the drought, farm stress and North Dakota State University's Agricultural and Biosystems Engineering Department from NDSU Extension personnel during the Big Iron farm show in West Fargo on Sept. 14-16.

NDSU Extension personnel will have four exhibits at the east end of the Hart Ag Building. In addition, Extension agents and specialists will be available to answer questions about crop and livestock production and other rural topics.

"This is an opportunity for people to stop by to view the displays, ask questions, pick up publications and provide input or just visit," says Ken Hellevang, NDSU Extension agricultural engineer.

Crop production accounts for about two-third of the agricultural economy in North Dakota. The Extension exhibit will focus on some of the current topics, with Extension agents and specialists available to discuss current challenges.

One hundred percent of North Dakota is experiencing drought that is impacting livestock, crops and farmsteads. Producers are encouraged to bring in livestock water samples to be screened to ensure the total dissolved solids and sulfates are not toxic. Part of the Extension exhibit will include resources available to assist farmers with various aspects of agriculture impacted by the drought.

Another aspect of the exhibit will focus on resources available to help producers survive the many challenges they face.

Faculty will be available to discuss various Agricultural and Biosystems Engineering Department topics. The department has academic degrees in engineering, with a focus on agricultural machinery, natural resource engineering and bio-systems engineering.

The department also offers degrees in agricultural systems management, which incorporates technology, business and agricultural production. The precision agriculture degree is one of only two four-year degrees offered in the U.S. and includes the many aspects of precision agriculture. Both of these degrees are through the College of Agriculture, Food Systems, and Natural Resources.

The department's research focus is on precision agriculture, natural resources and biosystems, including crop storage and enhanced bioproducts. Extension education and technical assistance is provided on grain drying and storage, agricultural machinery and precision agriculture, and water including irrigation, drainage and water quality. Agricultural and Biosystems Engineering students will have an exhibit outside Hart Hall showing their one-fourth scale tractor and possibly a re-conditioned tractor or two.

John Nowatzki, retired NDSU Extension agricultural machine systems specialist, has organized field demonstrations related to autonomous agricultural vehicles and automated precision rock picking. Demonstrations will be conducted daily from 1:30 to 3 p.m. in the field directly south of the Red River Valley Fairgrounds racetrack.

Heidi will be representing Hettinger County on Wednesday afternoon. Stop in and say hi.

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

Dear reader, I would like for us to think today about the love of God. Surely, there cannot be a more wonderful subject. And I cannot think of a more wonderful passage in the Bible which addresses this subject than the one with which Romans 8 concludes in verses 38-39: "For I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord."

What comfort is in those words for you if you are a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ. What they tell us is that if you are the object of God's love, then there will never be a place where God's love cannot reach you. If you are the object of God's love, you will go on being the object of that love forever.

One of the best things a believer can do in this life is to meditate upon the passages in the Bible that tell us about how much God loves His people, and we could never exhaust the subject. For the love of God for His children is far greater than any person can imagine. In fact, in his letter to the Ephesians, Paul prays that believers would "be able to comprehend with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height-- to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge."

Now, I want you to consider with me how the apostle can so confidently assert these things. How can he say that nothing in this life or in the life to come can separate believers from the love of God? The key to it all is in what he says Romans 8:33-34: "Who shall bring a charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. Who is he who condemns? It is Christ who died, and furthermore is also risen, who is even at the right hand of God, who also makes intercession for us."

You see, my friends, telling us all these wonderful things about the love of God would be of no value to us without also telling us how we can be the recipients of it. The point Paul is making in these verses is that if a person is justified through faith in Jesus Christ, then God no longer has anything against that person. If one is relying upon the saving sacrifice of Jesus Christ on the cross to make him or her right with God, then no one can bring condemnation upon that person. And with all condemnation removed, the believer is the object of God's love.

Why? Quite simply, the person relying on the saving sacrifice of Christ has all of his or her sins pardoned by God. And that is because Christ's sacrifice is so efficacious and so satisfactory to God, that God declares the one who relies upon it to be justified and forgiven.

On the other hand, the person without Christ has God's wrath hanging over him because his sins are still upon him. But if that sin is paid for to God's satisfaction, then God no longer has anything against him. And that is exactly what the apostle

is saying God will do for the one who relies on the Lord Jesus Christ alone for salvation.

I can tell you this, friends: if you think that God will forgive you on the basis of some good things you have done or plan to do, or because you think you are basically a good person, then you don't understand what the Bible is saying. If you think that you are saved because you were baptized or have been through a confirmation class, you don't understand what the Bible is saying. Our sins cannot be taken away by any other means than through the blood of Jesus Christ. And only by faith in His saving work does any of us receive pardon.

The apostle is making it clear that Jesus is the One who saves. He is the only One who can wash away our sins through His precious blood. And in order

for Him to do so for you, you must go to God through Him. You must go to God relying only on the Lord Jesus Christ and His saving sacrifice on the cross. You must go empty handed of anything you might think could commend you to God and rely on Christ to do all for you.

I conclude by inviting each one of you to have the blessings and joys of a relationship with God and the knowledge of His incomprehensibly great love as your own by coming to Him through Jesus Christ. And for you who are already believers, thank God for the unspeakable gift of His Son who has died in your place and caused the love of God that passes knowledge to flow to you. Bask in the sunshine of that love, which you will be privileged to enjoy for all eternity.

BAKED GARLIC PARMESAN CHICKEN

1/2 cup mayonnaise
1/2 cup shredded Parmesan cheese
4 boneless skinless chicken breast cutlets
4-5 teaspoons Italian seasoned dry bread crumbs
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
pinch of salt
1/2 teaspoon lemon pepper

Preheat oven to 400° F. In a small bowl combine mayonnaise, garlic powder and Parmesan cheese. Moisten chicken breasts with water and lay on baking sheet (NOTE: Line the baking sheet with parchment paper for easier clean up). Divide the mayonnaise mixture evenly among the chicken, just spreading it across the top of each piece, and sprinkle with salt and pepper to taste. Bake for 15-20 minutes, remove from the oven and sprinkle bread crumbs on each piece of chicken. Return to oven and bake for additional 20 minutes or until chicken is cooked thoroughly and juices run clear. Tops will be browned and chicken will be incredibly juicy. You can also finish them off under the broiler for a minute or two to get them extra browned on top. Season with a dash of fresh parsley, if desired.
