EDUCATION EXHIBITION September 11, 2001: The Day That Changed the World

The Adams County Library in Hettinger, ND is excited to announce its participation in September 11, 2001: The Day That Changed the World, a downloadable educational exhibition that presents the history of 9/11, its origins, and its ongoing implications through the personal stories of those who witnessed and survived the attacks. Told across 14 posters, this exhibition includes archival photographs and images of artifacts from the Museum's permanent collection. It explores the consequences of terrorism on individual lives and communities at the local, national, and international levels, and encourages critical thinking about the legacies of 9/11.

The Library is also displaying a statuette of the Twin Towers on loan from Andy Roehl. The statuette was given to Andv by his father Ronald Warnecke. who was a volunteer with The American Red Cross and involved in the emergency response. Andy also relayed to me that he remembers being in the school library watching the newscast about the attack when he was in sixth grade. I was the school librarian at that time and recall experiencing the newscasts of the day with the students.

Twenty years after the attacks, with terrorism still a threat today, the events of 9/11 and its aftermath remind us that we may never be able to prevent all the actions of people intent on harming others, but we do have control over how we respond to such events. Whether by volunteering in our local communities, serving our nation in the military, caring for the sick, or through other efforts, all of us can help build the world in which we want to live. As we witness history unfolding in our own time, the ways we choose to respond-both large and small-can demonstrate the best of human nature after even the worst of days.

This 9/11 Memorial & Museum curated exhibition reflects the core pillars of commemoration, education, and inspiration as we prepare to observe the 20th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks.

"During this 20th anniversary year, it is our privilege to share these lessons with a new generation, teach them about the ongoing repercussions of the 9/11 attacks and inspire them with the idea that, even in the darkest of times, we can come together, support one another and find the strength to renew and rebuild," said 9/11 Memorial & Museum President and CEO Alice M. Greenwald.

The Adams County Library is proud to display this exhibition and is also displaying the exhibition at the Hettinger Public School in collaboration with the teaching staff and administration. Mr. Jason LeFebre will be providing further educational opportunities in the Modern American History Course.



"Go, by all means, and I will go with you," said the neighbor.

So on the next Sabbath afternoon they went to the prayer meeting at Hell Corner. All were assembled, preparing to give solemn and serious attention to the services.

"I had not been there but a few minutes," said the deacon, before I felt that the Spirit of the Lord was there." Four or five of these hardened, wretched men were struck under conviction at this first meeting. Another meeting was held, and more were converted. These prayer meetings continued, and many of those who were convicted have since become converted and have become praying men and women. The work is going on with amazing power. At the last meeting heard from, more than one hundred were present.

Later accounts confirmed that these conversions were no mere passing fad of religion or emotion. Lives had been permanently changed by the power of the gospel. May all believers join me in praying that God will bring revival to our country.


Sandy is so very thankful for our fire department especially for the one firefighter that had to go to the hospital due to a heat related issue and thankfully was alright and was released that



NORTH OF COURTHOUSE -336 PACIFIC AVENUE IN MOTT

The Hettinger County Weed Control Board will be dispersing Tordon, Curtail, and Milestone at the **STORAGE BUILDING LOCATED NORTH OF THE COURTHOUSE IN MOTT** at 336 Pacific Avenue in Mott, from **9 AM to Noon**, or until all chemicals on hand is dispersed, **on Tuesday, September 7th, 2021.** We will be having a "DRIVE-THROUGH" operation again for the fall dispersal, so you will not have to get out of your vehicle. **Bringing your own pens will be helpful.**

All landowners / operators must supply a land / FSA map of the area that is to be treated. <u>The Weed Board</u> will need to keep the map.

The cost for chemical will be \$35.00 per gallon of Tordon, \$75.00 per 2 ½ gallon for Curtail, and \$40.00 for a quart of Milestone, with a limit 10 gallons of Curtail, 4 quarts of Milestone, and 5 gallons of Tordon.

EACH PERSON WILL BE ALLOWED TO PICK UP CHEMICAL AT THE LIMIT ES-TABLISHED BY THE WEED BOARD. <u>YOU WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO PICK UP</u> <u>CHEMICAL FOR ANYONE ELSE</u>, ALTHOUGH A WIFE MAY PICK UP CHEMICAL FOR HER HUSBAND.



