
A Little Birdie Told Me: "There's More Than One Recipe For Cranberry Relish." by Vivian Hernandez

In an effort to lighten the mood I presented the head cranberry relish preparer with a snack pack of red Jell-O. She looked at me in disbelief: I waited a moment and then gave her the six packs of Jell-O. She sighed with relief and returned to the task at hand.

I've been told people come just for the cranberry relish. I heard someone did pass over the turkey, dressing, mashed potatoes and yams to load their plate with cranberry relish, but I can't prove it. The good news is, if you missed out on the cranberry relish that night we have 24 quarts leftover! A quart of the famous cranberry relish can be purchased for \$5. As a public service the recipes in questions will be published just in time for Thanksgiving.

I'm no gourmet cook and I've always felt a recipe was more of a suggestion. I rarely follow a recipe, usually because I get started and realize I don't have all the ingredients. A perfect example of this would be my pie baking on Saturday. In my effort to get ahead of the Thanksgiving rush, I decided to bake pies and freeze them. I prepared my homemade pumpkin pie filling naturally I had to adlib a bit. The recipe called for cream, I substituted one can of evaporated milk and one can sweetened condensed milk. 

Reflections on the Words of Life

by Pastor Paul Ferrie, Grace Reformed Church of the Lord Jesus, New Leipzig

We have been considering the ways in which King Nebuchadnezzar tried to turn his young Jewish captives, including Daniel and his three friends, into thoroughgoing Babylonians. These teenagers were bombarded with temptations to compromise and to forget God. But in the case of Daniel and his three friends, the plan didn't work. These young men, despite the pressures they faced, remained faithful to their God. We begin to see the reason for this in Daniel 1:8: "But Daniel purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself with

the portion of the king's delicacies, nor with the wine which he drank; therefore he requested of the chief of the eunuchs that he might not defile himself."

Let's think here about Daniel's dilemma. This young man was under tremendous pressure because he had been taught the Word of God. If he had not known the Scriptures, there would have been no conflict in his mind. But he knew that the Law of God explicitly forbade the Jews to eat certain foods such as pork, rabbit, and some types of fish. It is likely that all these were part of the king's diet.

On top of that, Daniel was in a much better position than so many of his fellow Israelites. As you well know, captives taken in battle are not often treated well

by their conquerors. But Daniel, being one of Israel's extraordinary young people, was given the rare opportunity which only a few others had to become someone of importance, even in a foreign enemy land. Furthermore, his position might have been viewed as a way to eventually help his fellow Jews.

But it was not Daniel's plan to first work his way into a position of bargaining strength and then to decide not to defile himself. Instead, he purposed in his heart what he would do because he loved God and did not want to dishonor Him. No doubt, many might have said to Daniel, "There are much more serious matters for you to take a stand on. Don't be petty and blow this golden opportunity. If you create a road-block now over a little matter like this, your chances of reaching a place of prominence will be shot down."

But Daniel's decision was firm. The Babylonians might change his name (as we saw last time), but they couldn't change his heart's commitment to God. His decision to refuse the king's diet is something that Daniel made on his own, in private. He knew what was right and decided that he must do it, no matter the consequences.

Sometimes we need the advice of others. But if we know what is the right thing to do, we don't need more advice. Oh, that we had more people like Daniel, people who make decisions based on what is right according to God's Word, no matter what others around them are doing and what might be the results.

Friends, it is often hard to be a follower of Christ. In fact, the apostle Paul said, "All who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution" (2 Timothy 3:12). But the same apostle also said, "Our light affliction, which is but for a moment, is working for us a far more exceeding and eternal weight of glory" (2 Corinthians 4:17). Whatever difficulties we might be called to face for following Jesus will be more than worth it for all eternity. And even in the very midst of suffering, it is possible to have a joy and peace

that unbelievers know nothing

Are you a follower of Christ, dear reader? Have your eyes been opened to see that you (as all of us) are a sinner who needs a Savior and that Jesus alone paid the price for sin to God's satisfaction? Are you relying only upon what Jesus

did on the cross when He took upon Himself all the sins of all His people and was punished in their stead? If not, please make it your highest priority to be reconciled to God through Christ. And for all who are believers in Christ, may we seek God for grace to be like Daniel in our increasingly ungodly society.

Can I make a difference in my community if I change my attitude?

RECIPE

1 cup flour 1 cup sugar

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

1/2 cup butter 1/2 cup water

1/4 cup sour cream

1 whole egg

tablespoon fresh lemon peel 1 tablespoon fresh lemon juice

LEMON GLAZE

1 1/2 cups powdered sugar

1 teaspoon fresh lemon peel


tablespoon melted butter 2 tablespoons fresh femon juice

2 tablespoons milk

Spray mini muffin pans with nonstick spray; Sit aside. Whisk flour, sugar, salt, and baking soda in a mixing bowl. Sit aside. Dissolve butter in saucepan on medium heat. Add water and bring to a boil. Pour the hot mixture over the dry ingredients and beat with a hand mixer until just combined. Beat sour cream, eggs, zest and lemon juice until smooth. Scoop the mixture into muffin tins. Bake at 325 degrees for 12 minutes. Let cool for 5 minutes, then flip onto cooling racks. Cool completely before glazing. Dip the lemon drop side down into the glaze. Allow excess glass to drop into bowl, then flip top side down onto cooling racks. (Put wax paper under the cooling racks for easier cleanup.) Allow the




