Sure, how about you - - I'm working out every morning, at the gym - running on tread mill - -.

Text to second - - "starting your training?" "Sure - - darn, Derek keeps after us - - Thanks Derek for reminding me," as Mary gets into the vehicle making her way to teach the kindergarten class at Mott.

These conversations continue throughout the rest of 2020 and into 2021. 




Paula Anderson **New Hettinger** County JDA Director

Reflections on the

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord

I'd like for us to look today at a passage in Acts chapter 6, where we have an account of a problem that arose in the early church in Jerusalem. This group had one of those problems most churches would love to have. They were growing by leaps and bounds; people by the thousands were coming to faith in Jesus Christ and being added to the church. But with such rapid growth there often come problems. In this case the problem is described in Acts 6:1: "Now in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplying, there arose a complaint against the Hebrews by the Hellenists [Greek-speaking Jews], because their widows were ne-

The early church cared for the poor and widows by helping them with daily needs, often providing meals. But some widows were being overlooked in the daily distribution of food. and the apostles immediately sought a solution. We find their recommended course of action in Acts 6:2-4: "Then the twelve summoned the multitude of the disciples and said, 'It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God and serve tables.

Therefore, brethren, seek ou from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business; but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word."

The apostles realized that the need was legitimate and asked the believers to put their heads together and to find seven godly men who could attend to the problem and see that all the widows were cared for. But note that the apostles did not themselves engage in meeting this need. And they gave this reason why: "It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God." In verse 4 they state what would occupy their time: "We will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word.'

Here is lesson desperately needed by contemporary churches. It is wonderful for churches to have an outreach to help the needy, but they must not neglect the two most important ministries of all: the preaching and teaching of the word of God and prayer. Sadly, there are churches with little or no spiritual life because these things are no longer central. Several years ago it was common for churches to have a mid-week Bible study and prayer meeting. And in their Sunday morning worship, the preaching of the word of God was central because it was believed that listening to God speak through His word

health of God's people. But today, preaching and teaching of the word and prayer are more and more going by the wayside. In some cases sermons are being cut so short that very little good can come of them. Even worse, some do not come from the Bible at all. Their messages are worthless because they are the thoughts and ideas of mere men instead of the word of God, which is alive and powerful because God the Holy Spirit is its

ultimate Author. The apostles would not, even for a very important need, leave the ministry of the word and prayer. Without the preaching and teaching of the word of God, no believer will grow spiritually, and no unbeliever will be saved. Without prayer, no part of the church's work, including preaching and teaching, will be effective.

Oh, that we might get back to these two fundamental ministries. Mankind's greatest need is to be restored to a right relationship with God through faith in the Lord Jesus Christ, and the only source we have for understanding that is the Bible. And we must get back to prayer. The apostles gave themselves to it CONTINUALLY! We cannot expect God's blessing upon our labors for Christ unless we cry out to Him for it. Oh, may we see a resurgence of these two min-



Weed cutting notice to all landowners or Operators that weeds must be cut

Notice is hereby given to all landowners or operators to cut all weeds and grasses adjoining their lands along those roads defined as roadways by the Township supervisors and the Hettinger County Board of Commissioners including weeds and grasses growing within the public right-of-way bordering such highways and their lands. Such cutting shall be completed by October 1, 2021. Cutting with a swather is not adequate, maximum stubble height of 4 inches and a minimum of 13 feet must be cut using a mower. If the weeds and grasses are not cut along county roads or is not cut adequately to prevent snow buildup, the county will mow the weeds and grasses and charge the adjacent landowner at a rate of \$150.00 per one/half mile. The county will begin cutting ditches on October 1, 2021. If the landowner fails to cut the weeds and grasses along township roads adjoining their lands, the township Board of Supervisors may cause such weeds and grasses to be cut and the actual cost shall be charged against the land of the landowner and shall become part of the taxes levied against the land in the ensuing year. Also if hay bales remain in the ditches of county roads after October 15, 2021 the county will remove the hay bales and the landowner may redeem them by paying the cost of removal. If not redeemed by November the hay will be sold to pay the cost of removal. The Township Board of Supervisors do not need to advertise for weed cutting in their

Dakota Gardener: Save Your Tender **Bulbs for Next Year**

To preserve plants for next year and to save money, consider lifting and overwintering your expensive tender bulbs. By Esther E. McGinnis, Horticulturist NDSU Extension

We live in an era of reduce, reuse and recycle. We also have a Midwestern ethic of thriftiness. Can you apply this ethic to your flower garden? Yes!

