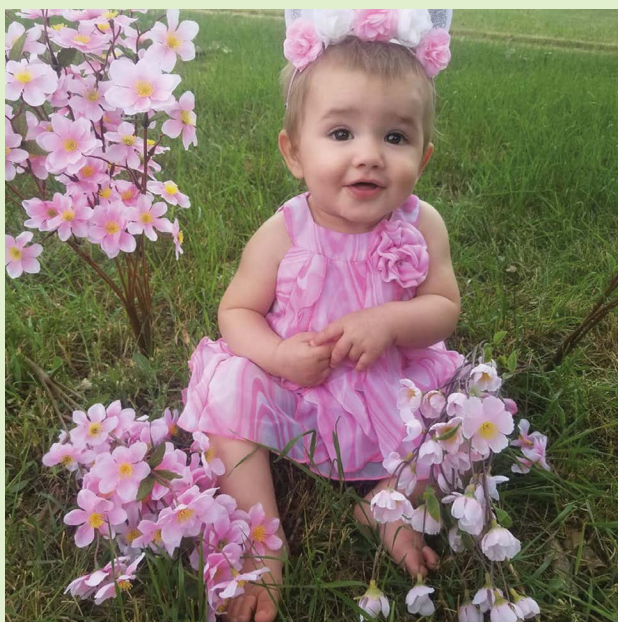

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

I'd like for us to consider together one short verse in the Bible, Philippians 1:21: "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain." Friends, have you thought about the real meaning and purpose of life? The apostle Paul's purpose in life could be stated in the first seven words of our verse: "For to me, to live is Christ." Paul's whole purpose for living was Jesus Christ. But what does that mean?

Well, later in Philippians 3:10, Paul gives us more insight as he goes on to tell us the chief goal of his life: "that I may know Him and the power of His resurrection, and the fellowship of His sufferings, being conformed to His death." More than anything else, Paul wanted to know Jesus Christ in a more intimate way. Paul believed that Jesus Christ was the Son of God who came to this earth for the purpose of saving sinners in order

to restore them to a relationship with Almighty God. And when Paul understood what Jesus did for him in order to save him and make him right with God, knowing more about Jesus and living a life pleasing to Jesus became his consuming passion.

My purpose today is not simply to tell you about what was important to the apostle Paul but to encourage each of you to ask yourself, "What is important to me, and what am I living for?" Paul had come to realize that there is nothing else in this world that compares with Jesus Christ, and for that reason there is nothing higher or greater than anyone could live for than Him.

English missionary C. T. Studd wrote a poem that contains these words: "Only one life, 'twill soon be past; only what's done for Christ will last." There is a great truth expressed in those words. The things of this world are temporary. We enjoy them for a time, and then they get used up or wear out or break down or become obsolete. Furthermore, the things of this world cannot help our souls.

We are more than flesh and blood. Each of us has a soul. And that soul, the Bible tells us, is going to spend eternity in one of two places: heaven or hell.

The Bible says that we are all born into this world on what Jesus called "the broad road to destruction." This means that a person doesn't have to do anything to go to hell. Since we are all born sinners, we are automatically on the path that leads to hell, where God will punish sinners with the just punishment their sins deserve. But Jesus mentioned another road: the "narrow way which leads to life." Jesus was talking about the way to God which He came to make for sinful man by means of His perfect life and sacrificial death on the cross. On the cross, Jesus Christ actually paid for the sins of every person who would ever rely upon Him to save his or her soul. There is no other way for you and me to have our sins paid for to God's holy satisfaction. When a person comes to see that and to rely exclusively on the saving work of Jesus Christ to make him right with God, that person's life changes directions. He or she gets off the broad road. He stops caring so much about the things of this world and starts to care more and more about living his life to please Jesus Christ. That is what happened to the apostle Paul. My friend, has it happened to you? What are you living for? What is important to you? Has God so worked in you that through a relationship with Jesus Christ the whole direction of your life has changed?