Dakota Gardener: Help Your Lawn Recover From Drought

A horticulturist offers tips on helping strengthen your lawn before winter.

This summer has been very stressful for lawns. The historic drought of 2021 turned many of our lawns brown and crispy.

That's in the past.

Temperatures have cooled off recently and we finally are getting some rain. This opens an opportunity for us to strengthen our lawns before winter.

Start by fertilizing your lawn. The fertilizer will thicken your turf and strengthen its root system this fall.

Applying a lawn fertilizer with potash in it is especially important this year. This is the third number listed on the bag. For example, a 30-0-10 fertilizer contains 30% nitrogen, 0% phosphate and 10% potash. This potash will help our lawns recover from the stresses of this summer's drought and the upcoming winter's cold temperatures.

Let's aim to apply the fertilizer near Labor Day. Irrigate the lawn after fertilizing.

Many of our lawns are full of weeds now. These weeds kept growing this summer while our lawn grasses turned brown and went dormant.

The key to killing a weed is to get the herbicide down into its roots.

As the nights get longer and the temperatures cool off, weeds will start moving their nutrients down into their roots to prepare for winter.

This movement down into roots makes fall the most effective season to kill hard-to-control perennial weeds such as thistle, field bindweed, clover and dandelion.

When you spray a perenni-

al weed this fall, the plant will move the herbicide naturally down into its roots along with its nutrients.

The first step is to get the herbicide absorbed by the leaves of the weed. That's why herbicide sprays are more effective than granular (usually weed-and-feed) products. Herbicide granules sometimes drop off weed leaves before they are absorbed.

Let's aim for weed control operations sometime in mid- to late September.

Spot treatments are best to minimize the exposure of yourself and your landscape plants to toxic chemicals. Read the label of the herbicide carefully and follow its instructions.

If the drought created some bare spots in your lawn, now is

a great time to sow seed and repair the damage. Now through mid-September is the best time to sow grass seed. The ground is warm, and the seed will germinate guickly.

Rake out the dead patches, sow the grass seed and lightly rake the seed into the soil.

Keep the soil moist with frequent, light waterings for two to three weeks until the seeds germinate and become established. Try to water at least once every day for a few minutes to keep the seed bed moist and to help the seedlings grow.

Another way to improve your lawn this fall is to aerate it. September is the best month to aerate your lawn.

A core aeration will open air pockets in the soil, encouraging

more roots to grow. Remove cores as deeply as possible, taking a few passes over the lawn. Best results are attained when the soil is slightly moist.

You can aerate, sow and fertilize on the same day, if you want.

Thank goodness for the rains we are receiving now. Let's take advantage of this cooler, wetter weather to help our lawns recover from drought and prepare for winter.

Trouble at the Border...

How many borders does the average American cross? Many people never leave our country. Here is something I have learned about borders. Travelers to Canada or Mexico cross those two borders. There were a few questions involved with my Canadian crossings, but an American traveler has no stop at all when walking or driving into Mexico - at least not the many times I traveled there in past years. The problem was coming back to the United States. At that time, U S Border Patrol guards were very careful to check our bags, ask many questions (mostly about drugs) and make us wait a while.

One winter in Arizona I attended a lecture given by U.S. Border Patrol agents. They went into detail about their work, which was mainly hunting down drug dealers who had sneaked across the southern border. At that time there were very few immigrants attempting to get into the U.S. and yet the Patrols were overwhelmed and having a difficult time keeping our borders secure. What is happening at that border now? It must be so much worse. Why can't we keep our border safe?

I do not know about European or far eastern borders as I haven't traveled there. My husband and I lived in South America for several years. We went through considerable questioning and bag searches when entering Colombia. There were also many vaccinations, visas, passports and other papers to be checked. It took an hour or two - if I was lucky - each time I returned after coming home for visits. Colombia had very secure borders.

While living there, my mom visited, and we took her with us on a group tour to Venezuela. Our bus was primarily full of American tourists when we arrived at that country's border. First, their guards boarded the bus, walked up and down to check us out. Then we waited in the bus - for almost an hour. We were then all taken out of the bus to stand by the side of the road - in the tropical sun for over an hour. Several people fainted and were brought water and chairs. The rest of us just waited. It was only then that the border guards decided to look at our visas. which took another hour. Finally, we were admitted to their country for a weekend tour. The return crossing took about half that