In a short period of time, our annual flowers will be killed by fall frost if left in the garden. To preserve plants for next year and to save money, consider lifting and overwintering your expensive tender bulbs.

Tender bulbs is a generic term for summer-blooming plants from the tropics and subtropics that have fleshy underground storage structures such as bulbs, rhizomes, tubers and corms. Gardeners plant them in late spring after the danger

of frost has passed. Examples include dahlias, cannas, caladiums and gladiolus.

After the first light frost has killed the aboveground foliage, dig up the root system using a pitch fork or shovel. Carefully dig around the perimeter of the plant making sure not to wound the underground structures. Wounds allow entry points for bacteria and fungi that may cause rotting over the winter.

Cut off the foliage and brush off excess dirt. A garden hose can be used to wash off dirt for most tender bulbs but not gladiolus. More on gladiolus in a min-

Cannas, caladiums and dahlias should be cured for one to three days. Curing means allowing the underground structures to dry indoors at room temperature for one to three days. Discard any structures that are rotting or infested with insects.

Gladiolus corms are a special type of tender bulb that

should not be washed or else they will rot. Corms should be allowed to cure for three weeks hefore storage.

Eido/Connect Country

All tender bulbs should be marked with their species and cultivar. An easy way to do this is to write the name on the bulb using a permanent marker. Tags may also be used.

Place the tender bulbs in a well-ventilated container such as a cardboard box. Plastic containers should be avoided because they keep the humidity too high around the bulbs.

The container should be filled with a dry media such as peat moss, vermiculite or sawdust. To prevent rotting, dust the bulbs with an approved fungicide and place in the media with space between the bulbs.

Store the bulbs for the winter at temperatures between 40 degrees and 50 degrees F. Finding an appropriate storage area can be challenging to prevent the bulbs from freez-

ing or else rotting at a higher temperature. A heated garage works well if the temperature is regulated. Alternatively, find the coolest and darkest corner of vour basement.

In early April, pot up the bulbs in small containers to coax the bulbs out of dormancy. These tender plants can be transplanted into the garden in mid- to late-May depending on your average last frost date.

Tender bulbs should not be confused with hardy bulbs. Hardy bulbs are planted in the fall and include crocus, tulips, hyacinths and daffodils. These hardy bulbs can remain in the ground over the winter.

1 tablespoon vanilla


3-4 tablespoons whole milk

FOR THE CAKE:


Heat oven to 350°Spray bottom and sides of 13x9-inch pan with cooking spray. In large bowl, beat all of the cake ingredients with an electric mixer on medium speed for 2 -minutes, scraping bowl occasionally. Pour into pan. Bake 28 to 33 minutes or until toothpick inserted in center comes out clean. Poke holes into cake with the handle of a wooden spoon or fork. While the cake is still warm, gently spread 1 cup caramel sauce over cake. Refrigerate 2 hours. Spread frosting evenly on top once the cake is chilled. FOR THE FROSTING:

Place the butter and cream cheese in the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with a paddle attachment and beat on medium speed until smooth, about 1 minute. Reduce the speed to low, slowly add powdered sugar, and beat until fully incorporated and smooth, about 3 minutes. Stop the mixer and scrape down the paddle and sides of the bowl with a rubber spatula. Add vanilla and salt. Mixing completely. Add the milk one tablespoon at a time until it's a smooth consistency. Turn mixer to high and beat until light and fluffy.

2021 District I Cloud Seeding **Operations Summary**

BISMARCK, N.D. -September 1, cloud seeding has concluded for the District

I operations area of the 2021 North Dakota Cloud Modification Project (NDCMP). For the season, there were 82.10 flight hours flown in the district, which included Bowman and part of Slope counties. Of those hours, 46.12 were flown for hail suppression, 14.45 for rain enhancement, 15.15 for reconnaissance, and 6.38 for

aircraft repositioning.

Overall, 2021 District I flight hours were well below the tenyear average of 121.89 hours. There were 28 operational days out of a possible 92 project days when hail suppression, rain enhancement, reconnaissance flights were flown in the district. Hail suppression operations flown on 17 of the operational days, rain enhancement on 6 days, and reconnaissance operations on 14 days.

Planning meetings for the 2022 NDCMP will be held in January. Seeding operations are currently scheduled to resume