Now, let us look briefly at the last part of our verse. After telling us that for him to live is Christ, Paul goes on to say, "and to die is gain." Can you say that, my friend? The person who is trusting in Christ alone for salvation has no need to fear death. The minute the believer dies, he or she will go immedi-

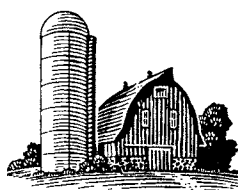

Design Your Succession Plan

The Adams County Development Corporation, Adams County Extension, and Hettinger Area Chamber of Commerce are partnering this fall to offer Design Your Succession Plan, a program focused on transition planning for small businesses developed by NDSU.

The Design Your Succession Planning program is being held in Adams County in response to the identification of succession planning as a major regional need during the Adams County strategic planning process held throughout 2021. Over a six month period, the Adams County Development Corporation hired an outside consultant, AE2S, to facilitate the strategic planning process for Adams County. Stakeholders were engaged on multiple levels in the planning, from student and business surveys to focus groups and community leader interviews. Workforce development and business retention and expansion make up two of the three main segments of the 2021 Economic Development Strategic Plan, with developing the next generation of tradespeople and business succession planning being identified as the top goals.

The Design Your Succession Plan curriculum will help Adams County businesses advance these goals, being proactive as the county combats the looming loss of retiring

trades workers and other key business owners. The program, consisting of three modules, addresses starting a succession plan, determining their succession planning goals, identifying and building the next generation and your legacy, facilitating tough conversations, and working with professionals to develop and implement a succession plan.

The trainings will be held on October 18th, October 25th, and November 1st. All sessions will be held from 6-9pm at The Rural Collective (506 2nd Ave. S). The cost is \$60 to participate. Weed cutting notice to all landowners or Operators that weeds must be cut

Notice is hereby given to all landowners or operators to cut all weeds and grasses adjoining their lands along those roads defined as roadways by the Township supervisors and the Hettinger County Board of Commissioners including weeds and grasses growing within the public right-of-way bordering such highways and their lands. **Such cutting shall be completed by October 1, 2021.** Cutting with a swather is not adequate, maximum stubble height of 4 inches and a minimum of 13 feet must be cut using a mower. If the weeds and grasses are not cut along county roads or is not cut adequately to prevent snow buildup, the county will mow the weeds and grasses and charge the adjacent landowner at a rate of \$150.00 per one-half mile. **The county will begin cutting ditches on October 1, 2021.** If the landowner fails to cut the weeds and grasses along township roads adjoining their lands, the township Board of Supervisors may cause such weeds and grasses to be cut and the actual cost shall be charged against the land of the landowner and shall become part of the taxes levied against the land in the ensuing year. Also if hay bales remain in the ditches of county roads after October 15, 2021 the county will remove the hay bales and the landowner may redeem them by paying the cost of removal. If not redeemed by November the hay will be sold to pay the cost of removal. The Township Board of Supervisors do not need to advertise for weed cutting in their Township.

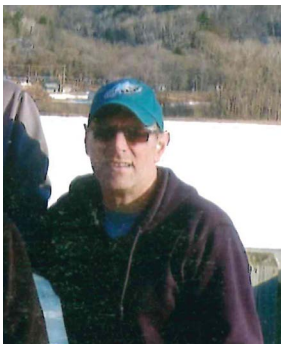

With over 120 kids participating from across 9 counties making it a successful show and sale.

The show is open to all 4-H and FFA members in western North and South Dakota who have shown at their county level. This show and sale provides the contestants an opportunity to compete against livestock from other counties without having to haul their animals long distances. It also concludes with a market livestock sale where the member can choose to sell their market animal to finish their project.

The show started at 9:00am Saturday morning with livestock judging of hogs, sheep, goats, and beef animal exhibits being shown. The livestock are judged as breeding or market animals and then the exhibitors have the option show off their skills in the showmanship competition. At the end of the day the grand champion showman for each species compete against each other in the round robin competition. The round robin contest has each showman show all 4 species for a specific amount of time, the overall showman award goes to the person who shows all four species the best. There are three levels of competition, beginner, junior and senior.

This year the overall beginner showman was Shelby Penfield, overall junior showman Gentry Schmidt, and overall senior showman was a tie between Aliceson Stranberg and Dara Bauer.

Lemmon Junior Livestock Show also has a couple of scholarship programs. The first program is the beginner breeding herd establishment/ expansion scholarship for any applicant ages 8-10. The applicants have to submit a 250 word essay explaining why they are wanting the scholarship. This year's winner is Brea Bauer from Adams County.

The second scholarship is the senior scholarship that goes to a 4-H or FFA high school senior to help defray the cost of post-secondary school. This year's winner was Macy Schiley, who was awarded \$2,000.

"We had a beautiful day for the show and with the help of the board members and the countless volunteers we were once again able to put on a great show today," Nikole Tennant, LJLS President.

For a bit of fun there was also a costume contest where the kids could dress up their animal and themselves in a costume to entertain the crowd and win votes for most humorous or most creative. This year the winners were Oscar Laufer & Cassy Hartman.

To conclude the day there was an awards ceremony at 5:30pm with the market auction to follow. At the end of the night the participants get their awards, their checks for the premiums and for their market animal if they sold one. Many of the participants use the money from this year's project to fund their livestock project for next year.

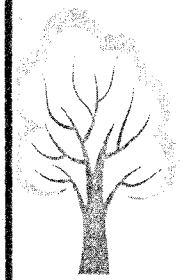

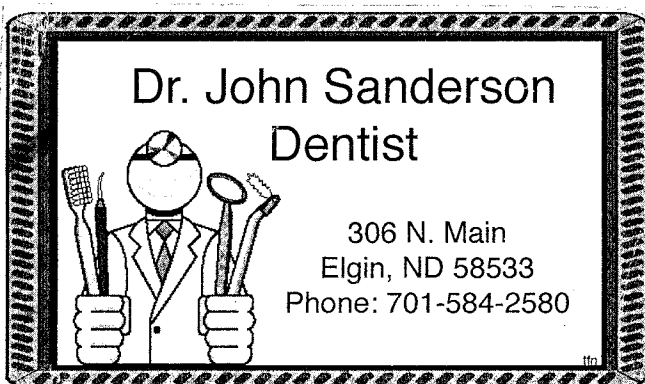
In December 1969, Hilda moved to Las Vegas, her home for 52 years. She retired after

PUMPKIN CUPCAKES

FOR THE CUPCAKES:
2 1/4 cups all purpose flour
1 tablespoon baking powder
1/2 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 teaspoon salt
3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg
1/2 cup (1 stick) butter, softened
1 1/3 cups granulated sugar
2 eggs, slightly beaten
1 cup pumpkin puree
3/4 cup milk

FOR THE FROSTING:
1 pkg. (8 oz.) cream cheese
1/4 cup butter, softened
1/4 cup pumpkin puree
4 cups powdered sugar
1 teaspoon vanilla extract
1 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon ground ginger
1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg

FOR THE CUPCAKES:
Preheat oven to 375°F. Line a muffin tin with cupcake papers (24 cavities) and set aside. In a medium bowl, combine the flour, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, ginger, and nutmeg. In a separate medium bowl, cream the butter and sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the eggs until thoroughly combined. Add the pumpkin and combine. Stir in the dry ingredients alternately with the milk, blending until the mixture is smooth after each addition. Divide the batter between the prepared muffin cups, filling about two-thirds full. Bake for 23-25 minutes or until a wooden toothpick inserted near the center of one of the cupcakes tests clean. Remove cupcakes to a wire rack to cool completely.

FOR THE FROSTING:
Beat the cream cheese, butter, and pumpkin in a large bowl until thoroughly combined and fluffy. Add the powdered sugar, vanilla, cinnamon, ginger, and nutmeg. Beat until smooth. Scrape down the sides of the bowl at least once to make sure all ingredients are incorporated. Frost cupcakes.
Refrigerate leftover cupcakes.

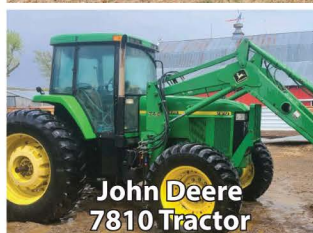

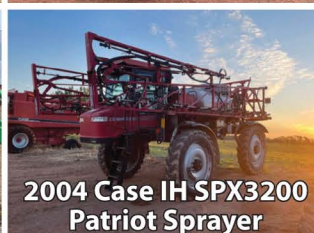
